FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP April 1, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [1] vs. UTAH HOCKEY CLUB [3]

Game Summary | Event Summary

The Calgary Flames finished off a three-game road swing on Tuesday night by travelling to the Delta Center to face the Utah Hockey Club. It would take just under 18 minutes for the games-opening goal, and it was Kevin Stenlund who gave Utah a 1-0 lead through 20. In the second, the Utah Hockey Club would double their advantage just 2:25 into the frame. Calgary would respond with seven minutes left in the middle stanza with a Rasmus Andersson point shot beating Karel Vejmelka and giving the visitors life as they skated into the break down 2-1. The Flames would amass 12 third period shots but Utah held firm and added an empty netter to knock off the Flames 3-1.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third of four meetings this season between the Flames and Ducks. Calgary has beaten Anaheim in both previous matchups in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 11-4-4 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 20-16-6 against Western Conference opponents.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

With his second period marker on Tuesday against Utah, Rasmus Andersson recorded his 11th goal of the season to tie his career high. Andersson's 11 tallies are the third-most among Swedish-born blueliners this season with only Victor Hedman (14) and Rasmus Dahlin (14) scoring more. Andersson's previous 11-goal campaign came during the 2022-23 season. The goal also marked his 229th career point, passing Dion Phaneuf (228) for eighth on the franchise's all-time points list among defensemen.

SUN(IEV) SHINE:

On Wednesday afternoon, the Calgary Flames announced the signing of forward Aydar Suniev to a three-year entry-level contract. Suniev, a native of Kazan, RUS played 35 games for the University of Massachusetts Amherst in 2024-25, posting career-bests in goals (20), assists (18) and points (38), finishing second on the team in scoring. Suniev helped his club upset the number three ranked Minnesota Golden Gophers in the Fargo Regional Semifinals, scoring a pair of goals including the overtime winner in a 5-4 UMASS victory.

Prior to embarking on his collegiate career, Suniev was a member of the BCHL's Penticton Vees winning back-to-back BCHL Championships in 2021-22 and 2022-23, totaling 110 points in 67 regular season contests over his two campaigns in Penticton. He was the joint top goal scorer in the league during his final BCHL campaign with 45 goals in 50 games.

Suniev was the Flames third-round pick (80th overall) in the 2023 NHL Draft.

A MARCH TO REMEMBER:

Nazem Kadri ended the month of March with 10 goals and five assists for 15 points in 15 games. Kadri's 10 goals were tied for the third most through the month, with two of them being overtime tallies, tied for the most in the league in March. This season, Kadri has 30 goals and currently sits two tallies away from tying his career-best of 32 which he has hit twice previously in 2016-17 and 2017-18.

HARVARD ALUMNI:

Tonight's matchup features two of the nine active Harvard alumni in the NHL with Anaheim's Alex Killorn and Calgary's Matt Coronato set to faceoff. Coronato spent the 2021-22 and 2022-23 campaigns with the Crimson, totaling 38 goals and 34 assists for 72 points in 68 contests for Harvard. Killorn spent four years at Harvard from 2008 to 2012, amassing 109 total points in 130 NCAA games.

MATT SCOREONATO:

Matt Coronato recorded the third multi-goal performance of his career (also Oct. 15, 2024 & Nov. 5, 2024) in Calgary and Anaheim's last meeting, a 4-1 Flames victory. Since that game, Coronato has scored seven goals, posted his fourth multi-goal game, and reached the 20-goal mark for the first time in his career.

ANAHEIM CALGARY TIES:

Ducks defenceman Olen Zellweger and forward Brett Leason are both Calgary natives. Zellweger is looking to face his hometown club for the third time in his career, while Leason is slated to face the Flames for the ninth time. Ducks rearguard Oliver Kylington was drafted by the Flames in the second round (60th overall) in the 2015 NHL draft. He spent six years with the Flames, skating in 201 games with 55 points. He has a chance to face his former club for the second time in his career.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In Calgary and Anaheim's last meeting, Flames centre Kevin Rooney skated in his 300th NHL game.

Flames goaltending coach Jason LaBarbera played five games for the Ducks in 2014-15, posting a 2-2-1 record.
