



FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

November 26, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [1] vs. TAMPA BAY LIGHTNING [5]

The Calgary Flames were overwhelmed early and never recovered in a 5–1 loss to the Tampa Bay Lightning on Wednesday night at Benchmark International Arena. Brandon Hagel opened the scoring just 39 seconds in, followed quickly by goals from Charle-Édouard D'Astous, Zengus Girgensons, and Declan Carlile as Tampa Bay jumped to out to a 4–0 lead before the midway point of the first. The middle frame would see both clubs post nine shots on goal, but the score remained the same through 40. The Flames pushed back with a strong third period shot surge and got on the board when Joel Farabee buried a shorthanded goal at 1:04, set up by John Beecher who recorded his first point as a member of the Calgary Flames while Yan Kuznetsov registered the other helper. Tampa Bay added one later to knock off the Flames.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Panthers. Calgary and Florida split their season-series in 2024-25, with the home team winning 3-0 on both occasions.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-2-2 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 4-2-2 against Eastern Conference opponents.

ANDY, YOU'RE A STAR:



Flames rearguard Rasmus Andersson was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending November 23. Andersson led the league with nine points (2G, 7A) in four games, helping the Flames go 3-1-0 from Nov. 18–23.

He opened the week with a goal and an assist in a 5–2 setback in Chicago on Nov. 18. The following night in Buffalo, he recorded three points — including the game's opening goal — becoming just the third Flames defenseman in the past 15 years to score on consecutive days, joining Noah Hanifin (Mar. 6–7, 2021) and Mark Giordano (3x; last: Jan. 18–19, 2018). Andersson then added two third period assists for his first three-point night of the week to close out a 6–2 win over the Sabres.

Back on home ice on Nov. 22, he registered an assist in a 3–2 shootout victory against the Dallas Stars. He capped the week with a three-assist outing — his ninth career three-point game and third career three-assist effort — in Calgary's 5–2 win over the Vancouver Canucks on Nov. 23. With that performance, Andersson moved past Dion Phaneuf and Dougie Hamilton and into a tie with Phil Housley for the fifth-most three-point games by a Flames defenceman and reached 247 career points, surpassing Jamie Macoun for sixth-most by a blueliner in franchise history.

The 29-year-old recorded a five-game point streak from Nov. 15 to Nov. 23, posting 10 points (2G, 8A), and is tied for 14th among NHL defensemen in scoring this season with 16 points (5G, 11A) while appearing in all 25 Flames games. His 16 points rank second on the team, behind only Nazem Kadri (4-14–18).

FLASHBACK FRIDAY:

Flames forward Morgan Frost made his NHL debut in Florida on November 19, 2019, as a member of the Philadelphia Flyers. Frost was recalled from the Flyers' AHL affiliate in Lehigh Valley the day prior and would go on to score his first NHL goal, beating Panthers netminder Sergei Bobrovsky with a slick short-side backhand. On the night, Frost totalled 14:16 of ice time and was named the game's Third Star.

A pair of current Calgary Flames were also involved in that contest. Joel Farabee, who was acquired along with Morgan Frost last January, was also in his rookie season with Philadelphia and logged 15:41 of ice time that night. Across the ice, Jonathan Huberdeau scored the insurance marker and finished with a +2 rating for Florida.

JOEL-SCORER:

Joel Farabee scored his second-career shorthanded goal on Wednesday in Tampa Bay and now has 99 goals through his NHL career and is aiming to become the fourth member of the 2018 NHL Draft class to hit the 100-goal milestone. The most recent player from the class to reach the century mark was teammate Yegor Sharangovich, who scored his 100th on Oct. 30 in Ottawa — a goal Farabee set up, recording the primary assist on the tally.



FLORIDA/CALGARY TIES:

Today's contest features several skaters who have spent time with both the Flames and Panthers organization.

Panthers forwards Sam Bennett, A.J. Greer, Cole Schwindt, and Matthew Tkachuk were all at one-point members of the Calgary Flames. Bennett was Calgary's first-round pick (4th overall) in the 2014 NHL Draft and spent seven seasons with the club. A.J. Greer was claimed off waivers and spent the 2023–24 campaign in Flames colours, skating in 59 games, while Cole Schwindt appeared in four contests for Calgary that same season. Matthew Tkachuk played for the Flames from 2016 to 2022, recording 382 points in 431 games.

Flames forwards Ryan Lomberg, Dryden Hunt, and Jonathan Huberdeau, along with defenceman MacKenzie Weegar, all spent time as members of the Panthers organization. Lomberg was part of Florida's 2024 Stanley Cup championship team and signed with Calgary for his second stint as a Flame in the summer of 2024. Dryden Hunt was signed by Florida as a free agent in March 2016 following five WHL seasons spent with the Regina Pats, Medicine Hat Tigers, and Moose Jaw Warriors, earning WHL Player of the Year honours in 2016. Hunt played his first three professional seasons with the Panthers from 2017–18 through 2019–20, skating in the first 63 games of his NHL career. MacKenzie Weegar and Johnathan Huberdeau were acquired by Calgary in the summer of 2022, with Weegar posting a career year in 2023–24 and Huberdeau finishing second on the team in scoring last season.

WEEGSY BABY:

MacKenzie Weegar enters today's game with 196 assists in his NHL career and is four away from reaching the 200-assist mark. With four more helpers, Weegar would become just the sixth defenceman in NHL history drafted in the seventh round (FLA – 206th overall in 2013) to register 200 NHL assists, and the only active seventh-round–selected rearguard to achieve the milestone. Only one other active seventh-round selection has more career helpers than Weegar — Devils winger Ondrej Palat (TBL – 208th overall in 2011), who has recorded 329 through his 848-game career.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman scored a goal and an assist on Sunday in Vancouver to record his 300th NHL point. Coleman is just the fourth Texas-native to reach the 400-point mark.

Coleman's goal would come shorthanded, giving him 20-career shorthanded goals. He is tied with Joel Armia and Sebastian Aho for the fourth most among active skaters, behind only Brad Marchand (36), Jean-Gabriel Pageau (23) and Jordan Staal (21).

NAZ-HIM:

Following his two-assist effort on Sunday night in Vancouver, Nazem Kadri became just the second different Flames player in the past 10 years to post three straight multi-assist games, doing so from Nov. 19 – Nov. 23. He joined Johnny Gaudreau who did so four times with Calgary, with his longest run of consecutive multi-assist games coming with a four-game streak from Dec. 2-8, 2018 (8A). Since arriving in Calgary for the 2022–23 season, Kadri (21) is one of only two Flames skaters to register 20-or-more multi-assist games, alongside Jonathan Huberdeau (25).

RING OF FIRE:

Morgan Frost and Connor Zary scored goals 35 seconds apart on Sunday in Vancouver, marking Calgary's second-fastest pair of goals this season. The Flames' quickest two-goal burst of 2025–26 came on November 11, when Matt Coronato and Rasmus Andersson found the back of the net just 25 seconds apart in St. Louis.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his assist on Blake Coleman's third-period marker in Vancouver on Sunday night, Mikael Backlund recorded the 33rd shorthanded point of his NHL career. The helper moved Backlund past Peter Forsberg (32) for the fifth-most shorthanded points by a Swedish-born player in NHL history.



HUBY DOO:

Jonathan Huberdeau has accumulated 794 points in his NHL career and is six shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (1,021) and Mark Scheifele (833). There are 25 active skaters who have surpassed 800 points in the NHL, with Florida's Brad Marchand being the only member of that list involved in today's afternoon affair.

Huberdeau was Florida's first-round pick (3rd overall) in 2011 and recorded 613 points with the Panthers over the first 10 seasons of his career, ranking second on the franchise's all-time scoring list.

MILESTONE NIGHT:

In Calgary and Florida's first meeting of 2024-25, MacKenzie Weegar — originally a Florida Panthers draft pick — skated in his 500th NHL game. At the time, he became just the fourth active seventh-round draft pick to reach 500 NHL games, joining Ondrej Palat (drafted 208th overall by TBL in 2011), Erik Haula (drafted 182nd overall by MIN in 2009), and Nic Dowd (drafted 198th overall by LAK in 2009).


Fellow Flames blueliner Joel Hanley also reached a milestone in that matchup, skating in his 200th NHL game. With the achievement, Hanley became the 17th active undrafted defenceman to appear in 200 NHL games. Dustin Wolf would make 32 saves in that game to post his second-career shutout.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

With his assist on Joel Farabee's goal on Wednesday in Tampa Bay, John Beecher recorded his first point as a Calgary Flame, and first career shorthanded point.

Rasmus Andersson's three-assist outing in Vancouver on Sunday tied the franchise mark for the most assists by a Flames defenceman in a road game against the Canucks. He joins Al MacInnis (Oct. 14, 1984), Gary Suter (2x: Jan. 15, 1988, and Nov. 19, 1990), and Zarley Zalapski (Apr. 30, 1995) as the only Calgary blueliners to accomplish the feat.
