The Calgary Flames welcomed the Montreal Canadiens to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Saturday for a Hockey Night in Canada matchup. The first would see the clubs combine for 13 shots but both Calgary's Dustin Wolf and Montreal's Jakub Dobes were equal to the task to keep things scoreless through 20. It would take until 16:21 mark for the game's first goal and it would be Joel Farabee who made it goals in back-to-back games to put the home side up 1-0 through 40. The Flames would clamp down in the third, Dustin Wolf made 10 final-frame saves to help Calgary blank Montreal 1-0 and sweep the season series.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the fourth and final meeting this season between the Flames and Canucks. Calgary has gone 2-1-0 against Vancouver so far in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 10-4-2 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 18-13-4 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST MEETING WITH VANCOUVER:

The Calgary Flames finished off 2024 by welcoming the Vancouver Canucks to the Scotiabank Saddledome on December 31st. Calgary would open the scoring with Connor Zary burying his then ninth on the season to give the home side a 1-0 advantage through 20. In the second, neither team could find the back of the net, but they did find the inside of the penalty box with the clubs racking up a combined 44 penalty minutes in the middle frame alone. Vancouver would find an equalizer 6:15 into the third, but Calgary responded shortly after with Nazem Kadri restoring the Flames lead. Calgary would lock things down from there, and Jonathan Huberdeau added an empty netter as the Flames finished off the calendar year with a 3-1 win.

HOWLIN FOR YOU:

Dustin Wolf turned aside all 26 shots he faced on Saturday against Montreal to record his third shutout of the season. Wolf is tied with Ottawa's Leevi Meriläinen for the most by a rookie this season while leading all freshman netminders in wins (22), assists (3) and saves (1,032).

In recording his third shutout of the season, Dustin Wolf set a new Flames franchise record for the most shutouts in a single campaign by a rookie netminder, passing Dan Bouchard, Rejean Lemelin, Mike Vernon, Andrei Trefilov, and Dan Vladar who all registered two as rookies.

Wolf also recorded the 30th win of his career and became the third-fastest Flames goalie to reach the mark with the club, doing so in 56 games played. The only netminders to do so in fewer games are Miikka Kiprusoff (52 GP) and Dan Vladar (55 GP).

GROWING UP:

Flames sophomore forwards Connor Zary and Martin Pospisil both skated in their 100th NHL game in Calgary and Vancouver's last meeting, both recording points (Zary: 1-0 – 1), Pospisil (0-1 – 1). The pair both skated in their first NHL games last season (Zary: Nov. 1 vs. DAL), Pospisil (Nov. 4 at SEA) and would both score in their respective NHL debuts. Zary has gone on to score 26 goals and 32 assists for 58 points in his first 111 NHL outings, while Pospisil has 12 goals and 33 helpers for 45 points through his first 126 contests in the NHL. At the time, Zary became the 44th Kamloops Blazers alumni to reach at least 100 NHL games, while Pospisil became the fifth-active Slovakian-born skater in the NHL to reach 100 games.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his second period marker on Thursday in Dallas, Mikael Backlund scored his 211th career goal and surpassed Johnny Gaudreau (210) for ninth place on the Flames' all-time list. With five more goals, Backlund can leapfrog Sean Monahan (212), Al MacInnis (213), and Lanny McDonald (215) to take sole-possession of the sixth-most in Flames history.

DARTH VLADAR:

Dan Vladar made 24 saves in his most recent start last Thursday in Dallas as he played in his 100th career-NHL game. He has become the 13th goalie of Czech descent to reach the 100 games played plateau and did so with 95 of his 100 NHL games coming in a Flames sweater.

FUTURE WATCH:



Flames 2024 first round selection Zayne Parekh was named to the CHL's Team of the Month for the second consecutive month. In 14 games through February, Parekh registered seven goals and 24 assists for 31 points, including two separate four-point nights and 10 multi-point efforts. He currently leads all CHL defencemen with 32 goals and 100 points through 2024-25 and has become just the fifth blueliner to reach 100 points in CHL history.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Defencemen Kevin Bahl and Jake Bean recorded their first points as Flames in these clubs' first meeting.

The Calgary Flames have played more games against the Vancouver Canucks (306) than they have against any other NHL franchise.
