

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****December 4, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. MINNESOTA WILD [1]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames opened up a four-game homestand on Thursday night with a 4–1 win over the Minnesota Wild, riding a 26-save performance from Dustin Wolf and multi-point outings from Rasmus Andersson and Matt Coronato. After a scoreless first period, Jonathan Huberdeau broke the ice at the 4:21 of the second, before Yakov Trenin tied it late in the frame. Calgary took over in the third as Matt Coronato restored the home side's lead 3:33 in, Connor Zary added insurance just 2:45 later, and Andersson sealed it with an empty netter. Blake Coleman, Mikael Backlund, Morgan Frost and Joel Hanley added helpers on the night. The Flames continued their strong penalty kill play as of late, forcing Minnesota to go 0-for-5 on the power play.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Mammoth. Calgary fell 3-1 in these clubs' first matchup on October 15 in Utah.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 2-10-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 5-13-1 against Western Conference opponents.

KILLER CONFIDENCE:

Calgary went five-for-five on the penalty kill on Thursday against Minnesota, and now the Flames have not surrendered a power-play goal in five straight games, killing off all 15 penalties they've faced over that span. Joel Farabee scored a shorthanded goal on Nov. 26 in Tampa Bay, and since that date the Flames have a league-best net penalty-kill percentage of 106.7%. Calgary has been perfect on the penalty kill in eight of their last nine outings and have operated at 96.7% efficiency — the best mark in the NHL since Nov. 16.

MAN OF THE MONTH:

Flames rearguard Rasmus Andersson finished the month of November with a team-leading 14 points, recording three goals and 11 assists in 15 games. The Malmö, SWE, native posted four multi-point outings, including a pair of three-point nights on Nov. 19 in Buffalo (1-2—3) and Nov. 23 in Vancouver (0-3—3). He was named the NHL's first star of the week for the period ending Nov. 23 after posting a league-high nine points from Nov. 18–23. Andersson added two assists in Florida on Friday to record his 13th and 14th points of the month, giving him the most by a Flames defenceman in a single month since Noah Hanifin had 16 in April 2022.

Andersson registered 11 of his November points on the road, finishing two points shy of tying Gary Suter (2-11—13 in January 1988) and Paul Reinhart (3-10—13 in March 1981) for the most road points in a single calendar month by a Flames defenceman.

JUNIOR CONNECTIONS:

Flames forward Morgan Frost and Utah forward Barrett Hayton were junior teammates, spending three seasons together with the OHL's Sault Ste. Marie Greyhounds. During the 2018–19 campaign, Frost posted a team-leading 109 points on 37 goals and 72 assists, while Hayton finished fourth on the team with 66 points. The pair also went on to represent Canada at the 2019 IIHF World Junior Championship.

WEEGSY BABY:

MacKenzie Weegar enters tonight's game with 196 assists in his NHL career and is four away from reaching the 200-assist mark. With four more helpers, Weegar would become just the sixth defenceman in NHL history drafted in the seventh round (FLA – 206th overall in 2013) to register 200 NHL assists, and the only active seventh-round-selected rearguard to achieve the milestone. Only one other active seventh-round selection has more career helpers than Weegar — Devils winger Ondrej Palat (TBL – 208th overall in 2011).

FUTURE WATCH:

Flames 2025 first round pick Cullen Potter was named the NCHA Forward of the Week from Nov. 24-30, 2025. Potter helped Arizona State sweep Ohio State with a pair of overtime wins. The Calgary Flames first round draft pick tied for the NCHC lead with four points on the weekend, tallying a goal and an assist both nights against the Buckeyes. In Friday's opener, Potter scored ASU's first goal on the power play to tie the game, then set up the overtime game-winner with the primary assist in a 3-2 victory. A night later, he helped the Sun Devils erase a three-goal deficit with another primary assist during the comeback, before scoring the OT winner on Saturday to cap a 4-3 win. Potter was named First Star of the Game both nights. He finished last weekend with two goals and two assists, while leading the NCHC with a +4 plus/minus in the series. He fired 11 shots on goal in the two games, while going 16-13 in the faceoff circle (55.2 percent).

HUBY DOO:

With his game-opening goal on Thursday night against Minnesota, Johnathan Huberdeau registered his 796th NHL point and is now four shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (TBL: 2nd round – 58th overall) and Mark Scheifele (WPG: 1st round – 7th overall). There are 25 active skaters who have surpassed 800 points in the NHL.



LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Mikael Backlund is closing in on 1,100 NHL games, needing just five more to reach the milestone. Backlund was the Flames’ first-round pick (24th overall) in the 2007 NHL draft and made his NHL debut on January 8, 2009, against the New York Islanders.

As Backlund developed in Calgary, he became known for his hockey IQ, defensive reliability, penalty-killing strength and ability to drive play at both ends of the ice. He represented Sweden at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey, following that tournament with a breakout season in 2016-17 in which he posted a then-career-high 53 points and earned Selke Trophy consideration. In 2022-23, he set a new career high with 56 points (19G, 37A) and a team-best plus-minus rating of +24, while appearing in all 82 games for the Flames. That summer, the Vasteras, SWE, product won the King Clancy Memorial Trophy for his leadership and humanitarian contributions, and on September 21, 2023, was named the 21st captain in franchise history.



Backlund became the 19th player of Swedish descent — and the 397th skater in NHL history — to reach 1,000 NHL games, hitting the mark Oct. 30 in Utah. He was also just the second player to skate his first 1,000 games with the Flames, joining Jarome Iginla. He now looks to join Iginla once again as the second skater in franchise history to reach 1,100 games played with Calgary.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

The Flames (60-32-17 in 109 GP) own an all-time points percentage of .628 against the Wild, which is their fourth-best percentage against any active franchise. The only teams they have a higher percentage against are the Kraken (.733, 10-3-2 in 15 GP), Devils (.711; 74-26-14 in 114 GP) and the Panthers (.652; 27-13-6 in 46 GP).

With Thursday’s win against Minnesota, Calgary snapped an opponent’s point streak of 12-plus games for the third time in the past decade, following Florida in 2015-16 (13 GP) and Los Angeles in 2022-23 (12 GP).
