2024-25: Minnesota won the series-opening game, 5-2, in San Jose (11/7)... LW Kirill Kaprizov led the Wild with three points (0-3=3)...LW Matt Boldy scored two goals (2-0=2)...G Marc-Andre Fleury saved 24-of-26 shots faced to earn the Win for Minnesota...C Macklin Celebrini (2-0=2) scored both goals for the Sharks, assisted each time by C Mikael Granlund (0-2=2) and D Henry Thrun (0-2=2)...G Vitek Vanecek stopped 26-of-30 shots faced for San Jose.

WILD LEADERS: RW Mats Zuccarello leads the Wild with 27 points (10-17=27) in 30 career contests against the Sharks... Kaprizov owns 21 points (10-11=21) in 17 games)...D **Jared Spurgeon** has 18 points (8-10=18) in 42 games...C Ryan Hartman owns 15 points (2-13=15) in 27 games.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 19-5-4 with a 1.88 GAA, a .939 SV% and three shutouts in 28 career starts vs. San Jose...G Filip Gustavsson is 2-1-1 with a 2.47 GAA and .939 SV% in four starts against the Sharks.

SHARKS LEADERS: C Logan Couture leads San Jose with 30 points (14-16=30) in 45 career games against Minnesota...RW **Tyler Toffoli** has 20 points (10-10=20) in 31 games...D Marc-Edouard Vlasic has 14 points (1-13=14) in 60 games...Granlund has 13 points (3-10=13) in 17 games.

SHARKS GOALIES: Vanecek is 2-1-2 with a 2.72 GAA and a .892 SV% in five starts against the Wild...G Alexandar Georgiev owns a 6-3-0 2.75 GAA and a .909 SV% in nine career starts...G Yaroslav Askarov has not faced Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota President of Hockey Operations and General Manager Bill Guerin skated in 16 games with San Jose during the 2006-07 season...D Jake Middleton recorded 12 points (3-9=12) and 82 PIM in 59 games for San Jose in parts of four seasons (2018-22)...Granlund was selected by Minnesota in the first round of the 2010 NHL Draft (9th overall) and tallied 317 points (93-224=317) in 461 games in parts of seven seasons with the Wild (2012-19)...C **Luke Kunin** was drafted by Minnesota in the first round (15th overall) of the 2016 NHL Draft and totaled 52 points (23-29=52) in 131 games in three seasons with the Wild (2017-20)...C Nico Sturm tallied 36 points (20-16=36) in 111 games in parts of four seasons with the Wild (2018-22).

FAST FACTS: Minnesota has won nine of the last 12 meetings (9-2-1) vs. San Jose...Minnesota is 14-6-2 in its last 22 contests against the Sharks at Xcel Energy Center...The Wild has points in 10 of the last 15 games played at SAP Center at San Jose (9-5-1).

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: With a 26-12-4 record, ranks second in the Central Division, third in the Western Conference and T-4th in the NHL in points (56)...T-2nd in the NHL with a .906 team SV% and seventh with a 2.70 team GAA...Third in the NHL by allowing 1.98 even-strength goals per game...Leads the NHL with 33 road points (15-3-3), 15 road wins and a .786 road point percentage...Second in the NHL with 26 goals scored by defensemen this season.

Matt Boldy: Scored his seventh GWG of the season vs. STL (1/7), second-most in the NHL (Draisaitl, nine)...Registered a season-high plus-three rating at CAR (1/4) and tied his season high with three points (1-2=3)...Scored the game-deciding goal in shootout at WSH (1/2), his second-such goal of the season and sixth of his career... Ranks sixth in the NHL with 143 shots...Ranks T-2nd on the Wild in goals (15) and third in points (15-20=35) and assists.

Zach Bogosian: Has an active two-game goal streak, tied for the longest of his career and his 10th career time achieving the feat.

Jonas Brodin: Recorded a four-game point streak (1-4=5) from 12/31 - 1/7 and owns seven points (2-5=7) in his last seven games played...Skated a career-high 33:02 vs. STL (1/7), the second-highest TOI total in the NHL this season...Currently at 198 career assists.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Posted a four-game point streak (2-3=5) from 12/31 - 1/7... Scored the 39th PPG of his career at CAR (1/4) and tied Brian Rolston for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.

Brock Faber: Skated 30:33 at CAR (1/4), his second consecutive game with 30-plus minutes of TOI and fifth-highest total of his career...Skated 31:29 of TOI at WSH (1/2), his second-highest total of the season and fourth-highest total of his career... Leads Wild defensemen and ranks fifth among skaters with 20 points (5-15=20)... Ninth in the NHL with 24:57 of TOI/G this season.

Marc-Andre Fleury: Posted his 66th career shootout win at WSH (1/2), extending his NHL record.

Marcus Foligno: Eighth in the NHL with 143 hits this season.

Filip Gustavsson: Notched is third shutout of the season with 21 saves at CAR (1/4)...With the win at CAR (1/4), reached 60 career wins in a Wild sweater and tied Josh Harding for fifth-most in franchise history...Recorded a season-high 43 saves on 46 shots vs. NSH (12/31)...Is 18-7-3 on the season and ranks T-3rd in the NHL with three shutouts,T-4th with 18 wins, sixth with a .918 SV% and 10th with a 2.44 GAA...Has allowed two-or-fewer goals in 18 of his 29 starts this season, tied for the second-most such games in the NHL.

Ryan Hartman: Owns five points (1-4=5) in his last five games.

Marcus Johansson: Currently at 499 career points (179-320=499)...Would become the 33rd Swedish-born player to reach 500 NHL points.

Kirill Kaprizov: T-1st in the NHL with six multi-goal games while ranking fifth with 1.47 points/game and 39 even-strength points (20-19=39), T-5th with 23 goals and 29 points on the road (11-18=29), T-6th with 16 multi-point games and a plus-21 rating and T-9th with 50 points (23-27=50)...Second among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:37)...Has notched a point in 14-of-17 road games played this season (11-18=29), including a franchise-record 11-game road point streak (8-16=24) from 10/15 - 11/21.

Jake Middleton: In his first game back from injury vs. STL (1/7), registered his first multi-point game of the season (1-1=2) and eighth of his career...T-13th in the NHL with a plus-18 rating this season.

Marco Rossi: Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5...Posted four assists at CAR (1/4), establishing new career highs in assists and points, and tied his career high with a plus-3 rating...Per NHL Stats, has scored three game-tying goals in the final 10 minutes of regulation this season, most in the NHL...Owns 12 points (4-8=12) in his last 11 games and 20 points (10-10=20) in his last 20 games...Leads the Wild with 254 faceoff wins this season...Ranks second on the Wild in points (15-22=37) and assists and T-2nd in goals...His 22 assists this season marks a career-high. Jared Spurgeon: Currently at 899 career games played and 397 career points (114-

283=397).

Mats Zuccarello: Owns seven points (3-4=7) in his last five games and nine points (3-6=9) in his last eight games.

4 NATIONS FACE-OFF

The National Hockey League Players' Association (NHLPA) and National Hockey League (NHL) has announced the full rosters for the 4 Nations Face-Off, as selected by each National Association (Hockey Canada, Finnish Ice Hockey Association, Swedish Ice Hockey Association and USA Hockey). Minnesota Wild left wing Matt Boldy (United States), defenseman Jonas Brodin (Sweden), center Joel Eriksson Ek (Sweden), defenseman Brock Faber (United States) and goaltender Filip Gustavsson (Sweden) will each represent their respective country.

The Bell Centre in Montreal and TD Garden in Boston will serve as the host venues and cities for the 4 Nations Face-Off in 2025, which will consist of a total of seven games played over a nine-day period from Feb. 12 to 20, along with two designated training/practice days (Feb. 10 and Feb. 11).

All 4 Nations Face-Off games will be played in accordance with NHL rules. Each team will play three tournament games in a traditional Round Robin format, under the following points system: three points for a win in regulation time; two points for a win in overtime/shootout; one point for a loss in overtime/shootout; and no points for a loss in regulation time. The two teams with the best tournament record will then advance to a one-game Final.

WILD PROSPECTS AT WORLD JUNIORS

D **Zeev Buium** tallied the primary assist on the game-winning goal in Team USA's 4-3 overtime win vs. Finland to help Team USA win the gold medal for the second year in a row. Buium tallied two assists and six shots on goal in a game-high 27:58 of TOI. D **Aron Kiviharju** recorded two shots in 23:52 of TOI and F Rasmus Kumpulainen collected two shots in 16:58 of TOI for Finland. D **Sebastian Soini** did not play in the Gold Medal game for Finland.

Buium recorded six points (2-4=6), a plus-10 rating, 11 shots on goals and averaged 25:13 in TOI in seven games for Team USA. He ranked second in the tournament in TOI/game.

Kivihariu tallied three assists and 14 shots on goal in seven games and averaged a team-high 21:17 in TOI/game for Finland.

Kumpulainen collected three points (2-1=3) and 15 shots on goal and averaged 14:15 in TOI/game in six contests for Finland.

Soini notched three shots on goal in two games for Finland.

HOT START

 With 56 points (26-12-4) this season, the Wild has recorded the thirdhighest point total in franchise history through a season's first 42 games.

- Has scored 128 goals this season, fifth most in franchise history through the first 42 games of a season.
- Is one of 89 teams in NHL history to record 30 points in a season's first 20 games, including the 2024-25 Winnipeg Jets. Of the 87 teams to reach the mark prior to this season, 64 made the Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- The Wild began the season with a seven-game season-opening point streak (5-0-2) from 10/10 10/24, marking the fourth time in franchise history achieving the mark following 2007-08 (7-0-1 in 8 GP), 2008-09 (6-0-1 in 7 GP) and 2001-02 (3-0-4 in 7 GP).
- Of the 121 previous teams in NHL history to record 16 points or more in a season's first 10 games, 87 have made the playoffs.
- Of the 60 previous occurrences of a season-opening seven-game point streak in NHL history, 53 teams made the playoffs. 13 of those teams won the Stanley Cup.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild is 16-0-0 when leading through two periods and 13-1-1 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in 24 games this season, T-3rd most in the NHL, and holds a 17-5-2 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

• The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

- The Wild owns 13 comeback wins (trailed at any point) this season, T-3rd in the NHL (Washington, 16; Vegas, 15).
- Minnesota owns a 5-12-2 (.263) record when trailing at any point in the third period. It's .263 point percentage in such situations ranks third in the NHL (Vegas, 6-10-1, .353; Washington, 4-10-1).

WILD UNDER HYNES

- The Wild has played 105 regular-season games under Head Coach John Hynes dating back to Nov. 28, 2023 vs. STL.
- Hynes owns a 60-36-9 record (.614) during that span. His .614 point percentage ranks second all-time among Wild head coaches.
- The Wild ranks eighth in the NHL in points (129) and wins (60) since Hynes took the bench on Nov. 28, 2023.

YOUNG GUNS

- The Wild ranks fifth in the NHL with 96 points (36-60=96) registered by players aged 23 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Faber, Khusnutdinov, Rossi).
- Marco Rossi is T-4th among NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 37 points (15-22=37) and T-8th with 15 goals. Matt Boldy is T-6th with 35 points (14-21=35) and T-8th with 15 goals.

STINGY PLAY

- Minnesota is T-2nd in the NHL with a .906 team SV% and seventh with a 2.70 team GAA...Third in the NHL by allowing 1.98 even-strength goals per game
- The Wild has recorded 22 games allowing two-or-fewer goals this season, T-2nd in the NHL.
- The Wild is allowing 2.43 opponent power-play opportunities per game, the fifth-best mark in the NHL this season.

ROAD DAWGS

- Leads the NHL with 33 road points (15-3-3), 15 road wins and a .786 road point percentage.
- The Wild is 10-0-0 this season when scoring first in a road game.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov recorded his 50th point of the season with a goal vs. CHI
 (12/23), established a new franchise mark for fewest games to 50 points
 in a season (34 GP), besting his previous mark set in 2021-22 (38 GP).
- Recorded 56 goals (tied with Sam Reinhart for most in the NHL) and 112 points (56-56=112, sixth in NHL) during the 2024 calendar year.
- T-1st in the NHL with six multi-goal games while ranking fifth with 1.47 points/game and 39 even-strength points (20-19=39), T-5th with 23 goals and 29 points on the road (11-18=29), T-6th with 16 multipoint games and a plus-21 rating and T-9th with 50 points (23-27=50). Second among NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:37)
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. VGK (12/15), his 34th career multi-goal game. Also posted 28:03 of TOI, the second-highest mark of his career (29:09, OT win vs. MTL, 12/21/23) and the highest in a non-OT game. The total was also the highest by a forward in a non-OT game in Wild history.
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. PHI, tying Marian Gaborik (29 GP in 2006-07) for the franchise mark of fewest games to 20 goals.
- Finished with three points (1-2=3) at ANA (12/6), extending his franchise record with his 38th career three-point contest.
- With his first assist at ANA (12/6), reached the 40-point landmark in his 25th game played this season, fastest in franchise history.
- Kaprizov reached 370 career points (176-194=370) with his first assist at ANA (12/6) and surpassed Ryan Suter (55-314=369) for sole possession of fifth place on the Wild's all-time scoring list.
- Kaprizov scored his 61st career PPG vs. Nashville (11/30), moving past Mikko Koivu for second on the Wild's all-time PPG list (Parise, 69 PPG).
- Played in his 300th career game vs. CHI (11/29), tallying an assist to move his career point total to 366 (174-191=366). The only active players with more points through 300 games include: Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384) and Evgeni Malkin (371). Only Ovechkin (204) and Auston Matthews (176) have more goals through 300 games among active skaters.
- Among players selected in the fifth round of the NHL Draft or later, only four skaters have tallied as many goals as Kaprizov at the time of their 300th career contest: Brett Hull (226), Pavel Bure (187), Luc Robitaille (185) and Alexander Mogilny (176).
- With two goals (2-0=2) at STL (11/19), became one of 19 players in NHL history (29 total occurrences) to record 12 multi-point outings in a team's first 18 games played. He is the first to achieve the feat since Peter Forsberg (2005-06)
- With two points (1-1=2) vs. MTL, became the fastest player in franchise history (16 GP) to reach 30 points in a season, shattering the mark he set in 2022-23 (22 GP). Also became the ninth NHL player born outside of North America to reach the 30-point mark in 16 or fewer games.
- With three points (2-1=3) in the 292nd game of his career at ANA (11/8), tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to record 100 multi-point games (Crosby 235 games; McDavid 270 games; Ovechkin 272 games; Kaprizov 292 games; Malkin 292 games). Tied Malkin and Glenn Anderson as the 27th fastest player in NHL history to reach the mark. Among Wild players, Marian Gaborik was previously the fastest to reach 100 multi-point games, doing so in 455 contests.
- With three assists (0-3=3) at SJS (11/7), recorded his eighth career three-assist game and tied Mats Zuccarello and Pierre-Marc Bouchard for the second most in franchise history (Mikko Koivu, 16 three-assist games).
- Kaprizov was named the NHL's Third Star of the Month for October (5-3=18 in 9 GP), averaging two points/game (first in NHL) and tallying a point in eight of nine contests to lead the Wild to a 6-1-2 record. Is the fourth Wild player to be named an NHL Star of the Month, joining Eric Staal, (First Star-Feb. 2018); Devan Dubnyk (4x) and Josh Harding (Third Star-Nov. 2013).
- Currently with 40 career multi-assist games, needs one more to tie Jared Spurgeon (41) for third-most in franchise history.

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov scored his franchise-leading ninth career overtime goal vs. VAN (12/3).
- Kaprizov notched the 24th GWG of his career at ANA (11/8), moving past Eric Staal (23 GWG) for fourth-most in franchise history.

- Joel Eriksson Ek posted a four-game point streak (2-3=5) from 12/31

- Scored the 39th PPG of his career at CAR (1/4) and tied Brian Rolston for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.

- Recorded a season-high 43 saves on 46 shots vs. NSH (12/31).
- Is 18-7-3 on the season and ranks T-3rd in the NHL with three shutouts,T-4th with 18 wins, sixth with a .918 SV% and 10th with a 2.44 GAA. Has allowed two-or-fewer goals in 18 of his 29 starts this season, tied for the second-most such games in the NHL..
- Is 60-34-14 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson's nine shutouts rank T-3rd in the NHL during that span, while his .915 save percentage ranks T-5th.
- Stopped all 39 shots faced at BUF (11/27) to record his second shutout
 of the season and eighth of his career, moving past Darcy Kuemper

- Fleury recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15/24), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.
- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach 1,000 games played when he started vs. WPG (12/31/23).
- He made 24 saves at NYR (11/9/23) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made a season-high 40 saves in a 4-3 OT win at BOS (12/19/23), his 40th career game with 40-plus saves (T-11th most in NHL history).
- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
