NEW JERSEY DEVILS

All-Time Wild Record: 12-11-8 (6-5-4 at Xcel Energy Center, 6-6-4 at New Jersey)

2023-24: Minnesota went 0-2-0 in the season series against New Jersey... The Devils won the series-opening game, 4-3, at Prudential Center (10/29) and earned a 5-3 win in the series finale at Xcel Energy Center (11/2)...RW **Matt Boldy** (0-2=2), D **Jonas Brodin** (0-2=2), D **Jake Middleton** (2-0=2) and C **Marco Rossi** (1-1=2) all had two points...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** saved 26-of-30 shots faced in the first meeting...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 33-of-38 shots faced in the second meeting...RW **Jesper Bratt** led New Jersey with seven points (3-4=7)...D **Luke Hughes** had three points (0-3=3)...LW **Jack Hughes** (0-2=2) and LW **Timo Meier** (1-1=2) had two points each...G Vitek Vanecek went 2-0-0 with a 3.00 GAA and a .898 SV% in two starts.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Mats Zuccarello** leads Minnesota with 24 points (6-18=24) in 34 career contests against the Devils...C **Gustav Nyquist** has 17 points (3-14=17) in 30 career games...D **Jared Spurgeon** owns 11 points (3-8=11) in 14 matches...LW **Marcus Johansson** has 10 points (4-6=10) in 34 games.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 24-26-5 with a 2.49 GAA, a .914 SV% and six shutouts in 55 career starts against New Jersey...Gustavsson is 2-1-0 with a 2.55 GAA and a .930 SV% in three starts.

DEVILS LEADERS: Meier leads New Jersey with 15 points (6-9=15) in 27 career games vs. Minnesota...Bratt owns 12 points (4-8=12) in 10 games...LW **Tomas Tatar** has 10 points (7-3=10) in 21 games...D **Brenden Dillon** owns nine points (0-9=9) in 38 games.

DEVILS GOALIES: G **Jake Allen** is 8-6-2 with a 2.59 GAA and a .907 SV% in 20 games (17 starts) against Minnesota...G **Jacob Markstrom** is 7-3-2 with a 2.24 GAA, a .925 SV% and one shutout in 13 games (12 starts) against Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Wild President of Hockey Operations and General Manager **Bill Guerin** was selected by New Jersey in the first round (fifth overall) of the 1989 NHL Draft...He collected 214 points (108-106=214) in 380 career games in seven seasons (1991-98) and won the Stanley Cup with the Devils in 1995... Wild Senior Advisor to the GM **Ray Shero** served as Executive Vice President and General Manager of the Devils from 2015-20...Wild Goaltending Coach **Frederic Chabot** was drafted by New Jersey in the 10th round (192nd overall) of the 1986 NHL Draft...LW **Marcus Johansson** posted 41 points (17-22=41) in 77 games with New Jersey (2017-19)...D **Jon Merrill** was drafted by New Jersey in the second round (38th overall) of the 2010 NHL Draft and tallied 36 points (6-30=36) in 216 games with the Devils (2013-17)...C **Erik Haula** was selected by Minnesota in the seventh round (182nd overall) of the 2009 NHL Draft and recorded 89 points (42-47=89) in 266 games with the Wild (2013-17).

FAST FACTS: Minnesota is 7-2-1 in its last 10 games against New Jersey, out scoring the Devils 32-27 in that span.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Second in the NHL with 47 road points (22-11-3) and a .653 road point percentage while ranking third with 22 road wins...T-3rd in the NHL with a .906 team save percentage this season...T-6th in the NHL with 35 goals scored by defensemen this season...Has scored first in 42 games this season, tied for most in the NHL.

Matt Boldy: Posted his 17th multi-point game of the season with two points (1-1=2) vs. WSH (3/27)...Notched his ninth GWG of the season vs. WSH (3/27), establishing a new single-season franchise record...Owns seven points (3-4=7) in his last six games ...T-2nd in the NHL in game-winning goals this season...Currently tied for fifth in franchise history with 23 career GWG, needs one to move past Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal for fourth...Ranks sixth in the NHL with 246 shots this season...Leads the Wild with 62 points (24-38=62), 24 goals and 38 assists with and six PPG.

Brock Faber: He ranks fourth in the NHL at 25:20 TOI/G this season...Owns a 25:04 TOI/G average in 153 career games, the third-highest average by an NHL player prior to turning 23 (min. 100 games played) since 2000-01... Second among Wild defensemen and T-8th among Wild skaters with 24 points (7-17=24).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Made the 1,015th start of his career vs. PIT (3/9), moving past Roberto Luongo (1,014 GS) for second-most all-time among NHL goaltenders...Made the 1,045th game appearance of his career at DET (2/22) to move past Roberto Luongo for sole possession of second-most all-time among NHL goaltenders...Recorded the 69th overtime victory of his NHL career at DET (2/22) to tie Martin Brodeur for most in league history.

Marcus Foligno: 11th in the NHL with 221 hits this season.

Freddy Gaudreau: Posted two goals (2-0=2) vs. WSH (3/27), his third multi-goal game of the season and sixth of his career...Ranks fourth on the team with 18 goals this season, one shy of tying his single-season career high set in 2022-23. Filip Gustavsson: Since March 1, is 7-3-1 and leads the NHL with a .939 SV%, ranks T-2nd in wins and third with a 1.72 GAA (min. seven games)...For the season, Gustavsson is 29-16-4 and ranks T-3rd in the NHL in shutouts (five), fourth in SV% (.919), and sixth in wins and GAA (2.46)...Named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending March 23, going 3-0-0 with a 0.67 goals-against average, .976 save percentage and one shutout...Posted a 161:49 shutout streak from 3/17 - 3/22, the longest home shutout streak in ranchise history and the sixth-longest shutout streak in the NHL this season and in franchise history...Per NHL Stats, his five shutouts this season are tied for the second-highest single-season total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).

Jake Middleton: Played his 300th NHL game vs. VGK (3/25)...Leads Wild defenseman in goals scored this season...Leads the Wild and ranks 13th in the NHL with 148 blocked shots this season.

Marco Rossi: Ranks T-1st on the team in PPG (six), second in assists (33) and points (22-33=55), and third in goals (22)...Has played in 158 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players.

Jared Spurgeon: Currently at 132 career power-play points (34-98=132), one shy of tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for fifth in franchise history... Leads Wild defensemen and ranks sixth among Wild skaters with 29 points (7-22=29)

Yakov Trenin: Finished with a game-high eight hits vs. WSH (3/27), the second-highest total of his NHL career (10, 2/1/25 at 0TT)... Owns 210 hits this season, which ranks 17th in the NHL and establishes a new single-season career-high.

Mats Zuccarello: Recorded the 225th assist of his Wild career vs. VGK (3/25), passing Mikael Granlund (224) for fifth-most in team history... Finished with two points (1-1=2) vs. BUF (3/22), recorded his 80th multi-point game in a Wild sweater and moved past Zach Parise (79 mpg) for fourth-most in franchise history... Ranks second on the team with five GWG.

TEAM NOTES



OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild is 28-0-0 when leading through two periods, the only NHL team with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Is 20-4-1 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in 41 games this season, tied for most in the NHL, and holds a 29-10-2 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

• The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

ROAD DAWGS

- Second in the NHL with 47 road points (22-11-3) and a .653 road point percentage while ranking third with 22 road wins.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild is 16-3-1 this season (.825) when scoring first in a road game, the third-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

YOUNG GUNS

- The Wild ranks ninth in the NHL with 58 goals and T-11th with 155 points (58-97=155) registered by players aged 23 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Faber, Jiricek, Khusnutdinov, Ohgren, Rossi).
- Matt Boldy ranks T-5th among NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 62 points (24-38=62), sixth with 38 assists and eighth with 24 goals. Marco Rossi is T-9th with 55 points (22-33=55), T-9th with 22 goals and T-11th with 33 assists.

MAGIC NUMBERS

- The Wild is 33-3-2 (.895) when scoring three-plus goals in regulation this season, the fifth-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- The Wild is 30-2-3 (.900) when allowing two or fewer goals in regulation this season, T-8th best point percentage in that situation.
- The Wild is 23-14-0 (.622) when allowing fewer than 30 shots on goal this season, the third-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.

IN EXTRA TIME

- The Wild holds an 8-5 record (.808) in extra-time games this season, the eighth-best point percentage in the NHL in such games.
- The Wild is 7-1 (.938) in extra-time games since Nov. 24, 2024, the best point percentage in the NHL in that span.
- The Wild won seven consecutive extra-time games dating from 11/30/24 3/11/25 (four overtime wins, three shootout wins).

ON SPECIAL TEAMS

- The Wild ranks ninth in the NHL with a 27.9 power-play percentage (12-43) since February 8. Minnesota's 12 total power-play goals rank T-8th in the NHL during that time frame.
- The Wild has allowed three PPGs in 21 shorthanded situations in the team's last nine games. Since March 11, ranks seventh in the NHL with a 85.7 penalty-kill percentage (18-21).

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- Matt Boldy posted his 17th multi-point game of the season with two points (1-1=2) vs. WSH (3/27).
- Notched his ninth GWG of the season vs. WSH (3/27), establishing a new single-season franchise record.
- Owns seven points (3-4=7) in his last six games.
- T-2nd in the NHL in game-winning goals this season. Ranks sixth in the NHL with 246 shots this season.
- Currently tied for fifth in franchise history with 23 career GWG, needs one to move past Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal for fourth.
- Leads the Wild with 62 points (24-38=62), 24 goals and 38 assists with and six PPG.
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. SEA (3/19), his 14th multi-goal game of his career, to tie Nino Niederreiter for seventh-most in franchise history.
- Is the fourth player in franchise history to record three consecutive 60-point seasons (also Kaprizov, Koivu, Zuccarello).
- Posted a game-high eight shots on goal vs. BOS (3/2), tied for the second-highest total of his career.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-4=7) from 2/8 2/27.
- Is the second player in franchise history with three 30-assist seasons before turning 24, joining Pierre-Marc Bouchard (3x) Owns five points (3-2=5) in his last two games.
- Notched a game-high three points (2-1=3) vs. NYI (2/8), tying his season high.
- Boldy tied his single-game career high with three assists at CHI (1/26).
- Skated 26:35 of TOI at COL (1/20), the second-highest total of his season and NHL career.
- Skated a career-high 26:55 of TOI vs. EDM (1/15) and notched two
 points (1-1=2). He also registered seven shots on net, his secondhighest total of the season and T-4th highest of his career, while his
 15 shot attempts marked a season high and the second-highest total
 of his career.
- Tallied two points (1-1=2) and tied season-high plus-3 rating at SJS (1/11).
- Set a season-high with a plus-three rating at CAR (1/4) and tied his season high with three points (1-2=3).
- Scored the game-deciding goal in shootout at WSH (1/2), his secondsuch goal of the season and sixth of his career, and passed Matt Cullen for most game-deciding shootout goals in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Scored a goal vs. PHI (12/14) to reach 200 career points (88-112=200) in his 233rd career game, becoming the second-fastest Wild player to reach the mark (Kaprizov, 169 gp).
- Scored his fifth career game-deciding shootout goal at UTA (12/10), tying Matt Cullen for the second most in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Recorded a six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 11/10 11/23.
- Is the fourth NHL player since 2000-01 to record five GWG in a season's first 16 games, joining Fedorov (six, 2002-23), Draisaitl (five, 2021-22) and Matthews (five, 2020-21).
- Reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.
- Boldy opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.

MARCO POLO

- Marco Rossi ranks T-1st on the team in PPG (six), second in assists (33) and points (22-33=55), and third in goals (22).
- Has played in 158 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players.
- Won 9-of-11 draws taken (81.8 pct) at VAN (3/7), marking the third-highest faceoff percentage of his season (min. five face offs taken).
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-1=4) from 2/8 2/25, tying his career-long goal streak established earlier this season.
- Scored the game-winning goal in overtime at DET (2/22).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. CGY (1/25), his fourth three-plus point performance this season and fifth of his career, to move his season point total to 43 (17-26=43) and surpass the 40-point total (21-19=40) he established as a rookie in 2023-24. Also finished with a plus-2 rating vs. CGY (1/25).
- Recorded a career-high 24:51 time-on-ice total vs. EDM (1/15) while also scoring a goal.
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5.
- Posted four assists at CAR (1/4), establishing new career highs for most assists and points in a game.
- Rossi posted three points (2-1=3) and tied his season and career highs with two goals, seven shots and a plus-3 rating vs. NSH (12/31). Also won a career-high 12 faceoffs vs. NSH (12/31) out of 15 total faceoffs taken.
- Notched a career-high four hits vs. CHI (12/23).
- Scored a game-tying goal with 46 seconds left in regulation at UTA (12/10), finishing the game with a career-best-tying plus-3 rating.
- Rossi recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12 - 10/24.
- Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 10/22, also establishing a career-long mark.

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- Jared Spurgeon notched the 145th and 146th primary assists of his career vs. LAK (3/17) to overtake Mikael Granlund (145) for the secondmost in franchise history (Koivu, 269).
- Currently at 132 career power-play points (34-98=132), one shy of tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for fifth in franchise history.
- Leads Wild defensemen and ranks sixth among Wild skaters with 28 points (7-21=28).
- Tied his season high with six blocked shots at VAN (3/7).
- Posted two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4) to record the 73rd multi-point game of his career and moved past Ryan Suter (72 mpg) for most multipoint games by a Wild defensemen. Now with 74 career multi-point games, ranks sixth all-time in multi-point games among all Wild skaters.
- Reached 401 career points (116-285=401) with an assist at MTL (1/30) and moved past Zach Parise (199-201=400) for third on the Wild's all-time points list.
- Reached 400 career points (116-284=400) with a goal at TOR (1/29) and became the fourth player and first defenseman to reach 400 points in a Wild sweater.
- Also notched his 23rd career game-winning goal at TOR (1/29), tying Eric Staal for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Played in his 900th career NHL game vs. UTÁ (1/23), joining Mikko Koivu (1,028 games) as the only players to play 900-plus games for the Wild.
- Spurgeon pushed his career TOI total to 19,726:58 with 24:08 skated at UTA (12/10), moving past Mikko Koivu (19,718:08 TOI) for most in franchise history.
- Spurgeon scored the GWG in overtime vs. NSH (11/30) to reach five career OTG, tied Brent Burns and Mikko Koivu for third in franchise history.
- Recorded the game-winning goal in consecutive contests for the first time in his career (11/29 vs. CHI, 11/30 vs. NSH).
- Tallied two goals (2-0=2) on his 35th birthday vs. CHI (11/29 and reached 112 career goals, moving past Eric Staal (111 goals) for eighth on the Wild's all-time goal list.
- Ranks first in franchise history in plus-minus rating (plus-125), blocked shots (1,588) and minutes skated (20,416:11), second in games played (923), third in assists (295), third in scoring (117-295=412) and fourth in shots (1,528).
- Since entering the NHL in 2010-11, has recorded the fewest PIMs (160) by a defenseman playing in 750-plus games.
