## **PRACTICE UPDATE:**

- The Stars will practice at approximately 11:30 a.m. CT on Wednesday, Nov. 15 at Comerica Center (2601 Avenue of the Stars, Frisco, TX 75034).

## NOTES:

- With a 4-3 overtime victory, the Stars have collected a point in 18 consecutive home meetings against Arizona dating to March 20, 2012 (17-0-1), their second-longest such run versus a single opponent in team history. Only a 19-game home point streak against Minnesota (April 10, 2002 to Feb. 24, 2012) is longer.
- It's also the second-longest active home point streak behind only Boston's 19-game home point streak against Philadelphia (Feb. 17, 2012-present).
- The Stars tallied a power-play goal for the third consecutive game and have seven PPGs over that span.
- Forward **Matt Duchene** (1-1—2) scored the game-winning goal for the third time in four games. He became the sixth player in franchise history to score three winning goals in a four-game span, joining **Jamie Benn** in 2019-20, **Jere Lehtinen** in 2005-06, **Pierre Turgeon** in 2002-03, **Jude Drouin** in 1971-72 and **Wayne Connelly** in 1967-68.
- Duchene's goal marked his 11th career overtime tally to extend his goal streak to a career-tying four consecutive games. Over that span, Duchene has recorded four goals and eight points (4-4—8).
- In addition to goals in four straight, Duchene has lit the lamp in six of his past eight games (6-5—11) and has points in nine of his previous 10 overall (6-7—13).
- Forward **Tyler Seguin** scored the game-tying goal with 3:20 remaining in regulation. Seguin finished the game with his second consecutive multi-point game, giving him four points (1-3—4) over that span. He also earned the lone assist on Duchene's OT winner.
- Seguin's 329th career goal is the second most behind Jeff Skinner (340) among players from the 2010 NHL Draft.
- Defenseman **Esa Lindell** (1-0—1) tallied his first goal of the season to even the score at a goal apiece in the first period. It marked Lindell's 45th career NHL marker.
- Defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** (0-1—1) extended his point streak to two consecutive games (0-2—2) with an assist against Arizona and has four points (0-4—4) over his past four games. Lundkvist, 23, set a career best in assists last season with 10 in 60 GP.
- Forward **Joe Pavelski** picked up career point No. 1,015 (455-560—1,015) with an assist vs. the Coyotes. At age 39, Pavelski co-leads the Stars in points (6-8—14) in 15 GP.
- Forward **Roope Hintz** (1-0—1) picked up his sixth goal of the season, placing him in a tie for second on the team in that category. Hintz' goal gave him points in two consecutive games (1-1—2) and 13 points (6-7—13) in 14 GP.
- Defenseman **Miro Heiskanen** (0-1—1) recorded his team-leading 10th assist of the season on Hintz' power-play goal to give him four points over his past two games (0-4—4) and six points (0-6—6) over his previous five.
- Forward **Jason Robertson** (0-1—1) registered his ninth assist of the season. Robertson shares first on the team in points (5-9—14) and ranks second in assists.
- With a 23-save performance, goaltender **Jake Oettinger** improved his record this season to 8-2-1. Among league leaders, Oettinger ranks 10th in goals-against average (2.26) and save percentage (.926).
