VANCOUVER CANUCKS

All-Time Wild Record: 53-40-15 (31-18-6 at Grand Casino Arena, 22-22-9 at Vancouver)

2025-26: Minnesota won the series-opening game, 5-2, in St. Paul (11/1) before Vancouver won the second meeting, 4-2, at Rogers Arena (12/6)...RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** (1-2=3) and LW **Matt Boldy** (1-2=3) lead the Wild with three points each...D **Jonas Brodin** (1-1=2), C **Joel Eriksson Ek** (0-2=2) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (1-1=2) have each posted two points...G **Filip Gustavsson** saved 26-of-28 shots to earn the victory for the Wild in the first game...G **Jesper Wallstedt** stopped 16-of-20 shots faced in the second game...C **Autu Raty** leads the Canucks with five points (2-3=5) in the series...LW **Drew O'Connor** (2-0=2) and D **Tom Willander** (1-1=2) each have two points...G **Thatcher Demko** stopped 23-of-27 shots faced for the Canucks in the first game...G **Nikita Tolopilo** saved 28-of-30 shots faced to earn the win in the second matchup.

WILD LEADERS: Tarasenko leads Minnesota with 32 points (13-19=32) in 33 career games against Vancouver...Zuccarello has 28 points (10-18=28) in 25 career contests...D **Jeff Petry** owns 24 points (8-16=24) in 47 games...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (9-10=19 in 13 games) and D **Jared Spurgeon** (4-15=19 in 45 games) each have 19 points.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 6-3-1 with a 2.45 GAA, a .910 SV % and one shutout in 11 career games (10 starts) vs. Vancouver...Wallstedt is 0-1-0 with a 4.20 GAA and a .810 SV% following his lone start.

CANUCKS LEADERS: LW **Evander Kane** leads Vancouver with 23 points (13-10=23) in 35 career games against Minnesota...C **Elias Pettersson** owns 12 points (7-5=12) in 17 games...RW **Brock Boeser** (3-8=11 in 21 games) and LW **Jake DeBrusk** (7-4=11 in 15 games) have 11 points each.

CANUCKS GOALIES: Demko is 0-4-2 with a 3.51 GAA and a .893 SV% in five career starts against Minnesota...G **Kevin Lankinen** is 1-1-3 with a 2.56 GAA and a .924 SV% in seven career games (five starts)...Tolopilo is 1-0-0 with a 2.02 GAA and a .933 SV% in his lone start.

CONNECTIONS: D **Quinn Hughes** was selected by Vancouver in the first round (No. 7 overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft and recorded 432 points (61-371=432) in 459 games across parts of eight seasons (2018-2026) with the Canucks, as well as 26 points (2-24=26) in 30 games across two Stanley Cup Playoff appearances (2020, 2024)...Minnesota Associate Coach **Jack Capuano** played in three games with Vancouver in 1990-91...Wild Assistant Coach **Jason King** was selected by Vancouver in the seventh round (212th overall) of the 2001 NHL Draft and recorded 23 points (12-11=23) in 55 games in parts of two seasons with the Canucks (2002-04)...King also served as an Assistant Coach for Vancouver for three seasons (2020-23) and five seasons as an Assistant Coach with the Canucks AHL affiliate in Utica (2016-20)...C **Marco Rossi** was selected by the Wild in the first round (No. 9 overall) of the 2020 NHL Draft and recorded 114 points (49-65=114) in 202 games across parts of five seasons (2021-26) with the Wild, as well three points (1-2=3) in six games during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs...F **Liam Ohgren** was selected by Minnesota in the first round (No. 19 overall) of the 2022 NHL Draft and tallied seven points (3-4=7) in 46 games in parts of three seasons (2023-26) with the Wild...D **Zeev Buium** was selected by the Wild in the first round (No. 12 overall) of the 2024 NHL Draft and posted 14 points (3-11=14) in one season (2025-26) with Minnesota, as well as one assist in four games during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs...Boeser is from Burnsville...D **Derek Forbort** is from Duluth...Canucks Assistant Coach **Brett McLean** was an Assistant Coach for the Iowa Wild for three seasons (2017-20), spent three seasons as an Assistant Coach with Minnesota (2020-23) and two seasons as the Iowa Wild Head Coach (2023-25).

FAST FACTS: Minnesota has won eight consecutive home games against Vancouver (since 2/6/20), including three OTW and one SOW...Minnesota is 16-5-0 in its last 21 games overall vs. Vancouver (since 3/9/8) and 5-2-0 in the last six meetings (since 12/16/23)...The Wild set single-game franchise records for goals scored (10) and single-period goals scored (seven, third period) vs. Vancouver on 2/19/24...Minnesota's 53 wins and 121 points vs. the Canucks are its fourth-most against any franchise.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: At 41-21-12, ranks third in the Western Conference with 94 points, tied for the third-highest point total through a season's first 74 games in franchise history... Has scored first in 43 games, tied for fourth-most in the NHL this season...Ranks second in the NHL with a .904 team SV% as well as eight shutouts (NYI, nine), tied for the single-season franchise record (five other occurrences)...Ranks second in the NHL with 27 extra-time games played and with 15 extra-time victories (11 OTW, four SOW)...Ranks third in the NHL with 60 PPG and a 25.0 PPG (60/240) and fifth with 15.5 blocked shots per game.

Matt Boldy: Owns 76 points (38-38=76) on the season, a new career high...For the season, ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four SHG and T-8th with 38 goals...Ranks second on the Wild in goals, points and PPG (11), third in assists, T-3rd in plus-minus (plus-15) and T-4th in GWG (three).

Brock Faber: Has an active three-game point streak (1-2=3)...Owns a career-high 50 points (15-35=50) through 74 games played this season, the fewest games ever by a Wild defenseman to hit the 50-point mark in a season...Needs one point to tie Ryan Suter (51 points, 2015-16 and 2017-18 seasons) for the single-season franchise record among defensemen...For the season, ranks T-8th among NHL defensemen in goals and third among all skaters in even strength TOI/G (21:08) and 11th in TOI/G (24:42)...His 13 even-strength goals rank T-5th among NHL defensemen this season and mark a single-season franchise record among Wild defensemen.

Marcus and Nick Foligno: Became the first set of brothers to skate for the Wild in the same game at FLA (3/26)...Per NHL Stats, also became the 130th pair of brothers to skate together in an NHL game for the same team.

Filip Gustavsson: Currently owns 99 wins with the Wild...Owns a point in 13 of his last 17 games overall (12-4-1) and 14 of his last 18 starts (12-4-2)...In 33 games (32 starts) since Nov. 16, is 22-6-4 and ranks T-4th in the NHL with the .915 SV% and three shutouts, fifth with a 2.37 GAA, and T-5th in wins (min. 14 GP)...For the season, holds a 26-12-6 record and ranks T-3rd in shutouts (four) and ninth in GAA (2.57).

Ryan Hartman: Owns seven points (3-4=7) in his last seven games.

Quinn Hughes: Since Jan. 17, ranks T-3rd in the NHL (second among defensemen) with 30 assists and T-12th (third among defensemen) in points (3-30=33)...Leads NHL defensemen this season with 33 PPP (2-31=33, seventh among skaters) and ranks T-1st with 66 assists (T-4th among all skaters) and fifth with 72 points (6-66=72)...Leads all NHL skaters in TOI/G (27:47) and even strength TOI/G (23:24) and ranks T-2nd in power-play TOI/G (4:17) this season...In 42 games since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, leads NHL defensemen (third among all skaters) with 45 assists and ranks second (T-11th among skaters) with 49 points (4-45=49)...Needs one assist to pass Ryan Suter (45 assists, 2017-18) for the single-season record by a Wild defenseman...Needs three points to pass Suter (51 points, 2015-16 and 2017-18 seasons) for the single-season record by a Wild defenseman.

Marcus Johansson: Currently owns 199 career goals, can become the 33rd Swedish-born player to reach the 200-goal milestone.

Kirill Kaprizov: Ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 16 PPG, seventh with 39 goals, T-8th with 248 shots and T-13th with 81 points (39-42=81)...Ranks first on Wild in goals, points, PPG, and shots, T-1st in GWG (five) and second in assists.

Jared Spurgeon: Owns 435 points (123-312=435), three shy of passing Marian Gaborik (219-218=437) for third in franchise history...Needs three assists to pass Ryan Suter (314) for second in franchise history.

Vladimir Tarasenko: Currently at 898 career games played...Owns five goals (5-1=6) in his last seven games and nine points (5-4=9) in his last 10 games...Ranks third on the Wild in goals (21) and T-4th in GWG (three).

Yakov Trenin: Owns an NHL-leading 371 hits on the season, a Wild single-season record and the fifth-highest single-season total since the league began tracking the stat in 2005-06...Needs four hits to pass Matt Martin (374, 2011-12) for fifth.

Jesper Wallstedt: Owns a 7-3-1 record against teams currently in a playoff position through games played March 31 and leads the NHL with a .929 SV% against such teams (min. 10 GP)...Is 7-3-4 with a 2.60 GAA, .917 SV% and two shutouts in 14 road starts this season...Is 15-8-6 on the season and needs one win to tie Kaapo Kahkonen (16 wins, 2020-21) for the single-season record by a Wild rookie goaltender...Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with a .912 SV% and T-3rd with four shutouts this season.

LOCKING IT DOWN

- The Wild ranks second in the NHL with eight shutouts this season, tied for the single-season franchise record (five other occurrences, last 2015-16 season).
- Ranks second in the NHL with 2.65 goals against/game since November 1.

- Is 39-2-10 (.863) this season when allowing three or fewer goals in regulation, the third-best point percentage in the NHL.

BY THE PERIOD

- Ranks T-7th in the NHL by allowing .77 first-period goals per game this season and a plus-9 goal differential in the opening frame.
- Ranks fifth in the NHL by allowing 0.89 second-period goals per game this season and sixth with a plus-11 second-period goal differential.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks seventh in the NHL with a plus-14 third-period goal differential and T-7th by allowing 0.94 third-period goals per game.
- Ranks second in the NHL with 27 extra-time games played and 15 extra-time victories (11 OTW, four SOW).

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 43 games this season, T-4th in the NHL.
- Owns a 31-6-6 record (.791) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 687-182-112 all-time record (.757) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

STEERING THE SHIP

- The Wild owns 264 points (120-74-24) since John Hynes debuted as Head Coach on 11/28/23, tied for the eighth-best mark in the NHL.

- Since Dec. 14, ranks second in the NHL in PPG/G (0.86), T-2nd in PPG (36), third in goal per game (30.5) and PP% (27.7, 36/130).
- The Wild scored a power-play goal in a season-long eight consecutive games from 1/29 - 3/3, tied for the second-longest streak in the NHL this season and tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history.
- The Wild ranks T-1st the NHL with 101 assists and third with 121 points (20-101=121) recorded by defensemen since Dec. 14.

RED HOT AND ROLLING

- At 41-21-12, ranks third in the Western Conference with 94 points, tied for the third-highest point total through a season's first 74 games in franchise history
- Is 38-15-9 (.685) since Nov. 1, ranking third in the NHL in point percentage, T-5th in wins and sixth in points (85).
- Since Nov. 1, ranks first in the NHL in team SV% (.910), second in team GAA (2.59) and fourth in goal differential (plus-43).
- Recorded a seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) from 12/8 - 1/3, the team's longest road point streak since a nine-game run last season (Oct. 29 - Dec. 6, 2024).
- Recorded a 14-game home point streak (12-0-2) from 11/1 - 12/20, the longest run in franchise history and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, 22).
- Won seven consecutive games from 12/8 - 12/20, tied for the team's longest streak of the season (also seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- All seven wins from 12/8 - 12/20 were in regulation, tying the franchise record for most consecutive wins in regulation (2x previously).
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Recorded 10 or more wins in both November and December 2025, marking the fourth time in franchise history the team has won 10 or more games in consecutive months (February and March, 2014-15; December and January, 2016-17; March and April, 2021-22).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 16 PPG, seventh with 39 goals, T-8th with 248 shots and T-13th with 81 points (39-42=81).
- Ranks first on Wild in goals, points, PPG, and shots, T-1st in GWG (five) and second in assists.
- Scored a goal in six consecutive home games from 1/29 - 3/12, tied for longest home goal streak in Wild history.
- With two points (1-1=2) vs. UTA (3/10), reached 242 career assists and moved past Pierre-Marc Bouchard (241) for fifth in franchise history.
- Scored the 220th goal of his NHL career vs. TBL (3/3), moving past Marian Gaborik (219) for the all-time franchise record.

- Has surpassed the 70-point plateau for the fourth season in his career, one of two players (Matt Boldy, 2x) in franchise history with multiple 70-point seasons.
- With an overtime assist at NSH (2/4), recorded his ninth overtime point (4-5=9) of 2025-26 and tied Connor McDavid and Leon Draisaitl (both w/ 9 in 2024-25) for the most overtime points in a single season in NHL history.
- Scored his fourth OTG of the season vs. MTL (2/2), T-1st in the NHL, and now ranks T-1st in the NHL since debuting in 2020-21 with a franchise-record 14 career OTG.
- Is the second player in franchise history to record four-plus 30 goal seasons (Gaborik, 5x).
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 1/25 after recording nine points (3-6=9) across four games.
- Tied his season-high in points (2-1=3) and plus-minus rating (plus-3) vs. DET (1/22).
- Scored a goal vs. NYI (1/10) to move his career point total to 438 (210-228=438) and pass Marian Gaborik for second on the franchise's all-time points list (Koivu, 205-504=709).
- Recorded a power-play assist at WPG (12/27), reaching 146 career power-play points (70-76=146) and passing Marian Gaborik (145) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 251).
- Notched a PPG vs. WSH (12/16) to reach 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.
- Reached 200 career goals in his 344th career game, becoming fourth-fastest player drafted in fifth round or later to hit the landmark (Brett Hull, 280 GP; Luc Robitaille, 323 GP; Pavel Bure, 328 GP).
- With two goals vs. COL (11/28), reached 115 career home goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (113 home goals) for most in franchise history.
- Tallied the 115th MPG of his career with two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28), moving past Marian Gaborik (114 MPG) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 153).
- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov recorded an eight-game point streak (7-4=11) from 1/29 - 3/3, his longest of the season.
- Kaprizov posted multiple points in five consecutive games (3-9=12) from 1/17 - 1/24, marking the second-longest multiple-point-game streak of his career (seven consecutive MPG, 10/15 - 11/1/24) and third-longest in franchise history.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 - 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.

A QUINN-TESSENTIAL ADDITION

- **Quinn Hughes** ranks T-3rd in the NHL (second among defensemen) with 30 assists and T-12th (third among defensemen) in points (3-30=33) since Jan. 17.
- Leads NHL defensemen this season with 33 PPP (2-31=33, seventh among skaters) and ranks T-1st with 66 assists (T-4th among all skaters) and fifth with 72 points (6-66=72).
- Leads all NHL skaters in TOI/G (27:47) and even strength TOI/G (23:24) and ranks T-2nd in power-play TOI/G (4:17) this season.
- In 42 games since debuting with the Wild on Dec. 14, leads NHL defensemen (third among all skaters) with 45 assists and ranks second (T-11th among skaters) with 49 points (4-45=49).
- Needs one assist to pass Ryan Suter (45 assists, 2017-18) for the single-season record by a Wild defenseman.
- Needs three points to pass Suter (51 points, 2015-16 and 2017-18 seasons) for the single-season record by a Wild defenseman.
- At the point of his 500th game played 3/26 at FLA, owned 414 career assists, the third-highest total by a NHL defenseman through 500 career games behind Bobby Orr (469) and Paul Coffey (437).

THE WALL OF ST. PAUL

- **Jesper Wallstedt** owns a 7-3-1 record against teams currently in a playoff position through games played March 31 and leads the NHL with a .929 SV% against such teams (min. 10 GP).
- Is 7-3-4 with a 2.60 GAA, .917 SV% and two shutouts in 14 road starts this season.
- Is 15-8-6 on the season and needs one win to tie Kaapo Kahkonen (16 wins, 2020-21) for the single-season record by a Wild rookie goaltender.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with a .912 SV% and T-3rd with four shutouts this season.
- Posted 39 saves at EDM (1/31), tied for the second-highest single-game total of his career and season, while tallying his first career assist, the 13th goalie in team history to do so.
- Made 29 saves vs. CHI (1/27) while also stopping all three Blackhawk shootout attempts to surpass Darcy Kuemper (2013-14) and Kaapo Kahkonen (2021-22) for the second-most wins by a rookie goaltender in a season in Wild history.
- Posted a 27-save win at CBJ (12/18) and improved to 10-1-2 (.846), setting the franchise benchmark for fewest games to 10 wins in a season by a rookie goaltender (previously Kaapo Kahkonen, 14 GP in 2020-21). - Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38).
- Went 7-0-0 from in seven starts from 11/7 - 12/2, stopping 235 of 242 shots faced for a 0.98 GAA, .971 SV% and four shutouts and joining Jeremy Swayman (8-0-0 in 2021-22) as the second rookie goaltender in the last five years to record a win streak of seven or more games.
- Became the second rookie Wild goaltender to post a winning streak of at least seven games, following Kaapo Kahkonen (9 GP in 2020-21).
- Set the franchise benchmark for longest season-opening point streak (8-0-2) from 10/13 - 12/2, besting Niklas Backstrom (6-0-1 in 2008-09).
- Wallstedt's 10-game point streak from 10/13 - 12/2 is tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak by a rookie in NHL history, and tied for the fourth-longest goalie point streak in Wild history.
- Following his shutout win at EDM (12/2), became the second-youngest goaltender in NHL history (23 years, 18 days) with a season-opening point streak of at least 10 games (P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - 22 years old).
- Was named the NHL's Rookie of the Month for November after going 6-0-0 with a league-best 1.14 GAA, .967 SV% and three shutouts. He joined Brock Faber (Jan. 2024) as the only Wild players to receive the award.
- Recorded a career-high 42 saves vs. CAR (11/19), tied for the second-highest single game total by a Wild rookie.
- Posted a shutout streak of 175:12 across parts of four games from 11/7 - 11/19, the longest shutout streak by a rookie in franchise history and fourth-longest overall.

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** owns a point in 13 of his last 17 games overall (12-4-1) and 14 of his last 18 starts (12-4-2).
- In 33 games (32 starts) since Nov. 16, is 22-6-4 and ranks T-4th in the NHL with a .915 SV% and three shutouts, fifth with a 2.37 GAA, and T-5th in wins (min. 14 GP).
- For the season, holds a 26-12-6 record and ranks T-3rd in shutouts (four) and ninth in GAA (2.57).
- Saved all 25 shots faced vs. Utah (3/10) to earn his 15th career shutout, tying Dwayne Roloson for third in franchise history.
- Per NHL Stats, Gustavsson (210 GP) became the second-fastest Swedish goaltender in NHL history to 15 career shutouts behind only Henrik Lundqvist (178 GP).
- Made a season-high 44 saves at COL (2/27), the fourth-highest save total of his NHL career.

- Recorded an eight-game point streak (7-0-1) from Dec. 8 - Jan 2.
- Started his 157th game in a Wild sweater at SEA (12/8), moving past Dwayne Roloson (156) for fourth in franchise history.
- Is 46-30-10 with a 2.61 GAA, .913 SV% and eight shutouts in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks second in the NHL in road shutouts, third in road SV% and fourth in road GAA during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9) to become the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 99-59-23 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks T-3rd in the NHL during that span with a .913 SV%, fourth with 15 shutouts and T-8th with a 2.58 GAA (min. 75 games).
