COLORADO AVALANCHE

All-Time Wild Record: 62-56-13 (35-27-5 at Grand Casino Arena, 27-29-8 at Colorado)

2025-26: Minnesota won the series-opening game, 3-2, in shootout at Grand Casino Arena (11/28) before Colorado earned a 5-1 win in St. Paul in the second meeting (12/21)...**LW Kirill Kaprizov** leads Minnesota with three points (2-1=2) in the series...**C Ryan Hartman** has two points (1-1=2)...**G Jesper Wallstedt** is 1-1-0 with a 2.91 GAA and a .927 SV% in starting both games for the Wild...**C Nathan MacKinnon** (3-1=4) and **D Cale Makar** (1-3=4) lead the Avalanche with four points each in the season series...**LW Gabriel Landeskog** (1-2=3) and **C Brock Nelson** (1-2=3) each own three points...**G Scott Wedgewood** stopped 37-of-39 shots faced for Colorado in the first game...**G Mackenzie Blackwood** saved 28-of-29 shots faced to earn the win for the Avalanche in the second game.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** leads Minnesota with 35 points (15-20=35) in 48 career games against Colorado...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns 33 points (7-26=33) in 36 matches...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** has 23 points (14-9=23) in 20 games...D **Jared Spurgeon** owns 20 points (5-15=20) in 63 games.

WILD GOALIES: F **Filip Gustavsson** is 2-7-1 with a 3.81 GAA and a .884 SV% in nine starts against Colorado...Wallstedt is 1-1-0 with a 2.91 GAA and a .927 SV% in two starts, both this season.

AVALANCHE LEADERS: MacKinnon leads the Avalanche with 67 points (26-41=67) in 53 career games against Minnesota...Landeskog owns 45 points (21-24=45) in 51 games...D **Brent Burns** has 29 points (5-17=29) in 47 games...Makar has 23 points (6-20=26) in 27 games.

AVALANCHE GOALIES: Blackwood has a 3-4-2 record with a 2.53 GAA and a .911 SV% in nine career starts vs. Minnesota...Wedgewood has a 1-1-3 record with a 2.70 GAA and a .913 SV% in six games (four starts) against the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: LW **Yakov Trenin** recorded three points (2-1=3) in 16 games with the Avalanche in 2023-24...C **Nico Sturm** collected three assists in 21 games with Colorado during the 2021-22 season and helped the Avalanche win the 2022 Stanley Cup with two assists in 13 games during the team's 2022 postseason run...Burns was selected by Minnesota in the first round (20th overall) of the 2003 NHL Draft and collected 183 points (55-128=183) and 325 PIM in 453 games with the Wild across seven seasons (2003-11)...Nelson is from Warroad...D **Sam Malinski** is from Lakeville.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota has won three of its last five meetings with Colorado, including two shootout victories...The Wild's 35 all-time home wins over Colorado is its most against any single opponent, while its 137 overall points and 62 overall wins ranks second...Minnesota's 27 all-time wins in Denver is tied for the franchise's second-highest road mark against a single opponent.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Has won five consecutive games and is 8-1-1 in its last 10 contests...At 34-14-10, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 78 points, the second-highest point total through a season's first 58 games in franchise history...Is 32-0-8 (.900) this season when allowing three or fewer goals in regulation, the only team in the NHL without a regulation loss...Has scored first in 35 games, tied for most in the NHL (Washington)...Ranks second in the NHL with seven shutouts, one shy of tying the single-season franchise record...Leads the NHL with 13 extra-time victories and T-1st with 23 extra-time games played...Ranks fifth in the NHL with 910 blocked shots...Ranks third in the NHL with 48 PPG and sixth with a 25.4 PP% (48/189).

Matt Boldy: Named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 2/5 after recording six points (3-3=6) in two contests...Owns an active six-game point streak (5-6=11)...Notched his fourth career hat trick and became the fourth different player in franchise history with a three-goal period by scoring three times in the first period at NSH (2/4)...Finished with four points (3-1=4) at NSH (2/4), tying his career high...For the season, ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 32 goals, T-4th with three SHG and T-15th with 62 points (32-30=62)...Ranks T-1st on Wild in goals, second in points and PPG (nine), third in assists, and T-3rd in GWG (three).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Currently at 596 career games played...Has scored a goal in four games during his active six-game point streak (4-4=8)...Owns 24 points (11-13=24) in his last 23 games played...Ranks third on the Wild in points (15-25=40), T-3rd in goals and fourth in assists.

Brock Faber: Owns an active four-game point streak (2-3=5)...Has 16 points (5-11=16) in 16 games played since Jan. 3...In 26 games since Dec. 14, ranks T-7th among NHL defensemen with seven goals and T-9th with 22 points (7-15=22)...Since Nov. 7, ranks T-4th among NHL defensemen with a plus-27 rating...For the season, ranks seventh among NHL defensemen in goals (13) and third among all skaters in even strength TOI/G (21:17), eighth in TOI/G (24:58) and T-10th in blocked shots (119).

Filip Gustavsson: In 23 games (22 starts) since Nov. 16, is 16-2-4 and ranks fifth in the NHL with 13 wins, T-5th with two shutouts, seventh with a .915 SV%, and eighth with a 2.38 GA (min. 13 GP)...Since Nov. 1, has appeared in 16 consecutive home games (15 starts) without a regulation loss (10-0-5), tied for the longest streak in franchise history (Dubnyk, 12-0-3, 2017-18 season)...Ranks T-5th in the NHL with three shutouts this season.

Quinn Hughes: With two assists at NSH (2/4), extended his active assist and point streaks to 10 games (2-16=18), moving past Kirill Kaprizov (nine games, 2022-23 season) for assist streak in franchise history...Can tie his career-long point streak (11 games, 11/6-11/25/23 with VAN) with a point at COL...Since his current streak began on Jan. 17, ranks second in the NHL with 16 assists and T-2nd in points (2-16=18)...Since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, he leads NHL defensemen and ranks second among all skaters with 31 assists...Per NHL Stats, is the first defenseman in NHL history to register an assist streak of 10 games in his first season with a franchise...Tallied three helpers and a career-high 33:19 TOI vs. MTL (2/2), becoming the first player in franchise history with five three-assist games in a single season in his 25th game with the team...Also reached 400 career assists vs. MTL (2/2) in his 484th career game, becoming the third-fastest defenseman in NHL history to reach the milestone (B. Orr, 437 games; P. Coffey, 464 games)...Per NHL Stats, is the second-fastest American skater in NHL history to hit the 400-assist milestone, behind only C. Janney (477 GP)...Leads NHL defensemen with 52 assists this season (fifth among all skaters) and is currently the only defenseman and one of four skaters (Draisaitl, MacKinnon, McDavid) to record 50-plus assists in each of the last five seasons...Leads NHL defensemen with 25 PPP (2-23=25) and ranks T-4th with 57 points (5-52=57) this season...Leads all NHL skaters with a 27:51 TOI/G, even strength TOI/G (23:24), and power-play TOI/G (4:21) this season...In 26 games since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, leads NHL defensemen (second among all skaters) with 31 assists and ranks T-1st (T-8th among skaters) with 34 points (3-31=34).

Marcus Johansson: Owns 198 career goals.

Kirill Kaprizov: Currently at 217 career goals, needs three goals to pass Marian Gaborik (219) for the all-time franchise record...Needs three assists to pass Pierre-Marc Bouchard (241) for fifth in franchise history...Owns an active four-game point streak (4-2=6)...With an overtime assist at NSH (2/4), recorded his ninth overtime point (4-5=9) of 2025-26 and tied Connor McDavid and Leon Draisaitl (both w/ 9 in 2024-25) for the most overtime points in a single season in NHL history...Scored his fourth OTG of the season vs. MTL (2/2), T-1st in the NHL, and now ranks T-1st in the NHL since debuting in 2020-21 with a franchise-record 14 career OTG...Ranks T-2nd in the NHL in points (7-11=18) and T-5th in goals in 10 games since Jan. 17...Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 32 goals and 13 PPG, fourth with 206 shots and seventh with 70 points (32-38=70)...Ranks first on Wild in assists, points, PPG, shots and T-1st in goals and GWG (four).

Jared Spurgeon: Scored the sixth OT goal of his career at NSH (2/4), tying Matt Dumba for second in franchise history...Owns 433 points (123-310=433), five shy of passing Marian Gaborik (219-218=437) for third in franchise history...Needs five assists to pass Ryan Suter (314) for second in franchise history.

Yakov Trenin: Leads the NHL with 286 hits, the fifth-highest single-season total in franchise history and the second-highest total in the NHL through 57 games since the 2005-06 season.

Jesper Wallstedt: Posted 39 saves at EDM (1/31), tied for the second-highest single-game total of his career and season, and tallied his first career assist, the 13th goalie in team history to do so...Is 7-2-3 with a 2.39 GAA, .919 SV% and two shutouts in 12 road starts this season...Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four shutouts and sixth with a .914 SV%.

Mats Zuccarello: Currently at 497 career assists...Needs three points to pass Ryan Suter (369) for sixth in franchise history.

WILD OLYMPIC RECAP

10 players and six staff members represented the Minnesota Wild organization at the 2026 Milan-Cortina Winter Olympic Games.

Matt Boldy collected four points (2-2=4), averaged 16:35 in TOI/game and ranked second on the team with 21 shots on goal in six games to help the United States win the Gold Medal with a 2-1 overtime victory vs. Canada... Boldy scored the fastest goal by any team to start a gold medal game in an Olympic Games with NHL players, ahead of Team USA's Tony Amonte (8:49 in 2002 GMG).

Brock Faber tallied two points (1-1=2), a plus-seven rating and skated 18:00 in TOI/game in six games to help the United States win the Gold Medal... He ranked T-6th in plus/minus rating in the tournament.

Quinn Hughes led the United States in scoring with eight points (1-7=8) and in TOI/game (23:31) and recorded 15 shots on goal to help the United States win the Gold Medal... He led tournament defensemen and ranked T-4th overall in Olympic scoring... Hughes scored a point in all six games to establish the longest scoring streak in a single Olympics featuring NHL players by an American player... His seven assists established a new mark for the most assists by an American in a single Olympic tournament with NHL players... Hughes tied the record for most points by a defenseman in a single Olympic Games with NHL players (Erik Karlsson 2014 w/SWE) and Brian Rafalski (2010 w/USA).

Joel Eriksson Ek tallied two points (1-1=2), averaged 19:15 in TOI/game and led the team with 23 shots on goal in five games as Sweden lost to the United States, 3-2 in overtime, in the quarterfinals... He ranked T-5th in the tournament in shots on goal.

Filip Gustavsson went 1-1-0 with a 2.55 GAA and a .889 SV% in two starts for Sweden.

Marcus Johansson skated in two games for Sweden.

Jesper Wallstedt did not appear in a game for Sweden.

Nico Sturm recorded one goal in five games and averaged 10:21 in TOI/game as Germany lost to Slovakia, 6-2, in the quarterfinals.

Samuel Hlavaj went 2-3-0 with a 3.56 GAA and a .908 SV% in five starts as Slovakia lost to Finland, 6-1, in the Bronze Medal Game.

David Spacek collected one assist and skated 14:33 in TOI/game in five games as Czechia lost to Canada, 4-3 in overtime, in the quarterfinals.

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** served as the General Manager of the Gold-Medal winning United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He was joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who served as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who worked on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who worked as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who served as team physician.

LOCKING IT DOWN

- The Wild ranks T-2nd in the NHL with seven shutouts this season, one shy of tying the single-season franchise record (eight SO, five occurrences, last 2015-16 season).
- Ranks fourth in the NHL with 2.59 goals against/game since November 1.

- Is 32-0-8 (.900) this season when allowing three or fewer goals in regulation, the only team in the NHL without a regulation loss

BY THE PERIOD

- Rank seventh in the NHL with a plus-11 goal differential in the opening frame.
- Ranks T-2nd the NHL by allowing 0.84 second-period goals per game this season and seventh with a plus-9 second-period goal differential.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks fourth in the NHL by allowing 0.85 goals per game in the third period and fifth with a plus-15 third period goal differential.
- Leads the NHL with 13 extra-time victories and T-1st with 23 extra-time games played.

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 35 games this season, T-1st in the NHL.
- Owns a 25-4-6 record (.800) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 681-180-112 all-time record (.757) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

- Minnesota ranks second in the NHL with 3.92 goals scored per game since Dec. 14.

RED HOT AND ROLLING

- At 34-14-10, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with 78 points, the second-highest point total through a season's first 58 games in franchise history
- Is 31-8-7 (.750) since Nov. 1, ranking first in the NHL in points (69), T-1st in point percentage and second in wins.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks first in the NHL in team SV% (.913), third in goal differential (plus-42) and fourth in team GAA (2.53).
- Recorded a seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) from 12/8 - 1/3, the team's longest road point streak since a nine-game run last season (Oct. 29 - Dec. 6, 2024).
- Recorded a 14-game home point streak (12-0-2) from 11/1 - 12/20, the longest run in franchise history and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, 22).
- Won seven consecutive games from 12/8 - 12/20, tied for the team's longest streak of the season (also seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- All seven wins from 12/8 - 12/20 were in regulation, tying the franchise record for most consecutive wins in regulation (2x previously).
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Finished 10-3-2 (.733) in December, ranking T-3rd in the NHL in points (22) and T-4th in wins.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Recorded 10 or more wins in both November and December 2025, marking the fourth time in franchise history the team has won 10 or more games in consecutive months (February and March, 2014-15; December and January, 2016-17; March and April, 2021-22).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

- **Kirill Kaprizov** is currently at 217 career goals and needs three goals to pass Marian Gaborik (219) for the all-time franchise record.
- Needs three assists to pass Pierre-Marc Bouchard (241) for fifth in franchise history.
- Owns an active four-game point streak (4-2=6).
- With an overtime assist at NSH (2/4), recorded his ninth overtime point (4-5=9) of 2025-26 and tied Connor McDavid and Leon Draisaitl (both w/ 9 in 2024-25) for the most overtime points in a single season in NHL history.
- Scored his fourth OTG of the season vs. MTL (2/2), T-1st in the NHL, and now ranks T-1st in the NHL since debuting in 2020-21 with a franchise-record 14 career OTG.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL in points (7-11=18) and T-5th in goals in 10 games since Jan. 17.
- Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 32 goals and 13 PPG, fourth with 206 shots and seventh with 70 points (32-38=70).
- Ranks first on Wild in assists, points, PPG, shots and T-1st in goals and GWG (four).
- Is the second player in franchise history to record four-plus 30 goal seasons (Gaborik, 5x).
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 1/25 after recording nine points (3-6=9) across four games.
- Tied his season-high in points (2-1=3) and plus-minus rating (plus-3) vs. DET (1/22).
- Has surpassed the 60-point plateau for the fourth season in his career, tying Marian Gaborik for most in franchise history.
- Scored a goal vs. NYI (1/10) to move his career point total to 438 (210-228=438) and pass Marian Gaborik for second on the franchise's all-time points list (Koivu, 205-504=709).
- Tallied an assist at VGK (12/29), reaching 225 career assists and passing Mikael Granlund (224) for sixth in franchise history
- Recorded a power-play assist at WPG (12/27), reaching 146 career power-play points (70-76=146) and passing Marian Gaborik (145) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 251).
- Notched a PPG vs. WSH (12/16) to reach 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.

- Reached 200 career goals in his 344th career game, becoming fourth-fastest player drafted in fifth round or later to hit the landmark (Brett Hull, 280 GP; Luc Robitaille, 323 GP; Pavel Bure, 328 GP).
- With two goals vs. COL (11/28), reached 115 career home goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (113 home goals) for most in franchise history.

- Kaprizov posted multiple points in five consecutive games (3-9=12) from 1/17 - 1/24, marking the second-longest multiple-point-game streak of his career (seven consecutive MPG, 10/15 - 11/1/24) and third-longest in franchise history.

- **Quinn Hughes** with two assists at NSH (2/4), extended his active assist and point streaks to 10 games (2-16=18), moving past Kirill Kaprizov (nine games, 2022-23 season) for assist streak in franchise history.
- Since his current point streak began on Jan. 17, ranks second in the NHL with 16 assists and T-2nd in points (2-16=18).
- Since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, leads NHL defensemen and ranks second among all skaters with 31 assists.
- Per NHL Stats, is the first defenseman in NHL history to register an assist streak of 10 games in his first season with a franchise.

THE WALL OF ST. PAUL

- **Jesper Wallstedt** posted 39 saves at EDM (1/31), tied for the second-highest single-game total of his career and season, while tallying his first career assist, the 13th goalie in team history to do so.
- Is 7-2-3 with a 2.39 GAA, .919 SV% and two shutouts in 12 road starts this season.
