Post-Game Notes

- The Tampa Bay Lightning defeated the Boston Bruins 5-4 in overtime on Monday night at AMALIE Arena.
- The Lightning improved to 9-6-4 overall this season, including a home record of 6-2-2.
- The Lightning won their first game decided in overtime since December 3, 2022 versus Toronto.
- Tampa Bay had lost eight consecutive games decided in overtime prior to Monday night.
- The Lightning scored on their first shot in five overtime games this season after being outshot 14-0 over their first four overtime games.
- The Bolts improved to 3-2-3 against Atlantic Division opponents and 4-4-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.
- The Lightning moved to 4-5-1 over their last 10 games against Boston and to 6-3-1 over their last 10 home matchups with the Bruins.
- The Bolts outshot Boston 46-26, including a 19-12 advantage in the first period and a 14-4 advantage in the third period.
- The Bolts' 19 shots in the first were the most they have taken in a single period this season and their 46 shots overall were the most they've recorded in a single game this season.
- Nikita Kucherov led the Lightning with seven shots on goal.
- 15 of 18 Lightning skaters recorded at least one shot on goal.

- ❑ Mikey Eyssimont recorded six shots on goal, tied for the second-most of his career.
- ❑ Brandon Hagel recorded five shots on goal, tied for the third-most of his career.
- ❑ Steven Stamkos led the Lightning going 6/7 at the faceoff dot.
- ❑ Lightning goaltender Jonas Johansson made 22 saves on 26 shots and improved to 8-4-4 this season.
- ❑ Tanner Jeannot opened the scoring on Monday night, knocking in a rebound that came loose in the crease. The goal gave the Lightning a 1-0 lead at 6:39 of the first period.
- ❑ Jeannot picked up his fourth goal of the season and second goal in two games. The goal marked Jeannot's eighth point of the season.
- ❑ Last year, Jeannot tallied six goals through 76 games.
- ❑ The Lightning improved to 6-1-0 record when scoring first in 2023-24.
- ❑ Tyler Motte picked up the primary assist, marking his first point in a Lightning sweater.
- ❑ Mikey Eyssimont tallied the secondary assist, marking his seventh point of the season (4-3—7).
- ❑ Pavel Zacha tied the game 1-1 at 9:55 of the first period.
- ❑ Nick Paul redirected a shot from the point to tally his fifth power-play goal of the season, giving the Lightning a 2-1 lead with just under 30 seconds remaining in the second period.
- ❑ Paul's goal was his eighth of the season and his 11th point.
- ❑ Mikhail Sergachev notched the primary assist, extending his point streak to three games (2-4—6). Sergachev's assist marked his 14th point of the campaign (2-12—14) and his sixth power-play point (0-6—6).
- ❑ Steven Stamkos recorded his 19th point of the season (6-13—19) and his 11th on the power play (2-9—11) with the secondary assist on Paul's goal.
- ❑ The Bruins got two goals in one minute and 21 seconds from David Pastrnak and John Beecher to take a 3-2 lead, with just over 11 minutes to go in the third.

- ❑ Austin Watson scored his first goal as a Bolt to tie the game 3-3 at 8:43 of the third period, just 56 seconds after the Bruins scored to take a 3-2 lead.
- ❑ Anthony Cirelli recorded his eighth point of the season (2-6—8) with the lone assist on Watson's game-tying goal.
- ❑ Charlie Coyle scored with 3:51 remaining in regulation too give Boston a 4-3 lead.
- ❑ Steven Stamkos scored with 4.8 seconds remaining in the third period to tie the game 4-4 and send it to overtime.
- ❑ The goal marked Stamkos' 20th point of the season (7-13—20) and his second point of the game.
- ❑ Stamkos' goal marked the fifth contest of 2023-24 to feature four game-tying goals between both teams.
- ❑ Steven Stamkos scored his fourth game-tying goal in the final minute of regulation, passing Alexander Selivanov for the most in Lightning history.
- ❑ Steven Stamkos finished the contests with 1-1—2 to improve his career totals against the Bruins to 28-13—41 (50 GP) and now has 40 points against 14 different franchises. Stamkos became the fourth active player to record at least 40 points against as many franchise, joining Alex Ovechkin (14), Evgeni Malkin (16) and Sidney Crosby (15).
- ❑ Steven Stamkos scored his second career game-tying goal in the final 10 seconds of regulation (also Oct. 18, 2016). Only three players in NHL history have scored more: Mario Lemieux (3), Bill Guerin (3) and Wayne Simmonds (3).
- ❑ Stamkos has pointed in 10 of his last 13 games against the Bruins (9-6—14).
- ❑ Nikita Kucherov recorded the primary assist, marking his 28th point of the season (13-15—28).
- ❑ Brandon Hagel registered his ninth assist and 17th point of the season with the secondary helper on Stamkos' game-tying goal.
- ❑ At 1:19 of overtime, Brandon Hagel broke loose and scored five-hole on a breakaway to give the Lightning a 5-4 win, the Bolts' first overtime win this season.
- ❑ The goal marked Hagel's 18th point of the season (9-9—18).

- Victor Hedman (4-16—20) and Brayden Point (7-16—23) each picked up an assist on the game-winning goal.
- Brayden Point has found the scoresheet in eight of his last 12 games against Boston (4-7—11).
- The Bolts will play the Winnipeg Jets in their third and final game of a three-game homestand on Wednesday Night at AMALIE Arena (7:00pm).
- The Lightning are 49-34-9 with four ties all-time against the Jets' franchise, including a home record of 30-13-4 with one tie.
