- Oskar Bäck recorded the primary assist on Blackwell's goal, marking the first point of his NHL career.

#### **GAME NOTES**

#### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- A Dallas victory today would give the Stars four consecutive home wins to begin a year for the first time since the 2020-21 season.
- Dallas' next win will mark the 617th victory of **Pete DeBoer's** head coaching career, which will tie him with Bruce Boudreau and Jacques Lemaire for 21st on the all-time coaching wins list.
- Roope Hintz enters tonight's game one goal shy of becoming the 18th skater in franchise history to score 150 goals
  with the team.
- The Stars have had nine different forwards score a goal through their first five games of the season: Roope Hintz (2), Mason Marchment (2), Jason Robertson (2), Tyler Seguin (2), Jamie Benn, Colin Blackwell, Matt Duchene, Wyatt Johnston and Sam Steel. Entering play Friday, only New Jersey Devils (10) have had more forwards score a goal this season.
- A Dallas win or overtime loss tonight would give the Stars points in four consecutive games against the Oilers after going 3-0-1 against them during the 2023-24 regular season.
- The Stars went 4-for-8 on the power play against the Oilers last season and were one of five teams (Florida, NY Rangers, St. Louis, Tampa Bay) in 2023-24 to score at least one power-play goal in each of their regular-season matchups against Edmonton.
  - Dallas' 50 percent success rate on the power play against Edmonton last season was tied with the Tampa Bay Lightning for the best mark in the NHL.
- Stars vice president of cultural growth and strategy Al Montoya and defenseman Alexander Petrovic both previously played for the Oilers Montoya in 2017-18 and Petrovic in 2018-19.

#### **EIGHT IS GREAT**

- Stars goaltender Jake Oettinger singed an eight-year, \$66 million contract extension with Dallas on Oct. 17. His new deal will kick in next year and will run through the 2032-33 season.
- Since the 2020-21 NHL season, **Oettinger** ranks in the top 10 in wins (116, sixth) and goals-against average (2.49, seventh) amongst active goalies to play in at least 50 regular-season games. He also tied for 11th in save percentage (.914) and tied for 13th in shutouts (11) over that span.
- Over the last three postseasons, his 23 wins in the Stanley Cup Playoffs are tied with Igor Shesterkin for the secondmost by any netminder.
- Despite only being five seasons into his NHL career, **Oettinger** ranks in the top 10 in franchise history in wins (116, eighth), save percentage (.914, fourth), goals-against average (2.49, fourth) and shutouts (11, seventh) amongst franchise netminders.
- Through three games played this season, Jake Oettinger has saved 4.6 goals above expected according to MoneyPuck.com, which was tied with Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck for the third-highest mark in the NHL entering play Friday.

#### **OIL LEAK**

- Jamie Benn has eight points (3-5-8) in his last eight games against Edmonton.
- Matt Duchene has 12 points (4-8—12) in his last 12 games against the Oilers dating back to Jan. 14, 2020.
- Thomas Harley has three points (1-2—3) in three career games against Edmonton.
- Miro Heiskanen has six assists in his last six games against the Oilers and enters tonight's contest riding a four-game point streak against Edmonton.
- Roope Hintz has 14 points (6-8—14) in 14 career games against Edmonton, which includes recording six multi-point
  efforts in those games.
- Wyatt Johnston has five points (3-2-5) in his last five games against the Oilers.
- Mason Marchment has five points (1-4-5) in his last four games against Edmonton.
- Jason Robertson has 11 points (4-7—11) in nine career games against the Oilers.

#### JOHNNY BE GOOD

- With an assist on **Jason Robertson's** goal on Thursday, **Wyatt Johnston** extended his point streak to five games (1-4—5) and now has a point in each game the Stars have played this season.
- Johnston became and third player in franchise history to record a point in each of his team's first five games of a season at age 21 or younger according to NHL Stats. The others are Steve Payne (6 GP in 1979-80), Bobby Smith (6 GP in 1979-80) and Tim Young (4 GP in 1976-77).
- The 2024-25 season is already the first time in **Johnston's** career that he has opened a season with a point in five consecutive games.
- If Johnston were to extend his point streak tonight, it would give him points in six consecutive games for the first time
  in his career.
- A goal or an assist tonight would also make **Johnston** the 12th skater in Stars/North Stars history and first since **Jamie Benn** in 2015-16 to begin a season with a point in six consecutive games according to NHL Stats.
- Entering play Friday, Johnston's was one of four skaters to have an active point streak of five games, the longest in the NHL.

#### **KILLING IT**

- The Stars are 18-for-19 on the penalty kill this season and have gone four consecutive games without allowing a power-play goal against.
- Their 94.7 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season was the second-best mark in the league entering play Friday, trailing only the Winnipeg Jets who are 5-for-5 while playing shorthanded this season.
- With Colin Blackwell's shorthanded goal against the Capitals on Oct. 17, the Stars now have an even goal differential
  while playing shorthanded. Entering play Friday, Dallas was one of four teams to have an even shorthanded goal
  differential, joining the Florida Panthers, New York Islanders and Winnipeg Jets.
- If the Stars were to remain perfect on the penalty kill tonight, it would mark the first time since March 14 to 24, 2024 that the team has gone five consecutive games without surrendering a power-play goal.

#### BÄCKSTREET'S BÄCK, ALRIGHT!

- Rookie Oskar Bäck recorded the first point of his NHL career in Dallas' last game on Oct. 17 against Washington, notching the only assist on Colin Blackwell's shorthanded goal.
- When Bāck has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outshot their opponents 20-14 and have recorded a 55.4 percent on-ice Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Dallas' Oct. 10 matchup against the Nashville Predators marked the first NHL game of Bäck's career. Bäck was originally
  drafted by the Stars in the third round (75th overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft.
- Bāck became the seventh player drafted by the Stars between 2017 and 2024 to play in at least one regular-season game for Dallas.

#### **ROOKIE REPORT**

- Logan Stankoven has recorded five assists through the Stars' first five games of the season and was leading all NHL
  rookies is scoring entering play Friday.
- With his assist on Oct. 15 against the Sharks, Stakoven became just the second rookie in Stars/North Stars history to record five or more assists through his first four games of a season, joining Marc Bureau (5 in 4 GP in 1990-91) according to NHL Stats.
- He recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him the only rookie to have a three-point game this season.
- According to NHL Stats, Stankoven became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4-4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, Stankoven appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8—14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5—8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.

#### BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain Jamie Benn enters tonight's contest having played in 302 consecutive games.
- Last Sunday's matchup against the Kraken marked the 300th consecutive game that Benn had played in, becoming
  the fourth player in franchise history to play in 300 consecutive games for the team according to NHL Stats.

- Benn's current 302-game Iron Man streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Benn is one of 15 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games and is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.
- The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,117), goals (384), assists (525) and points (909). His 909 career points rank 12th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

#### FROM START TO FINNISH

- Forward Roope Hitz was named one of the Stars alternate captains this season. 2024-25 will mark the first time that Hitz and fellow Fins Miro Heiskanen and Esa Lindell are all a part of Dallas' leadership group.
  - o Captain Jamie Benn and alternate captain Tyler Seguin round out the team's leadership group for this season.
- Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are three of six Finnish players in the NHL this season to be a part of their team's leadership
  group, joining Florida captain Aleksander Barkov, Carolina alternate Sebastian Aho and Colorado alternate Mikko
  Rantanen.
- Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are set to face off against Barkov the NHL's Global Series when the Stars will take on the Panthers in back-to-back games on Nov. 1 and 2 at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
- All three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** rank in the top 15 in all-time scoring among active, Finnish skaters. At eighth, **Hintz** ranks the highest with 314 career points followed by **Heiskanen** (258, 10th) and **Lindell** (191, 13th).

#### ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Tyler Seguin is seven assists away from bringing his total with the stars to 380, which would tie him with Brian Bellows for fifth-most assists by a skater in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is nine points shy of becoming the 49th player and 13th defensemen in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars. He is also just three goals away from tying Philippe Boucher (52) for the 10th-most goals among defensemen in franchise history.
- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.

## FOR PETE'S SAKE

- Dallas' win over the Predators on Oct. 10 marked Head Coach **Pete DeBoer's** 100th behind the Stars bench. He became the fourth Stars head coach (since 1993-94) to record at least 100 regular-season wins with the team, joining Ken Hitchcock (319), Dave Tippett (271) and Lindy Ruff (165).
- Since the start of the 2022-23 season **DeBoer's** first as the team's head coach the Stars have posted a 103-43-23 record for a .678 win percentage, which is the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span.
  - Only Jim Montgomery (Boston; 115) and Rod Brind'Amour (Carolina; 105) have recorded more regular-season wins since the starts of the 2022-23 season
  - This excludes the Utah Hockey Club, which has gone 3-1-1 through its first five games this season after relocating to Salt Lake City from Arizona.
- **DeBoer** has posted a 616-422-146 record over the course of his coaching career with the Dallas Stars, Vegas Golden Knights (2019-20 to 2021-22), San Jose Sharks (2015-16 to 2019-20), New Jersey Devils (2011-12 to 2014-15) and Florida

Panthers (2008-19 to 2010-11). His 616 career wins rank 23rd all-time among all NHL coaches and rank fifth all-time among active coaches.

#### FIRST THING'S FIRST

- Dallas opened the 2024-25 season with 11 former first-round picks on its roster; Mavrik Bourque (DAL; 2020), Matt Duchene (COL; 2009), Matt Dumba (MIN; 2012), Thomas Harley (DAL; 2019), Miro Heiskanen (DAL; 2017), Wyatt Johnston (DAL; 2021) Nils Lundkvist (NYR; 2018), Jake Oettinger (DAL; 2017), Tyler Seguin (BOS; 2010), Brenden Smith (DET; 2007) and Sam Steel (ANA; 2016)
- Tyler Seguin is the highest drafted player on Dallas' roster, selected by Boston with the second-overall pick in the 2010
   NHL Draft. Seguin leads all 2010 draft picks in career assists (437) and points (788), and ranks second in goals (351).
- There are two sets of Stars skaters that were taken with the same pick in different years: Matt Duchene and Miro Heiskanen were both taken with the third-overall pick, Duchene by Colorado in 2009 and Heiskanen by Dallas in 2017. Additionally, Sam Steel and Mavrik Bourque were both drafted 30th-overall Steel by Anaheim in 2016 and Bourque by Dallas in 2020.
- Six additional Stars draft picks are on Dallas' opening night roster this year: Oskar Bāck (2018; 3rd round), Jamie Benn (2007; 5th round), Roope Hintz (2015; 2nd round), Esa Lindell (2012; 3rd round), Jason Robertson (2017; 2nd round) and Logan Stankoven (2021; 2nd round).
