- According to NHL Stats, the Stars earned their 17th win in a one-goal game this season. The only team with more is the Islanders (18).
- **Jamie Benn** assisted on a game-winning goal for the 100th time, the second-most instances in Stars/North Stars history behind Mike Modano (137), according to NHL Stats.
- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 18th power-play goal of the season, which is already a career high and tied with Mike Modano in 1993-94 for the second-most in a single-season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
 - He extended his point streak against the Mammoth to six games, earning seven points (3-4—7) during that span.
- **Mikko Rantanen** recorded an assist on **Johnston's** goal, extending his point streak vs. Utah to seven games, collecting 10 points (2-8—10) during that span.
- **Thomas Harley** opened scoring for Dallas and now has surpassed Barry Gibbs (35) for the 15th-most goals by a defenseman in franchise history.
 - He also surpassed Tom Reid (123) for the 20th-most points by a defenseman in franchise history.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third of four games that the Stars will play against the Jets this season. Dallas defeated Winnipeg in both of their matchups earlier this season on Oct. 9, 2025 (5-4 W) and Dec. 9, 2025 (4-3 W).
 - The two teams will face each other for a final time this season on April 2 in Dallas.

- A Dallas victory tonight would give the Stars wins in five consecutive games for the second time this season after also doing so from Nov. 8 to 15.
- The Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL in wins (32, tied fourth), points (73, second) and points percentage (.664, fourth) this year entering play Sunday. The team's success this season comes despite having 188 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Matt Duchene**, **Adam Erne**, **Thomas Harley**, **Roope Hintz**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin** and **Tyler Seguin** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this year.
- Fourteen different skaters have scored a game-winning goal for Dallas this season, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NHL this year entering play Sunday.
 - **Jason Robertson** and **Sam Steel** lead the team with five each, which was tied for eighth in the NHL entering play Sunday. **Steel's** five game-winning goals are a career high and **Robertson's** are the fourth-most of his career.
- **Roope Hintz** has gone 412-for-699 at the faceoff dot this season for a 58.9 percent success rate, which was the seventh-best mark in the NHL this season among skaters to take at least 500 draws entering play Sunday.
- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's game two goals shy of scoring 200 NHL goals. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the...
 - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
 - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
 - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.
- **Colin Blackwell** is two points shy of notching 100 career points. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the ninth active, seventh-round pick to total 100 NHL points.

GROUNDING THE JETS

- Dallas is 35-22-5 all-time vs. Winnipeg, including a 19-9-2 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have earned wins in six of their last 10 games played against the Jets, dating back to Nov. 11, 2023 (6-4-0). Dallas has also earned points in 10 of their last 12 games played vs. Winnipeg at American Airlines Center (9-2-1).
- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak against the Jets, earning three points (2-1—3) during that span. In all, **Robertson** has totaled 16 points (11-5—16) in 17 career games played vs. Winnipeg, carrying a plus-minus rating of +8.
 - **Robertson's** 11 goals against the Jets since the start of the 2019-20 season are tied for the fourth-most in the NHL.
- **Mikko Rantanen** enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak vs. Winnipeg, collecting six points (1-5—6) during that span, both of which were three-point outings. In 33 career games played against the Jets, **Rantanen** has tallied 34 points (11-23—34), averaging 1.03 points per game.
 - **Rantanen's** 34 points against Winnipeg since 2016-17 rank as the fifth-most in the League.
- **Matt Duchene** has recorded 37 points (17-20—37) in 49 career games against the Jets. His 37 career points vs. Winnipeg rank third among active Stars skaters and tied for 15th among all active NHL skaters.
- **Jamie Benn** has collected 43 points (19-24—43) in 50 career games played against the Jets. His 43 career points against them rank second among active Stars skaters and 10th among all active NHL skaters.
- **Wyatt Johnston** enters tonight's game riding a two-game point streak vs. Winnipeg, notching three points (1-2—3) during that span, including putting up a multi-point outing (0-2—2) in Dallas' last game against them on Dec. 9, 2025.
 - In all, **Johnston** has totaled eight points (4-4—8) in 13 career games played against the Jets.
- **Roope Hintz** enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak against Winnipeg, earning three points (1-2—3) during that span. He also has registered eight points (4-4—8) in his last eight games played against them.
 - In all, **Hintz** has recorded 12 points (4-8—12) in 22 career games played against the Jets.
- **Alexander Petrovic** scored his first career goal against Winnipeg in Dallas' last outing against them on Dec. 9, 2025. He has two points (1-1—2) in nine career games played against the Jets.
- **Mavrik Bourque** tallied his first career point vs. Winnipeg (0-1—1) in his last matchup against them on Dec. 9, 2025. He is upholding a plus-minus rating of +2 against them.
- **Jake Oettinger** holds a 7-4-1 record in 12 career games against the Jets, with a .900 save percentage, 2.69 goals-against average and one shutout.
 - His seven wins vs. Winnipeg ranks tied for 10th among active NHL netminders.
- **Casey DeSmith** owns a 2-0-0 record in five career games played against the Jets, posting a .905 save percentage and 2.40 goals against average.

ROAD TRIP RECAP

- The Stars return home tonight after sweeping their three-game road trip, taking down the St. Louis Blues 4-3, the Vegas Golden Knights 5-4 and the Utah Mammoth 3-2.
- It is the first time the team has swept a road trip of at least three games since they went a perfect 4-0-0 on a four-game trip from March 26 to 31, taking down the Oilers, Flames and Kraken.
- The Stars scored first in each of the three games they played on this most recent road trip.
- Dallas' penalty kill went a perfect 6-for-6 on the road trip.
- The team converted on four of nine power-play opportunities on the trip for a 44.4 percent success rate.
- Three players finished the road trip with four points: **Matt Duchene** (4-0—4), **Jamie Benn** (0-4—4) and **Sam Steel** (0-4—4).

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 18th power-play goal of the season in Dallas' last game, matching the Dallas Stars team record (since 1993-94) that Mike Modano set during the 1993-94 season, the Stars' first year playing in Texas.
- His 18 power-play goals are already tied for the eighth most in a single season in franchise history and are four shy of tying the franchise record of 22 that Dino Ciccarelli set during the 1986-87 season.
 - **Johnston** is on pace to score 27 power-play goals this season.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, **Johnston** has scored 29 power-play goals, which tops the NHL during that span.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- **Matt Duchene** has scored five goals in his last four games. If he were to score again tonight, it would give him goals in five consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- A goal tonight would also make **Duchene** the 12th NHL skater – and second Stars skater – this year to have a goal streak of at least five games. **Jason Robertson** previously scored in seven straight games from Nov. 11 to 25.
- **Duchene's** next assist will be his 100th as a member of the Stars. He is set to become the 61st skater to tally at least 100 assists with the franchise.
- **Duchene** scored twice in a span of 40 seconds in Dallas' game on Jan. 27 against the Blues. His first goal came on the power play at 3:20 of the second period and then he scored a 5-on-5 goal at 4:00 of the second period.
- **Duchene** became the sixth different Stars player in the past decade to score two goals in a span of 40 seconds or less according to NHL Stats. **Jason Robertson** (0:39 on Jan. 18, 2025) was the last to do so.
- **Duchene** is also one of eight players to score two goals in a 40-second span this season according to NHL Stats.
- When **Duchene** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play against the Blues, the Stars owned a 62.2 expected goals for percentage according to Natural Stat Trick.

HEATING UP

- **Wyatt Johnston** enters tonight's game riding a four-game point streak, totaling five points (3-2—5) during that span. A goal or an assist tonight would give in points in five straight games for the third time this season after also doing so from Oct. 9 to 18 and again from Nov. 1 to 9.
- **Johnston** has also scored in each of Dallas' last two games. If he were to do so against tonight would give him goals in at least three straight games for the third time this year.
- **Jamie Benn** has recorded two assists in each of the Stars last two games. If he were to have at least two points tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts in three consecutive games for the first time since Feb. 22 to 27, 2023.
- **Sam Steel** enters tonight's game riding a three-game assist streak. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in four consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Jan. 20, notching six assists in six games during that span.
- **Thomas Harley** has notched five points (2-3—5) in his last six games played.

TALK TO ME GOOSE

- **Mavrik Bourque** has tallied at least a point in each of his last two games played, scoring two goals on Jan. 29 against the Vegas Golden Knights and notching an assist on Jan. 31 against the Utah Mammoth.
 - His performance against Vegas was the first multi-goal game of his career.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Bourque** points in three consecutive games for the first time since he had a career-best, six-game point streak from Feb. 2 to 25, 2025.
- Despite playing in only 54 games this season, **Bourque** (10-11—20) is one goal, three assists and four points shy of matching his totals from last season that he reached in 73 games. **Bourque** finished the 2024-25 campaign with 11 goals, 14 assists and 25 points.
 - He's currently pacing to finish the season with a career high 15 goals, 16 assists and 31 points.
- Since Jan. 1, when **Bourque** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 8-5, own a 57.9 expected goals for percentage and have a 52.1 percent Corsi rating.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 48-for-160 on the power play this season for a 30.0 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday. Dallas' 48 power-play goals scored this season were tied with Edmonton for the most in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Dallas' 48 power-play goals are just seven shy of the 55 they scored in 82 games last season. The team is currently on pace to finish the year with 72 power-play goals, which would tie for the sixth-most in Dallas Stars team history.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 16 different times this season, most recently on Jan. 31 against the Utah Mammoth, a 3-2 win. The Stars had 12 multi-power-play-goal games in all of 2024-25.
 - Their 16 multi-power-play goal games are their most in a season since they scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 times in 2022-23.
 - The Stars have scored two power-play goals in four of the last six games that they have played.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.

- Dallas' 48 power-play goals have been scored by 11 different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (18), **Jason Robertson** (10), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Matt Duchene** (3), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Justin Hryckowian**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
- **Johnston** (18-11—29) and **Rantanen** (5-24—29) were tied for fourth in the NHL in power-play points this season entering play Sunday with 29 each, followed by **Robertson** (10-16—26) who ranked sixth.
 - **Johnston's** 29 power-play points are already a career high. **Robertson's** 26 power-play points are the third-most of his career and **Rantanen's** 28 power-play points are the sixth-most of his career.
- **Johnston's** 18 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Sunday and were five more than the second-ranked skater (Vegas' Pavel Dorofeyev).
- His 18 power-play goals are already a career high and are tied with Mike Modano in 1993-94 for the second-most in a single-season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
 - **Johnston's** 18 power-play goals are four shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
- **Heiskanen** has totaled 18 points (1-17—18) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the fourth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Sunday.

THE ROARING TWENTIES

- The line of **Mavrik Bourque**, **Roope Hintz** and **Jason Robertson** has played 187:05 together at 5-on-5 this season. During that time, the Stars have outscored their opponents 11-7, have a 64.9 expected goals for percentage, a 57.9 shots for percentage and a 59.2 Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick.
- According to MoneyPuck.com, the line has a 64.3 expected goals for percentage, which was the best mark of any forward line in the NHL to play at least 150 minutes together entering play Sunday.
- In Dallas' game on Jan. 20 against Boston, when the trio was on the ice the Stars outscored the Bruins 2-0 and outshot them 8-1 at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - All three players had two points in the game – **Robertson** scored two goals, **Hintz** had two assists and **Bourque** had a goal and an assist.
- The Stars owned a 60 percent Corsi rating and a 58.7 expected goals for percentage at 5-on-5 when the line was on the ice on Jan. 22 against the Blue Jackets.
- In the Stars' game on Jan. 29 against Vegas, the team had a 79.9 expected goals for percentage and a 59.1 Corsi rating when the trio was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Hintz** and **Robertson** both assisted on **Bourque's** first goal of the game on Jan. 29 against the Vegas Golden Knights. It marked the 199th time the two have factored in on the same goal according to NHL Stats, which is the third-most in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). They trail only **Jamie Benn** and **Tyler Seguin** (272) and Mike Modano and Jere Lehtinen (242).

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

- **Mikko Rantanen** is one goal shy of becoming the fifth Finnish player in NHL history to record nine-plus 20-goal seasons according to NHL Stats. He would join Teemu Selanne (17x), Jari Kurri (13x), Aleksander Barkov (10x) and Sebastian Aho (9x).
- **Rantanen** is currently pacing to finish the year with a career-high 71 assists and 102 points, which would be three points shy of matching his career high. If he were to maintain that pace, **Rantanen** would become the third Finnish skater in NHL history to record three 100-point seasons after also doing so in 2022-23 (55-50—105) and 2023-24 (42-62—104). He would join Jari Kurri (6x) and Teemu Selanne (4x).
 - 102 points would tie for the 12th-most in a single season by a Finnish player in NHL history.
- If **Rantanen** were to finish the year with 102 points, it would make his 2025-26 campaign the sixth-highest scoring season by a Stars skater in franchise history.
- Seventy-one assists would tie for the second-most in a single season in franchise history and the most-ever by a Finnish skater in NHL history.
- **Wyatt Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 43 goals, 45 assists and 88 points, all of which would be career highs. Forty-three goals would tie for the eighth-most by a Stars skater in a single season in franchise history.
 - **Johnston** enters tonight's game one goal shy of making the 2025-26 campaign his third consecutive 30-goal season. His is also one point away from recording his third straight 60-point season.
 - He is also just four goals shy of matching his career high of 33 that he set last season.
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 27 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart also scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- **Jason Robertson** (45) and **Johnston** (43) are both pacing to finish the season with at least 40 goals. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the first pair of 40-goal Stars teammates since Brian Bellows (55) and Dave Gagner (40) in 1989-90.
 - There have been five instances in franchise history of Stars teammates scoring at least 40 goals in the same year, but none have occurred since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.
- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 21 points (5-16—21) in 55 games this year, which is the second-most among Stars defensemen this season. It puts him on pace to finish the season with 25 assists and 33 points, both of which would be career highs.
 - His 16 assists this season are only five shy of matching his career high that he's reached on four previous occasions, most recently last year.
- **Sam Steel** is currently on pace to finish the season with 21 assists and 32 points, both of which would be career highs.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- The Stars scored a goal with less than a minute and a half in two consecutive games to win in regulation, taking down the Blues in both contests. **Jason Robertson** scored with 60 seconds left on Jan. 23 to defeat the Blues 3-2 and **Thomas Harley** scored with 67 seconds left on Jan. 27 to secure a 4-3 Stars win.
- **Robertson's** goal was the latest game-winning goal in regulation for the Stars since **Harley** scored at 19:55 on March 4, 2025 to help Dallas defeat the New Jersey Devils 4-3.
- With his game-winning goal on Jan. 27, **Harley** became the first defenseman in franchise history with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** became the fourth active defenseman with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats, alongside Shea Theodore (3x), Drew Doughty (2x) and Charlie McAvoy (2x).
- Two of **Harley's** four goals this season have stood as game winners, which is just one shy of matching his career high of three that he reached in both 2023-24 and 2024-25.

SHOOT YOUR SHOT

- **Jason Robertson** and **Mikko Rantanen** both scored in the shootout and **Jake Oettinger** stopped each of the two shots he faced to help the Stars defeat the Golden Knights 5-4 in their game on Jan. 29.
- **Robertson's** goal – which stood as the game decider – was the 21st of his career, which passed Mike Ribeiro (20) for the most in franchise history.
 - The goal was also the sixth game-decider in his career, which is just one shy of the most in franchise history.
- His goal against the Golden Knights was also his fourth shootout goal of the season, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- **Robertson** has gone 21-for-37 in his career in the shootout for a 56.8 percent success rate, which is the third-best mark in the NHL among active skaters to have at least 20 shootout attempts in their career.
- **Robertson's** 21 shootout goals since the start of the 2020-21 season are the most in the NHL during that span and are four more than the second-ranked skaters (Adrian Kempe and Trevor Zegras with 17 each).
 - Despite not taking a shootout attempt until the 2020-21 season, **Robertson's** 21 shootout goals are the most in the League since the start of the 2018-19 season.
- **Rantanen's** goal was the third shootout goal as a member of the Stars. Two of his three shootout goals with Dallas have been game deciders.
- **Rantanen** has scored 11 shootout goals in his career, which ranks eighth in NHL history among Finnish skaters.
- With the win, **Oettinger** improved to 3-1 in shootouts this season and has .750 save percentage against shootout attempts this year.
- His performance against the Golden Knights was the ninth time in his career that he has not allowed a goal against in the shootout.
- In all in his career, **Oettinger** has a 0.739 save percentage in the shootout, which is the seventh-best mark in the NHL among active goaltenders to play in at least 20 shootout games.

MR. 300

- Forward **Wyatt Johnston** played in his 300th NHL regular-season NHL game on Thursday against the Golden Knights. He became the fourth player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to reach the 300-game milestone and the 82nd player in franchise history to play in 300 regular-season games with the team.
- **Johnston** has not missed a Stars game (regular season or playoffs) since making his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He became the 17th skater in NHL history – and first since Nick Suzuki – to begin his NHL career by playing in at least 300 consecutive regular-season games according to NHL Stats.
 - Suzuki played in 410 consecutive regular-season games from Oct. 3, 2019 to Dec. 31, 2024 to begin his NHL career.
- **Johnston** has totaled 235 points (117-118—235) in his career, which is tied for the 19th-most in franchise history through a player's first 300 games played with the team according to NHL Stats.
 - Johnston's goal against Vegas tied Dennis Maruk for 19th. Maruk had 235 points (80-155—235) in his first 300 games with the Minnesota North Stars from 1978-79 to 1987-88.
- His 235 points are also the 10th-most in franchise history through a player's first 300 games played with the Stars from the start of his career according to NHL Stats.
 - **Jason Robertson** (137-183—320) is the only Stars skater who began his career with the team since the franchise relocated to Dallas to have more points than **Johnston** through his first 300 games played.
- **Johnston**, selected with the 23rd-overall pick in 2021, leads all 2021 draftees in career goals, assists, points, even-strength goals (77), even-strength points (158), power-play goals (34), power-play points (70) and shorthanded goals (6).

GOING FOR GOLD

- Seven stars players have been selected to represent their home countries at the upcoming Winter Olympic Games in Milan – **Radek Faksa** (Czechia), **Thomas Harley** (Canada), **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland), **Roope Hintz** (Finland), **Esa Lindel** (Finland), **Jake Oettinger** (United States) and **Mikko Rantanen** (Finland).
- The Stars are one of seven NHL teams to have at least seven Olympians on their roster, joining the Colorado Avalanche (8), Florida Panthers (9), Minnesota Wild (8), New Jersey Devils (8), Tampa Bay Lightning (10) and Vegas Golden Knights (7).
- The Stars and the Wild are the only teams to have four of their players on the same Olympic team – Four Stars will play for Finland and four Wild will play for Sweden.
- This marks the first Olympic selection for **Faksa, Harley, Hintz, Lindell, Oettinger** and **Rantanen**.

- **Heiskanen** previously represented Finland at the 2018 Winter Olympic games, scoring one goal in five games. He has also represented Finland in international play at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2016, 2017), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2017, 2018) and IIHF World Championship (2018, 2022).
- **Lindell** has played for Finland's national team at nearly every level of international competition – the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2012), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2014), IIHF World Championship (2015, 2022) and World Cup of Hockey (2016).
- **Rantanen** has previously represented Finland at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2014), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2015, 2016) and IIHF World Championship (2016, 2017, 2018, 2023).
- Prior to last year's Four Nations Face Off, **Hintz** played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- The Winter Olympics will mark the first time that all four Finns on Dallas' roster will play in an international tournament together.
- Although born in Syracuse, New York, **Harley** holds dual citizenship and has elected to represent Canada in international competition, doing so at the 2019 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship and the 2021 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship prior to last year's Four Nations Face Off.
- **Oettinger** – a native of Minnesota – has previously played for Team USA at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2015, 2016), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2017, 2018) and IIHF World Championship (2021).
- **Harley, Oettinger** and all four Finns were selected for their country's roster for the Four Nations Face Off that was played last February. **Heiskanen** ultimately had to withdraw from the tournament due to injury.
- **Faksa** has previously played for Czechia's national team at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2011), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2012, 2013, 2014), IIHF World Championship (2016, 2018, 2019) and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson, Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4-9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (347) and **Wyatt Johnston** (301).
- **Robertson's** 347-game Iron Man streak was tied for the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 16 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 301 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Sunday, it was tied for the 11th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only **Will Borgen** (248) and **Charlie Coyle** (247) appeared in more.
 - **Borgen** (84) and **Coyle** (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen, Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.

- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Jets forward Gustav Nyquist skated in three games together with the Minnesota Wild during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Jets forward Tanner Pearson shared the ice during the 2018-19 season with the Pittsburgh Penguins.
- Stars defenseman **Thomas Harley** and Jets forward Cole Perfetti both represented Team Canada and captured the silver medal at the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Jets forward Mark Scheifele were teammates for the gold-medal-winning Team Canada at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Jets defenseman Dylan DeMelo were teammates on the Ottawa Senators for the 2018-19 season.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Jets defenseman Haydn Fleury were teammates for a short time in Anaheim during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars forward **Nathan Bastian** and Jets defenseman Haydn Fleury both skated for the Seattle Kraken during the 2021-22 season.
- Jets defenseman Colin Miller skated in six games for the Dallas Stars during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defensemen **Thomas Harley** and Jets defenseman Josh Morrissey were teammates during the NHL Four Nations Faceoff, where they won gold.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Jets defenseman Dylan Samberg represented Team USA during the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Jason Robertson** and Jets defenseman Dylan Samberg skated for Team USA in the 2019 World Junior Championship.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Jets goaltender Eric Comrie were teammates in Buffalo during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars captain **Jamie Benn** and Jets defenseman Luke Schenn played for Team Canada at the 2012 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** played for Team Canada with Jets defenseman Luke Schenn at the 2011 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Jets defenseman Luke Schenn both played for the Anaheim Ducks in 2018-19.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** both played under Jets GM Kevin Cheveldayoff and VPs Craig Heisinger and Larry Simmons. Montoya in 2013-14 and Benn in 2020-21.
- Stars GM **Jim Nill** and Jets head coach Scott Arniel both played for the Winnipeg Jets from 1984-85 to 1985-86.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Jets assistant coach Dean Chynoweth overlapped in Toronto in 2022-23 when Chynoweth was an assistant coach and Benn was a defenseman.
