

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 11, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. LOS ANGELES KINGS [1]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames began a back-to-back set last night by welcoming the Los Angeles Kings to the Scotiabank Saddledome. The Flames would outshoot the Kings 10-7 in the opening 20, but both goalies stood tall to keep the contest scoreless through 20. Midway through the second, Mikael Backlund would bury his fourth of the season to give the Flames a 1-0 lead. 40 seconds later, Andrei Kuzmenko would spring Jonathan Huberdeau on a partial break, and the Saint-Jerome, QC native would slide home his sixth of the season to double the Flames advantage through 40. In the third, the Kings would draw within one late, but an empty netter from Kevin Rooney would seal it as the Flames knocked off the Kings 3-1.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of four meetings this season between the Flames and Canucks. Calgary knocked off Vancouver 6-5 in overtime with a come-from-behind effort in their season-opening matchup on October 9th.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 3-2-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 4-4-1 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames opened their 2024-25 campaign on October 9th in Vancouver. The Flames trailed 3-0 midway through the first before Anthony Mantha found himself on a shorthanded breakaway and converted to score his first as a Flame and get Calgary on the board. Vancouver would add one more later in the first, and the visitors skated into the first intermission down 4-1. Rasmus Andersson would draw the Flames within two late in the second with a seeing eye shot as the score read 4-2 Canucks through 40. In the final stanza, the Flames continued to chip away at the Canucks lead with Martin Pospisil bringing Calgary within one, followed by a MacKenzie Weegar power play marker to draw the Flames level. Shortly after, Jonathan Huberdeau deposited a loose puck into the net to give the Flames their first lead of the season. The Canucks found an equalizer with under two minutes of play in regulation, and this game was headed to overtime. In the extra frame, Connor Zary made a slick move around Filip Hronek, drove the net, and slid home the winner as Calgary rallied to knock off Vancouver 6-5.

MATT SCORE-ONATO:

With his assist last night, Matt Coronato extended his point streak to a career-best four games with three goals and two assists since November 5th. Coronato has now scored five goals and registered seven points on the season, while his +7 rating is tied with J.J. Moser for the highest among all skaters drafted in 2021 through the 2024-25 campaign thus far.

HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

Dustin Wolf turned aside 28 of the 29 shots he faced last night to earn his fifth win of the season. The 23-year-old is the youngest goalie in the NHL to record at least five wins so far this season, and chipped in with a helper on Monday night for his first NHL assist.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his assist last night against Los Angeles, Mikael Backlund recorded his 336th career-assist to tie Paul Reinhart and Guy Chouinard for the seventh-most in Flames franchise history. Backlund also scored to record his 152nd even-strength goal on Monday, one away from tying Lanny McDonald for the sixth-most in franchise history. The only players to score more are Jarome Iginla (351), Theoren Fleury (229), Gary Roberts (199), Joe Nieuwendyk (173) and Johnny Gaudreau (164).

BACK-TO-BACKS:

Tonight marks the Flames second back-to-back set of the 2024-25 season following last night's 3-1 victory over the Los Angeles Kings. Calgary swept their first back-to-back scenario with wins over the Philadelphia Flyers on October 12th and Edmonton on October 13th. The Flames will face back-to-back sets 10 more times this season with their next pair coming later this month when they face Columbus on November 29th before travelling to Pittsburgh to face the Penguins on November 30th.

QUICK STRIKES:

The Flames scored twice in 36 seconds last night against Los Angeles courtesy of Mikael Backlund and Jonathan Huberdeau. Calgary has now tallied twice in a span of 40 seconds or less on two different occasions this season (Blake Coleman, Jonathan Huberdeau 0:28 on Nov. 1). The most by any team this season is shared by the Bruins and Golden Knights (each 4x).

HUBY DOO:



With his assist on Saturday afternoon, Jonathan Huberdeau recorded his 499th career helper, one shy of reaching 500 NHL assists. Huberdeau is looking to join Nikita Kucherov and Johnny Gaudreau as the third skater from the 2011 NHL draft to reach 500 NHL assists and become the 25th active skater in the NHL to reach the milestone.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Defencemen Kevin Bahl and Jake Bean recorded their first points as Flames in these clubs' first meeting.

Last night's win came in Ryan Huska's 100th game as an NHL bench boss.
