SERIES SUMMARY: Vegas won Game 1, 4-2, at T-Mobile Arena (4/20); Game 4, 4-3, in overtime at Xcel Energy Center (4/26) and Game 5, 3-2, in overtime back in Las Vegas (4/29)...The Wild earned a 5-2 victory in Game 2 at T-Mobile Arena (4/22) before posting a 5-2 win at Xcel Energy Center in Game 3 (4/24)...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** leads Minnesota with nine points (5-4=9)...LW **Matt Boldy** owns seven points (5-2=6)...C **Ryan Hartman** has four assists (0-3=3)...G **Filip Gustavsson** owns a 2-2 record with a 2.63 GAA and a .919 SV% in starting all five games for the Wild...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** entered in relief in Game 5 and saved 6-of-7 shots faced in the third period and overtime...C **Tomas Hertl** leads Vegas with five points (3-2=5)...C **Jack Eichel** (0-3=3), D **Noah Hanifan** (1-2=3), D **Alex Pietrangelo** (1-2=3) and C **Nicolas Roy** (1-2=3) each have three points for the Golden Knights...G **Adin Hill** is 3-2 with a 3.00 GAA and .865 SV% in starting all four games...G **Akira Schmid** stopped 9-of-9 shots faced in relief in Game 3.

2024-25 REGULAR SEASON: Minnesota went 0-3-0 against Vegas in the regular season...The Golden Knights won the series-opening contest, 3-2, in St. Paul (12/15), the second game, 4-1, at T-Mobile Arena (1/12) and the third meeting, 5-1, at Xcel Energy Center (3/25)...RW **Mats Zuccarello** led the Wild with three points (0-3=3)...G **Jesper Wallstedt** saved 24-of-27 shots faced while making his season debut for Minnesota in the first game...Gustavsson started the second contest and stopped 33-of-37 shots faced...Fleury saved 33-of-37 shots faced in the third meeting...Eichel (3-2=5), RW **Mark Stone** (0-5=5) and D **Shea Theodore** (1-3=4) paced Vegas with five points each...G **Ilya Samsonov** stopped 20-of-22 shots faced to earn the win for Vegas in the first meeting...Hill went 2-0-0 with a 1.00 GAA and a .950 SV% in starting the final two contests.

WILD LEADERS: Kaprizov (10-5=15 in 16 games) and C **Joel Eriksson Ek** (7-8=15 in 24 games) both own 15 career points against Vegas...D **Jonas Brodin** (3-10=13 in 25 matches), C **Gustav Nyquist** (6-7=13 in 15 games) and Zuccarello (4-9=13 in 24 games) each have 13 points.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 1-4-0 with a 4.33 GAA and a .877 SV% in five career starts against Vegas...Gustavsson is 1-3-1 with a 2.76 GAA and a .911 SV% in six career games (five starts)...Wallstedt is 0-1-0 with a 3.12 GAA and a .889 SV% in his lone start.

GOLDEN KNIGHTS LEADERS: LW **Brandon Saad** (14-14=28 in 50 games) and Stone (5-23-28 in 24 games) lead the Golden Knights with 28 career points vs. the Wild...D **Alex Pietrangelo** owns 27 points (9-18=27) in 56 career games vs. Minnesota...Hertl owns 25 points (11-14=25) in 32 games.

GOLDEN KNIGHTS GOALIES: Hill is 3-4-0 with a 2.29 GAA and a .906 SV in eight career games (six starts) vs. the Wild...Samsonov is 3-0-0 with a 2.32 GAA and a .911 SV% in three starts...G **Akira Schmid** has not faced Minnesota in regular-season play.

CONNECTIONS: Fleury went 117-60-14 with a 2.41 GAA, a .917 SV% and 23 shutouts in 192 games with Vegas (2017-21)...D **Jon Merrill** collected 25 points (6-19=25) in 140 games with the Golden Knights in parts of three seasons (2017-20)...Vegas D **Zach Whitecloud** played two seasons (2016-18) at Bemidji State University...Vegas Assistant Coach **Joel Ward** made his NHL debut with Minnesota and appeared in 11 games with the Wild in 2006-07.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota ranks fifth in the NHL in points (30) and fourth in wins (13) all-time against Vegas.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Played the 23rd overtime game in franchise SCP history in Game 5 (4/29) and now owns an 10-13 all-time SCP overtime record.

Matt Boldy: Scored a goal at Vegas (4/29)...Ranks T-1st in the SCP in goals (five) and T-8th in points (5-2=7)...Leads all SCP forwards with a 24:57 TOI/G average...Recorded a game-high 33:08 time-on-ice total vs. Vegas (4/26), setting a SCP franchise record among forwards...Opened the SCP with three-game multi-point and goal streaks.

Jonas Brodin: T-1st in franchise history in SCP games played (72 w/ Spurgeon) and ranks fifth in SCP assists (15).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Ranks T-2nd in SCP with 69 face offs won (69-of-126, 54.8 pct.)...Posted his third career multi-point game in postseason play with two assists (0-2=2) at VGK (4/29).

Brock Faber: Ranks third in the SCP with a 27:45 TOI/G average...Posted a 33:07 TOI total vs. VGK (4/26), the second-highest of any game in his career (33:28, 4/12/25 at VAN).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Entered in relief at VGK (4/29) and has now seen action in 18 postseasons, moving past Martin Brodeur and Patrick Roy (17 postseasons) for the most total Stanley Cup Playoff years by a goalie in NHL history...Ranks third in NHL history among goaltenders in postseason games played (170), postseason saves (4,446) and minutes played (10,206:25), and T-3rd in postseason wins (92).

Marcus Foligno: Leads the SCP with 38 hits and is T-8th with three goals...Recorded a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) in Games 2-4, tied for the longest of his career (regular season or SCP).

Filip Gustavsson: Made 42 saves vs. VGK (4/26), the fifth-highest total in franchise postseason history...Recorded his fourth career SCP win vs. VGK (4/24), third most in franchise history...Ranks second in franchise SCP history with a .920 SV% and third with a 2.48 GAA.

Ryan Hartman: Recorded a four-game assist streak (0-4=4) in Games 1-4...Has nine points (2-7=9) in his last 10 SCP games played...Is the second player in Wild history to register at least one assist in each of the team's first four games of a playoff year, joining Zach Parise (0-5=5 in 4 GP; 2014).

Kirill Kaprizov: Scored a PPG at Vegas (4/29) to push his career SCP total to 15 goals, one shy of tying Zach Parise (16) for most in franchise history...Ranks first in franchise history with eight career postseason PPGs...Leads the SCP with three PPG and ranks T-1st with five goals and fourth with nine points (5-4=9)...Owns an active five-game point streak (5-4=9), a career long in SCP play, and tied with Mikael Granlund (5 GP in 2014) for the third-longest run in franchise SCP history...Posted 28:12 of TOI vs. VGK (4/26), the fourth-highest total by a forward in Wild history...Among forwards, now owns five of the top eight TOI totals in Wild SCP history.

Jake Middleton: Leads the SCP with 18 blocked shots.

Jared Spurgeon: Scored a goal vs. VGK (4/26) to reach nine career SCP goals and tie Jason Pominville for fifth in Wild history...T-2nd in the SCP with a plus-6 rating...Ranks T-1st in team history in SCP games played (72, w/ Brodin) and ranks second with 30 playoff points (9-21=30)...Needs one postseason assist to pass Parise (16-21=37) for most in franchise history.

Yakov Trenin: Recorded a game-high seven hits at VGK (4/29) and ranks third in the SCP with 29 hits.

Mats Zuccarello: Played in the 100th SCP game of his career vs. VGK (4/26).

ROUND 1 NOTES

- **Kirill Kaprizov** and **Matt Boldy** each own five goals in the series, marking the second time in Wild history that multiple players have notched five-plus goals in a single series (also 2003 CSF, Marian Gaborik and Wes Walz).
- Played the 22nd and 23rd overtime games in franchise SCP history in Game 4 (4/26) and Game 5 (4/29) and now owns an 10-13 all-time SCP overtime record.
- Game 4 finished as the fourth-longest contest in franchise history (1:17:26).
- In Games 2-3, the Wild scored five-plus goals in consecutive playoff games for the fourth time in franchise history.
- Minnesota notched the third penalty-free postseason game in franchise history at VGK in Game 2 (4/22).
- The Wild blocked 30 shots at Vegas in Game 2 (4/22), tied for the second-highest total in franchise postseason history.
- The Wild scored three first-period goals in the postseason for the third time in franchise history at VGK in Game 2 (4/22).
- Finished with 54 hits at Vegas in Game 1 (4/20), the second-highest postseason total in franchise history (71, 5/16/21 at VGK).
- Finished with a 60.0 face off percentage (39-for-65) at Vegas in Game 1 (4/20), the franchise's fourth-highest win rate in postseason history.

TEAM NOTES



POSTSEASON NOTES

- The Minnesota Wild is appearing in the postseason for 14th time in franchise history, including 11 of the last 13 seasons.
- The Wild holds an all-time series record of 3-3 (.500) against division winners, with their wins taking place in the 2003 Conference Quarterfinals (vs. COL), 2014 Conference Quarterfinals (vs. COL) and 2015 First Round (vs. STL).
- G **Marc-Andre Fleury** has appeared in the Stanley Cup Playoffs for the 18th season of his career, moving past Martin Brodeur and Patrick Roy (17 postseasons) for the most total Stanley Cup Playoff years by a goalie in NHL history.
- **Fleury** ranks third in NHL history among goaltenders in postseason games played (170), postseason saves (4,446) and minutes played (10,206:25), and T-3rd in postseason wins (92).
- **Fleury** (2009, 2016, 2017, all with PIT) and D **Zach Bogosian** (2020 with TBL) have each previously won the Stanley Cup.
- **Kirill Kaprizov** owns the franchise record for goals in a Stanley Cup Playoff series with seven against St. Louis in the 2022 First Round. He owns 15 career postseason goals and needs one to tie Zach Parise (16) for the all-time franchise record.
- D **Jared Spurgeon** (9-21—30 in 72 GP) is the franchise's all-time leader for playoff goals, assists and points among defensemen, while D **Jonas Brodin** (2-15—17 in 72 GP) also ranks among the top five on each of those lists (outright or tied). Spurgeon needs one postseason assist to pass Zach Parise (16-21=37) for most in franchise history.
- D **Zeev Buium**, D **Declan Chisholm**, C **Marco Rossi** and G **Jesper Wallstedt** are each making their first trip to the Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- **Bogosian**, RW **Justin Brazeau**, C **Vinnie Hinostroza** and C **Yakov Trenin** are making their first Stanley Cup Playoff appearances as a member of the Minnesota Wild.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild went 29-0-0 when leading through two periods, the only NHL team with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Was 21-4-2 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild scored first in 45 games this season, tied for fourth-most in the NHL, and held a 31-11-3 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

- The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

MAGIC NUMBERS

- The Wild went 41-9-5 (.791) when scoring two-plus goals in regulation this season, the third-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- The Wild went 33-2-4 (.897) when allowing two or fewer goals in regulation this season, T-9th best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.

ON SPECIAL TEAMS

- The Wild ranked ninth in the NHL with a 26.2 power-play percentage (17-65) since February 8.
- Since March 11, the Wild ranked ninth in the NHL with a 82.5 penalty-kill percentage (33-40).

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

- The Wild recorded 21 comeback wins (trailed at any point) this season, T-5th most in the NHL.
- The Wild posted seven wins this season in games where it has trailed by two or more goals, fourth-most in the NHL. Minnesota owned a .214 point percentage (7-27-1) in games where it trailed by two-plus goals, T-4th best point percentage in the NHL.
- Minnesota owned a 9-30-5 (.261) record when trailing at any point in the third period. It's .261 point percentage in such situations ranked sixth-highest in the NHL.

ROAD DAWGS

- Recorded a 23-13-5 record on the road this season, establishing a franchise record with 51 road points.
- Ranked fourth in the NHL in road points, road point percentage (.622) and T-4th in road wins.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild is 16-4-2 this season (.773) when scoring first in a road game, the seventh-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 - 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 - 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** scored a PPG at Vegas (4/29) to push his career SCP total to 15 goals, one shy of tying Zach Parise (16) for most in franchise history.
- Ranks first in franchise history with eight career postseason PPGs.
- Leads the SCP with three PPG and ranks T-1st with five goals and fourth with nine points (5-4=9).
- Owns an active five-game point streak (5-4=9), a career long in SCP play, and tied with Mikael Granlund (5 GP in 2014) for the third-longest run in franchise SCP history
- Posted 28:12 of TOI vs. VGK (4/26), the fourth-highest total by a forward in Wild history. Among forwards, now owns five of the top eight TOI totals in Wild SCP history.
- Opened the SCP with a three-game multi-point streak, becoming one of three players in franchise history with three consecutive multi-point games in SCP (Boldy, 2025; Gaborik, 2003)
- Notched three points (2-1=3) at VGK (4/22) to become the first player in Wild history with multiple three-point SCP games, per NHL Stats. Also became the first player in Wild history with three career multi-goal SCP games, per NHL Stats.
- With two assists (0-2=2) at VGK (4/20), pushed his career postseason point total to 14 (10-4=14) in 20 games, the third-highest total in a player's first 20 playoff games with the franchise (Gaborik, 10-9=19; Parise, 5-12=17).
- Ranked second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-31=56) and fourth in assists (31).
- Returned from injury to record three points (2-1=3) vs. SJS (4/9), including the GWG in overtime, furthering his franchise record with his 39th career game with three-plus points.
- Recorded his 50th point of the season with a goal vs. CHI (12/23), established a new franchise mark for fewest games to 50 points in a season (34 GP), besting his previous mark set in 2021-22 (38 GP).
- Recorded 56 goals (tied with Sam Reinhart for most in the NHL) and 112 points (56-56=112, sixth in NHL) during the 2024 calendar year.
