ST. LOUIS BLUES

All-Time Wild Record: 44-35-21 (27-15-9 at Grand Casino Arena, 17-20-12 at St. Louis)

2024-25: Minnesota went 3-1-0 vs. St. Louis...The Wild won the series-opening game, 4-1, at Enterprise Center (10/15), the second contest, 4-2, in St. Louis (11/19) and the third contest, 6-4, in Saint Paul (1/7). St. Louis won the final meeting, 5-1, at Grand Casino Arena (3/15)...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (2-2=4), C **Ryan Hartman** (2-2=4) and D **Jake Middleton** (2-2=4) led Minnesota with four points each...D **Jonas Brodin** (1-2=3), LW **Marcus Johansson** (1-2=3) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (0-3=3) each had three points...G **Filip Gustavsson** went 2-1-0 with a 3.24 GAA and .887 SV%, while also scoring the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal in the first meeting, to become the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net...G Marc-Andre Fleury entered the third game in relief and saved all 15 shots faced to earn the victory...RW **Jordan Kyrou** led St. Louis with five points (4-1=5), including a hat trick in the series finale...RW **Pavel Buchnevich** (1-3=4) and C **Robert Thomas** (1-3=4) had four points each...G **Jordan Binnington** started three contests for the Blues, going 0-3-0 with a 3.75 GAA and a .859 SV%...G **Joel Hofer** stopped 17-of-18 shots faced to earn the win in the final game.

WILD LEADERS: Zuccarello leads the Wild with 23 points (7-16=23) in 34 career games against St. Louis...Hartman owns 22 points (13-9=22) in 37 contests...Kaprizov (8-9=17 in 19 games) and Brodin (5-12=17 in 49 games) each have 17 points...D **Jared Spurgeon** has 16 points (4-12=16) in 53 games.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 4-2-0 with a 2.69 GAA and a .908 SV% in six career starts vs. the Blues...G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced St. Louis.

BLUES LEADERS: C **Brayden Schenn** leads St. Louis with 30 career points (11-19=30) in 40 career games against the Wild...Kyrou has 26 points (15-11=26) in 23 games...D **Justin Faulk** owns 23 points (3-20=23) in 38 contests...Buchnevich owns 22 points (10-12=22) in 21 games.

BLUES GOALIES: Binnington is 10-7-1 with a 2.87 GAA, a .901 SV% and one shutout in 19 career starts against Minnesota...G **Joel Hofer** is 1-0-0 with a 1.00 GAA and a .944 SV%.

CONNECTIONS: Wild President of Hockey Operations and General Manager **Bill Guerin** registered 47 points (28-19=47) in 61 contests with the Blues in 2006-07...RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** was selected in the first round (16th overall) of the 2010 NHL Draft by St. Louis and collected 553 points (262-291=553) in 644 games over a span of 11 seasons (2012-23). Tarasenko also recorded 60 points (41-19=60) in 90 Stanley Cup Playoff games with St. Louis, and won a Stanley Cup in 2019. He ranks fifth all-time on St. Louis in points and goals and is seventh in assists...Faulk is from South Saint Paul and played one season at the University of Minnesota Duluth (2010-11)...C **Nick Bjrgstad** is a Minneapolis native and played three seasons at the University of Minnesota (2010-13)...He tallied 30 points (13-17=30) in 101 games in two seasons with the Wild (2020-22)...C **Oskar Sundqvist** recorded seven points (3-4=7) in 15 games with Minnesota in 2022-23.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota is 6-2-2 in its last 10 meetings against the Blues...The Wild has never swept a season series against the Blues...Minnesota topped St. Louis in the 2015 First Round, clinching the series with a Game 6 win in Saint Paul – marking the first time in franchise history Minnesota won a playoff series on home ice...The Blues defeated the Wild in the 2017 First Round and 2022 First Round.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Currently has 13 first round draft picks on its roster, the most in the NHL...11 of the 23 players on the Wild's opening night roster were selected by Minnesota in the NHL Draft, the third most draft picks by a team on its NHL roster to start this season...Eight of the 11 draft picks selected by Minnesota on its opening night roster are first round picks, tied for the most first round draft picks selected by an NHL team on its current roster...Minnesota's average age of 27.7 is T-7th youngest in the NHL to start the 2025-26 season.

Matt Boldy: Led the Wild with a career-high 73 points (27-46=73), 27 goals and 46 assists and ranks second with six PPG last season...Was the eighth player in franchise history to record 70-plus points in a single season...T-3rd in the NHL with 10 GWG and seventh with 271 shots this season...Currently fifth in franchise history with 24 career GWG, three behind Kirill Kaprizov (27).

Zeev Buium: Can make his regular-season NHL debut at STL (10/9)...Notched the first assist of his NHL career vs. VGK (4/24) to become the second-youngest player in Wild history (19 years, 138 days) to record their first SCP point (Pierre-Marc Bouchard, 19 years, 19 days in Game 4 of 2003 CF)...Became the 12th-youngest player (19 years, 134 days) in NHL history to make his League debut during the Stanley Cup Playoffs vs. VGK (4/20) and 152nd player overall.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Currently at 299 career points (136-163=299).

Brock Faber: Led Wild defensemen with a career-high 10 goals scored in 2024-25...Ranks fourth in the NHL with 25:31 TOI/G average...Owns a 25:10 TOI/G average in 162 career games, the third-highest average by an NHL player prior to turning 24 since 2000-01 (Drew Doughty, 25:21 in 469 games; Wade Redden, 25:11 in 157 games).

Marcus Foligno: Finished 10th in the NHL with 253 hits in 2024-25...Recorded 29 points (14-15=29) last season, the second-highest total of his NHL career.

Filip Gustavsson: Went 31-19-6 in 2024-25 and ranked T-4th in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.914) and T-6th in wins...Became the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season.

Hunter Haight: Can make his NHL debut at STL (10/9).

Kirill Kaprizov: Ranked second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-31=56) and fourth in assists (31) in 2024-25.

Marco Rossi: Led the team in PPG (seven), ranked second in assists (36) and points (24-36=60) and third in goals (24)...Has played in 167 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players.

Jared Spurgeon: Currently at 299 career assists...Currently at 132 career power-play points (34-98=132), one shy of tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for fifth in franchise history...Led Wild defensemen and ranked seventh among Wild skaters with 32 points (7-25=32) last season.

Vladimir Tarasenko: Can make his Wild debut at STL (10/9)...His 304 career goals and 690 career points leads the current Wild roster...Ranks 36th among active NHL players in goals.

Yakov Trenin: Posted 241 hits last season, which ranked 12th in the NHL and established a new career-high.

Danila Yurov: Can make his NHL debut at STL (10/9).

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

2024-25 SEASON NOTES



OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild went 29-0-0 when leading through two periods, the only NHL team with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Was 21-4-2 when leading through one period last season.
- The Wild scored first in 45 games last season, tied for fourth-most in the NHL, and held a 31-11-3 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

- The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

ROAD DAWGS

- Recorded a 23-13-5 record on the road last season, establishing a franchise record with 51 road points.
- Ranked fourth in the NHL in road points, road point percentage (.622) and T-4th in road wins.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild was 16-4-2 last season (.773) when scoring first in a road game, the seventh-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 - 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 - 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

MAGIC NUMBERS

- The Wild went 41-9-5 (.791) when scoring two-plus goals in regulation last season, the third-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- The Wild went 33-2-4 (.897) when allowing two or fewer goals in regulation last season, T-9th best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.

ON SPECIAL TEAMS

- The Wild ranked ninth in the NHL with a 26.2 power-play percentage (17-65) since February 8.
- Since March 11, the Wild ranked ninth in the NHL with a 82.5 penalty-kill percentage (33-40).

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

- The Wild owned 21 comeback wins (trailed at any point) last season, T-5th most in the NHL.
- The Wild posted seven wins last season in games where it has trailed by two or more goals, fourth-most in the NHL. Minnesota owned a .214 point percentage (7-27-1) in games where it trailed by two-plus goals, T-4th best point percentage in the NHL.
- Minnesota owned a 9-30-5 (.261) record when trailing at any point in the third period. It's .261 point percentage in such situations ranked sixth-highest in the NHL.



PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** recorded an assist (0-1=1) at VAN (4/12/25) to reach 201 career assists and tie Jonas Brodin and Zach Parise for ninth in franchise history.
- Ranked second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-31=56) and fourth in assists (31) in 2024-25.
- Returned from injury to record three points (2-1=3) vs. SJS (4/9/25), including the GWG in overtime, furthering his franchise record with his 39th career game with three-plus points.
- Reached 200 career assists vs. SJS (4/9/25).
- Recorded his 50th point of the season with a goal vs. CHI (12/23/25), established a new franchise mark for fewest games to 50 points in a season (34 GP), besting his previous mark set in 2021-22 (38 GP).
- Kaprizov reached 370 career points (176-194=370) with his first assist at ANA (12/6) and surpassed Ryan Suter (55-314=369) for sole possession of fifth place on the Wild's all-time scoring list.
- Kaprizov scored his 61st career PPG vs. Nashville (11/30), moving past Mikko Koivu for second on the Wild's all-time PPG list (Parise, 69 PPG).
- Played in his 300th career game vs. CHI (11/29), tallying an assist to move his career point total to 366 (174-191=366). The only active players with more points through 300 games include: Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384) and Evgeni Malkin (371). Only Ovechkin (204) and Auston Matthews (176) had more goals through 300 games among active skaters.
- Among players selected in the fifth round of the NHL Draft or later, only four skaters have tallied as many goals as Kaprizov at the time of their 300th career contest: Brett Hull (226), Pavel Bure (187), Luc Robitaille (185) and Alexander Mogilny (176).
- With three points (2-1=3) in the 292nd game of his career at ANA (11/8), tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to record 100 multi-point games (Crosby - 235 games; McDavid - 270 games; Ovechkin - 272 games; Kaprizov - 292 games; Malkin - 292 games). Tied Malkin and Glenn Anderson as the 27th fastest player in NHL history to reach the mark. Among Wild players, Marian Gaborik was previously the fastest to reach 100 multi-point games, doing so in 455 contests.
- Kaprizov was named the NHL's Third Star of the Month for October 2024 (5-3=18 in 9 GP), averaging two points/game (first in NHL) and tallying a point in eight of nine contests to lead the Wild to a 6-1-2 record. Is the fourth Wild player to be named an NHL Star of the Month, joining Eric Staal, (First Star-Feb. 2018); Devan Dubnyk (4x) and Josh Harding (Third Star-Nov. 2013).
- Currently with 40 career multi-assist games, needs one more to tie Mats Zuccarello (41) for third-most in franchise history.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Notched a point in 16-of-20 road games played in 2024-25 (11-20=31), including a franchise-record 11-game road point streak (8-16=24) from 10/15 - 11/21.

- Kaprizov posted a multi-point streak of eight games on the road (6-14=20) from 10/15 - 11/8/25, joining Steven Stamkos (8 GP in 2017-18) and Roman Josi (8 GP in 2021-22) as the only active players to achieve the mark.
- Kaprizov recorded seven-game multi-point and assist streaks (6-11=17) from 10/15 - 11/1/25.
- His streak of seven consecutive games with multiple points set a franchise record and T-4th longest in the NHL since the 2000-01 season.
