



FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

February 8, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. SEATTLE KRAKEN [3] (OT)

The Calgary Flames finished a three-game homestand on February 8th by welcoming the Seattle Kraken to the Scotiabank Saddledome. The first 20 would go by without a goal despite the clubs' combining for 19 shots. In the second, Morgan Frost would score his first home goal as a Flame with a laser over the shoulder of Joey Daccord to give the home side a 1-0 edge through 40. In the third, Nazem Kadri would double the Flames advantage after a slick feed by Jonathan Huberdeau to put Calgary up 2-0. Seattle would respond with a pair of goals to force overtime and knock off the Flames in the extra frame.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of four meetings this season between the Flames and Sharks. Calgary knocked off San Jose 3-1 in their first matchup on December 28th.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 9-4-2 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 17-13-3 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING WITH SAN JOSE:

The Calgary Flames began their season-series against the San Jose Sharks at the SAP Center on December 28th. The Flames would outshoot the Sharks 17-7 in the opening frame, culminating in Jonathan Huberdeau giving the road-side a 1-0 edge through 20. In the second, both teams traded blows with Macklin Celebrini drawing the Sharks level, before captain Mikael Backlund restored the Flames lead, as Calgary held a 2-1 advantage through 40. In the third, Dustin Wolf shut the Sharks down, turning aside all eight shots he faced while Huberdeau added an empty netter for his second of the night to give Calgary a 3-1 win.

RETURN OF THE MAC:

With an assist in his last outing against Seattle on February 8th, MacKenzie Weegar extended his assist streak to five games. He has become the third Flames defenseman with a run of that length in the past 10 years, joining Mark Giordano (5 GP in 2018-19 & 2015-16) and TJ Brodie (2x: 5 GP in 2015-16). He is one helper shy of matching his career-long six game assist streak he set in 2020-21.

KADRI'S SCORING:

Nazem Kadri enters tonight's contest with 19 goals on the campaign, and with one more can record his third consecutive 20-goal season with Calgary. The only players in the previous 30 years to score 20 goals in each of their first three seasons with the Flames are Sean Monahan (7 from 2013-14 – 2019-20), Daymond Langkow (4 from 2005-06 – 2008-09) and Rene Bourque (3 from 2008-09 – 2010-11).

KLAP YOUR HANDS:

On Friday morning, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of forward Adam Klapka from the Calgary Wranglers. Adam Klapka has skated in 31 games for the Wranglers this season, recording 13 goals and 12 helpers for 25 points along with 50 penalty minutes. He has now accumulated 96 points in his Calgary Wranglers tenure from 47 goals and 49 helpers and is just two-points shy of becoming the highest-scoring player in Calgary Wranglers franchise history. The 24-year-old has competed in 12 contests for the Flames this season, scoring a goal and registering 15 penalty minutes. Klapka has a total of 18 NHL games to his credit.

PACIFIC PROFICIENCY:

The Calgary Flames enter tonight's contest with a 9-4-2 record against Pacific Division opponents and dating back to December 31st have recorded points in five-straight games against Pacific Division clubs with a 5-0-1 record. Over that span, the Flames have outscored their division rivals 17-10.

FLAMES FIRSTS VERSUS SAN JOSE:

Several Flames skaters recorded NHL firsts against the San Jose Sharks.

Matt Coronato and Dustin Wolf both played in their first NHL game against the Sharks on April 12th, 2023 with Wolf turning aside 23 of the 24 shots he faced to record his first NHL win. Rasmus Andersson and Nazem Kadri also both played their first NHL games against the Sharks (Andersson: April 8, 2017 at SJS) (Kadri: February 8, 2010 vs. SJS). Brayden Pachal scored his first NHL goal against the San Jose Sharks on October 12, 2023. Adam Klapka also scored his first NHL goal against the San Jose Sharks on April 12th, 2023.

HOW SWEDE IT IS:



Rasmus Andersson returns from the NHL's 4 Nations Face-Off after Sweden finished third in the tournament standings. Andersson skated in one game, a 2-1 Sweden victory over the USA logging 13:17 of ice-time while blocking a game-high five shots.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In Calgary and San Jose's first meeting of 2023-24, Jonathan Huberdeau recorded his 700th NHL point with an assist. At the time, Huberdeau became the third skater to reach the 700-point plateau from the 2011 draft class, joining Nikita Kucherov and the late Johnny Gaudreau.

Rasmus Andersson recorded his 200th NHL point against the Sharks on April 18, 2024 and at the time, became the 11th active Swedish-born defenceman to reach the 200-point plateau, and sixth rearguard from the 2015 draft class to achieve the feat.
