The Calgary Flames finished off a back-to-back set on Tuesday night in Vancouver. It would take until the 19-minute mark of the first period to find this game's first goal and it was Justin Kirkland who scored to give the Flames a 1-0 edge heading into the break. In the second, Vancouver would score a pair to flip the script and take the lead heading into the final stanza. The Canucks would extend their advantage and knock off the Flames 3-1.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of three meetings this season between the Flames and Predators. Calgary went 2-1-0 against Nashville in 2023-24, outscoring the Preds 12-9 in their three meetings.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-2-0 against Central Division teams and a record of 4-5-1 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST YEAR AGAINST NASHVILLE:

The Flames and Predators met three times last season, with the Flames winning the season-series by going 2-1-0 against their Central Division foe. Yegor Sharangovich led the Flames with two goals and three helpers for five points in their three-game set. Nazem Kadri and Blake Coleman also registered two goals in their three games against Nashville last season while Coleman along with Rasmus Andersson picked up the game-winners against the Preds. Dan Vladar made one start against Nashville last year, turning aside 29 shots helping backstop the Flames to victory.

KLAP YOUR HANDS:

On Monday, the Flames announced the recall of winger Adam Klapka from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. Klapka has skated in five games with the Wranglers on the campaign, scoring three goals and two assists for five points along with 22 penalty minutes. The Praha, CZE native is coming off a two-goal effort in his most recent outing with the Wranglers, a 4-0 win over the Henderson Silver Knights.

KELOWNA TIES:

Five different skaters in tonight's contest played their junior hockey with the WHL's Kelowna Rockets, Calgary's Mikael Backlund, Tyson Barrie and Justin Kirkland as well as Nashville's Luke Schenn and Colton Sissons. Backlund and Barrie were teammates for the Rockets 2009 WHL Championship, Luke Schenn and Tyson Barrie were teammates for two seasons (2006-07, 2007-08), and Justin Kirkland along with Colton Sissons were also teammates for two seasons (2011-12, 2012-13). Kirkland would go on to help the Rockets win the 2015 WHL Championship. Flames bench boss Ryan Huska was an assistant coach for the Rockets from 2002-03 before being named Head Coach prior to the 2007-08 season. Flames assistant coach Dan Lambert was an assistant with the Rockets from 2009 to 2014, before Head Coaching the Rockets to the 2015 WHL Championship.

CALGARY NASHVILLE TIES:

Flames forward Justin Kirkland was drafted by the Nashville Predators 62nd overall in the 2014 NHL draft. Kirkland would spend the first three seasons of his pro career with the Predators organization. Flames blueliner Tyson Barrie was acquired by Nashville in February of 2023 and spent the 2023-24 season with the Predators. Nashville forward Mark Jankowski was drafted by the Flames in the first round (21st overall) in the 2012 draft and spent seven seasons with the Flames organization.

HUBY DOO:



With his assist on Saturday afternoon, Jonathan Huberdeau recorded his 499th career helper, one shy of reaching 500 NHL assists. Huberdeau is looking to join Nikita Kucherov and Johnny Gaudreau as the third skater from the 2011 NHL draft to reach 500 NHL assists and become the 25th active skater in the NHL to reach the milestone.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

The Flames scored twice in 36 seconds last night against Los Angeles courtesy of Mikael Backlund and Jonathan Huberdeau. Calgary has now tallied twice in a span of 40 seconds or less on two different occasions this season (Blake Coleman, Jonathan Huberdeau 0:28 on Nov. 1).

Flames assistant coach Dan Lambert was an assistant with Nashville from 2019-20 until the 2022-23 campaign.
