



FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

March 20, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [5] vs. NEW JERSEY DEVILS [3]

The Calgary Flames continued a four-game road swing on Thursday night in New Jersey. The Devils would register the only goal of the first, with Nico Hischier giving the home side a 1-0 advantage through 20. In the middle frame, New Jersey would double their advantage 5:25 in, but Matt Coronato would give the Flames life and draw them within one midway through. However, Paul Cotter would restore the Devils two-goal lead with under 30 seconds left in the period, and Calgary found themselves in a two-goal hole heading into the third. 6:50 into the final stanza, Connor Zary would once again bring the Flames within one, and later in the frame, Daniil Miromanov ripped home the game-tying goal to knot things at three. Calgary kept pushing, and Jonathan Huberdeau would pounce on a Devils turnover and sniped his team-leading 26th of the campaign to give Calgary their first lead of the night. The visitors would add an empty netter to complete the comeback and knock off New Jersey 5-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of two meetings this season between the Flames and Islanders. Calgary knocked off New York 2-1 in a shootout in their first matchup on November 19th.

This is a Pacific Division versus Metropolitan Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 10-4-1 against Metropolitan Division teams and a record of 14-11-6 against Eastern Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING WITH the Islanders:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the New York Islanders to the Scotiabank Saddledome for their first meeting of the season on November 19th. Both goalies were solid early, with Dustin Wolf and Semyon Varlamov turning aside all 15 shots the clubs combined for to keep the game scoreless through 20. The Islanders would break the deadlock just 1:32 into the second with Pierre Engvall opening the scoring, and it would remain 1-0 New York through 40. In the third, Rasmus Andersson drew the Flames level on the power play midway through the frame and this game would require extra time. Overtime would solve nothing, and in a shootout, Dustin Wolf went 2/2 to help the Flames emerge victorious in game one of the season-series with a 2-1 win.

WHOLE LOTTA HUBY:

Jonathan Huberdeau enters play today with 899 games played and is one away from skating in his 900th NHL game. The Saint-Jerome, QC native was drafted third overall by the Florida Panthers in the 2011 NHL Draft and would make an immediate impact on the NHL, scoring a goal and adding two assists in his first NHL game on January 19th, 2013. Huberdeau would go on to post 14 goals and 17 helpers for 31 points through his 48-game rookie season, winning the Calder Trophy as the NHL's most outstanding rookie. The 31-year-old would spend the next nine seasons with Florida and still ranks second in goals, assists, and points in Panthers franchise history. He was acquired by Calgary in the summer of 2022, and has played 228 games with the Flames, scoring 53 goals and adding 106 assists for 159 points, and so far in 2024-25 has a team-leading 26 goals and 52 points.

Huberdeau's 899 games played rank as the fifth-most among skaters from the 2011 NHL Draft class and has the second most assists among all players drafted in 2011 with 521, and his 772 points rank as the third-most from his draft year.

HOWLIN FOR YOU:

With his 26 save effort on Thursday night, Dustin Wolf recorded his 31st win in Flames threads. Only Miikka Kiprusoff (36) has recorded more victories through a goalie's first 60 games with the Flames franchise. Wolf has posted a 23-14-5 record in 2024-25, with his 23 wins leading all rookie goalies in the NHL so far on the campaign.

WEEGSY BABY:

In Calgary's last trip to UBS Arena on February 10th, 2024, MacKenzie Weegar recorded his first career hat trick. Weegar joined Nikita Zadorov (April 12, 2023), Dougie Hamilton (Feb. 17, 2018), Al MacInnis (March 16, 1992), Dana Murzyn (Feb. 22, 1990), Paul Reinhart (Nov. 24, 1986) and Barry Gibbs (Dec. 31, 1975) to become the seventh defenceman in Flames franchise history to record a hat trick.

This season, Weegar has posted 41 points from seven goals and 34 assists to become the second Flames defenseman in the past five years with consecutive 40-point seasons, joining Rasmus Andersson (2 from 2021-22 – 2022-23).



HE'S NAZTY:

With his tally on Thursday in New Jersey, Nazem Kadri reached the 25-goal plateau for the fifth time in his career. Kadri has also become the third Flames player in the past 10 years with consecutive 25-goal seasons, joining Sean Monahan (5 from 2014-15 – 2018-19) and Elias Lindholm (2 from 2018-19 – 2019-20).

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

On Thursday in New Jersey, the Flames earn their second multi-goal, third-period comeback win of the season with Connor Zary, Daniil Miromanov and Jonathan Huberdeau's final frame markers. The other such comeback win came on Oct. 9 (6-5 OT W at VAN). The last time they achieved the feat with a win in regulation was March 2, 2024 (4-3 W vs. PIT).
