

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****April 11, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [1] vs. LOS ANGELES KINGS [4]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames continued a three-game California road trip in Los Angeles on Tuesday night against the Kings. The Kings would score the only goal of the opening 20 with Kevin Fiala giving the home side a 1-0 lead. Los Angeles would tack on a pair in the middle frame, and the Kings led 3-0 through 40. In the third, Calgary pressed hard, leading to a Daniil Miromanov point shot being re-directed by Jonathan Huberdeau to give the Flames life. The Kings would add an empty netter and claim this one 4-1.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Ducks. Calgary and Anaheim have split their two prior meetings with the road team winning on both occasions.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 11-11-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 21-23-2 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Anaheim Ducks to the Scotiabank Saddledome for the first and only time this season 10 days ago on April 10th. The visitors would score the only goal of the opening frame, with Mason McTavish giving the Ducks a 1-0 lead through 20. Yegor Sharangovich would draw the Flames level just 2:30 into the second, followed by a slick individual effort from Andrei Kuzmenko to give the Flames their first lead of the night. The Ducks would tie things up, and nothing separated these clubs through 40. In the third, the Ducks scored three to prevail 5-3.

KADRI 900:

Nazem Kadri is slated to skate in his 900th NHL game tonight in Anaheim and become the 12th skater from the 2009 NHL draft to reach the milestone with the most recent being Minnesota's Marcus Johansson who did so on March 23rd. In 899 games played, Kadri has recorded 269 goals and 367 assists for 636 points and 688 penalty minutes. The London, ON native made his NHL debut with the Toronto Maple Leafs on February 8th, 2010 against the San Jose Sharks and was drafted seventh-overall by the Leafs in 2009.

MIRO, MIRO ON THE WALL:

With his assist on Jonathan Huberdeau's third period marker in Los Angeles last night, Daniil Miromanov has matched his previous career-high of six points which he set during the 2022-23 season in 14 games with the Vegas Golden Knights. Since being acquired by the Flames and making his debut on March 8th, Miromanov has recorded three goals and three assists in 16 games played, with his six points ranking tied for the second-most among all Russian-born defenceman in the NHL over that span.

ON THE FARM:

On Thursday morning, the Flames announced the re-assignment of forward Jaden Lipinski to the Calgary Wranglers following the conclusion of his season with the Vancouver Giants. Lipinski had a career-year with the Giants, scoring 24 goals and adding 42 assists for 66 points in 67 games along with 55 penalty minutes. The 19-year-old was the Flames fourth-round pick (112th overall) in the 2023 NHL draft and joins the Wranglers on an ATO.

LAST TIME AT THE HONDA CENTER:



Jacob Markstrom made 25 saves in these clubs' first meeting at the Honda Center for his first shoutout of the season. Markstrom also recorded the 200th win of his career, becoming just the third Swedish-born goaltender in NHL history to record 200 career wins, joining Henrik Lundqvist (459) and Tommy Salo (210). Markstrom also joined Braden Holtby (299) as the only goalies from the 2008 draft to reach 200 wins in the NHL.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

MacKenzie Weegar is one goal away from recording his first career 20-goal campaign and becoming the first Flames defenceman to register 20 or more goals in a season since Mark Giordano did so during 2015-16.

Ducks defenceman Olen Zellweger and forward Brett Leason are both Calgary natives. Zellweger prepares to face his hometown club for the second time in his career, while Leason is slated to face the Flames for the sixth time.
