**Post-Game Notes**

- The Tampa Bay Lightning snapped their three-game losing streak with a 4-2 win over the Chicago Blackhawks on Thursday night at United Center.
- The Bolts improved to 7-6-4 overall and to 3-4-2 on the road this season.
- Tampa Bay boosted its record to 2-2-0 against Pacific Division opponents and 4-2-1 against Western Conference opponents.
- The Lightning extended their point streak at Chicago to 15 games, dating back to April 3, 2011. The Bolts' run at United Center is the longest active road points streak against a single franchise.
- The Bolts won their first game in which they trailed after the first period and moved to 1-5-2 in those games.
- Tampa Bay outshot Chicago 30-15, including an 9-2 advantage in the third period, tied for the fewest shots on goal allowed in period by the Bolts this season (Oct. 10 vs NSH, 1<sup>st</sup> per.).
- The Lightning have only allowed less than 15 shots on goal on 12 occasions in franchise history (Last: Dec. 31, 2014 at BUF, 11 SOG).
- Brayden Point paced the Bolts with six shots on goal, a season high.
- Tampa Bay improved to 6-3-0 when outshooting its opponent.
- Tanner Jeannot dished out a game-high four hits.
- Mikhail Sergachev tied a game-high with three blocked shots.
- Lightning goaltender, Jonas Johansson made 13 saves on 15 shots and improved to 6-4-4 this season.

- ❑ Lukas Reichel scored a power-play goal at 12:59 of the first period to give the Blackhawks a 1-0 lead.
- ❑ Brayden Point scored a power-play goal at 4:40 of the first period to knot the score at one apiece.
- ❑ The goal was Point's seventh of the season and his fourth on the power play.
- ❑ Point recorded the 78<sup>th</sup> power-play goal of his career, the fifth-most in franchise history behind Nikita Kucherov (79).
- ❑ Victor Hedman tallied the primary assist to notch his 18<sup>th</sup> point of the season (3-15—18) and his sixth power-play point (1-5—6).
- ❑ Nikita Kucherov picked up the secondary assist and tallied his 24<sup>th</sup> point of the season (11-13—24) and his 11<sup>th</sup> on the power play (4-7—11).
- ❑ Kucherov has pointed in 12 of his 17 career games against the Blackhawks (6-12—18).
- ❑ Kucherov leads the Lightning in goals, points and power-play points.
- ❑ The Lightning had gone 146:50 without scoring a goal, the seventh-longest span without a goal in franchise history. It is the longest span of time without a goal since 2015-16 (156:03 over a three-game span Oct. 24-29).
- ❑ Mikhail Sergachev gave the Bolts a 2-1 lead, scoring his first goal of the season on a one timer from the left point.
- ❑ Sergachev became the second Lightning blueliner to score a goal this season.
- ❑ Brayden Point notched his second point of the night and his 20<sup>th</sup> point of the season (7-13—20) with the primary assist on Sergachev's goal.
- ❑ Point became the second Bolt this season to reach the 20-point mark along with Nikita Kucherov. The Lightning have multiple 20-point scorers through 17 games for the first time since 2017-18 (Kucherov & Steven Stamkos).
- ❑ Steven Stamkos collected his 16<sup>th</sup> point of the season (5-11—16) with the secondary assist on Sergachev's go-ahead goal.
- ❑ Stamkos has pointed in 11 of his last 13 games against Chicago (6-10—16).
- ❑ Corey Perry tied the game 2-2 just 2:09 into the third period.

- Victor Hedman scored his fourth goal of the season to give the Bolts a 3-2 lead at 11:53 of the third period, backhanding a shot that bounced off the end boards and in front of the net onto his stick.
- Hedman recorded his second point of the game, and 19<sup>th</sup> point of the season (4-15—19).
- Hedman's goal marked the first time this season the Lightning defense has scored two goals in a game.
- Hedman has picked up points in four-straight games against Chicago (1-5—6).
- Hedman scored the 147<sup>th</sup> goal of his career to tie Fredrik Olausson for fourth place on the NHL's all-time list among Swedish-born defensemen. The only players with more are Niklas Lidstrom (264), Erik Karlsson (183) and Borje Salming (150).
- Hedman's go-ahead goal would prove to be the game-winning goal, marking the 27<sup>th</sup> of his career. He passed Bobby Orr, Sandis Ozolinsh and Ed Jovanovski to tie Chris Pronger, John Carlson, Red Kelly and King Clancy for 34<sup>th</sup> on the NHL's all-time list among defensemen.
- Erik Cernak notched the primary assist on the goal, marking his fourth point of the season (0-4—4).
- Brayden Point found the scoresheet for the third time in the game with the secondary assist on Hedman's go-ahead goal.
- Point extended his point streak against the Blackhawks to eight games (6-8—14) and has found the scoresheet in 18 of his 21 career matchups with Chicago (12-17—29).
- Point registered his third three-point performance of the season and the 37<sup>th</sup> of his career.
- Brandon Hagel scored an empty-net goal to extend Tampa Bay's lead to 4-2.
- The goal marked Hagel's eighth goal and 16<sup>th</sup> point of the season.
- Hagel has found the scoresheet in each of his five career games against his former team with goals in four of those matchups (4-2—6).
- Mikhail Sergachev notched his second point of the game and 10<sup>th</sup> point of the season (1-9—10) with the lone assist on Hagel's goal.

- Sergachev recorded his second multi-point game of the season.
- Sergachev has pointed in eight of his last 10 games against the Blackhawks (2-11—13).
- The Lightning return home to begin a three-game homestand at AMALIE Arena on Saturday against the Edmonton Oilers (4:00pm puck drop).
- The Bolts are 19-20-3 with two ties all-time against Edmonton, including a home record of 13-7-1 with two ties.
