



FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

October 30, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. OTTAWA SENATORS [4] (SO)

The Calgary Flames dropped a 4–3 shootout decision to the Ottawa Senators on Thursday night at the Canadian Tire Centre. Yegor Sharangovich opened the scoring on the power play midway through the first for his 200th NHL point, but Lars Eller responded with a shorthanded marker to even the game. Matt Coronato then restored Calgary's lead later in the period with a power-play goal, assisted by Morgan Frost and Rasmus Andersson. After a scoreless second period, Ottawa's Artem Zub tied the game early in the third, but Nazem Kadri put the Flames back ahead 3–2 at 8:16 with his third of the season. The Senators would respond as Jake Sanderson netted the equalizer with under three minutes left to force overtime. Neither team scored in the extra frame, and in the shootout Drake Batherson and Tim Stützle tallied for Ottawa while both Calgary shooters were denied, sealing the win for the home side. Devin Cooley made 35 saves to post a .921 save percentage in his second appearance for Calgary.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of three meetings this season between the Flames and Predators. Calgary posted a record of 2-1-0 against Nashville in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 0-4-0 against Central Division teams and a record of 1-7-0 against Western Conference opponents.

2024-25 SEASON RECAP VERSUS NASHVILLE:

The Flames and Predators met three times during the 2024-25 season, with Calgary posting a 2-1-0 record against Nashville.

GAME ONE (November 15, 2024 – vs. NSH):

The Calgary Flames opened their 2024–25 season series against the Nashville Predators at the Scotiabank Saddledome on November 15. Both goaltenders were sharp early, with Dustin Wolf and Juuse Saros turning aside all 18 combined shots to keep the game scoreless through 20 minutes. The goaltending duel continued into the second, as the contest remained deadlocked at zeros heading into the third. In the final stanza, Daniil Miromanov broke the scoreless tie with his first of the season to give Calgary a 1–0 lead. Blake Coleman added an empty-netter late, while Wolf stopped all 29 shots he faced to record his first NHL shutout in a 2–0 Flames victory.

GAME TWO (December 10, 2024 – at NSH):

The second meeting between the clubs came at Bridgestone Arena on December 10. Nashville opened the scoring with Jonathan Marchessault giving the home side a 1–0 lead, but Nazem Kadri responded less than three minutes later to draw Calgary even. Another Predators marker restored their advantage as Nashville led 2–1 after one. The Flames' offense came alive in the second, with goals from Kevin Rooney, Brayden Pachal, and Jonathan Huberdeau countering a second Marchessault tally to give Calgary a 4–3 lead through 40 minutes. The Flames held firm in the third to secure a 4–3 win.

GAME THREE (January 4, 2025 – vs. NSH):

The season-series wrapped up back in Calgary on January 4. Both goaltenders once again stood tall in the opening frame to keep things scoreless through 20 minutes, but 4:21 into the second, Ryan O'Reilly opened the scoring for Nashville. O'Reilly struck again just past the midway point of the period to make it 2–0 before Mikael Backlund buried his eighth of the season late in the frame to pull Calgary within one. The Predators restored their two-goal edge in the third and added an empty-netter to seal a 4–1 victory.

SHARK ATTACK:

Yegor Sharangovich opened the scoring on Thursday in Ottawa, registering his 200th career NHL point. He became just the fourth player of Belarusian descent to reach the 200-point milestone, joining Mikhail Grabovski (296), Andrei Kostitsyn (222), and Ruslan Salei (204). Sharangovich is currently the highest-scoring active Belarusian-born player in the NHL.

HUNGRY LIKE THE WOLF:

Dustin Wolf has recorded 39 wins in 79 career NHL starts and is looking to become the third goaltender in Flames history to reach 40 victories in 80 starts or fewer, joining David Rittich (67 GS) and Mike Vernon (68 GS).

Wolf (39 in 81 GP) can also tie Rick Wamsley (82 GP) for the fifth-fewest games to 40 wins with the Flames. Miikka Kiprusoff (66 GP), David Rittich (76 GP), Jacob Markstrom (77 GP) and Mike Vernon (77 GP) top the list.

KIRKLAND SIGNATURE:

Justin Kirkland recorded his first assist of 2025-26 on Joel Farabee's second period goal on Tuesday night in Toronto. Since making his Calgary Flames debut on Oct. 12, 2025 Kirkland has amassed nine points (2G, 7A) in 28 games with the Flames. Kirkland was drafted by the Nashville Predators 62nd overall in the 2014 NHL draft and would spend the first three seasons of his pro career with the Predators organization.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

Rasmus Andersson assisted on Joel Farabee's second period marker on Tuesday in Toronto to boost his career totals to 49-185—234. He moved past Jamie Macoun (184) for seventh place on the Flames' all-time assists list among

defensemen. With one more tally, Andersson can become the eighth defenceman in Flames franchise history with 50 or more goals, and tie Phil Housley (50) for the seventh-most goals by a defenceman in Flames franchise history.

BACK-TO-BACKS:

The Calgary Flames open their third back-to-back set of the 2025–26 season and will travel to Philadelphia following tonight's contest. Calgary's last back-to-back set came on October 14th when they hosted the Vegas Golden Knights before travelling to Utah to face the Mammoth. The Flames have six more back-to-back sets remaining this season after tonight and tomorrow, with their next coming on November 18, when they face the Chicago Blackhawks at the United Center before traveling to the KeyBank Center to take on the Buffalo Sabres on November 19.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Calgary opened the scoring on Thursday in Ottawa, marking the fourth straight game and eighth game overall this season they have done so, tied with Chicago and Pittsburgh for the most among all teams.

KADRI 1KOUNTDOWN:

Now in his 17th NHL season, Nazem Kadri is closing in on his 1000th NHL game, entering tonight with 997 games played. Drafted 7th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs in 2009, Kadri made his NHL debut later that season and became a full-time member of the Leafs roster by 2012–13. During his tenure in Toronto, he developed into a consistent scoring threat, posting back-to-back 32-goal seasons in 2016–17 and 2017–18.



In July 2019, Kadri was traded to the Colorado Avalanche, where he elevated his game to another level. His physical edge and clutch scoring became key elements of Colorado's identity, particularly during their 2022 Stanley Cup run. That year, Kadri recorded a career-best 87 points (28G, 59A) in 71 games and added 15 points in 16 playoff contests, including the overtime winner in Game 4 of the Stanley Cup Final. His determination and timely heroics helped the Avalanche capture their first championship in over two decades.

Kadri joined the Calgary Flames as a free agent, signing in August 2022, immediately taking on a leadership role both on and off the ice. He became an alternate captain and a central figure in the team's offensive core. In 2024–25, Kadri delivered one of the finest seasons of his career, posting a career-high 35 goals along with 32 assists for 67 points while appearing in all 82 games. His production and compete level earned him the Harley H. Hotchkiss Award as the Flames' Most Valuable Player.

Through his 997 NHL games, Kadri has amassed 310 goals and 409 assists for 719 points Kadri is in line to become the 41st – active skater in the league to reach the 1000-game marker. He is also looking to become the 13th player to appear in his 1,000th career regular-season game as a member of the franchise:
