WASHINGTON CAPITALS

All-Time Wild Record: 17-13-3 (11-5-1 at Grand Casino Arena, 6-8-2 at Washington)

2024-25: Minnesota went 2-0-0 against Washington...The Wild won the seriesopening game, 4-3, in a shootout at Capital One Arena (1/2) and completed the season sweep with a 4-2 win in Saint Paul (3/27)...LW **Matt Boldy** (1-1=2), C Freddy Gaudreau (2-0=2), C **Ryan Hartman** (1-1=2) and C **Marco Rossi** (1-1=2) all had two points...G Marc-Andre Fleury saved 28-of-31 shots faced to earn the win for the Wild in the first meeting...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 28-of-30 shots faced in the second meeting...D **Martin Fehervary** (1-0=1), LW **Alex Ovechkin** (1-0=1), RW **Tom Wilson** (1-0=1), LW **Brandon Duhaime** (1-0=1) and D **Matt Roy** (1-0=1) all scored for the Capitals...G **Charlie Lindgren** went 0-1-1 with a 2.94 GAA and a .887 SV% in two starts.

WILD LEADERS: D Zach Bogosian (3-9=12 in 36 games), LW Marcus Foligno (4-8=12 in 26 games) and RW Mats Zuccarello (3-9=12 in 31 games) each own 12 career points each against Washington... LW Marcus Johansson has 11 points (4-7=11) in 13 contests.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 2-1-0 with a 2.98 GAA and a .905 SV% in three career games (two starts) vs. Washington...G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced the Capitals.

CAPITALS LEADERS: Ovechkin leads Washington with 38 points (20-18=38) in 24 career games against Minnesota...D **Jakob Chychrun** owns 14 points (10-4=14) in 26 games...C **Dylan Strome** has 13 points (4-9=13) in 14 games.

CAPITALS GOALIES: Lindgren is 0-3-1 with a 3.30 GAA and a .898 SV% in four career starts vs. Minnesota...G **Logan Thompson** is 3-1-0 with a 1.57 GAA and a .950 SV% in five games (four starts) vs. the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: Johansson was selected by Washington in the first round (24th overall) in the 2009 NHL Draft and collected 324 points (118-206=324) in 579 games in parts of nine seasons with the Capitals (2010-17, 2021-23)...C **Nic Dowd** played four seasons at St. Cloud State University (2010-14)...Duhaime was selected by Minnesota in the fourth round (106th overall) of the 2016 NHL Draft and recorded 40 points (20-20=40) in 211 games with the Wild (2021-24)...Lindgren is from Lakeville and played three seasons at St. Cloud State University (2013-16)...D **Declan Chisholm** collected 20 points (5-15=20) in 95 games in two seasons (2023-25) with Minnesota.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota is 7-0-1 in the last eight meetings (since 1/8/22) and 8-1-1 in the last nine meetings (since 3/22/19)...Minnesota's series sweep in 2024-25 marked the fourth time in franchise history the Wild has won two games against Washington in the same season (also 2002-03, 2021-22, 2022-23)...Nine of Minnesota's 16 games played at Washington have been decided by one goal (4-3-2)...Ovechkin netted three PPG on March 28, 2017, the most ever by a Wild opponent.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Leads the NHL with a 47.6 power-play percentage and 10 PPG (21 PPO), each the highest marks in franchise history through a season's first four games... Ranks third in NHL with 35.0 shots/game...Has scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season...Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) have recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games...Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities has recorded a higher power-play percentage.

John Hynes: Became the 50th bench boss in NHL history to reach the 750-games coached milestone vs. LAK (10/13)...Ranks fourth in NHL history among American-born head coaches in wins (365) and games coached (751), and ranks 49th all-time in both categories.

Matt Boldy: Ranks second in NHL with six PPP (3-3=6) and T-3rd in NHL with eight points (4-4=8)...Owns an active four-game goal streak, the first player in franchise history to achieve the feat in a season's first four games...Also owns an active four-game point streak...Is tied for the third-most points in Wild history through the first four games of a season...Recorded a career-high 10 shots on goal at DAL (10/14), tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in franchise history.

Jonas Brodin: Made his season debut vs. CBJ (10/11), posting a 16:57 TOI mark to move his career total to 19,002:20 and become the third player in franchise history to reach the 19,000-minute milestone.

Zeev Buium: Leads NHL rookies with five points (1-4=5) and ranks second in shots (10) and TOI/G (20:59)...Ranks T-1st in the NHL with four PPA, and third in NHL with five PPP (1-4=5)...Ranks T-1st in points among NHL defensemen... According to NHL Stats, is one of five NHL rookies since the 1933-34 NHL season to record five-plus PPP in his team's first four games.

Joel Eriksson Ek: T-4th in NHL with four PPP (1-3=4).

Ryan Hartman: Ranks third on team and T-7th in NHL with 18 shots this season...Has scored 99 career goals with the Wild.

Kirill Kaprizov: Ranks first in the NHL in PPP (4-3=7), T-1st in points (4-5=9) and T-3rd in goals and shots (19)...Owns an active four-game point streak... Per #NHL Stats, is the fifth NHL player in the last 30 years to record a season-opening point streak of four-plus games in three or more consecutive seasons. With a two PPP (1-1=2) at DAL (10/14), reached 138 career power-play points (66-72=138) and tied Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history... Currently ranks second in franchise history with 66 career PPG (Parise, 69)... Has tied Mikko Koivu (1-8=9 in 2008-09) for most points in Wild history through a season's first four games.

Marco Rossi: Notched his first career shootout goal vs. LAK (10/13), the game winner...Has played in 171 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players and T-30th among active NHL players.

Jared Spurgeon: Currently at 299 career assists, could join Mikko Koivu (504 assists) and Ryan Suter (314 assists) as the only players to reach 300 assists with the Wild...Scored a power-play goal vs. LAK (10/13) to reach 133 career powerplay points (35-98=133) and tie Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for sixth-most in Wild history.

Vladimir Tarasenko: Ranks T-1st in the NHL with four PPA and T-4th with four PPP (0-4=4)...His 304 career goals leads the current Wild roster...Ranks 37th among active NHL players in goals.

Yakov Trenin: Finished with a game-high seven hits at DAL (10/14), tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in his career...Ranks T-5th in the NHL with 19 hits this season...Currently at 98 career points (55-43=98).

Jesper Wallstedt: Made a career-high 31 saves to earn his first career home-ice win and first career shoot victory in his season debut vs. LAK (10/13).

Danila Yurov: Made his NHL debut vs. LAK (10/13), winning 6-of-8 faceoffs taken.

Tuesday, Oct. 28 vs. Winnipeg at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 4 vs. Nashville at 7 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 21 vs. Colorado at 5 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 24 vs. Florida at 8 p.m.

The Wild announced former players Pierre-Marc Bouchard, Marian Gaborik, Brian Rolston and Stephane Veilleux will attend the team's first 25th anniversary celebration night on Tuesday, October 28 when it hosts the Winnipeg Jets at 7:00 p.m. Fans who purchase a special 25th Anniversary Bobblehead ticket will receive a Marian Gaborik bobblehead and have the opportunity to get an autographs from Bouchard, Gaborik, Rolston or Veilleux at a special pre-game signing.

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

TEAM NOTES



GETTING SHOTS UP

- The Wild ranks T-3rd with 35.0 shots/game this season.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, NHL teams are 250-159-43 (.601) when recording 35-plus shots on goal in a game.
- Minnesota leads the NHL by averaging 12.25 first-period shots on goal per game and 12.5 third-period shots on goal per game.

ON THE POWER PLAY

- Minnesota has scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season.
- The Wild leads the NHL in power-play percentage (47.6) and total power-play goals (10 goals, 21 power-play opportunities), each the highest marks in team history through a season's first four games.
- Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) have recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games. Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities has recorded a higher power-play percentage.
- The Wild has opened the season by scoring a power-play goal in four consecutive games, achieving the feat for the sixth time in franchise history. The run trails only the 2010-11 season (six-game streak) and the 2022-23 season (five-game streak) for the longest season-opening runs in franchise history.

ROAD DAWGS

- Recorded a 23-13-5 record on the road last season, establishing a franchise record with 51 road points.
- Ranked fourth in the NHL in road points, road point percentage (.622) and T-4th in road wins.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild was 16-4-2 last season (.773) when scoring first in a road game, the seventh-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.

YOUNG GUNS

- The Wild ranks T-5th in the NHL with 17 points (6-11=17) scored by players 25 years old or younger.
- Per NHL Stats, 33 percent of NHL players on opening-day rosters were 25 years old or younger (239 of 726).

MAGIC NUMBERS

- The Wild went 41-9-5 (.791) when scoring two-plus goals in regulation last season, the third-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- The Wild went 33-2-4 (.897) when allowing two or fewer goals in regulation last season, T-9th best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

- The Wild owned 21 comeback wins (trailed at any point) last season, T-5th most in the NHL.
- The Wild posted seven wins last season in games where it has trailed by two or more goals, fourth-most in the NHL. Minnesota owned a .214 point percentage (7-27-1) in games where it trailed by two-plus goals, T-4th best point percentage in the NHL.
- Minnesota owned a 9-30-5 (.261) record when trailing at any point in the third period. It's .261 point percentage in such situations ranked sixth-highest in the NHL.



KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** ranks first in the NHL in PPP (4-3=7), T-1st in points (4-5=9) and T-3rd in goals and shots (19).
- Has tied Mikko Koivu (1-8=9 in 2008-09) for most points in Wild history through a season's first four games.
- Owns an active four-game point streak. Per #NHL Stats, is the fifth NHL player in the last 30 years to record a season-opening point streak of four-plus games in three or more consecutive seasons.
- With a two PPP (1-1=2) at DAL (10/14), reached 138 career power-play points (66-72=138) and tied Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.
- Currently ranks second in franchise history with 66 career PPG (Parise, 69).
- Currently at 395 career points (189-206=395), five shy of tying Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth in franchise history.
- Posted a career-high 11 shots on goal vs. CBJ (10/11), tying the franchise single-game record (Parise, 1/17/19 vs. ANA; Rolston, 10/7/06 vs. ANA).
- Along with Matt Boldy, became the first players in Minnesota history to open a season with consecutive three-plus point games (10/9-10/11).
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) in the season opener at STL (10/9), becoming the second player in franchise history to achieve the feat (Bouchard, 0-3=3, 10/5/05).
- Has now registered a point in six consecutive season openers (1-9=10), the longest streak in Wild history.
- Moved his career assist total to 204 at STL (10/9), passing Andrew Brunnette and Jonas Brodin (202 each) for eighth in franchise history.
- Currently with 41 career multi-assist games, needs one more to tie
 Mats Zuccarello (42) for third-most in franchise history.
- Ranked second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-31=56) and fourth in assists (31) in 2024-25.
- Recorded his 50th point of the season with a goal vs. CHI (12/23/25), established a new franchise mark for fewest games to 50 points in a season (34 GP), besting his previous mark set in 2021-22 (38 GP).
- Played in his 300th career game vs. CHI (11/29), tallying an assist to move his career point total to 366 (174-191=366). The only active players with more points through 300 games include: Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384) and Evgeni Malkin (371). Only Ovechkin (204) and Auston Matthews (176) had more goals through 300 games among active skaters.
- Among players selected in the fifth round of the NHL Draft or later, only four skaters have tallied as many goals as Kaprizov at the time of their 300th career contest: Brett Hull (226), Pavel Bure (187), Luc Robitaille (185) and Alexander Mogilny (176).

HE'S GOING STREAKING

 Kaprizov notched a point in 16-of-20 road games played in 2024-25 (11-20=31), including a franchise-record 11-game road point streak (8-16=24) from 10/15 - 11/21.

- Kaprizov posted a multi-point streak of eight games on the road (6-14=20) from 10/15 11/8/25, joining Steven Stamkos (8 GP in 2017-18) and Roman Josi (8 GP in 2021-22) as the only active players to achieve the mark.
- Kaprizov recorded seven-game multi-point and assist streaks (6-11=17) from 10/15 - 11/1/25.
- His streak of seven consecutive games with multiple points set a franchise record and T-4th longest in the NHL since the 2000-01 season.

- Scored a power-play goal vs. LAK (10/13) to reach 133 career powerplay
 points (35-98=133) and tie Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for
 sixth-most in Wild history Marco Rossi notched his first career shootout
 goal vs. LAK (10/13), the game winner.
- Has played in 171 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players and T-30th among active NHL players.
- Opened the season with two points (1-1=2) at STL (10/9).
- Led the team in PPG (seven), ranked second in assists (36) and points (24-36=60) and third in goals (24) last season.
- Reached 101 career points with two assists (0-2=2) vs. SJS (4/9/25).
- Scored the GWG in overtime vs. DAL (4/6/25), his third GWG of the 2024-25 season.
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28/25) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5, 2025.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- Matt Boldy ranks second in NHL with six PPP (3-3=6) and second on team and T-3rd in NHL with eight points (4-4=8).
- Owns an active four-game goal streak, the first player in franchise history to achieve the feat in a season's first four games.
- Is tied for the third-most points in Wild history through the first four games of a season.
- Recorded a career-high 10 shots on goal at DAL (10/14), tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in franchise history.
- Along with Kirill Kaprizov, became the first players in Minnesota history to open a season with consecutive three-plus point games.
- Recorded the 20th three-point game (1-2=3) of his career vs. CBJ (10/11), one shy of tying Mats Zuccarello (21) for fourth in franchise history.
