2025-26: Minnesota won the series-opening game, 3-2, in overtime at Grand Casino Arena (11/16)...RW **Mats Zuccarello** (0-2=2) led the Wild with two points...C **Joel Erikson Ek** (1-0=1), LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-0=1) and C **Yakov Trenin** (1-0=1) each scored for the Wild...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 23-of-25 shots faced in the win for Minnesota...RW **Pavel Dorofeyev** (1-0=1) and RW **Reilly Smith** (1-0=1) scored for the Golden Knights...G Carl Lindbom stopped 25-of-28 shots faced for Vegas.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** (5-11=16 in 19 games), Kaprizov (11-5=16 in 17 games) and Eriksson Ek (8-8=16 in 25 games) lead the Wild with 16 career points against Vegas...D **Quinn Hughes** (5-10=15 in 15 matches) and Zuccarello (4-11=15 in 25 games) have 15 points each.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 2-3-1 with a 2.61 GAA and a .912 SV% in eight career games (seven starts) vs. Vegas...G **Jesper Wallstedt** is 0-1-0 with a 3.12 GAA and a .889 SV% in his lone start.

GOLDEN KNIGHTS LEADERS: LW **Brandon Saad** (14-14=28 in 51 career games) and Stone (5-23=28 in 24 career games) lead Vegas with 28 career points vs. Minnesota...C **Tomas Hertl** owns 26 points (11-15=26) in 33 games...C **Jack Eichel** has 20 points (7-13=20) in 16 games.

GOLDEN KNIGHTS GOALIES: Hill is 3-4-0 with a 2.29 GAA and a .906 SV% in eight career games (six starts) vs. the Wild...G **Akira Schmid** has not faced Minnesota...G **Carter Hart** is 4-2-1 with a 3.37 GAA and a .884 SV% in seven starts.

CONNECTIONS: Vegas Assistant Coach **Joel Ward** made his NHL debut with Minnesota and appeared in 11 games with the Wild in 2006-07...D **Zach Whitecloud** played two seasons at Bemidji State University (2016-18).

FAST FACTS: Minnesota ranks fourth in the NHL in wins (14) and T-4th in points (32) all-time against Vegas...Vegas defeated Minnesota in six games in the First Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: At 23-10-6 (.667), ranks third in the NHL with 52 points, tied for the third-highest point total in franchise history through a season's first 39 games...Is 20-4-3 (.796) since Nov. 1, ranking second in the NHL in wins and T-2nd in points (43)...Since Nov. 1, leads NHL in team SV% (.933) and team GAA (1.96) and third with a plus-33 goal differential...Has scored first in 24 games this season, fourth in the NHL...Leads the NHL with seven shutouts, one shy of tying the franchise's single-season record.

Matt Boldy: Notched the fifth OTG of his career at WPG (12/27), tying Brett Burns, Jared Spurgeon and Mikko Koivu for third most in franchise history... Tallied his 18th career multi-goal game at WPG (12/27), tying Koivu and Eric Staal for fourth in franchise history...Has 16 points (9-7=16) in his last 11 games since 12/6...For the season, ranks T-3rd in NHL in goals (24), T-5th in SHG (two), T-9th in points (24-21=45) and shots (129)...Ranks first on Wild in goals, second in points and assists and T-2nd in GWG (three).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Owns 11 points (5-6=11) in his last 10 games...Leads the NHL in total faceoffs taken (836) and ranks fourth in faceoffs won (414). **Brock Faber:** Played the 200th game of his NHL career vs. NSH (12/23), scoring a goal (1-0=1) to push his career point totals to 96 (25-71=96), trailing only Matt Dumba (26) in goals scored and Ryan Suter (111) and Marek Zidlicky (109) in points through a defenseman's first 200 games with the Wild...For the season, ranks T-10th among NHL defensemen in goals (seven), 11th in TOI/G (24:34) and T-13th in shots (84).

Filip Gustavsson: Is 5-0-1 in his last six starts, holding a 1.67 GAA, .936 SV% and one shutout...In 11 starts since Nov. 16, is 8-1-2 with 1.79 GAA, .934 SV% and two shutouts...Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with three shutouts this season.

Ryan Hartman: Ranks T-2nd on the team with three GWG this season.

Quinn Hughes: Posted three assists (0-3=3) at WPG (12/27), marking his 27th career three-assist game and passing Gary Suter for the third most by an American defenseman...Notched his 35th career game with three-plus points at WPG (12/27), trailing only Cale Makar (42) in three-plus point games by an NHL defenseman since the start of the 2019-20 season... Has tallied a point in five of the seven games (1-6=7) he's played with the Wild...Leads all NHL skaters with a 27:30 TOI/G, even strength TOI/G (22:50) and ranks third in power play TOI/G (4:32) this season...T-4th among NHL defenseman with 27 assists and T-6th in points (3-27=30).

Marcus Johansson: Ranks T-8th in the NHL with four GWG this season... Leads the team with a plus-17 rating and ranks third in points (11-17=28) and goals.

Kirill Kaprizov: Posted three points (1-2=3) at WPG (12/27), recording his 44th career multi-assist game and tying teammates Jared Spurgeon and Mats Zuccarello for the third most in Wild history...Recorded a power-play assist at WPG (12/27), reaching 146 career power-play points (70-76=146) and passing Marian Gaborik (145) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 251)...Ranks T-5th in the NHL with 23 goals and 135 shots, T-6th with eight PPG and eighth with 46 points (23-23=46)...Ranks first on Wild in points and assists and second in goals.

Yakov Trenin: Leads the NHL with 189 hits, the highest total in franchise history through a season's first 39 games and tied for the fourth-highest total in the NHL through 39 games since the 2006-07 season.

Jesper Wallstedt: Posted a 23-save victory at WPG (12/27) to improve to 11-2-2 on the season...Is 5-1-1 with a 1.87 GAA, .931 SV% and two shutouts on the road this season...Leads the NHL with a .931 SV% and fourth shutouts and ranks T-3rd with a 2.16 GAA.

Mats Zuccarello: Scored the game-tying goal at the 59:38 mark at WPG (12/27), the latest game-tying goal by a Wild skater since Nov. 6, 2021 (Hartman, 59:57 at PIT).

WORLD JUNIORS AT GRAND CASINO ARENA

The **2026 IIHF World Junior Championship** is taking place from Dec. 26 - Jan. 5 at Grand Casino Arena and 3M Arena at Mariucci. Two Wild prospects are named to tournament rosters: forward **Adam Benak** is representing Czechia, while defenseman **Aron Kiviharju** is representing Finland.

During the tournament, the Wild will embark on a seven-game road trip throughout the Western conference, departing the morning of Dec. 27 and returning Jan. 9. The trip marks the third occurance of seven consecutive road games in franchise history, and the first instance where the team does not return home to Minnesota at any point during a seven-game trip.

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Newly acquired Wild defenseman **Quinn Hughes** was selected to the United States' preliminary roster. The native of Orlando, Fla., has represented the United States in numerous international tournaments, including the 2019 and 2018 IIHF Men's World Championship and the 2019 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

- Leads the NHL with a 88.4 penalty-kill percentage on the road this season (38-for-43).
- Minnesota hasn't allowed a PPG in 19 out of 27 games played since Nov. 1.

BY THE PERIOD

- Ranks fifth in the NHL by allowing 0.69 first-period goals per game this season and sixth with a plus-7 goal differential in the opening frame.
- Ranks second in the NHL by allowing 0.72 second-period goals per game this season and fifth with a plus-9 goal differential in the middle frame this season.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks second in the NHL by allowing 0.67 goals per game in the third period and fourth with a plus-13 goal differential in the third period.
- Ranks T-4th in NHL with seven extra-time victories (four OTW, three SOW).

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 24 games this season, fourth in the NHL.

- Recorded a 14-game home point streak (12-0-2) from 11/1 12/20, the longest run in franchise history and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, active 16 game streak).
- Won seven consecutive games from 12/8 12/20, tied for the team's longest streak of the season (also seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- All seven wins from 12/8 12/20 were in regulation, tying the franchise record for most consecutive wins in regulation (2x previously).
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 3/15/23.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).

A QUINN-TESSENTIAL ADDITION

- Quinn Hughes posted three assists (0-3=3) at WPG (12/27), marking his 27th career three-assist game and passing Gary Suter for the third most by an American defenseman.
- Notched his 35th career game with three-plus points at WPG (12/27), trailing only Cale Makar (42) in three-plus point games by an NHL defenseman since the start of the 2019-20 season.
- Has tallied a point in five of the seven games (1-6=7) he's played with the Wild.
- Leads all NHL skaters with a 27:30 TOI/G, even strength TOI/G (22:50) and ranks third in power play TOI/G (4:32) this season.
- Ranks T-4th among NHL defenseman with 27 assists and T-6th in points (3-27=30).
- Skated a career-high 32:02 of TOI at CBJ (12/18), the second highest TOI total in an NHL game this season.
- Posted an assist vs. WSH (12/16) to become the second defenseman in Wild history to register a point in each of his first two games with the franchise (also C. Barker in 09-10).
- Made his Wild debut vs. BOS (12/14), becoming the 32nd player and sixth defenseman to score a goal (1-0=1) in their first game with the franchise.

- Jesper Wallstedt Recorded a 23-save victory at WPG (12/27) to improve to 11-2-2 on the season.
