FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP April 12, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [6] vs. ANAHEIM DUCKS [3] Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames wrapped up a three-game California road trip in Anaheim on Friday night against the Ducks. Andrew Mangiapane would break the ice in the first with a shorthanded goal to give the visitors a 1-0 lead. Later in the frame, Nazem Kadri would make a slick move and rifle home is 27th to double Calgary's advantage and the Flames led 2-0 through 20. In the second, the Flames continued to pour it on, starting with a power play marker from Andrei Kuzmenko followed by a Connor Zary marker to make it 4-0 Flames through 40. The Ducks pushed in the third, scoring three-unanswered goals, but Andrei Kuzmenko would net a pair to complete the hat trick, and help the Flames win 6-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Coyotes. Calgary has knocked off the 'Yotes in both prior matchups in 2023-24, outscoring them 9-4.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central matchup; the Flames have a record of 10-12-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 21-23-2 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Arizona Coyotes to the Scotiabank Saddledome on January 16th for their second meeting of the season. Neither team would score in the first, and the game's first goal wouldn't come until the midway point of the second when Sean Durzi would break the ice to give Arizona a 1-0 lead. Logan Cooley would extend Arizona's advantage 6:37 into the third, but Blake Coleman would respond for the Flames just over two minutes later to draw the Flames within one. Shortly after, Martin Pospisil would drive the net and find Nazem Kadri who would tie the game with his 15th of the campaign and this game needed overtime. In the extra frame, the Flames would muster seven shots with Yegor Sharangovich netting the overtime winner to give the Flames a 3-2 comeback win.

KADRI 900:

Nazem Kadri skated in his 900th NHL game on Friday in Anaheim, celebrating with a goal and two helpers in a 6-3 Flames win. Kadri has become the 12th skater from the 2009 NHL draft to reach the milestone with the most recent being Minnesota's Marcus Johansson who also scored in his 900th NHL game on March 23rd. In his 900 games played, Kadri has recorded 270 goals and 369 assists for 639 points and 688 penalty minutes. The London, ON native made his NHL debut with the Toronto Maple Leafs on February 8th, 2010 against the San Jose Sharks and was drafted seventh-overall by the Leafs in 2009.

THE KUZMENKO-SHOW:

Andrie Kuzmenko recorded his second-career hat trick on Friday night in Anaheim to help the Flames knock-off the Ducks 6-3. Since making his Flames debut on February 6th, Kuzmenko has a team-leading 13 goals with five multi-goal games. Since March 1st, Kuzmenko's 10 goals are the fourth most among all Russian skaters in the NHL, with only Kirill Kaprizov (16), Alex Ovechkin (14), and Artemi Panarin (13) having more.

ON THE FARM:

The Calgary Wranglers' newest members Jaden Lipinski and Etienne Morin made their professonuial hockey debuts on Friday night against the Abbotsford Canucks. The pair were both selected by the Flames during the 2023 NHL draft, with Morin being selected in the second-round, while Lipinski was selected in the fourth-round. Morin scored 12 goals and 37 assists for 49 points, with the QMJHL's Moncton Wildcats with Lipinski posting a career-best 24 goals and 42 assists for 66 points in 67 games for the WHL's Vancouver Giants.

SHARAN-GOAL-VICH:

In these clubs' first meeting, Yegor Sharangovich recorded his second-career hat trick and earned First Star honors in a 6-2 triumph over the Coyotes. Sharangovich's hat trick was the second of his career, and the first hat trick by a Flames skater since April 12, 2023 (Nikita Zadorov, 3G vs. SJS). The Minsk, BLR native also became the 67th Flames skater to record a hat trick.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In Arizona's last 10 trips to the Scotiabank Saddledome, the Flames have gone 9-1-0 against the Coyotes, outscoring their Central Division foe 42-19.
