Post-Game Notes

- The Tampa Bay Lightning had goals from six different goal scorers on Thursday night to defeat the San Jose Sharks 6-0.
- The last time the Lightning won by six or more goals was April 21, 2022, against Toronto.
- The Bolts improved to 4-2-2 overall this season, including a home record of 4-0-1.
- The Lightning are now 8-1-1 over their last 10 matchups with the Sharks and 5-4-1 over their last 10 meetings at AMALIE Arena.
- Since the 2021-22 season, the Lightning are 29-2-4 against Western Conference opponents, including a 3-0-0 record this season.
- Tampa Bay is 4-0-0 when scoring the first goal of the game and 3-0-0 when they outshoot their opponent.
- The Lightning outshot San Jose 31-23, including a 13-7 advantage in the first period and a 12-7 advantage in the second period.
- Anthony Cirelli, Brandon Hagel and Brayden Point paced the Lightning with four shots on goal each.
- Lightning goaltender Jonas Johansson stopped all 23 shots he faced to earn his second consecutive shutout. He has saved all 55 shots he's faced over his last two starts.
- Johansson's two shutouts this season are tied for first in the NHL.
- Johansson has made 103 saves over his last 3 starts.

- Andrei Vasilevskiy recorded Tampa Bay's last set of back-to-back shutouts, blanking Philadelphia on November 23, 2021 and Seattle on November 26, 2021.
- Brayden Point scored the game-opening goal for the second consecutive game, giving the Lightning a 1-0 lead at 1:41 of the first period.
- Point collected his 10th point of the season (2-8—10) in his eighth game which is the fewest he has required to reach a double-digit point total (required 9 GP in 2019-20 and 2020-21).
- Brayden Point scored his 43rd career game opening goal. He ties Alex Ovechkin for the fifth-most game opening goals since Point entered the league in 2016-17.
- Mikhail Sergachev notched his fourth point of the season (0-4—4) with the primary assist on Point's goal.
- Nick Perbix tallied his second point of the season (0-2—2), adding the secondary assist on the game-opening goal.
- Mikey Eyssimont redirected a shot while falling down to give the Bolts a 2-0 lead at 6:03 of the first period. The goal marked Eyssimont's third point of the season (2-1—3).
- Calvin de Haan registered his first point in a Lightning sweater with the primary assist on the goal, taking a shot from the left point that Eyssimont tipped home.
- Nick Perbix picked up his second assist of the period and his third point of the season (0-3—3).
- Steven Stamkos scored a 5-on-3 power-play goal at 19:18 of the first period to extend Tampa Bay's lead to 3-0. The goal marked Stamkos's seventh point of the season (3-4—7) and his fifth power-play point (1-4—5).
- The goal also marked Stamkos' 196th career power-play goal with the Lightning, passing Brett Hull for the seventh-most power-play goals with a single franchise in NHL history.
- Stamkos is now four away from becoming the 20th player in NHL history to reach 200 power-play goals. The only other active skater to reach the mark is Alex Ovechkin (300).
- Nikita Kucherov tallied his fifth assist and 11th point of the season with the primary assist on Stamkos' power-play marker. Kucherov also earned his sixth power-play point (3-3—6).

- ❑ Mikhail Sergachev tallied his second assist of the night and his fifth point of the season (0-5—5) with the secondary assist on the power-play goal. The assist also marked Sergachev's third power-play point of the season.
- ❑ Brandon Hagel recorded his fifth goal of the season at 4:01 of the second period to extend the Bolts' lead to 4-0.
- ❑ Alex Barré-Boulet picked up his first assist of the season and third point with the primary assist on Hagel's goal.
- ❑ Barré-Boulet has pointed in each of his last three games, tying his career-long point streak (1g, 2a from 10/26 to 11/1/21).
- ❑ Victor Hedman registered the secondary assist, tallying his eighth point of the season (1-7—8).
- ❑ Nick Paul scored his second goal in as many games and his fifth of the season (5-2—7) at 7:29 of the second period to widen Tampa Bay's lead to 5-0.
- ❑ Steven Stamkos earned his second point of the night and eighth point of the season (3-5—8) with the primary assist on Paul's goal.
- ❑ Victor Hedman notched his second assist of the game and ninth point of the 2023-24 campaign (1-8—9) with the secondary assist on the play.
- ❑ Hedman registered his 39th career multi-assist period and tied Martin St. Louis for the second most in Lightning history behind Steven Stamkos (40).
- ❑ Hedman is one of seven active defensemen with at least 30 career multi-assist periods. The other six defensemen are: John Carlson (35), Roman Josi (33), Brent Burns (32), Kris Letang (32) and Drew Doughty (32).
- ❑ Luke Glendening scored his first goal as a Bolt at 5:44 of the third period to extend Tampa Bay's lead to 6-0.
- ❑ Conor Sheary recorded the primary assist, picking up his second point of the season (0-2—2).
- ❑ Darren Raddysh registered the secondary assist, marking his fourth point of the season (0-4—4).
- ❑ The Lightning sold out their 335th consecutive game (excludes 2021 season due to COVID-19).

- The Lightning will wrap up their five-game homestand on Monday night at AMALIE Arena where they will play host to the Seattle Kraken.
- Tampa Bay is 4-0-0 all-time against Seattle and have outscored the Kraken 17-4 in those games.
