#### PITTSBURGH PENGUINS

**All-Time Wild Record:** 14-16-2 (6-7-2 at Xcel Energy Center, 8-9-0 at Pittsburgh)

**2023-24:** Pittsburgh won the series-opening game, 4-3, at PPG Paints Arena (12/18)...C **Ryan Hartman** (1-0=1), C **Vinni Lettieri** (1-0=1) and D **Jake Middleton** (1-0=1) each scored for the Wild...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 26-of-30 shots faced for Minnesota...C **Sydney Crosby** (1-1=2), LW **Jake Guentzel** (1-1=2), C **Evgeni Malkin** (1-1=2), D **Marcus Pettersson** (0-2=2) and D **Valtteri Puustinen** (0-2=2) all paced the Penguins with two points each...G **Alex Nedeljkovic** saved 24-of-27 shots faced to earn the victory for Pittsburgh.

**WILD LEADERS:** LW **Marcus Johansson** leads Minnesota with 23 points (10-14=24) in 41 career games against Pittsburgh...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns 22 points (6-16=22) in 34 games...D **Zach Bogosian** has 12 points (4-8=12) in 30 games...D **Jonas Brodin** owns 10 points (2-8=10) in 18 games.

**WILD GOALIES:** G **Marc-Andre Fleury** is 4-4-0 with a 3.19 GAA, a .900 SV% and one shutout in eight starts vs. Pittsburgh...Gustavsson is 1-3-0 with a 4.04 GAA and a .873 SV% in four games (three starts).

**PENGUINS LEADERS:** D **Erik Karlsson** (9-25=34 in 28 games) and Crosby (11-23=34 in 23 games) lead Pittsburgh vs. Minnesota...C **Jeff Carter** has 32 points (15-17=32) in 44 games...Malkin owns 25 points (11-14=25) in 19 matches...D **Kris Letang** has 18 points (4-14=18) in 21 contests.

**PENGUINS GOALIES:** G **Tristan Jarry** is 3-0-1 with a 2.95 GAA and a .900 SV% in four career starts vs. the Wild...Nedeljkovic is 1-1-1 with a 4.67 GAA and a .846 SV% in three starts.

**CONNECTIONS:** Minnesota President of Hockey Operations and General Manager **Bill Guerin** totaled 57 points (26-31=57) in 95 games with Pittsburgh in two seasons (2008-10), winning the Stanley Cup in 2009...Guerin spent eight seasons in the Penguins' front office (2011-19), including five seasons (2014-19) as Assistant General Manager where he won two more Stanley Cups (2016, 2017)...Minnesota Head Coach **John Hynes** served as Head Coach of Wilkes-Barre Scranton for five seasons (2010-15) and one season as an Assistant Coach (2009-10)...Hynes led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs as Head Coach...Fleury was selected by the Penguins first overall in the 2003 NHL Draft and went 375-216-68 with a 2.58 GAA, a .912 SV% and 44 shutouts in 691 career games (667 starts) in 13 seasons (2003-17)...He posted a 62-51 record with a 2.65 GAA, a .908 SV% and 10 shutouts in 115 career playoff contests (113 starts) with Pittsburgh and win the Stanley Cup in 2009, 2016 and 2017...C **Frederick Gaudreau** collected 10 points (2-8=10) in 19 games with the Penguins in 2020-21...D **Alex Goligoski** was drafted by the Penguins in the second round (61st overall) of the 2004 NHL Draft and recorded 90 points (23-67=90) in 177 games during parts of four seasons with Pittsburgh (2007-11) and won the Stanley Cup in 2009...Gustavsson was selected by Pittsburgh in the second round (55th overall) of the 2016 NHL Draft...Crosby played at Shattuck St. Mary's (2002-03)...Guentzel played high school hockey at Hill-Murray.

**FAST FACTS:** The Wild has scored 96 goals in the all-time series, while Pittsburgh has scored 99.

**Matt Boldy:** T-14th in the NHL with 15 goals scored since Nov. 28.  
**Marc-Andre Fleury:** Recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history...Posted the 74th shutout of his NHL career vs. NYI (1/15) and needs two more to tie Tony Esposito and Ed Belfour (76 career SO each) for 10th most in NHL history...Became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach the 1,000 games played mark when he started vs. WPG (12/31).  
**Joel Eriksson Ek:** Leads Minnesota with 21 goals and nine PPGs this season...Ranks ninth in the NHL with 188 shots on goal this season and t-12th in PPGs...Recorded a six-game point streak (6-5=11) from 1/15 to 1/25 and 14 has points (6-8=14) in his last 13 games.  
**Brock Faber:** With an assist at CHI (2/9), tied Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the most points in a single-season by a Wild rookie defenseman...Leads all NHL rookies with 24:55 TOI per game, 100 blocked shots and 26 assists, is second with 30 points (4-26=30)...Leads all rookie defensemen in scoring...10th among all NHL skaters in TOI/game...Recorded a six-game point streak (2-7=9) from 1/15 to 1/25, the longest point streak in franchise history by a rookie defenseman.  
**Vinni Lettieri:** Registered his second career multi-point game with two assists at CHI (2/7).  
**Jake Lucchini:** Scored his first goal in a Wild sweater at CHI (2/7).  
**Kirill Kaprizov:** Leads Minnesota with 45 points (19-26=45) this season...Named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending Jan. 21 after ranking T-1st in the NHL in scoring (4-4=8) and goals in four games...Registered his third career regular-season hat trick at CAR (1/21) and moved into a tie with Jason Zucker for fourth on the franchise's all-time goal scoring list (132 goals)...Has 21 points (11-10=21) and a plus-9 rating in his last 15 games played.  
**Marco Rossi:** Among NHL rookies is T-1st in GWG (two), second in goals (13), third in points (13-15=28), and fifth in shots on goal (93).  
**Mats Zuccarello:** Leads the Wild with 31 assists this season.

## MARC-ANDRE FLEURY NIGHT

The Minnesota Wild will hold “Marc-Andre Fleury Night” when it hosts the Pittsburgh Penguins on Feb. 9, 2024, at 7 p.m. on Bally Sports North and KFAN 100.3 FM. The Wild will commemorate goalie Marc-Andre Fleury for reaching 1,000 games played in the NHL and securing 552 career wins, moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most all-time among NHL goaltenders (Martin Brodeur, 691 career wins).

The team will hold a special pregame ceremony and feature Fleury-themed in-game elements throughout the evening. All fans in attendance will receive a commemorative ticket, lanyard and rally towel courtesy of WinCraft. Additionally, the Minnesota Wild Foundation will honor Fleury’s milestones by making a \$5,000 donation to the charity of his choice. The team will wear commemorative jerseys during pregame warmups that display Fleury’s name and number on the back and each respective player’s number on the sleeves. The warmup-worn jerseys will be signed by both Fleury and the respective player and offered for bidding in an online auction, held Feb. 9 through Feb. 19, with all proceeds benefitting the Minnesota Wild Foundation. # TEAM NOTES



## HEAD COACH JOHN HYNES



John Hynes was named Head Coach of the Minnesota Wild on Nov. 27, 2023. Bringing eight seasons of NHL head coaching experience to the start of his Wild tenure, Hynes owns a career record of 301-268-64 (.526) in 633 regular season games with Minnesota, the Nashville Predators and New Jersey Devils.

Hynes, 48, most recently served as Head Coach of the Nashville Predators for parts of four seasons (2020-23). He was named Head Coach of the Predators on Jan. 7, 2020, and recorded a 134-96-18 record in 248 games (.576) while qualifying for the Stanley Cup Playoffs three consecutive seasons (2020-22). Prior to his time with the Predators, Hynes spent four-plus seasons as Head Coach of the New Jersey Devils and went 150-159-45 in 354 games (2015-19).

Before his time in New Jersey, Hynes spent six seasons with the Wilkes-Barre Penguins in the American Hockey League, including five seasons as Head Coach (2010-15) and one season as Assistant Coach (2009-10). He led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs while helping the team allow the fewest goals in the AHL in four of his five seasons. Hynes received the Louis A. R. Pieri Memorial Award, annually awarded to the AHL's most outstanding head coach, at the conclusion of the 2010-11 season.

In between assistant coaching positions at Mass-Lowell (2000-01) and the University of Wisconsin (2002-03), Hynes spent nine seasons on the coaching staff of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, serving as an Assistant Coach (1998-2000, 2001-02) and Head Coach (2003-09). Team USA claimed four medals during his time with the National Team Development Program at the IIHF World Under-18 Championships, including gold medals in 2002 and 2006.

The native of Warwick, R.I., has also served as an Assistant Coach for Team USA at the 2004 IIHF World Junior Championship, where the Americans won gold for the first time and earned their first medal in the event since 1997. Hynes was also Head Coach of Team USA at the 2016 IIHF World Championship, an Assistant Coach at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and an Assistant Coach at the 2019 IIHF World Championship.

He played forward at Boston University (1993-97) and helped the Terriers advance to four consecutive Frozen Four appearances and win the 1995 NCAA championship. Hynes was inducted into the Rhode Island Hockey Hall of Fame on August 23, 2023.

He and his wife, Sarah, have three daughters, Sophia, Julia and Anna.

# PLAYER NOTES

## KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** received his third NHL All-Star honor on 1/4/24, becoming the second player in franchise history to be selected to three All-Star games and first to do so in three consecutive seasons.
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending Jan. 21 after ranking T-1st in the NHL in scoring (4-4=8) and goals in four games.
- Kaprizov leads the Wild with 45 points (19-26=45) and is T-1st with four GWG while ranking second in goals, assists and PPGs (seven) this season.
- Has 21 points (11-10=21) and a plus-9 rating in his last 15 games played.
- Notched his third career regular-season hat trick (3-0=3) at CAR (1/21).
- Scored his 133rd career goal vs. ANA (1/27) to move past Jason Zucker (132 goals with MIN) for sole possession of fourth on the franchise's all-time goal scoring list.
- Currently with 21 career multi-goal games, Kaprizov registered the 19th multi-goal game of his NHL career at BOS (12/19), moving past Eric Staal and Mikko Koivu (each with 18 multi-goal games) for third-most in franchise history.
- Now with 75 career multi-point games, he notched his 73rd career multi-point game at FLA (1/19) to move past Ryan Suter (72 career multi-point games) for fourth-most in franchise history.
- Currently with 46 career PPGs, Kaprizov scored the 40th PPG of his career at MTL (10/17) to become the fifth player in franchise history to reach 40 career PPGs. He joined Zach Parise (69), Mikko Koivu (60), Marian Gaborik (59) and Andrew Brunette (55).
- Kaprizov recorded the 25th three-point game of his career at CAR (1/21, 3-0=3). Only two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian Gaborik, 29).

## STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov's game-winning goal in overtime vs. MTL (12/21) marked the eighth of his NHL career, furthering his franchise record. The total is tied for third-most in the league since the start of the 2020-21 season.

## MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- **Mats Zuccarello** leads the Wild with 31 assists and ranks T-2nd with 39 points (8-31=39) this season.
- Played in the 800th game of his NHL career vs. NYI (1/15).
- Recorded a 10-game point streak (3-11=14) from 11/10 to 12/5, tied for the longest of his career (two other occurrences).
- He is the first player in Wild history to record three separate double-digit point streaks with the franchise.
- Notched an eight-game assist streak from 11/18 to 12/5, the longest of his career and one shy of the franchise record (Kaprizov, nine games in 2022-23).
- Recorded an 11-game home point streak (6-10=16), the longest in Wild franchise history to start a season and the longest home point streak of Zuccarello's career.
- Reached 600 career points (192-408=600) with an assist at CGY (12/5), the first Norwegian player to reach the mark.
- Recorded the 400th assist of his NHL career against OTT in Sweden (11/18), becoming the first Norwegian player to reach the mark.
- Zuccarello started the season on a six-game point streak, his longest point streak to open a season and tied for the second-longest season-opening point streak in franchise history.
- Zuccarello ranks second among active undrafted NHL players in career points (612), T-2nd in career assists (415) and third in career goals (194) and career games played (801).

## MARCO POLO

- Among NHL rookies, **Marco Rossi** is T-1st in GWG (two), second in goals (13), third in points (13-15=28), and fifth in shots on goal (93).
- Tallied the first OTG of his career at CBJ (1/6).
- Became the 12th rookie in franchise history to record a three-point game (1-2=3), doing so vs. MTL (12/21).
- Rossi became the third-fastest Wild rookie to record ten goals in a season by scoring vs. CGY (12/14), his 27th game played in 2023-24. The only others to require fewer than 30 games to reach the mark are Kirill Kaprizov (25 GP in 2020-21) and Matt Boldy (25 GP in 2021-22).
- Recorded the first multi-goal game of his career vs. CHI (12/3), scoring two.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (1-3=4) from 11/12 - 12/24/23, a career long.

## BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** leads all NHL rookies with 24:55 TOI per game, 100 blocked shots and 26 assists, is second with 30 points (4-26=30). He leads all rookie defensemen in scoring.
- Faber is 10th among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.
- With an assist at CHI (2/9), tied Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the most points in a single-season by a Wild rookie defenseman
- Recorded a six-game point streak (2-7=9) from 1/15 to 1/25, the longest point streak in franchise history by a rookie defenseman.
- Played in his 50th career game vs. NSH (1/25). With 29 points (4-25=29) in 50 career games, matched Marek Zidlicky for the second-most points by a Wild defenseman through their first 50 games with the Wild. The only blueliner with more is Ryan Suter (4-29=33 in 50 GP), per NHL Stats.
- Posted his second career three-point game (1-2=3) at FLA (1/19). According to NHL Stats, he is the fourth rookie in franchise history with multiple three-point games: Kirill Kaprizov (3), Calen Addison (2x) and Rickard Wallin (2x).
- Reached 20 assists on the season with a helper at TBL (1/18). Per NHL Stats, became the fifth rookie in Wild history, and fourth in as many seasons, to reach the 20-assist plateau in a campaign, joining Calen Addison (26 in 2022-23), Matt Boldy (24 in 2021-22), Kirill Kaprizov (24 in 2020-21) and Filip Kuba (21 in 2000-01).
- Per NHL Stats, among defensemen to start their NHL career with the Wild, he required the fewest games (46 GP) in franchise history to reach 20 NHL assists with the franchise. Among all players under that criteria, he required the second fewest behind only Matt Boldy (40).
- Has recorded five games with 30-plus minutes of TOI this season, four of which came in a five-game span from 12/14 to 12/21. Became one of two NHL rookies since 1997-98 to play four games with 30-plus minutes of TOI in a single season.
- Skated a career-high 33:25 vs. MTL (12/21), the highest single-game total in the NHL this season and the third-highest by an NHL rookie since the start of the 2000-01 season.
- Owns four of the top eight single-game TOI totals by a rookie in Wild franchise history.
- Per NHL Stats, since time on ice began being tracked in 1997-98, Faber is only the 2nd rookie to record consecutive 30+-minute games (Atlanta's Toby Enstrom in March 2008), doing so vs. CGY (12/14) and vs. VAN (12/16).

## PLAYER NOTES

### CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** leads Minnesota with 21 goals and nine PPGs this season while ranking T-1st with four GWGs.
- Eriksson Ek ranks ninth in the NHL with 188 shots on goal this season and t-12th in PPGs.
- Recorded a six-game point streak (6-5=11) from 1/15 to 1/25 and 14 has points (6-8=14) in his last 12 games.
- Scored the 112th goal of his career vs. WSH (1/23), moving past Eric Staal (111 goals with MIN) for seventh-most in franchise history.
- Posted a career-best plus-4 rating at CAR (1/21).
- Recorded a career-high 25:30 in TOI at CBJ (1/6).
- Eriksson Ek tied his career high with eight shots on goal at WPG (12/30) and vs. VAN (12/16).
- Scored the 33rd PPG of his career vs. NYI (1/15), tying Jared Spurgeon for seventh-most in franchise history.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-1=4) from 11/19 to 11/28 and a three-game goal streak (3-0=3), tied for the longest goal streak of his career (third occurrence), from 11/24 to 11/28.
- Eriksson Ek reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the milestone.
- Won 19-of-23 faceoffs (83%) at BUF (11/10), tying his career high (10/19/21 vs. WPG, 19-of-25).
- Eriksson Ek has recorded 10 multi-point games this season, second on the team.



### SHOT THROUGH THE HART

- **Ryan Hartman** is fourth on Minnesota with 15 goals and 102 shots this season while ranking seventh on the team with 25 points (15-10=25).
- Hartman was awarded the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the week ending Oct. 29 after ranking second in the NHL with five goals (5-2=7) in four appearances.
- Recorded five points (3-2=5) vs. EDM (10/24), marking his second career hat trick (first with MIN) and tying his career-best in points in a game.

### BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** is T-14th in the NHL with 15 goals scored since Nov. 28.
- Boldy scored his 31st goal of the 2022-23 season at CHI (4/10) to surpass Marian Gaborik (30 in 2002-03 and 2001-02) for most by a Wild player age 22 or younger.
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6/23). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).
- Scored 12 goals in the month of March 2023, becoming the third Wild player with as many in a calendar month (Kaprizov, 14 in March 2022; E. Staal, 13 in Feb. 2018).
- Recorded his third career hat trick (3-0=3) vs. SEA (3/27), the first natural hat trick of his career and his second hat trick in a five-game span.
- Became the fourth U.S.-born NHL player to record three hat tricks before turning 22, joining Jimmy Carson (seven), Alex DeBrincat (four) and Jeremy Roenick (four).
- Recorded his second career hat trick vs. WSH (3/19), becoming the seventh player in franchise history to notch multiple hat tricks.
- Has joined Marian Gaborik (67 in 2001-02 & 65 in 2002-03) and Pierre-Marc Bouchard (59 in 2005-06) as the only Wild players to record a 50-point season before age 22.
- Boldy reached the 30-goal mark in the 94th game of his career, joining Kirill Kaprizov (30 goals in first 67 games) and Marian Gaborik (30 goals in first 93 games) as the only players to debut with the Wild and reach the mark in fewer than 100 games.

## IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender **Marc-Andre Fleury** recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.
- Posted the 74th shutout of his NHL career vs. NYI (1/15) and needs two more to tie Tony Esposito and Ed Belfour (76 career SO each) for 10th most in NHL history.
- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach the 1,000 games played mark when he started vs. WPG (12/31).
- With his 20th save of the game vs. WPG (12/31), became the third goaltender in NHL history to reach 26,000 career saves.
- He made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made a season-high 40 saves in a 4-3 OT win at BOS (12/19), his 40th career game with 40-plus saves (T-11th most in NHL history).
- Fleury made his season debut at MTL (10/17), making 27 saves in the 5-2 win and improving his record to 27-13-6 all-time against the Canadiens.
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Finished 24-16-4 for the 2022-23 season, Fleury recorded his 15th career season of 20-plus wins, tied for third-most in NHL history: Patrick Roy (17), Martin Brodeur (16) and Ed Belfour (15).
- With 73 career shutouts, Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
