VEGAS GOLDEN KNIGHTS

All-Time Wild Record: 13-11-4 (7-4-3 at Grand Casino Arena, 6-7-1 at Vegas)

2024-25: Minnesota went 0-3-0 against the Golden Knights last season... Vegas won the series-opening contest, 3-2, in Saint Paul (12/15) and the second contest, 4-1, at T-Mobile Arena (1/12) and the series finale, 5-1, at Grand Casino Arena (3/25)...RW **Mats Zuccarello** led Minnesota with three points (0-3=3)...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** had two points (2-0=2)...C **Ryan Hartman** and LW **Marcus Johansson** each scored a goal...G **Jesper Wallstedt** saved 24-of-27 shots faced while making his season debut for Minnesota in the first game...G **Filip Gustavsson** started the second contest and stopped 33-of-37 shots faced...G Marc-Andre Fleury stopped 33-of-37 shots faced in the third meeting...C **Jack Eichel** (3-2=5), RW **Mark Stone** (0-5=5) and D **Shea Theodore** (1-4=5) paced Vegas with five points each...G Ilya Samsonov stopped 20-of-22 shots faced to earn the win for Vegas in the first meeting...G **Adin Hill** went 2-0-0 with a 1.00 GAA and a .950 SV% in two starts.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** leads Minnesota with 16 points (5-11=16) in 19 career games vs. Vegas...Kaprizov (10-5=15 in 16 games) and C **Joel Eriksson Ek** (7-8=15 in 24 games) both own 15 career points against Vegas...D **Jonas Brodin** (3-10=13 in 25 matches) and Zuccarello (4-9=13 in 24 games) have 13 points each.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 1-4-1 with a 2.76 GAA and a .911 SV% in seven career games (six starts) vs. Vegas...Wallstedt is 0-1-0 with a 3.12 GAA and a .889 SV% in his lone start.

GOLDEN KNIGHTS LEADERS: LW **Brandon Saad** (14-14=28, in 50 career games) and Stone (5-23=28, in 24 career games) lead Vegas with 28 points...C **Tomas Hertl** owns 25 points (11-14=25) in 32 games...Eichel has 20 points (7-13=20) in 15 games.

GOLDEN KNIGHTS GOALIES: Hill is 3-4-0 with a 2.29 GAA and a .906 SV% in eight career games (six starts) vs. the Wild...G **Akira Schmid** has not faced Minnesota...G **Carl Lindbom** has not faced the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: Vegas Assistant Coach **Joel Ward** made his NHL debut with Minnesota and appeared in 11 games with the Wild in 2006-07...D **Zach Whitecloud** played two seasons at Bemidji State University (2016-18).

FAST FACTS: Minnesota ranks fourth in the NHL in wins (13) and fifth in points (30) all-time against Vegas...Vegas defeated Minnesota in six games in the First Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Has allowed 1.71 goals/game in five games since Nov. 1, the second-best mark in the NHL...Has killed 16-of-17 opponent power-play opportunities since Nov. 1 and ranks third in the NHL with a 94.1 PK% in that span...Ranks second in the NHL with 19 PPG and fourth with a 26.0 PP% this season...Through the first 19 games of a season, ranks second in franchise history in PP% and T-3rd in PPG...Has scored first in eight consecutive games since 10/30, marking the longest streak in franchise history and the longest streak in the NHL since Los Angeles scored first in 10 straight games from March 29 – April 15, 2025.

Matt Boldy: Owns an active three-game point streak (3-2=5) and has five goals and seven points (5-2=7) in his last five games...Ranks T-1st on the team with 10 goals and ranks second with 20 points (10-10=20) and T-2nd with 10 assists...Ranks T-5th in the NHL with five PPG, T-8th with nine PPP and T-11th with 65 shots...Has played in 174 consecutive games dating back to 11/2/23, the 28th-longest active streak in the NHL.

Zeev Buium: Skated a career-high 26:08 and tied his career high with four shots vs. SJS (11/11)...Ranks T-1st among NHL rookies with seven power-play points (2-5=7) and five PPA, fourth with seven assists and a 19:09 TOI/G average and T-5th with 10 points (3-7=10)...Ranks T-2nd among NHL defensemen in PPP and T-6th in PPA.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Skated a season-high 24:15 vs. ANA (11/15)...Leads the NHL in faceoffs won (212) and total faceoffs taken (411)...Ranks T-2nd on the team with 10 assists.

Brock Faber: Owns nine points in his last 10 games (3-6=9)...Since 10/26, ranks T-3rd among NHL defensemen in goals (three) and T-5th in points (3-6=9) and shots (26).

Marcus Johansson: Owns 12 points (6-6=12) in his last 11 games...Recorded a career-long nine-game point streak (5-6=11) from 10/25 - 11/9, tied for the fifth-longest streak in the NHL this season...Played in his 1,000th NHL game vs. CGY (11/9), becoming the 20th Swedish-born player to reach the milestone and 412th player overall...Was the 11th player to play his 1,000th game while in a Wild sweater...Per NHL Stats, was only the second player in NHL history to carry an active point streak of nine games or longer through their 1,000th career game (Bobby Hull, 17-game streak following his 1,000th game on 1/15/72)...Was the fourth player to record a point while skating in their 1,000th NHL game with the Wild (Koivu, 12/1/19; Suter, 10/25/18; Cullen, 1/10/12).

Kirill Kaprizov: Owns 12 points (5-7=12) in his last 11 games...Leads the team in points (10-12=22) and assists and ranks T-1st in goals...Ranks T-5th in the NHL in PPG (five), T-8th in PPP (nine) and T-11th in shots (65)...Currently ranks second in franchise history with 67 career PPG, trailing Zach Parise (69), and third with 140 power-play points (67-73=140), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Gaborik (145).

Yakov Trenin: Ranks second in the NHL with 83 hits this season...With an assist at NYI (11/7), reached 100 career points (55-45=100).

Jesper Wallstedt: Posted his second consecutive shutout with a 28-save performance vs. ANA (11/15), becoming the first rookie and youngest goaltender in team history to record consecutive shutouts...Owns an active shutout streak of 141:09 spanning across three starts (since 11/7 at NYI)...Is the only NHL goaltender with multiple shutouts this season...Wallstedt has not lost in regulation this season (4-0-2), marking the longest season-opening point streak by a rookie in franchise history...Among NHL goaltenders with six-plus games played, ranks second with a 2.10 GAA and third with a .924 SV%...Notched his first shutout of the season vs. CGY (11/9) with a career-high 36 saves...Now with three career shutouts, joins Josh Harding (3) as the only Wild goaltenders to earn three or more shutouts as a rookie.

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

TEAM NOTES



ON THE POWER PLAY

- Ranks second in the NHL with 19 PPG and fourth with a 26.0 PP% this season.
- Through the first 19 games of a season, ranks second in franchise history in PP% and T-3rd in PPG.
- Scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season, from 10/11 - 10/14.
- Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games. Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities recorded a higher power-play percentage.
- The Wild opened the season by scoring a power-play goal in four consecutive games, achieving the feat for the sixth time in franchise history. The run trailed only the 2010-11 season (six-game streak) and the 2022-23 season (five-game streak) for the longest season-opening runs in franchise history.

- Has allowed 1.71 goals/game in five games since Nov. 1, the second-best mark in the NHL.

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in eight consecutive games since 10/30, marking the longest streak in franchise history and the longest streak in the NHL since Los Angeles scored first in 10 straight games from March 29 – April 15, 2025.
- Has scored first in 11 total games this season, T-4th in the NHL.
- Owns a 7-2-2 record (.727) when scoring first.
- As a franchise, holds an 178-82-26 all-time record (.756) when scoring first in a regular-season game.





PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** owns 12 points (5-7=12) in his last 11 games.
- Leads the team in points (10-12=22) and assists and ranks T-1st in goals.
- Ranks T-5th in the NHL in PPG (five), T-8th in PPP (nine) and T-11th in shots (65).
- Posted two points (1-1=2) at NYI (11/7) to tally the 113th MPG of his NHL career and now sits one back of Marian Gaborik (114 MPG) for second-most in Wild history.
- Currently ranks second in franchise history with 67 career PPG, trailing Zach Parise (69), and third with 140 power-play points (67-73=140), trailing Mikko Koivu (251) and Marian Gaborik (145).
- With a goal vs. PIT (10/30), became the third player in Wild history with a point in each of the team's first six home games to start a season (Zuccarello, 11 GP in 2023-24; Bouchard, 6 GP in 2005-06)
- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

- Currently at 213 career assists, needs six assists to pass Marian Gaborik (218) for seventh in franchise history.
- Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the highest total by an NHL forward this season.
- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possession of second-most games in Wild history.
- Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.
- Opened the season with a four-game point streak from 10/9 - 10/14. Per #NHL Stats, became the fifth NHL player in the last 30 years to record a season-opening point streak of four-plus games in three or more consecutive seasons.
- Posted a career-high 11 shots on goal vs. CBJ (10/11), tying the franchise single-game record (Parise, 1/17/19 vs. ANA; Rolston, 10/7/06 vs. ANA).
- Currently with 42 career multi-assist games, tied with Mats Zuccarello (42) for fourth-most in franchise history.
- Ranked second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-31=56) and fourth in assists (31) in 2024-25.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** owns an active three-game point streak (3-2=5) and has five goals and seven points (5-2=7) in his last five games.
- Ranks T-1st on the team with 10 goals and ranks second with 20 points (10-10=20) and T-2nd with 10 assists.
- Ranks T-5th in the NHL with five PPG, T-8th with nine PPP and T-11th with 65 shots.
- Has played in 174 consecutive games dating back to 11/2/23, the 28th-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Notched two points (1-1=2) vs. CGY (11/9) to record his 69th career multi-point game, passing Andrew Brunette (68) and tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard for eighth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Skated in the 300th game of his NHL career at CAR (10/6), finishing with two goals (2-0=2).
- Reached 259 career points (109-150=259) in his 300th game, the second-highest point total through a player's first 300 games with the franchise (Kaprizov, 366 pts).
- Per NHLStats, the only Wild players with more goals through their first 300 games with the club are Kaprizov (174 G), Zach Parise (114 G) and Eric Staal (109 G).
- Currently fifth in franchise history with 25 career GWG, two behind Kirill Kaprizov (27).
- Notched an assist vs. VAN (11/1) to reach 150 career assists and become the second-fastest player in Wild history (298 GP) to reach the landmark with the club (Kaprizov, 249 GP).
- According to NHL Stats, became the sixth different Wild player to record a point in each of his team's first five games of a season.
- Posted a four-game goal streak from 10/9 - 10/14, becoming the first player in franchise history to achieve the feat in a season's first four games.
- Recorded a career-high 10 shots on goal at DAL (10/14), tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in franchise history.
- Recorded the 20th three-point game (1-2=3) of his career vs. CBJ (10/11), one shy of tying Mats Zuccarello (21) for fourth in franchise history.
- Posted three points (1-2=3) at STL (10/9), moving his career total in season-opening games to nine points (4-5=9) in four games and marking the highest PPG average (2.25) in team history.
- Led the Wild with 73 points (27-46=73), 27 goals and 46 assists and ranked second with six PPG in 2024-25.
- Established single-season career highs in games played (82), points and assists in 2024-25.
- Became the eighth player in franchise history to record 70-plus points in a single season.
- Finished T-3rd in the NHL with 10 GWG (franchise record) and seventh with 271 shots in 2024-25.
- Is the first player in Wild history to record three 25-goal seasons before turning 24. Is the fifth player in Wild history to record consecutive 40-assist seasons, joining Mats Zuccarello (three from 2021-22 to 2023-24), Ryan Suter (three from 2017-18 to 2019-20), Mikko Koivu (three from 2008-09 to 2010-11) and Mikael Granlund (two from 2016-17 to 2017-18).
- Is the fourth player in franchise history to record three consecutive 60-point seasons (also Kaprizov, Koivu, Zuccarello).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** owns nine points in his last 10 games (3-6=9).
- Since 10/26, ranks T-3rd among NHL defensemen in goals (three), fifth in points (3-6=9), and T-8th in shots (22).
- Recorded two assists (0-2=2) vs. NSH (11/4) while skating a season-high 27:24 and tying a career high with six blocked shots.
- Finished with a game-high seven shots on goal vs. WPG (10/28), the second-highest single-game total of his career.
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), tying his single-game career-high in assists and points. The total also tied the franchise single-game high for assists by a defenseman (23rd occurrence).
- Owns a 25:01 TOI/G average in 181 career games, tied for the third-highest average by an NHL player prior to turning 24 since 2000-01.

- Logged a career-high 33:28 of TOI at VAN (4/12/25), the second-highest total in the NHL last season, and scored a goal.
- Led Wild defensemen with a career-high 10 goals scored in 2024-25.
- Ranked fourth in the NHL with 25:31 TOI/G in 2024-25.

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** is now 35-26-10 with a 2.58 GAA, .914 SV% and seven shutouts in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks T-1st in the NHL in road shutouts, fourth in road GAA and T-4th in road SV% during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9), reaching 12 for his career and tying Manny Fernandez for fourth-most in Wild history.
- Is the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and is the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 77-53-19 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks fourth in the NHL during that span with a .913 SV% and T-5th 12 shutouts (min. 50 games).
- Posted a 31-19-6 record in 2024-25 and ranked T-4th in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.914) and T-6th in wins.
- Is the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season.
- His five shutouts last season were tied for the second-highest single-season total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending March 23, 2025, going 3-0-0 with a 0.67 goals-against average, .976 save percentage and one shutout.
- Posted a 161:49 shutout streak from 3/17 - 3/22/25, the longest home shutout streak in franchise history and the sixth-longest shutout streak in the NHL this season and in franchise history.
- Stopped a penalty shot at SEA (3/4/25) to remain a perfect 4/4 against penalty shots for his career.
- Is the fifth Swedish goaltender in NHL history to record three consecutive 20-win seasons.
