FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP December 12, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. TAMPA BAY LIGHTNING [8]

Game Summary | Event Summary

The Calgary Flames opened a five-game homestand on Thursday night by welcoming the Tampa Bay Lightning. Both teams would strike in the first, with Jonathan Huberdeau giving the Flames an early lead, before Nikita Kucherov evened things late in the frame as the clubs were knotted at one through 20. In the second, Tampa would find themselves up 4-1, before Nazem Kadri and Connor Zary scored to draw the home side back into the game as Calgary trailed 4-3 through 40. Tampa would pull away in the third, and ultimately knock off the Flames 8-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Panthers. Calgary and Florida split their season-series in 2023-24, with the home team winning on both occasions.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-2-3 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 7-5-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.

FLORIDA'S LAST TRIP TO CALGARY:

The last time Calgary Flames welcomed the Florida Panthers to the Scotiabank Saddledome was back on December 18th, 2024. Both teams would find the back of the net in the opening 20, with Martin Pospisil giving the Flames a 1-0 lead midway through the first before Sam Reinhart evened the score with 31 seconds remaining in the frame and the teams skated into the break knotted at ones. The middle stanza would see 16 shots between the two teams, but nobody would score, and this game remained deadlocked at one a piece. In the final frame, Mikael Backlund would shelf a backhander over the glove of Anthony Stolarz to give the Flames a 2-1 lead. Blake Coleman would add an empty netter, and the Flames would take this one 3-1.

HUBY DOO:

Jonathan Huberdeau registered a goal and an assist on Thursday against Tampa Bay to extend his point streak to six games, with four goals and five assists for nine points over the run dating back to November 30th. Huberdeau has now totaled a team-leading 21 points so far this season from 11 goals and 10 helpers, including two game-winning goals.

WEEGAR 500:

MacKenzie Weegar enters play tonight with 499 career games played and has a chance to play in his 500th NHL game against the team that drafted him, the Florida Panthers. Weegar made his NHL debut on April 3rd, 2017 against the Montreal Canadiens, and would score his first NHL goal on October 20th, 2017 against the Pittsburgh Penguins. Weegar played 306 games for the Panthers through six years before a trade in the summer of 2022 brought him to Calgary where he has skated in 193 contests. The Ottawa, ON native was the Panthers seventh-round pick (206th overall) in the 2013 NHL draft, and is looking to become just the fourth active seventh-round draft pick to reach 500 NHL games and join: Ondrej Palat (Drafted 208th overall by TBL in 2011), Erik Haula (Drafted 182nd overall by MIN in 2009), and Nic Dowd (Drafted 198th overall by LAK in 2009),

COOL GUY:

On Friday, the Flames announced the recall of goaltender Devin Cooley on an emergency basis from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. At the time of his recall, Cooley had an AHL-best 14-3-0 record along with a league-leading 1.80 goals-against average and is tied for the AHL's top save-percentage (.942) and most shutouts (3). Cooley signed with the Flames this summer as a free agent and has won his last four American Hockey League starts dating back to November 29th

FLORIDA/CALGARY TIES:

Tonight's contest features several skaters who have spent time with both the Flames and Panthers organization.

Panthers forwards Sam Bennett, A.J. Greer, and Matthew Tkachuk were all at one point Calgary Flames. Bennett was the Flames first-round pick, (4th overall) in the 2014 NHL Draft, and spent seven seasons with Calgary. A.J. Greer was claimed by the Flames off waivers and spent the 2023-24 campaign in Flames colours, skating in 59 games. Matthew Tkachuk was a Flame from 2016 to 2022, scoring 382 points in 431 outings for Calgary.

Flames forwards Jonathan Huberdeau and Ryan Lomberg along with blueliner MacKenzie Weegar all spent time as members of the Panthers. Ryan Lomberg is fresh off a Stanley Cup Championship with Florida and signed with Calgary for his second stint as a Flame this past summer. Both MacKenzie Weegar and Jonathan Huberdeau were acquired from Florida in the summer of 2022, with Weegar posting a career-year last season, while Huberdeau leads the Flames in points through 30 games for Calgary this season,

HANLEY MAN:

Flames blueliner Joel Hanley skated in his 199th NHL game in Columbus on Nov. 29 and is just one game away from 200 in his NHL career. Hanley can become the 17th-active undrafted defenceman to reach 200 games in their NHL career. The Keswick, ON native made his NHL debut on March 20th, 2016 against Calgary as a member of the Montreal Canadiens, and has spent time with Montreal, Arizona, Dallas, and Calagry through his 199-previous NHL games.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Jonathan Huberdeau ranks second in goals (198), assists (415) and points (415) for the Florida Panthers franchise. He was the Panthers first round pick (3rd overall) in the 2011 NHL draft. Huberdeau also became the first player in Panthers franchise history to win the Calder Trophy as NHL Rookie of the Year when he did so for his play in the 2012-13 campaign.
