| The Tampa Bay Lightning fell 5-2 to the Ottawa Senators on Sunday night at Canadian Tire Center.  |

| The Lightning dropped to 1-2-0 as they dropped both games in their first back-to-back set this season.  |
| The Lightning are now 6-4-0 in their last 10 meetings with the Senators and have lost four consecutive games at Ottawa while allowing 23 goals during that span.  |
| The Bolts were outshot 38-24, including a 17-3 shot deficit in the first period and a 15-10 disadvantage in the second period.  |
| Anthony Cirelli and Nikita Kucherov each took four shots on goal to pace Lightning skaters.   |
| The Lightning are 0-2-0 this season when they allow the game-opening goal and are when they are outshot by their opponent.  |
| Tanner Jeannot delivered a game-high four hits. Jeannot and Erik Cernak are tied for the team lead in hits this season with eight each.   |
| Mikhail Sergachev blocked three shots to lead all Lightning skaters.  |
| Tampa Bay won 32/59 (54%) of the faceoffs and were led at the dot by Luke Glendening who won 9/13 (69%) of his draws.   |
| Victor Hedman (1-4—5 in 3 GP) recorded an assist and has now collected at least five points through the first three games of a season for the third time his career (also 3-4—7 in 2014-15 & 0-5—5 in 2021-22). |
| Hedman has pointed in 12 of his last 17 meetings with the Senators (7-11—18).   |
| Head Coach Jon Cooper coached his 800 <sup>th</sup> NHL game.   |

| Cooper is tied with Scotty Bowman for the most wins by a coach through their first 800 games in NHL history with 481.  |

| Lightning goaltender Matt Tomkins skated in his first NHL game and recorded 33 saves on 37 shots.  |
| Tampa Bay failed to score on the power play for the first game this season. Entering the night, the Lightning ranked third in the NHL for power-play percentage (42.9) behind the Vancouver Canucks (44.4) and Toronto Maple Leafs (57.1). |
| Vladimir Tarasenko opened the scoring and gave Ottawa a 1-0 lead with a goal at 7:02 of the first period.  |
| Anthony Cirelli broke loose and netted a backhand shot in the top right corner of the net to tie the game 1-1 only 60 seconds into the second period.  |
| Cirelli tallied his first goal and second point of the season.   |
| Darren Raddysh and Tanner Jeannot each tallied their first point of the season with assists on Cirelli's goal.   |
| Brady Tkachuk gave the Senators a 2-1 lead at 8:48 of the second period, beating Tomkins from the right circle.  |
| Tanner Jeannot picked up his second point of the night and tied the game 2-2, scoring top shelf from the slot at 13:00 of the second period.   |
| Mikey Eyssimont tallied the primary assist to pick up his first point of the season.   |
| Victor Hedman notched his fifth point of the season (1-4—5 pts.) with the secondary assist on Jeannot's game-tying goal.   |
| Former Bolt Mathieu Joseph scored with 59 seconds left in the second period to give the Senators a 3-2 lead heading into the third period.   |
| Brady Tkachuk scored his second goal of the game at 12:53 of the third period to extend Ottawa's lead to 4-2.  |
| Tim Stutzle scored an empty net goal at 17:17 of the third period to make the score 5-2 Senators.  |
