

# BOB MURRAY EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT/GENERAL MANAGER & INTERIM HEAD COACH

Bob Murray completed his 44th consecutive year in the National Hockey League in 2018-19, his 12th as Executive Vice President and General Manager of the Anaheim Ducks. Murray won the NHL General Manager of the Year award in 2013-14 and has been a finalist for the honor three times. He also served as an Assistant General Manager for Team Canada during the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

Signed by Anaheim to a two-year contract extension through the 2021-22 NHL season on Dec. 8, 2018, Murray has posted a 523-385-131 record in 1,039 NHL games as General Manager for Anaheim and Chicago. He is the longest serving and winningest GM in club history with a 459-290-102 record in 851 games. As a player, Murray appeared in 1,008 NHL games (all with Chicago), scoring 132-382=514 points. He is the fifth person in NHL history to both play and manage (GM) 1,000 career regular season NHL games.

Murray assumed interim head coach duties with Anaheim on Feb. 10, 2019 for the remainder of the 2018-19 regular season. He made his NHL coaching debut on Feb. 13 vs. Vancouver, earning a 1-0 victory. Murray led the Ducks to a 14-11-1 record for 29 points, including a 5-1-1 record in the final seven games. Anaheim also went 11-5-1 for 23 points in its remaining 17 games, which ranked tied for third among NHL teams in points during that stretch.

Under Murray's guidance, the Ducks have qualified for the playoffs six of the last seven years, second only to Pittsburgh (7). In 2017-18, Anaheim went 44-25-13 for 101 points, tied for fourth in the West and tied for 8th in the NHL, despite having 318 man games lost due to injury. The 2016-17 Ducks were the seventh different team in NHL history to win five consecutive division titles and the only team to win the Pacific Division five consecutive years since its creation in 1993-94. Anaheim defeated Calgary and Edmonton in the first two rounds of the Stanley Cup Playoffs before falling to Nashville in the Conference Final. It was Anaheim's fourth trip to the Conference Final since Murray joined the team in 2006 (only Chicago, 5, and Pittsburgh, 4, have made as many appearances).

In 2014-15, Anaheim finished with the best record in the Western Conference (51-24-7, 109 points), becoming the first team since 2011-12 (Vancouver) to post consecutive 50+ win seasons. Anaheim defeated Winnipeg and Calgary in the first two rounds of the postseason before falling in the Conference Final to Chicago (seven games). The 2013-14 team finished with a record of 54-20-8, the best mark in franchise history. Anaheim posted the top record in the Western Conference for the first time in club history that season, setting season records for standings points (116), wins (54) and win/points percentage (.707), while also leading the league in goals (263). The 2012-13 club finished the regular season with the third-best record in the NHL (30-12-6, second in the West).

Murray was named to his current position Nov. 12, 2008 after spending the previous three-plus seasons as the club's Senior Vice President of Hockey Operations. In that role, much of Murray's work behind the scenes led directly to many successful trades and other player transactions by Anaheim. During that three-year period, the Ducks won a Stanley Cup (2007), a Pacific Division title (2007), and qualified for the playoffs each season. Murray was the General Manager of the Portland Pirates (Anaheim's AHL affiliate) from 2005-06 through 2007-08. The Pirates went to the Conference Finals twice (2006 & 2008), appearing in six playoff rounds. Between 2005 and 2008 (three seasons), Anaheim and Portland combined to win 10 and appear in 14 playoff rounds, both the most of any organization in hockey.

Prior to joining the Ducks in July 2005, Murray worked as a professional scout with the Vancouver Canucks from 1999-05. Murray's scouting expertise helped to build teams that recorded 100+ point seasons two years in a row (2002-03 and 2003-04) and advanced to the Stanley Cup Playoffs four seasons in a row (2001-04). Before his stint in Vancouver, he served as a Scouting Consultant for Anaheim during the 1998-99 season.

Murray was a member of the Chicago Blackhawks organization for 25 years, serving as General Manager from 1997-99. He was named the sixth General Manager in team history July 3, 1997. He was promoted to the post after serving as Assistant General Manager under Bob Pulford for two seasons. Before joining upper-management, Murray was named Director of Player Personnel in 1991 and was largely responsible for the club's NHL Entry Draft selections over eight seasons.

Drafted by the Blackhawks in 1974, Murray spent his entire 1,008-game, 15-year career in a Chicago uniform. He became just the fourth player in Blackhawks history to reach the 1,000-game plateau in 1989-90. In addition, he became the first defenseman in club history to appear in 100 postseason contests, reaching the mark during the 1990 Stanley Cup Playoffs. In all, Murray scored 132-382=514 points and currently ranks third in all-time points among Blackhawks defensemen (17th overall in club history). He was named to both the 1981 and 1983 NHL All-Star Games. Murray retired at the conclusion of the 1989-90 season. Known for his work ethic, intelligence and determination as a player, Murray remained with the organization as a professional scout following his retirement in 1990.

Bob and his wife, Betsy, have four children: Kevin, Amanda, Andrew and Katie; and four grandchildren: Mikayla, Aisley, Lily and Kaden.

# MARK MORRISON ASSISTANT COACH

Mark Morrison completed his second season as an assistant coach for the Ducks in 2018-19.

A native of Prince George, British Columbia, Morrison was previously with the Winnipeg Jets organization as an assistant coach for the AHL Manitoba Moose (2015-17) and St. John's IceCaps (2011-15).

Prior to St. John's, Morrison served as Head Coach and General Manager of the Victoria Salmon Kings of the ECHL, where he spent four years. He also coached and played with the Fife Flyers of the British National League, winning Coach of the Year honors three times.

Morrison played 10 NHL games with the New York Rangers from 1981-84, won the Adams Cup with the CHL's Tulsa Oilers and was named Most Sportsmanlike Player in the 1980-81 Memorial Cup. He also represented Canada at the World Junior Championships in 1982 (gold medal) and 1983.

Morrison has three children: son, Lance, and daughters, Nicole and Tara.



# MARTY WILFORD ASSISTANT COACH

The 2018-19 campaign marked Marty Wilford's first season as an assistant coach with the Ducks and his eighth season overall in the Anaheim organization. Wilford spent the previous seven seasons as an assistant coach with Anaheim's AHL affiliate in San Diego (2015-18), Norfolk (2012-15) and Syracuse (2011-12).

Wilford helped the Gulls to a 118-71-10-5 record in his three seasons in San Diego, including an appearance in the Pacific Division Finals in 2016 and 2017. From 2012-15, Wilford was part of a Norfolk coaching staff that led the Admirals to a 104-99-25 record and a win over top-seeded Manchester in the opening round of the 2014 Calder Cup Playoffs. Wilford made his professional coaching debut in 2011-12 at Syracuse, which went 37-29-10 and earned a berth in the 2012 Calder Cup Playoffs.

Originally selected by Chicago in the sixth round (149th overall) of the 1995 NHL Draft, Wilford collected 47-228=275 points with 573 PIM as a defenseman in 539 career AHL games from 2000-07. He ranked as Norfolk's all-time leading scorer among defensemen with 32-141=173 points in 318 games from 2000-05.

Wilford began his professional career in the International Hockey League, scoring 3-29=32 points in 186 games between 1997-00. He spent his final four seasons in Europe with Hamburg and Iserlong (Germany), and Fassa HC (Italy), notching 19-121=140 points in 146 contests. Wilford and his wife, Shelly, have three children: Emma, Grayce and Nash.



# RICH PRESTON ASSISTANT COACH

Rich Preston finished his fourth season as an assistant coach for the Anaheim Ducks in 2018-19. Since joining the organization in 2015-16, Preston has helped Anaheim to a 171-110-47 record and 389 points.

A native of Regina, Saskatchewan, Preston previously served as an NHL assistant coach with Chicago (1991-95), Calgary (1997-00 & 2003-09), and San Jose (2000-03). He was the Head Coach of his hometown Regina Pats (WHL) from 1995-97 and the General Manager/Head Coach of Lethbridge (WHL) from 2009-13. With the Pats, Preston helped the team to a franchise-record 27-game home undefeated streak during the 1996-97 season.

Preston played in the NHL from 1979-87, appearing with the Chicago Blackhawks and New Jersey Devils. He appeared in 580 NHL games, scoring 127-164=291 points. He also played in the World Hockey Association, winning championships with the Houston Aeros (1974-75) and Winnipeg Jets (1978-79). Preston was also named the 1979 WHA Playoff MVP with the Jets and collected 133-152=285 points in 388 career WHA games.

Preston and his wife, Laura, have three boys, Troy, Lucas and Thomas, and reside in Calgary.

# SUDARSHAN MAHARAJ

Sudarshan "Sudsie" Maharaj (Sud-DARE-shun MAH-ha-raj) concluded his third season as Goaltending Coach for the Anaheim Ducks in 2018-19. Under Maharaj's watch, the Ducks established a franchise-record with a .923 SV%, which co-led all NHL teams in 2017-18. In addition, both Ryan Miller (.928) and John Gibson (.926) surpassed the individual single-season franchise record for SV% (.924, Jonas Hiller in 2010-11, Gibson in 2016-17) two seasons ago.

Maharaj joined the Ducks organization prior to the 2013-14 season in a consultant role focused on the club's AHL affiliate in Norfolk, VA. Maharaj continued in the role throughout the team's transition to San Diego for the 2015-16 season, where he helped Gulls goaltenders to a 39-23-8 record, 2.87 GAA, .906 SV% and a berth in the Calder Cup Playoffs.

A native of Trinidad, Maharaj spent eight seasons with the New York Islanders from 2003-06 (goaltending coach) and 2009-12 (goaltending consultant). He also helped develop the National Goaltending Development Program for Hockey Canada (2005-07) and served as goaltending consultant for the Korean national hockey team in preparation for the 2018 Olympic Winter Games. Maharaj continues to help develop young goaltenders in the Korean national team system.

Raised in Toronto from the age of six, Maharaj was a member of the 1984-85 National Hockey Championship York University team and played six seasons of prohockey in Sweden.

Sudarshan and his wife, Yvonne, have two daughters, Alexandra (17) and Katherine (14).



# LARRY BARRON SKATING AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT COACH

The 2018-19 campaign marked Larry Barron's first season as Skating and Skills Development Coach for the Anaheim Ducks. Prior to assuming his current role, Barron served as a skating consultant for the Ducks from 2013-18.

A native of Toronto, Ontario, Barron coached at the U-16 and U-18 levels from 2012-16, including Jr. Ducks 18AAA teams, and made two national championship appearances as head coach during that time.

With a 25-year background in youth hockey, Barron also owns Barron Hockey Academy in Lake Forest, CA, which offers on-ice development and team training for local players ranging from amateur to professional backgrounds.

Barron resides in Ladera Ranch with his wife, Michelle, and their three children: Dillon (9), Peyton (8) and Brock (6).




# JOE **PISCOTTY** Video coach


Joe Piscotty finished his eighth season as Video Coach in 2018-19, his ninth overall season with the organization. Piscotty originally joined the Ducks prior to the 2010-11 season as a video scouting analyst, assisting Hockey Operations with special projects before moving to his current role on Dec. 2, 2011.

Piscotty worked with the University of Michigan's hockey team from 2006-08, serving as a graduate student manager under Head Coach Red Berenson. He was with the Wolverines when the club advanced to the Frozen Four in 2008. While at Michigan, Piscotty also earned a Master's in Sports Management.

In addition, Piscotty served as a hockey operations assistant for the University of Denver's men's squad from 2008-10. He completed his time at Denver with a Master's degree in Business Administration (MBA). A native of Huntington Beach, Piscotty earned his Bachelor's degree in Business Administration from the University of Las Vegas, Nevada in 2006.

Joe and his wife, Carrie, reside in Huntington Beach with daughters, Kadence and Lea.



### 2018-19 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:

- Appeared in his ninth NHL season with Anaheim, collecting 5-18=23 points in 59 games.
- Ranked second among team defensemen in TOI (23:22) and shifts-per-game (29.3), and tied for second
  in goals...also finished third among Anaheim blueliners in blocked shots (91) and takeaways (24).
- Surpassed Scott Niedermayer (264) to become the all-time franchise leader in points among defensemen in an 8-2 win Mar. 8 vs. MTL...along with his 265th career point that night, also passed Paul Kariya (606) for sole possession of fifth place on the all-time franchise games played list.
- Scored his 13th career GWG to match Scott Niedermayer (13) for the all-time franchise lead in GWG among defensemen Mar. 3 vs. COL...Fowler's 57th career goal that day also moved him past Francois Beauchemin for sole possession of second on the all-time franchise goals list for defensemen.
- Passed Scott Niedermayer (204) with his 205th career NHL assist Feb. 17 vs. WSH to become the
  franchise's all-time leader in assists among defensemen...two games earlier Feb. 13 vs. VAN, surpassed
  Ruslan Salei (594) for the all-time franchise lead in games played among defensemen.
- Became the first Anaheim defenseman to 600 career games Feb. 23 @ EDM...also passed Steve
   Rucchin (616) for sole possession of fourth on the all-time franchise games played list Mar. 29 @ CGY.
- Became the seventh defenseman in NHL history to record three goals, including an overtime winner
  on Nov. 4 vs. CBJ...the last three such instances were accomplished by the Ducks (Lubomir Visnovsky
  Mar. 4, 2011 vs. DAL and Hampus Lindholm Dec. 21, 2017 @ NYI)...no other NHL team has had a
  defenseman accomplish the feat since Dec. 2003 (MTL's Sheldon Souray).

- Collected his 900th and 901st career NHL points (0-2=2) with a career-tying +4 rating in 18:10 TOI, Dec. 12
   vs. DAL...joined Teemu Selanne as the only two players in franchise history to record 900 points and became the eighth active skater to reach the milestone.
- Extended his own all-time franchise lead with his ninth OT goal, Nov. 30 @ CAR...marked his 50th career GWG in a 2-1 victory.
- Missed 15 games due to injury in 2018-19.



### 2018-19 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:

- Appeared in his fifth NHL season with Anaheim...posted a 26-22-8 record with two shutouts, a 2.84 GAA and .917 SV% in 58 games...fell two appearances shy of matching his single-season career best in games played.
- Participated in the 2019 NHL All Star Game, becoming the first Anaheim goalie to appear twice.
- Led the NHL in shorthanded saves (285), ranked sixth in saves (1,685) and shots against (1,838), and 10th in appearances...also tied for ninth in most appearances with two goals-or-less allowed (29) during the 2018-19 campaign.
- Ranked tied for fourth among goaltenders in March wins (8-3-0),
- Tied franchise records in most saves and shots faced in overtime (stopped all 10 shots), which was
  originally set by Guy Hebert on Feb. 3, 2000 @ PHI (10-of-10), Nov. 12 vs. NSH.

### 2018-19 **SEASON IN REVIEW**

**THE 2018-19 SEASON:** The Ducks finished the season with a 35-37-10 record for 80 points...Anaheim went 5-1-1 in its last seven games, earning points in six of those seven contests (11 pts.)...only Columbus (6-1-0) had a better record in its final seven games of 2018-19...Anaheim also went 11-5-1 for 23 points in its last 17 games, which ranked tied for third among NHL teams in points during that stretch...the Ducks scored 57 goals in those final 17 games (tied for fifth in the NHL) and went 11-for-43 on the PP (25.6%, fourth in NHL).

**YOUTHFUL IMPACT:** Young players made an impact at both the start and at the end of the season...**Troy Terry** co-led NHL rookies in points (2-8=10) and assists from Mar. 5 until the night he was injured on Mar. 29...Terry was named the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending Mar. 10 after collecting 2-5=7 with a +5 rating in four games...Terry finished the week ranked third among NHL leaders in points, tied for third in assists, and tied for second in plus/minus.

Sam Steel led NHL rookies in goals (5-1=6) from the date of his Mar. 26 hat trick through the end of the regular season (see hat trick note below).

Max Comtois became the first Ducks player to score in his first two career NHL games from the start of a season and also became the second rookie in franchise history to record at least one point in each of his first three career NHL games...Comtois' goal 49 seconds into the season-opening game Oct. 3 at San Jose was the fastest to start an NHL career since 1989, when Buffalo's Alexander Mogilny scored 20 seconds into the first period Oct. 5, 1989 vs. Quebec...Comtois' goal, four seconds into his first shift, was the sixth-fastest goal to open an NHL career in NHL modern-era history (since 1943-44).

Six rookies made their NHL debuts with Anaheim in 2018-19, including Sam Steel, Max Comtois, Max Jones, Josh Mahura, Isac Lundestrom and Kiefer Sherwood.

During the 2018-19 NHL season, the Ducks led the NHL in games played by drafted defensemen (418)...Anaheim also ranked second in most rookies (16), games played by rookies (325) and games played by defensemen aged 27-or-younger (449).

HISTORIC HAT TRICK: Sam Steel (21 years, 51 days) became the youngest Ducks player in club history to record a hat trick in Anaheim's 5-4 win on Mar. 26 at Vancouver...Bobby Ryan held the previous mark (21 years, 297 days) as the only other Ducks rookie to record a hat trick, scoring three times on Jan. 8, 2009 at Los Angeles...the hat trick came in Steel's 18th career game, the fastest in Ducks history from the start of his career...the last two NHL players to score a hat trick as quickly were Patrik Laine (fourth and 14th game) and Auston Matthews (four goals in first game), who each did so in Oct/Nov, 2016...Steel was also the third rookie in NHL history to score a regular-season hat trick that included a penalty-shot goal...Steel joined Eric Lindros of Philadelphia (Dec. 26, 1992 vs. Winnipeg) and Teemu Selanne of Winnipeg (Mar. 9, 1993 vs. Tampa Bay)...Steel completed the hat trick by scoring on his first career penalty shot attempt, becoming the youngest player in franchise history to score such a goal...Ondrej Kase was previously the youngest player at 21 years and 350 days when he scored on a penalty shot vs Philadelphia on Oct. 24, 2017...Steel also joined Patrik Laine of Winnipeg (three times) and Elias Pettersson of Vancouver as the only players aged 21 years-or-younger to score three-or-more goals in a game in 2018-19...three unassisted goals by rookies for the same team (Steel, 2, and Kiefer Sherwood) in the same game had not happened in the NHL since Mar. 13, 1927 when four rookies scored unassisted goals for the Blackhawks in a 4-0 win over the Bruins...in addition, the 2018-19 campaign is the first in franchise history to feature eight different rookies score their first career goal in the same season, one more than the previous benchmark set in 1997-98.

**SIGNED & DELIVERED:** Jakob Silfverberg averaged over a point-per-game after he signed his five-year contract extension Mar. 2...in his final 17 games, Silfverberg recorded 8-11=19 points with a +10 rating to help the Ducks to a 11-5-1 record...Silfverberg finished the season leading the Ducks with a career-high 24 goals and ranked tied for second in points (24-19=43)...on Mar. 12 vs. Nashville, Silfverberg scored his 103rd career goal as a Duck to surpass Andrew Cogliano (102) for sole possession of eighth on the all-time franchise goals list.

FRANCHISE LEADERS: Ryan Getzlaf (984) became the franchise's all-time leader in games played Feb. 9 at Philadelphia, surpassing Teemu Selanne (966) with his 967th career appearance...of his 984 career games, Getzlaf has served 621 of those as Anaheim captain, the most in franchise history...Corey Perry (988) matched Getzlaf for the all-time franchise lead in games played Mar. 1 vs. Vegas and finished the regular season as the all-time franchise leader...Getzlaf finished the season leading the Ducks in points (14-34=48) and assists.

NATURAL 3: Rickard Rakell scored three consecutive goals in the second period to lead the Ducks to a 5-1 win over the Edmonton Oilers Mar. 30 at Rogers Place...Rakell's three goals marked the eighth natural hat trick in club history (last: Corey Perry Jan. 14, 2015 vs. Toronto) and the sixth time in club history a player had scored three goals in a single period...the previous Ducks player to score three goals in a single period (club record) was Ryan Getzlaf Nov. 8, 2013 vs. Buffalo (first period)...Rakell joined Andrew Cogliano as the only players in club history to record a natural hat trick in a single period (Cogliano did so Jan. 31, 2012 at Phoenix, second period)...from Mar. 1 through the end of the regular season, Rakell co-led the NHL in PPG (4).

**NET PRESENCE: John Gibson** finished the season with a 26-22-8 record, two shutouts, a 2.84 GAA and .917 SV% in 58 games...Gibson led the NHL in shorthanded saves (285), ranked sixth in saves (1,685) and shots against (1,838), and 10th in appearances...Gibson, who was also tied for fourth among goaltenders in March wins (8-3-0), tied for ninth in most appearances with two goals-or-less allowed (29) during the 2018-19 campaign...Gibson collected his 100th career NHL win in Anaheim's 4-3 victory over Vancouver Nov. 21 to become the fourth Ducks goaltender to reach the milestone, joining Jean-Sebastien Giguere (206), Guy Hebert (173) and Jonas Hiller (162)...Gibson also became the fastest to 100 wins with Anaheim in 196 games, besting Hiller (214 games), Giguere (248) and Hebert (254).

RECORD-SETTING PERFORMANCE: Ryan Miller surpassed John Vanbiesbrouck (374) Feb. 17 vs. Washington for the all-time lead among U.S.-born goaltenders in wins (375)...Vanbiesbrouck had been the all-time leader since Jan. 6, 2000, when he passed Tom Barrasso with his 349th career win with the Flyers over the NY Islanders...both goalies remained active yet Vanbiesbrouck did not relinquish the lead until Miller tied him Dec. 2, 2018... Miller, who also ranks 16th on the all-time wins list for NHL goaltenders, owns a 378-275-81 record with 44 shutouts, a 2.61 GAA and .915 SV% in 757 career NHL games...on Feb. 19 at Minnesota, Miller stopped all 31 shots to post his 44th career shutout, second among U.S.-born goaltenders all-time... that night Miller also became the fourth goaltender since 2013-14 to record a shutout at the age of 38 or older...below is a list of the top five U.S.-born goaltenders in all-time wins.

MOVIN' ON UP: Cam Fowler surpassed Scott Niedermayer (264) to become the all-time franchise leader in points among defensemen in an 8-2 win over Montreal Mar. 8...along with his 265th career point, Fowler passed Paul Kariya (606) for sole possession of fifth place on the all-time franchise games played list...Fowler reached or tied additional milestones in 2018-19...he scored his 13th career GWG to match Scott Niedermayer (13) for the all-time franchise lead in GWG among defensemen Mar. 3 vs. Colorado...Fowler's 57th career goal that day also moved him past Francois Beauchemin for sole possession of second on the all-time franchise goals list for defensemen...Fowler became the franchise's all-time leader in assists among defensemen by surpassing Scott Niedermayer (204) with his 205th career NHL assist on Feb. 17 vs. Washington...two games earlier on Feb. 13 vs. Vancouver, Fowler surpassed Ruslan Salei (594) for the all-time franchise lead in games played among defensemen...Fowler became the first Anaheim defenseman to 600 career games Feb. 23 at Edmonton, and also surpassed Steve Rucchin (616) for sole possession of fourth on the all-time franchise games played list Mar. 29 at Calgary.

**1,000:** Ryan Kesler reached the 1,000-game milestone Mar. 5 in Arizona, becoming one of 25 active skaters and the 333rd player in NHL history to reach the milestone...Kesler became the 49th American player to appear in 1,000 games and the third such player to hit the milestone in an Anaheim sweater...Kesler also became the 11th player all-time to appear in his 1,000th game while a member of the Ducks...Kesler has collected 258-315=573 points in 1,001 career NHL games with Anaheim and Vancouver.

THE COMEBACK: The Ducks rallied from a 5-1 deficit to defeat the Washington Capitals, 6-5, Dec. 2 at Capital One Arena...the comeback marked the first time in club history the Ducks rallied from four goals down to win on the road (and first such comeback win in regulation)...the only other instance came at home in overtime, when Anaheim rallied from 4-0 down to beat Winnipeg 5-4 (Mar. 31, 2014)...the Ducks became the first road team to accomplish the feat in regulation since Colorado Mar. 9, 1999 at Florida, and the first team to win in regulation after trailing by four since the Penguins did so against Atlanta Oct. 27, 2005...the four-goal comeback win also marked the first time in which a team (home or road) overcame such a deficit against a defending Stanley Cup Champion...with 19 saves in relief and the victory, Ryan Miller tied John Vanbiesbrouck (374) for the all-time lead among U.S.-born goaltenders in wins...Pontus Aberg led Anaheim with two goals and three points (2-1=3), while the Ducks also received goals from Ryan Getzlaf, Andrew Cogliano, Hampus Lindholm and Rickard Rakell.


