WINNIPEG JETS

All-Time Wild Record: 29-22-6 (17-9-3 at Xcel Energy Center, 12-13-3 at Winnipeg)

2024-25: The Jets won the series-opening game, 2-1, in overtime at Canada Life Centre (10/13)...D **Jake Middleton** (1-0=1) scored for the Wild, assisted by **Marco Rossi** (0-1=1)...G **Filip Gustavsson** saved 33-of-35 shots faced for Minnesota...C **Mark Scheifele** (1-1=2) lead Winnipeg with two points, while LW **Kyle Connor** (1-0=1) notched the game-winning goal in overtime...G **Connor Hellebuyck** saved 26-of-27 shots faced for the Jets.

WILD LEADERS: LW **Marcus Johansson** leads the Wild with 25 points (5-20=25) in 37 games vs. Winnipeg...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns 24 points (11-13=24) in 28 games...LW **Marcus Foligno** has 21 points (11-10=21) in 33 games...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** owns 19 points (6-13=19) in 12 matches.

WILD GOALIES: G **Marc-Andre Fleury** is 23-14-0 with a 2.71 GAA, a .906 SV% and one shutout in 38 career games (36 starts) against the Jets...Gustavsson is 4-1-1 with a 1.76 GAA and a .943 SV% in six starts.

JETS LEADERS: Scheifele leads Winnipeg with 33 points (14-19=33) in 43 games against Minnesota...Connor owns 24 points (10-14=24) in 24 games...D **Josh Morrissey** owns 16 points (2-16=16) in 28 games...C **Adam Lowry** has 14 points (5-8=14) in 36 games.

JETS GOALIES: Hellebuyck is 13-10-2 with a 2.64 GAA, a .916 SV% and three shutouts in 28 games (27 starts) vs. the Wild...G **Eric Comrie** is 0-1-0 with a 4.95 GAA and a .846 SV% in two games (one start) vs. the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: Wild D **Zach Bogosian** tallied 127 points (40-87=127) in 393 games in parts of seven seasons (2008-15) with the Atlanta Thrashers and Winnipeg Jets...Wild D **Declan Chisholm** was selected by Winnipeg in the fifth round (50th overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft and appeared in four career games for the Jets (2021-24), tallying an assist...RW **Nino Niederreiter** collected 228 points (110-118=228) in 434 games in parts of six seasons with the Wild...D **Dylan Samberg** is from Saginaw and played three seasons at the University of Minnesota Duluth (2017-20)...D **Neal Pionk** was raised in Hermantown and played two seasons (2015-17) at the University of Minnesota Duluth.

FAST FACTS: The Wild is 10-5-0 in the last 15 contests at Xcel Energy Center...Minnesota's sweep of the Jets in 2018-19 (5-0-0) marked the third time in franchise history Minnesota swept a season series of more than four games: 5-0-0 vs. Chicago (2015-16) and 6-0-0 vs. Edmonton (2010-11)...The Wild fell, 4-1, in its first-ever postseason meeting against the Jets in the 2018 First Round.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: With a 13-3-4 record (.750), ranks second in the NHL in point percentage, T-2nd in points and T-4th in wins...30 points marks the franchise's highest total through a season's first 30 games...Has scored 69 goals this season, most in franchise history through the first 20 games of a season. Minnesota's plus-21 goal differential through 20 games is also a franchise high...Ranks second the NHL with a 2.37 GAA and T-2nd with a .916 SV%. T-4th with a plus-21 goal differential and T-8th with 3.45 goals/game...Also leads the NHL by allowing only 1.75 even-strength goals per game, and ranks seventh by scoring 2.80 even-strength goals per game...Owns an active seven-game point streak on the road (5-0-2), tied with Winnipeg (7-0-0) and Vancouver (7-0-0, active) for the longest in the NHL this season...Leads the NHL with 21 road points (9-1-3), ranks T-1st with nine road victories and second with a .808 road point percentage...Leads the NHL with a plus-19 goal differential on the road...Is one of two NHL teams (Carolina) yet to record consecutive regulation losses this season.

Matt Boldy: Owns an active six-game point streak (3-4=7)...Tied for the NHL leads with five GWG...T-12th in the NHL with four power-play goals...T-13th in the NHL with 11 goals...Ranks second on the Wild with 22 points (11-11=22).

Travis Boyd: Made his Wild debut at CGY (11/23).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Won 18-of-24 face offs (75.0 pct.) taken at CGY (11/23). His 18 total face offs marked a season high and the fourth-highest total of his NHL career (19 face offs won, three occurrences). He last won 18-plus face offs on 2/19/24 vs. PIT (19-for-33).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Played in the 1,030th game of his NHL career at EDM (11/21), passing Patrick Roy (1,029 gp) for third all time among NHL goaltenders (Brodeur, 1,266; Luongo, 1,044)...Also made his 1,000th career start at EDM (11/21), becoming the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach the mark (Brodeur, 1,251; Luongo, 1,014; Roy, 1,003)...Owns a 4-0-1 record for the season and is the only NHL goaltender with five-plus starts to not suffer a regulation loss.

Marcus Foligno: With two points (1-1=2) at EDM (11/21), reached 301 career points (130-171=301) and eclipsed the 300-point mark in his 817th career NHL game...T-9th in the NHL with 68 hits this season.

Brock Faber: Seventh in the NHL with 24:50 of TOI/G.

Freddy Gaudreau: Tied his single-game career and season-high mark with three points (2-1=3) at EDM (11/21)...Owns 12 points (4-8=12) in last 12 games, beginning 10/29 at PIT.

Filip Gustavsson: Owning a 9-3-3 record, is T-1st in the NHL with a 2.13 GAA and ranks T-4th with a .924 SV% and nine wins...Has allowed two or fewer goals in 11 starts this season, most in the NHL.

Marcus Johansson: Owns an active three-game point streak (2-1=3) and has scored goals in consecutive games...Finished with a game-high eight shots on goal at CGY (11/23), tying his career-high mark (three total occurrences, last 2/19/19 vs. PIT while with New Jersey).

Ben Jones: Made his Wild debut at STL (11/19).

Kirill Kaprizov: Leads the NHL with 12 multi-point games, 1.79 points/game, 26 even-strength points (11-15=26) and 24 points on the road (8-16=24) this season while ranking second with 34 points (13-21=24), T-3rd with a plus-16 rating, T-5th with 13 goals and sixth with 21 assists...Third among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:13)...Recorded an 11-game point streak (8-16=24) on the road from 10/15 - 11/21, a franchise record...Recorded a seven-game point streak (6-7=13) from 11/7 - 11/21...Needs one PPG to pass Mikko Koivu (60 PPG) for second-most all-time in franchise history (Parise, 69 PPG).

Jake Middleton: T-3rd in the NHL with a plus-17 rating...T-11th in the NHL with 48 blocked shots this season.

Marco Rossi: Has tallied a point in 14 of 20 games this season and ranks T-2nd on the Wild with 11 assists and third in scoring (6-11=17).

Devin Shore: Made his Wild debut at EDM (11/21).

TEAM NOTES



HOT START

- With 30 points (13-3-4) through 20 games this season, The Wild has recorded its best 20-game start in franchise history.

- Minnesota has scored 69 goals this season and owns a plus-21 goal differential, both the highest marks in franchise history through the first 20 games of a season.
- Is one of two NHL teams (Carolina) yet to record two consecutive regulations losses this season.
- Is one of 89 teams in NHL history to record 30 points in a season's first 20 games, including the 2024-25 Winnipeg Jets. Of the 87 teams to reach the mark prior to this season, 64 made the Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- The Wild began the season with a seven-game season-opening point streak (5-0-2) from 10/10 - 10/24, marking the fourth time in franchise history achieving the mark following 2007-08 (7-0-1 in 8 GP), 2008-09 (6-0-1 in 7 GP) and 2001-02 (3-0-4 in 7 GP).
- Of the 121 previous teams in NHL history to record 16 points or more in a season's first 10 games, 87 have made the playoffs.
- Of the 60 previous occurrences of a season-opening seven-game point streak in NHL history, 53 teams made the playoffs. 13 of those teams won the Stanley Cup.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild has allowed 11 first-period goals this season, tied for fewest in the NHL. Minnesota owns a plus-7 goal differential (18 goals for, 11 goal against) in the first period this season, T-4th in the NHL.
- The Wild is 9-0-0 when leading through two periods and 8-0-1 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in a 13 games this season, tied for most in the NHL, and holds a 10-1-2 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

- The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

WILD UNDER HYNES

- The Wild has played 83 regular-season games under Head Coach John Hynes dating back to Nov. 28, 2023 vs. STL.
- Hynes owns a 47-27-9 record (.620) during that span. His .620 point percentage ranks second all-time among Wild head coaches.
- The Wild ranks T-8th in the NHL in points (103) and wins (47) since Hynes took the bench on Nov. 28, 2023.

YOUNG GUNS

- The Wild ranks fifth in the NHL with 52 points (20-32=52) registered by players aged 23 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Faber, Khusnutdinov, Rossi).
- Matt Boldy is third among NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 11 goals and 22 points (11-11=22). Marco Rossi ranks T-7th with 17 points (6-11=17).
- Minnesota ranked second in the NHL last season with 0.42 rookie points scored per game played (min. 100 games played by rookie skaters).
- Minnesota finished second in the NHL last season with 104 points scored by rookies (34-70=104) and third with 245 games played by rookie skaters (248 including goalies).

STINGY PLAY

- Minnesota ranks second the NHL with a 2.40 GAA and T-2nd with a .916 SV%. Also ranks leads the NHL by allowing only 1.75 even-strength goals per game.
- The Wild has recorded 13 games allowing two-or-fewer goals this season, most in the NHL.
- The Wild is allowing 2.30 opponent power-play opportunities per game, the third-best mark in the NHL this season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Minnesota leads the NHL with 21 road points (9-1-3), ranks T-1st with nine road victories and second with a .808 road point percentage. Also leads the NHL with a plus-19 goal differential on the road.
- Owens an active seven-game point streak on the road (5-0-2), tied with Winnipeg (7-0-0) and Vancouver (7-0-0, active) for the longest in the NHL this season.
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 - 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota currently owns 10 road points in November (4-0-2), tied for the highest total in franchise history (10 road points in November, 2019-20 and 2011-12 seasons).



PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** leads the NHL with 12 multi-point games, 1.79 points/game, 26 even-strength points (11-15=26) and 24 points on the road (8-16=24) this season while ranking second with 34 points (13-21=24), T-3rd with a plus-16 rating, T-5th with 13 goals and sixth with 21 assists.
- Third among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:13)
- With two goals (2-0=2) at STL (11/19), became one of 19 players in NHL history (29 total occurrences) to record 12 multi-point outings in a team's first 18 games played. He is the first to achieve the feat since Peter Forsberg (2005-06)
- With two points (1-1=2) vs. MTL, became the fastest player in franchise history (16 GP) to reach 30 points in a season, shattering the mark he set in 2022-23 (22 GP). Also became the ninth NHL player born outside of North America to reach the 30-point mark in 16 or fewer games.
- With three points (2-1=3) in the 292nd game of his career at ANA (11/8), tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to record 100 multi-point games (Crosby - 235 games; McDavid - 270 games; Ovechkin - 272 games; Kaprizov - 292 games; Malkin - 292 games). Tied Malkin and Glenn Anderson as the 27th fastest player in NHL history to reach the mark. Among Wild players, Marian Gaborik was previously the fastest to reach 100 multi-point games, doing so in 455 contests.
- Ranks third in Wild history with 102 multi-point games (Koivu, 153; Gaborik, 114).
- With a PPG at ANA (11/8), tied Mikko Koivu (60 PPG) for second-most all-time in franchise history (Parise, 69 PPG).
- With three assists (0-3=3) at SJS (11/7), recorded his eighth career three-assist game and tied Mats Zuccarello and Pierre-Marc Bouchard for the second most in franchise history (Mikko Koivu, 16 three-assist games).
- Currently with 37 career three-plus point games, notched his 35th game with three-plus points of his career with a three-point performance (2-1=3) vs. TBL (11/1) to move past Mikko Koivu (34 games) for most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov was named the NHL's Third Star of the Month for October (5-3=18 in 9 GP), averaging two points/game (first in NHL) and tallying a point in eight of nine contests to lead the Wild to a 6-1-2 record. Is the fourth Wild player to be named an NHL Star of the Month, joining Eric Staal, (First Star-Feb. 2018); Devan Dubnyk (4x) and Josh Harding (Third Star-Nov. 2013).
- Currently with 39 career multi-assist games, needs two more to tie Jared Spurgeon (41) for third-most in franchise history.
- Scored his 27th career game-opening goal at TBL (10/24) to pass Jason Zucker for the fourth most in Wild history.

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov notched the 24th GWG of his career at ANA (11/8), moving past Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fourth-most in franchise history.

- Kaprizov posted a seven-game point streak (6-7=13) from 11/7 - 11/21.
- Kaprizov posted a multi-point streak of eight games on the road (6-14=20) from 10/15 - 11/8, joining Steven Stamkos (8 GP in 2017-18) and Roman Josi (8 GP in 2021-22) as the only active players to achieve the mark
- Kaprizov recorded seven-game multi-point and assist streaks (6-11=17) from 10/15 - 11/1.
- His streak of seven consecutive games with multiple points set a franchise record and T-4th longest in the NHL since the 2000-01 season.

CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** won 18-of-24 face offs (75.0 pct.) taken at CGY (11/23). His 18 total face off wins marked a season high and the fourth-highest total of his NHL career (19 face offs won, three occurrences). He last won 18-plus face offs on 2/19/24 vs. PIT (19-for-33).
- The Swede recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-2=5) from 10/22 - 10/26.
- Eriksson Ek played in his 500th career NHL game vs. SEA (10/12).
- Opened the season with a goal (1-0=1) and five hits vs. CBJ (10/10), tied for the ninth-highest single-game hit total of his career.
- Currently with 38 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs one PPG to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek ranked second on the Wild with 12 PPGs and a career-high 30 goals last season while ranking third in points (30-34=64).
- Became the 11th player in franchise history to record 30 goals in a single season, reaching the mark vs. SJS (3/28/24).

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** owns an active six-game point streak (3-4=7).
- Tied for the NHL leads with five GWG, is T-12th in the NHL with four power-play goals and T-13th in the NHL with 11 goals.
- Ranks second on the Wild with 22 points (11-11=22).
- With a GWG vs. MTL (11/14), reached 19 career GWG and tied Ryan Hartman and Pierre-Marc Bouchard for 10th-most in franchise history.
- Is the fourth NHL player since 2000-01 to record five GWG in a season's first 16 games, joining Fedorov (six, 2002-23), Draisaitl (five, 2021-22) and Matthews (five, 2020-21).
- Reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.
- Boldy opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6/23). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).

MARCO POLO

- **Marco Rossi** owns points in 14 of 20 games played this season (5-10=15) and ranks T-2nd on the team with 11 assists and third with 17 points (6-11=17).
- Rossi recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12 - 10/24.
- Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 - 10/22, also a career-long mark.
- Rossi picked up his 46th career point in his 108th career game at CBJ (10/19). Per NHL Stats, he surpassed Marko Dano (45 in 141 GP) for fifth most by an Austria-born player.
- Among NHL rookies, Rossi finished second in goals (21), T-3rd in shots (167), T-4th in GWG (two) and fifth in points (21-19=40) last season.
- With two assists at LAK (4/15/24), became the third rookie in franchise history with 40 points in a single season.
- Recorded a career-high seven shots on goal vs. STL (3/23/24) and notched his third career multi-goal game (2-0=2), moving his season total to 20 goals and joining Kirill Kaprizov (27 goals, 2020-21) as the only Wild rookies with 20-goal seasons. Also moved past Marian Gaborik (18-18=36, 2000-01 season) for the fourth-highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie.

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** played in his 100th career NHL game vs. MTL (11/14).
- Ranks seventh in the NHL with 24:50 of TOI/G.
- Recorded a three-game point streak (2-1=3) from 10/26 - 11/1.
- Reached 50 career points (8-42=50) in his 89th career game at CBJ (10/19), becoming the second-fastest Wild defenseman to reach 50 points with the franchise (Ryan Suter, 83 games).
- Faber led all NHL rookies with 24:58 TOI per game and 150 blocked shots, ranked T-1st with 39 assists and third with 46 points (8-39=47). Faber finished sixth among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.
- With a blocked shot at LAK (4/15/24), became the ninth NHL rookie to post 150-plus blocks in a season since 2005-06.
- With two blocks at COL (3/8/24), reached 126 for the season and moved past Nate Prosser (124 blocked shots in 2011-12) for the highest single-season blocked shot total by a rookie in franchise history.
- With an assist vs. PIT (2/9/24), moved his season point total to 4-27=31 and surpassed Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie defenseman. Also moved past Calen Addison (26 assists in 2022-23) for most single-season assists by a Wild rookie.
- Played in his 50th career game vs. NSH (1/25). With 29 points (4-25=29) in 50 career games, matched Marek Zidlicky for the second-most points by a Wild defenseman through their first 50 games with the Wild. The only blueliner with more is Ryan Suter (4-29=33 in 50 GP), per NHL Stats.
- Recorded five games with 30-plus minutes of TOI last season, four of which came in a five-game span from 12/14/23 to 12/21/23. Became one of two NHL rookies since 1997-98 to play four games with 30-plus minutes of TOI in a single season.
- **Skated a career-high 33:25 vs. MTL (12/21/23), the highest single-game total in the NHL last season and the third-highest by an NHL rookie since the start of the 2000-01 season.**
- Per NHL Stats, since time on ice began being tracked in 1997-98, Faber is only the 2nd rookie to record consecutive 30-plus-minute games (Atlanta's Toby Enstrom in March 2008), doing so vs. CGY (12/14/23) and vs. VAN (12/16/23).

- **Filip Gustavsson** owns a 9-3-3 record and is T-1st in the NHL with a 2.13 GAA while ranking T-4th with a .924 SV% and nine wins.
- Has allowed two or fewer goals in 11 starts this season, most in the NHL.
- Made a season-high 38 saves vs. DAL (11/16).
- Notched the seventh shutout of his NHL and Wild career vs. MTL (11/14), tying Darcy Kuemper for sixth in franchise history.
- Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 15 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 18 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.
- He is the 10th goalie to score a goal by shooting it into an empty net (the others were the last to touch an own-goal).

- **Jared Spurgeon** record a three-game point streak (0-3=3) from 11/14 - 11/19.
- Ranks first in franchise history in plus-minus rating (plus-123), blocked shots (1,516), second in games played (881) and minutes skated (19,554:34), third in assists (280) and fourth in scoring (110-280=390) and shots (1,460).
- Since entering the NHL in 2010-11, has recorded the fewest PIMs by a defenseman playing in 700-plus games.

IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender **Marc-Andre Fleury** played in the 1,030th game of his NHL career at EDM (11/21), passing Patrick Roy (1,029 gp) for third all time among NHL goaltenders (Brodeur, 1,266; Luongo, 1,044).
- Also made his 1,000th career start at EDM (11/21), becoming the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach the mark (Brodeur, 1,251; Luongo, 1,014; Roy, 1,003).
- Owns a 4-0-1 record for the season and is the only NHL goaltender with five-plus starts to not suffer a regulation loss
- Is playing in his 21st career NHL season, tied for second-most by a goaltender in NHL history and trailing only Martin Brodeur (22 seasons).

- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach 1,000 games played when he started vs. WPG (12/31/23).
- He made 24 saves at NYR (11/9/23) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made a season-high 40 saves in a 4-3 OT win at BOS (12/19/23), his 40th career game with 40-plus saves (T-11th most in NHL history).
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
