



**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP**

**October 3, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. WINNIPEG JETS [5] (SO)**

The Calgary Flames wrapped up their 2025 pre-season by welcoming the Winnipeg Jets to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Friday night. Just 7:04 into the contest, Nazem Kadri received a slick feed from Adam Klapka and buried the game's opening goal to put the home side ahead. Later in the frame, Matvei Gridin found himself alone in the slot and made a smooth move to the backhand to fool Connor Hellebuyck, doubling the Flames' advantage. Winnipeg drew within one with under five minutes remaining in the first, but Joel Hanley restored the Flames' two-goal edge as Calgary skated into the breakup 3-1. In the middle stanza, both teams traded goals — a Gustav Nyquist tally was canceled out by Kadri's second of the night — making it 4-2 Flames through 40 minutes. In the third, the Jets scored twice to level things, sending the game to overtime. After the extra frame solved nothing, it took a 14-shooter shootout for the Jets to prevail, knocking off the Flames 5-4.

## **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the first of four meetings this season between the Flames and Oilers. Calgary went 1-1-1 against Edmonton in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; in 2024-25, the Flames had a record of 16-4-6 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 26-16-8 against Western Conference opponents.

### **2024-25 BATTLE OF ALBERTA:**

The Flames and Oilers met in three Battle of Alberta's during the 2024-25 season:

#### *Game One (October 13<sup>th</sup>):*

The Calgary Flames headed north to Edmonton for round one of the Battle of Alberta back on October 13<sup>th</sup>. Edmonton would score the only goal of the first with Jeff Skinner giving the Oilers a 1-0 lead through 20. In the second, Rasmus Andersson would draw the Flames level with a slick individual effort, and nothing could separate these clubs through 40. In the third, Anthony Mantha would elevate a backhand over the shoulder of Stuart Skinner and in to give the Flames their first lead of the night, before Justin Kirkland doubled the Flames advantage with his first NHL goal. Calgary would shut the door from there, Connor Zary added an empty netter, and the Flames took round one 4-1.

#### *Game Two (November 3<sup>rd</sup>):*

Matchup number two came at the Scotiabank Saddledome on November 3<sup>rd</sup>. The visitors would open the scoring 20 seconds into the contest, before doubling their advantage midway through the opening frame to lead 2-0 through 20. Calgary would get one back in the middle stanza and trailed 2-1 through 40. Yegor Sharangovich brought the Flames back to level terms 4:28 into the third with his first of the season. Edmonton would reclaim the lead midway through the third and add an empty netter to knock off Calgary 4-2.

#### *Game Three (March 29<sup>th</sup>):*

The final edition of the Battle of Alberta in 2024-25 came at Rogers Place. Yegor Sharangovich opened the scoring for Calgary in the first period, with Nazem Kadri recording an assist to register his 700<sup>th</sup> NHL point. Edmonton answered in the second period with Viktor Arvidsson tying the game to deadlock things through 40. In the third, Brayden Pachal gave Calgary the lead with a goal set up by Kadri, but Edmonton again tied it late in regulation. The game was ultimately decided in overtime when the Oilers prevailed.

### **HITTIN' THE GRIDDY:**

19-year-old forward Matvei Gridin is looking to make his NHL debut tonight in Edmonton after making the Flames opening-night roster. The 2024 first round pick registered three goals in six pre-season tilts, with only nine other skaters in the NHL recording more goals than him in pre-season action. Gridin spent the 2024-25 season with the QMJHL's Shawinigan Cataractes, scoring 36 goals and 43 assists for a team-leading 79 points in 56 games. The Kurgan, RUS native posted the most goals, assists and points by a rookie, being named the QMJHL's Rookie of the Year. Gridin would also be named to both the QMJHL and CHL All-Rookie Team's in 2024-25.

### **KIRKLAND SIGNATURE:**

Justin Kirkland scored his first NHL goal in Edmonton last season 10 years after being drafted by the Nashville Predators 62<sup>nd</sup> overall in 2014. At the time, Kirkland joined Gregory Hofmann (Oct. 25, 2021), Christopher DiDomenico (Oct. 27, 2017) and Mario Kempe (Oct. 14, 2017) as the fourth skater over the past 10 years to score their first NHL goal 10 years after being drafted. He also became the 7<sup>th</sup>-oldest Calgary Flame to get their first NHL goal.

### **KADRI 1KOUNTDOWN:**

Nazem Kadri enters the 2025-26 season with 985 games played, sitting 15 away from his 1,000<sup>th</sup> NHL game. In his career, Kadri has scored 307 goals and 403 assists for 710 points, along with 760 penalty minutes. The 35-year-old was selected seventh overall in the 2009 NHL Draft by the Toronto Maple Leafs, a club he played his first 561 NHL contests with. A trade in the summer of 2019 would send him to Colorado, where he would help the Avalanche win the 2022 Stanley Cup. The London, ON native joined the Flames as a free agent in August of 2022 and is looking to become the 13<sup>th</sup> player to play their 1,000<sup>th</sup> career regular-season game as a member of the Flames franchise:

### HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In Calgary's last trip to Rogers Place on March 29<sup>th</sup>, 2025, Morgan Frost skated in his 300<sup>th</sup> NHL game. Nazem Kadri also registered a pair of assists to record his 700<sup>th</sup> and 701<sup>st</sup> NHL points.

### FLAMES SUMMER 25' RECAP:

**May 3:** Re-signed RW Matt Coronato to a seven-year extension.

In his third professional season, and his first complete NHL campaign, Coronato set career highs in 77 games played with Calgary in 2024-25. The 22-year-old right winger recorded 47 points from 24 goals and 23 assists, including five powerplay goals and four game winners. He finished third on the Flames in both points and goals, trailing only Nazem Kadri and Jonathan Huberdeau.

**May 30:** Named Trent Cull assistant coach.

Trent Cull was in his second year as head coach with the Calgary Wranglers at the time of his interim appointment to the Flames on December 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024. During his time on the NHL bench, the Flames penalty kill improved from 29<sup>th</sup> in the league to 15<sup>th</sup> (December 23<sup>rd</sup> – April 17<sup>th</sup>). Before his recall, Cull led the Wranglers to a 20-8-1 record, 41 points and a .707 points percentage (1<sup>st</sup> in the AHL). As a result, the Wranglers coaching staff were selected to represent the Pacific Division at the 2025 AHL All-Star Game.

**June 10:** Re-signed RW Adam Klapka to a two-year extension.

Klapka skated in 31 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring six goals and four assists for 10 points along with 29 penalty minutes. From April 1<sup>st</sup> until April 17<sup>th</sup>, Klapka would record three goals and three assists for six points which ranked sixth on the team during the Flames final nine games. He also averaged a career-high 12:43 of ice time while registering a team-leading 32 hits during the month of April.

**Jun. 16:** Named Peter Hanlon assistant general manager.

Peter Hanlon began his managerial career with the Toronto Maple Leafs' American League franchise in St. John's, Newfoundland. He was then recruited to work at the AHL head office in Springfield, Mass. before joining the Flames to begin the 1997-98 season. He has international experience having represented Team Canada at the 2002 Olympics, World Championships, and the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

**Jun. 23:** Re-signed C Justin Kirkland to a one-year contract extension.

Justin Kirkland skated in 21 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring two goals and six assists for eight points before an injury at the end of November sidelined him for the remainder of the season. The 28-year-old scored his first NHL goal this past season on October 13<sup>th</sup> in Edmonton. He would go 3/4 in shootout attempts in 2024-25 with his 75% success rate in shootouts leading all Flames with at least two attempts.

**Jun. 28:** Re-signed D Kevin Bahl to a six-year contract extension.

Kevin Bahl skated in 73 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring three goals and adding 17 assists for 20 points and 35 penalty minutes. The 25-year-old defender averaged 21:23 of ice time this season which was the third highest total on the Flames. Bahl was originally acquired by Calgary on June 19, 2024 from New Jersey along with a 2025 first-round (Cole Reschny) in exchange for goalie Jacob Markstrom.

**Jul. 1:** Re-signed D Joel Hanley to a two-year contract extension.

Hanley skated in 53 games with the Flames in 2024-25, scoring two goals and seven assists for nine points. Hanley's 53 games were a career-high and the 34-year-old finished the season with a career-best +12 while averaging 18:35 of ice time.

**Jul. 3:** Re-signed C Morgan Frost to a two-year contract extension.

Frost was acquired by Calgary from Philadelphia on January 31st, 2025 and would skate in 32 games in a Flames sweater, scoring three goals and nine assists for 12 points. The 26-year-old averaged 16:37 of ice time with the Flames to set a new career high. He was a first round pick (27th overall) by Philadelphia in the 2017 NHL Draft.

**Jul. 30:** Re-signed C Martin Pospisil to a three-year contract extension.

Martin Pospisil, a native of Zvolen, SVK played 81 games for the Flames in 2024-25, registering a career-best 25 points from four goals and 21 assists along with 84 penalty minutes. Since making his NHL debut during the 2023-24 season, Pospisil has recorded 539 hits to lead all Flames over the past two seasons as well as rank third in the NHL in hits since he entered the league on November 4th, 2023. The 25-year-old was named to Slovakia's preliminary roster for the 2026 Olympic Winter Games in Milano and Cortina, Italy

**Sep. 2:** Named Dave Lowry assistant coach

Dave Lowry, a native of Sudbury, ON, spent the past three seasons as an assistant coach with the Seattle Kraken from 2022 through 2025. He previously spent time as an assistant coach with the Winnipeg Jets, Los Angeles Kings, and Calgary Flames throughout his NHL coaching tenure. During his playing career, Lowry spent nineteen years in the NHL and amassed over 1,000 NHL games split between the Vancouver Canucks, St. Louis Blues, Florida Panthers, San Jose Sharks, and Calgary Flames. He would captain the Flames from 2000 to 2002.

**Sep. 6:** Re-signed C Connor Zary to a three-year contract extension.

Connor Zary, a native of Saskatoon, SK, played 54 games for the Flames in 2024-25, scoring 13 goals and 14 assists for 27 points. The 23-year-old has 117 games of NHL experience to his credit, scoring 27 goals and 34 assists for 61 points along with 36 penalty minutes. He was the Flames first round pick (24th overall) in the 2020 NHL Draft.

**Sep. 9:** Re-signed G Dustin Wolf to a seven-year contract extension.

Dustin Wolf appeared in 53 games for the Flames in 2024-25, posting a 29-16-8 record, with a .910 save-percentage and a 2.64 goals-against average. Wolf's 29 wins led all rookie goaltenders in the NHL last season, while also leading all freshman netminders in saves (1,409), and shutouts (3). Wolf finished the 2024-25 season second in Calder Memorial Trophy voting. His 2024-25 totals also placed him among all NHL goaltenders in save percentage (11<sup>th</sup>), wins (11<sup>th</sup>), and goals against average (16<sup>th</sup>).

**Sep. 17:** Re-signed C Mikael Backlund to a two-year contract extension.

Mikael Backlund has played his entire 1,066-game NHL career in Calgary and is the longest tenured active skater on the Flames. In 76 games last season, Backlund scored 15 goals and recorded 17 assists for 32 points. He has been one of the top conditioned players on the team throughout his career and ranked in the top three fittest Flames the past four years and finished first in testing last year.

**Oct 2.** Extended Head Coach Ryan Huska for two more seasons.

Ryan Huska has coached in the Flames organization since the 2014-15 season in which he was appointed head coach of the Flames' American Hockey League affiliate in Adirondack. He would go on to coach the Flames top prospects in Stockton, posting a 135-118-27 record in four years as an AHL bench boss. In 2018, Huska became an assistant coach with the Flames where he spent five seasons before becoming the 24th head coach in Flames franchise history on June 12, 2023. In his two prior seasons as the Flames Head Coach, Huska has led the club to a 79-66-19 record and coming within one point of a playoff appearance in 2024-25.
