## TEAM NOTES

- The Tampa Bay Lightning fell by a score of 4-1 to the Vancouver Canucks on Tuesday night at Rogers Arena.
- The Bolts slid to 13-12-5 overall and 5-9-2 on the road...Tampa Bay is 1-5-0 over its last six road games.
- Tampa Bay had its seven-game winning streak against Vancouver ended... The Lightning are 8-2-0 over their last 10 games against the Canucks and 8-2-0 over their last 10 games at Vancouver.
- The Lightning lost in regulation to a Pacific Division opponent for the first time this season and moved to 4-1-1 in those games...Tampa Bay fell to 7-7-2 against Western Conference opponents.
- The Tampa Bay Lightning scored the game-opening goal for the fifth consecutive game...Tampa Bay moved to 9-4-0 when scoring first.
- The Lightning outshot Vancouver 29-22, including an 11-4 advantage in the first and a 13-4 advantage in the second period...Tampa Bay fell to 9-8-1 when outshooting its opponent.
- the Canucks improved to 16-0-0 this season when leading after two periods of play, conversely the Lightning slid to 1-10-2 when trailing after two periods.

#### **PLAYER NOTES**

- **Brayden Point** scored the game-opening goal, his 3<sup>rd</sup> game-opening goal of the season, tying Nikita Kucherov and Anthony Cirelli for the team lead...Point's goal was his 13<sup>th</sup> of the season and his 32<sup>nd</sup> point...Point extended his point streak to four games against Vancouver (2-4—6) and has 13 points over the last nine meetings (5-8—13)...
- Mikhail Sergachev tallied an assist to mark his 18<sup>th</sup> point of the season (2-16—18)...Dished out three hits and blocked two shots, both tied for the team lead on Tuesday night...Sergachev registered a season-high of 26:37 time on ice in Victor Hedman's absence.
- Brandon Hagel notched his fourth assist over his last three games and his 27<sup>th</sup> point of the season (10-17—27)...Hagel has found the scoresheet in each of his four career games against the Canucks (1-4—5).
- Nikita Kucherov set a season-high with 26:16 time on ice...Kucherov led Tampa Bay with five shots on goal.
- Luke Glendening paved the way for Tampa Bay in the faceoff circle, winning eight of the 12 draws he took.
- Mitchell Chaffee made his Lightning debut on Tuesday night and recorded two hits and one block in 6:56 time on ice...Chaffee was recalled from AHL Syracuse on December 12...Chaffee was tied for the Crunch lead in scoring with nine goals and 19 assists in 21 games...Chaffee appeared in just his third career NHL game.
- Andrei Vasilevskiy stopped 18 of the 21 saves he faced in defeat...Vasilevskiy's record dropped to 4-4-0 over his first eight starts this season
- **Brock Boeser** tallied his second natural hat trick of the season to lead the Canucks to a 4-1 victory on Tuesday night...The only other player in Canucks history with as many is Petri Skriko (Nov. 18 & 21, 1986)...Boeser joins Brayden Point and four others as the only skaters in the NHL this season with multiple hat tricks...Boeser and Toronto's Auston Matthews became the first two skaters to reach 20 goals this season...The 2023-24 season marked the second in League history where each of the first two 20-goal scorers were U.S.-born players, following 1998-99 (Tony Amonte & John LeClair).
- Quinn Hughes recorded three assists to regain sole possession of the NHL lead for assists with 30.
