MONTREAL CANADIENS

All-Time Wild Record: 21-7-3 (12-2-1 at Xcel Energy Center, 9-5-2 at Montreal)

2023-24: Minnesota swept the season series against Montreal...Minnesota won the series-opening game, 5-2, in Montreal (10/17) and claimed a 4-3 overtime victory in St. Paul (12/21)...LW Kirill Kaprizov led the Wild with six points (2-4=6)...RW Mats Zuccarello (0-3=3) and C Marco Rossi (1-2=3) each had three points...C Joel Eriksson Ek scored two goals (2-0=2)...G Marc-Andre Fleury saved 26-of-28 shots faced in the opening game...G Filip Gustavsson stopped 22-of-25 shots faced in the second meeting...D David Savard led Montreal with three points (1-2=3)...LW Cole Caufield (0-2=2) and C Nick Suzuki (1-1=2) had two points each...G Sam Montembeault went 0-1-1 with a 4.38 GAA and a .847 SV% in two starts.

WILD LEADERS: LW **Marcus Johansson** leads Minnesota with 23 points (5-18=23) in 32 career games vs. Montreal...LW **Marcus Foligno** (7-8=15, in 32 games) and D **Zach Bogosian** (4-11=15, in 45 games) have 15 points each...Zuccarello has 12 points (2-10=12) in 26 games...Kaprizov owns 11 points (4-7=11) in six games.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 27-13-6 with a 2.91 GAA, a .904 SV% and two shutouts in 47 career starts vs. Montreal...Gustavsson is 1-2-1 with a 3.64 GAA and a .884 SV% in four starts against the Canadiens.

CANADIENS LEADERS: Savard has 10 points (5-5=10) in 22 games...C **Christian Dvorak** (2-6=8, in 23 games) and LW **Brendan Gallagher** (5-3=8, in 16 games) have eight points each.

CANADIENS GOALIES: Montembeault is 1-1-1 with a 3.60 GAA and a .872 SV% in three career starts vs. the Wild...G **Cayden Primau** is 0-1-0 with a 7.50 GAA and a .844 SV% in one career start vs. Minnesota (1/24/22).

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota Goaltending Coach **Frederic Chabot** went 1-4-1 with a 2.63 GAA and a .899 SV% in 16 games (seven starts) with the Canadiens in parts of four seasons (1990-91; 1992-94; 1998-99)...C **Frederick Gaudreau** hails from Bromont, Quebec...Fleury is from Sorel, Quebec...D **Jon Merrill** skated in 13 games for Montreal in 2020-21.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota is 16-1-0 in its last 17 games vs. the Canadiens, and is on a seven game winning streak since 10/20/19...The seven-game win streak is the Wild's longest active winning streak vs. a single opponent...The Wild recorded a nine-game win streak against Montreal (12/3/14-1/7/19), out scoring the Canadiens, 36-10...Minnesota has won the last 10 games played at Xcel Energy Center (11/1/13 - 12/21/23), the team's longest active home win streak against an opponent and tied for the sixth-longest active home winning streak vs. a single opponent in the NHL.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: With a 10-2-3 record, ranks T-2nd in the NHL in wins, third with a .786 point percentage and T-3rd with 23 points...23 points through 15 games marks the best 15-game start in franchise history...Has scored 53 goals this season, most in franchise history through the first 15 games of a season...Third in the NHL with a 2.53 GAA, fifth with a .911 SV%, T-6th with a plus-15 goal differential and seventh with 3.53 goals/game...Leads the NHL with 16 road points (7-1-2) and is T-1st with seven road victories...Ranks third in the NHL with a plus-15 goal differential on the road.

Matt Boldy: T-1st in the NHL with four GWG and T-5th with four power-play goals . . . T-12th in the NHL with nine goals this season. . . T-4th in the NHL with seven goals since 10/22.

Jonas Brodin: Needs one goal to move out of a tie with Brent Burns and Ryan Suter (55 goals each) for third-most goals by defenseman in franchise history (Spurgeon, 110: Dumba. 79).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Played in the 1,029th game of his NHL career at SJS (11/7), tied with Patrick Roy for third-most all time among NHL goaltenders (Brodeur, 1,266; Luongo, 1,044).

Marcus Foligno: Currently at 299 career points (129-170=299)...Seventh in the NHL with 55 hits this season...Has scored three goals on six shots this season.

Proof Fahor, Currently at 29 career games played. Papers seventh in the NHL

Brock Faber: Currently at 99 career games played...Ranks seventh in the NHL with 25:08 of TOI/G.

Freddy Gaudreau: Recorded a career-long six-game point and assist streak (2-6=8) from 10/29 - 11/8.

Filip Gustavsson: Owns a 7-2-2 record through 11 starts, ranking fourth in the NHL in GAA (2.27), sixth in SV% (.919) and T-6th in wins among qualified goalies...Has allowed two or fewer goals in eight starts this season, T-1st in the NHL.

Kirill Kaprizov: Leads the NHL with 20 even-strength points (7-13=20) and 21 points on the road (6-15=21) this season while ranking T-1st with 10 multi-point games and a plus-14 rating, second with 28 points (9-19=28) and 1.87 points/ game and T-2nd with 15 assists...Third among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:10)... Owns an active nine-game point streak on the road since 10/15 (6-15=21)... Posted a multi-point streak of eight games on the road (6-14=20) from 10/15 -11/8, joining Steven Stamkos (8 GP in 2017-18) and Roman Josi (8 GP in 2021-22) as the only active players to achieve the mark... With three points (2-1=3) in the 292nd game of his career at ANA (11/8), tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to record 100 multi-point games (Crosby - 235 games; McDavid -270 games; Ovechkin - 272 games; Kaprizov - 292 games; Malkin - 292 games)... With a PPG at ANA (11/8), tied Mikko Koivu (60 PPG) for second-most all-time in franchise history (Parise, 69 PPG)...Also notched the 24th GWG of his career at ANA (11/8), moving past Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fourth-most in franchise history... With three assists (0-3=3) at SJS (11/7), recorded his eighth career three-assist game and tied Mats Zuccarello and Pierre-Marc Bouchard for the second most in franchise history (Mikko Koivu, 16 three-assist games).

Jakub Lauko: Currently at 98 career games played...Recorded seven hits at CHI (10/10), the second-highest single game total in his NHL career.

Jake Middleton: T-3rd in the NHL with a plus-13 rating...T-9th among NHL defensemen with three goals...T-10th in the NHL with 39 blocked shots this season.

Marco Rossi: Has recorded a point in 11 of 15 games (4-9=13) this season.

TEAM NOTES



HOT START

 With 23 points (10-2-3) through 15 games this season, The Wild has recorded its best 15-game start in franchise history.

- Minnesota has recorded 53 goals through its first 15 game this season, most in franchise history.
- The Wild began the season with a seven-game season-opening point streak (5-0-2) from 10/10 - 10/24, marking the fourth time in franchise history achieving the mark following 2007-08 (7-0-1 in 8 GP), 2008-09 (6-0-1 in 7 GP) and 2001-02 (3-0-4 in 7 GP).
- Of the 121 previous teams in NHL history to record 16 points or more in a season's first 10 games, 87 have made the playoffs.
- Of the 60 previous occurrences of a season-opening seven-game point streak in NHL history, 53 teams made the playoffs. 13 of those teams won the Stanley Cup.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild has allowed eight first-period goals this season, third-fewest in the NHL. Minnesota owns a plus-7 goal differential (13 goals for, six goal against) in the first period this season, T-6th in the NHL.
- The Wild is 7-0-0 when leading through two periods and 7-0-1 when leading through one period this season.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

• The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Minnesota leads the NHL with 16 road points (7-1-2) and is T-1st with seven road victories this season.
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, this season marked the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark.

YOUNG GUNS

- The Wild ranks fifth in the NHL with 40 points (15-25=40) registered by players aged 23 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Faber, Khusnutdinov, Rossi).
- Matt Boldy is T-3rd among NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 16 points (9-7=16) and nine goals.
- Minnesota ranked second in the NHL last season with 0.42 rookie points scored per game played (min. 100 games played by rookie skaters).

- Minnesota ranks third in the NHL with a 2.53 GAA and fifth with a .911 SV%.
- The Wild has recorded 10 games allowing two-or-fewer goals this season, tied with Toronto for most in the NHL.
- The Wild is allowing 2.40 opponent power-play opportunities per game, the fourth-best mark in the NHL this season.

PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** leads the NHL with 20 even-strength points (7-13=20) and 21 points on the road (6-15=21) this season while ranking T-1st with 10 multi-point games and a plus-14 rating, second with 28 points (9-19=28) and 1.87 points/game and T-2nd with 15 assists.
- Third among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:10).
- With three points (2-1=3) in the 292nd game of his career at ANA (11/8), tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to record 100 multi-point games (Crosby 235 games; McDavid 270 games; Ovechkin 272 games; Kaprizov 292 games; Malkin 292 games). Tied Malkin and Glenn Anderson as the 27th fastest player in NHL history to reach the mark. Among Wild players, Marian Gaborik was previously the fastest to reach 100 multi-point games, doing so in 455 contests.
- Ranks third in Wild history with 100 multi-point games (Koivu, 153; Gaborik, 114).
- With a PPG at ANA (11/8), tied Mikko Koivu (60 PPG) for second-most all-time in franchise history (Parise, 69 PPG).
- With three assists (0-3=3) at SJS (11/7), recorded his eighth career three-assist game and tied Mats Zuccarello and Pierre-Marc Bouchard for the second most in franchise history (Mikko Koivu, 16 three-assist games).
- Currently with 37 career three-plus point games, notched his 35th game with three-plus points of his career with a three-point performance (2-1=3) vs. TBL (11/1) to move past Mikko Koivu (34 games) for most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov was named the NHL's Third Star of the Month for October (5-3=18 in 9 GP), averaging two points/game (first in NHL) and tallying a point in eight of nine contests to lead the Wild to a 6-1-2 record. Is the fourth Wild player to be named an NHL Star of the Month, joining Eric Staal, (First Star-Feb. 2018); Devan Dubnyk (4x) and Josh Harding (Third Star-Nov. 2013).
- Currently with 39 career multi-assist games, needs two more to tie Jared Spurgeon (41) for third-most in franchise history.
- Scored his 27th career game-opening goal at TBL (10/24) to pass Jason Zucker for the fourth most in Wild history.

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

 Kaprizov notched the 24th GWG of his career at ANA (11/8), moving past Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fourth-most in franchise history.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Owns an active nine-game point streak on the road since 10/15 (6-15=21).
- Kaprizov posted a multi-point streak of eight games on the road (6-14=20) from 10/15 - 11/8, joining Steven Stamkos (8 GP in 2017-18) and Roman Josi (8 GP in 2021-22) as the only active players to achieve the mark
- Kaprizov recorded seven-game multi-point and assist streaks (6-11=17) from 10/15 - 11/1.
- His streak of seven consecutive games with multiple points set a franchise record and T-4th longest in the NHL since the 2000-01 season.

PLAYER NOTES

CROWN JOEL

- Joel Eriksson Ek recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-2=5) from 10/22 - 10/26.
- Eriksson Ek played in his 500th career NHL game vs. SEA (10/12).
- Opened the season with a goal (1-0=1) and five hits vs. CBJ (10/10), tied for the ninth-highest single-game hit total of his career.
- Currently with 38 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs one PPG to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek ranked second on the Wild with 12 PPGs and a career-high 30 goals last season while ranking third in points (30-34=64).
- Became the 11th player in franchise history to record 30 goals in a single season, reaching the mark vs. SJS (3/28/24).
- Eriksson Ek posted an eight-game point streak (7-8=15) from 2/9/24 to 2/24/24, a career long.
- Posted a career-long four-game goal streak (7-4=11) from 2/12/24 to 2/19/24.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- Matt Boldy ranks T-1st in the NHL with four GWG, T-5th with four powerplay goals and T-12th with eight goals.
- Is T-4th in the NHL with seven goals since 10/22.
- Boldy recorded a four-game point streak (2-4=6) from 10/19 10/26.
- Reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.
- Boldy opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.
- Finished T-15th in the NHL with seven GWG in 2023-24.
- Finished 2023-24 second on the Wild with 69 points (29-40=69), reaching a new single-season career high with an assist at VGK (4/12).
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6/23). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- Filip Gustavsson owns a 7-2-2 record through 11 starts, ranking fourth in the NHL in GAA (2.27), sixth in SV% (.919) and T-6th in wins among qualified goalies.
- Has allowed two or fewer goals in eight starts this season, T-1st in the NHI
- Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 15 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 18 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.
- He is the 10th goalie to score a goal by shooting it into an empty net (the others were the last to touch an own-goal).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- Brock Faber is currently at 99 career games played.
- Ranks seventh in the NHL with 25:08 of TOI/G.
- Recorded a three-game point streak (2-1=3) from 10/26 11/1.
- Reached 50 career points (8-42=50) in his 89th career game at CBJ (10/19), becoming the second-fastest Wild defenseman to reach 50 points with the franchise (Ryan Suter, 83 games).
- Faber led all NHL rookies with 24:58 TOI per game and 150 blocked shots, ranked T-1st with 39 assists and third with 46 points (8-39=47). Faber finished sixth among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.
- With a blocked shot at LAK (4/15/24), became the ninth NHL rookie to post 150-plus blocks in a season since 2005-06.
- With two blocks at COL (3/8/24), reached 126 for the season and moved past Nate Prosser (124 blocked shots in 2011-12) for the highest single-season blocked shot total by a rookie in franchise history.
- With an assist vs. PIT (2/9/24), moved his season point total to 4-27=31
 and surpassed Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the highest singleseason point total by a Wild rookie defenseman. Also moved past Calen
 Addison (26 assists in 2022-23) for most single-season assists by a
 Wild rookie.
