- With a goal on Sunday, **Wyatt Johnston** (64-66—130 in 199 GP) overlapped **Roope Hintz** (63) for the third-most goals in Stars team history by a player at the time of his 200th NHL contest.

# **GAME NOTES**

### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of two games the Stars will play against the Sabres this season and the only time the two teams are facing off in Dallas this year.
- Tonight is the first time that the Stars are playing at home on New Year's Eve since 2018 when they fell to the Montreal Canadiens 3-2 in overtime.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, the Stars have posted a 16-6-2 record against the Sabres. Their .708 points percentage against Buffalo during that span is the ninth-best mark in the NHL.
- Additionally, since the start of the 2009-10 season, the Stars have gone 20-for-74 on the power play against the Sabres. Their 27.0 percent success rate while playing a man up during that span is the fourth-best mark in the league.
- Wyatt Johnston had a goal and an assist in Dallas' last game and now has seven points (2-5—7) in his last six games played.
- Miro Heiskanen is averaging 25:11 of ice time per game this season, which was the fifth-most in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.54 goals against per game this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 19 of the 35 games that they have played this year.

#### SHARPENING THE SWORDS

- Dallas is 56-57-20 all-time vs. Buffalo, including a 36-23-8 mark at home.
- Evgenii Dadonov has 23 points (8-15—23) in 22 career games against Buffalo. His 1.05 points per game average against the Sabres is his best mark against any opponent.
- Matt Duchene has nine points (5-4-9) in his last nine games against the Sabres.
- Thomas Harley has four points (1-3—4) in four career games against the Sabres.
- Roope Hintz has three points (1-2-3) in five career home games against Buffalo and has six points (3-3-6) in the last seven games he has played against the Sabres (home and away).
- Jake Oettinger has a 4-1-1 career record against the Sabres, posting a .920 save percentage and 2.53 goals-against average in those contests.
- Jason Robertson has eight points (4-4—8) in seven career games against Buffalo.
- Among active Stars, captain Jamie Benn ranks second in goals (12) and third in points (12-10-22) in 24 career games
  against Buffalo.

#### CHEERS TO THE NEW YEAR

- Tonight marks the final game that the Stars will play in 2024. Entering tonight's contest, Dallas has 51-25-6 record for 108 points and a .659 points percentage.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL in points (fifth), points percentage (fifth) and wins (tied fifth) in 2024.
- 2024 will mark the third consecutive calendar year in which the Stars will finish with at least 100 points and a points percentage above .600.
  - o In 2023 they had 104 points and a .658 points percentage, and 118 points and a .648 points percentage in 2022.
- Entering tonight's contest, **Jason Robertson** is Dallas' leading scorer in 2024 with 69 points (26-43—69) in 82 regular-season games. He is followed closely by **Wyatt Johnston** (31-37—68) and **Matt Duchene** (28-39—67).
- Johnston's 31 goals top all Stars skaters in 2024, with Roope Hintz (30) and Duchene (28) ranking second and third, respectively.
- Thomas Harley has posted a plus-37 plus/minus rating in 2024, which was the seventh-best mark in the NHL entering
  play Monday.
- Harley (10-35-45) and Miro Heiskanen (9-36-45) are the Stars' highest scoring defensemen in 2024.
- **Jake Oettinger** has posted a 41-16-3 record in 2024. Entering play Monday, his 41 wins this calendar year ranked second to only Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck (43).
- Oettinger's 41 wins are already the second-most by a Stars goaltender in a calendar year in franchise history. If
  Oettinger plays and wins tonight, he will tie Marty Turco (42 in 2006) for the most wins in a single year in franchise
  history.

### **DADDY ISSUES**

- Evgenii Dadonov recorded two points (1-1—2) in Dallas' last game on Dec. 29 and now has six points in his last five games played dating back to Dec. 18.
- If **Dadonov** were to have at least two points tonight against the Sabres, it would mark the first time that he has recorded three consecutive multi-point games since Oct. 11 to 14, 2019 while playing for the Florida Panthers.
- If he were to score tonight, it would give **Dadonov** goals in three consecutive games for the first time since he scored in four straight from March 17 to 26, 2022 while playing for the Vegas Golden Knights.
- Dadonov's goal against the Blackhawks was his 10th of the season. Born on March 12, 1989, he is the fifth-oldest player
  to score at least 10 goals this season, trailing Alex Ovechkin (39 years old; 17 goals), Sidney Crosby (37 years old; 10
  goals), Anze Kopitar (37 years old; 12 goals) and Brad Marchand (36 years old; 15 goals).
- Dadonov is now pacing to finish the year with 37 points (23-14—37), which would be the fifth-highest scoring season of his career.

#### **BIKER GANG**

- Thomas Harley recorded a plus-four plus/minus rating in Dallas' last game, which was tied for the seventh-highest total by any NHL skater in a single game this season entering play Monday.
  - o It marked the first time in Harley's career that he has logged a plus-four plus/minus rating in a single game.
- In all this year, Harley has a plus-18 plus/minus rating, which was tied for the sixth-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday.
- In Dallas' last game, the Stars outscored the Blackhawks 4-0 and outshot them 10-6 during 5-on-5 play when **Harley** was on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick. No player from either team was on the ice for more 5-on-5 shots for than **Harley**.
- Harley enters tonight's matchup against the Sabers with a plus-21 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was tied for the second-best mark in the NHL this season entering play Monday. Only Minnesota's Kirill Kaprizov (plus-23) had a better mark.

#### **KILLING IT**

- Entering play Monday, the Stars had the fourth-ranked penalty kill in the NHL this season with an 84.7 percent success
  rate.
- Dallas has allowed only 15 power-play goals against this season, which was tied for the second-fewest in the NHL this
  season entering play Monday. Their 0.43 power-play goals against per game were tied for third in the NHL entering
  play Monday.
- Since Dec. 8, the Stars have gone 20-for-21 on the penalty kill for a 95.2 percent success rate, which was tied with the Carolina Hurricanes for the second-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
- Wyatt Johnston's shorthanded goal on Dec. 8 gives the Stars an even goal differential on the penalty kill during that span. The Hurricanes (0), Tampa Bay Lightning (0) and Vegas Golden Knights (1) are the only teams with an even or better goal differential on the penalty kill since Dec. 8.
- Thomas Harley has allowed 3.16 power-play goals against per 60, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday among NHL defensemen that have at least 50 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- Esa Lindell has skated 121:18 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was fourth-highest total of any NHL skater this season entering play Monday.
  - o **Lindell**, who skated 7:58 of shorthanded ice time, was on the ice for all but two seconds of Dallas' eight penalty kill minutes in their game on Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals.

#### **ROBO ON THE GOGO**

- Jason Robertson enters tonight's matchup having totaled 11 points (3-8—11) in his last 11 games played dating back to Dec. 4 against the Los Angeles Kings.
- His 11 points since Dec. 4 are tied with Jamie Benn (2-9—11) for the most of any Stars skater during that span.
- With two assists in Dallas' game on Dec. 16 against Washington, Robertson moved into 23rd on the franchise's all-time scoring list with 335 (140-195—335) career points. He now sits one point shy of tying Joe Nieuwendyk Al MacAdam for 22nd all-time.
- Robertson enters tonight's game two assists shy of recording 200 career assists. When he reaches the milestone, he
  will become the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL
  assists.
- Additionally, Robertson who turned 25 on July 21 can become the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

## BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Jamie Benn had three points (1-2-3) in Dallas' last game on Dec. 29 at Chicago and now has 11 points (2-9-11) in his last 11 games played dating back to Dec. 4 against Los Angeles.
  - o His 11 points during that span are tied with Jason Robertson for the most among Stars skaters.
- Benn is now pacing to finish the season with 59 points, which would mark the 11th time that the 16-year veteran had at least 50 points in a season.
- Benn enters tonight's game nine goals shy of scoring 400 career goals. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 10th active skater to score 400 NHL goals.
- Dallas' game on Dec. 18 was the 1,143rd game of captain **Jamie Benn's** career, which is the most-ever by a Stars skater.
  - o Benn surpassed Mike Modano's 1,142 games with Dallas.
- Benn's 1,147 career games rank second on the franchise's all-time list behind Modano, who played in 317 games for the North Stars before the team relocated to Dallas.
- Benn also ranks in the top five in franchise history in career goals (391, second), assists (542, third) and points (932, second).

## **IRON SHARPENS IRON**

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 100 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (332), Jason Robertson (245), Esa Lindell (205) and Wyatt Johnston (199). Entering play Monday, only the Calgary Flames (five) had more players on their roster to have an Iron Man streak of at least 100 games.
- Dallas' last game on Dec. 29 against Chicago was the 332nd consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of six players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- Robertson's 245-game Iron Man streak was the 13th-longest in the NHL entering play Monday. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Monday.
- Lindell's 205-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.

## WHAT IN THE WORLD

- The 2025 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship began on Dec. 26 and will be played in Ottawa through Jan. 5.
- Stars prospects **Emil Hemming** (Finland) and **Aram Minnetian** (United States) have each been selected to represent their home countries at this year's tournament.
- Hemming, who was selected by Dallas with the 29th-overall pick in the 2024 NHL Draft previously represented Finland
  at the 2024 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship where he tallied two assists in seven games and has also played for
  Finland's national team in several U18 tournaments.

- This tournament marks Minnetian's first appearance at the World Juniors. The Woodcliff Lake, New Jersey native
  previously played for Team USA at the 2023 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
  - Minnetian was originally selected by the Stars is the fourth round (125th-overall) of the 2023 NHL Draft.
- Fifteen Stars skaters have previously played at the IIHF U20 World Junior Championships: Oskar Bāck, Jamie Benn, Lian Bichsel, Evgenii Dadonov, Matt Dumba, Thomas Harley, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Esa Lindell, Nils Lundkvist, Ilya Lyubushkin, Jake Oettinger, Jason Robertson, Logan Stankoven and Sam Steel.

- Matt Duchene is two points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- Esa Lindell enters tonight's contest four assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.

#### **CONNECT FOUR**

- Stars forward Roope Hintz (Finland), defensemen Miro Heiskanen (Finland) and Esa Lindell (Finland), and goaltender Jake Oettinger (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected
  for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
  - Heiskanen has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold)
     IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
  - Lindell suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He
    again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the
    2016 World Cup of Hockey.
  - Hintz previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
  - Oettinger has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are playing for Finland together.
  - o Heiskanen and Lindell previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.

The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen will serve as Finland's General Manager.

- Stars forward Sam Steel played under Sabres assistant coach Marty Wilford when Wilford was an assistant coach in Anaheim during the 2018-19 to 2020-21 seasons.
- Sabres head coach Lindy Ruff was the head coach of the Dallas Stars from 2014-15 to 2016-17.
- Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin played for the Sabres during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars Player Development Assistant Jordie Benn and Sabres forward Nicolas Aube-Kubel played a handful of games together for Toronto during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba, forward Sam Steel and Player Development Assistant Jordie Benn played with Sabres forwards Jordan Greenway and Jason Zucker in Minnesota. Dumba and Zucker were teammates from 2013-14 to 2019-20. Dumba and Greenway shared the ice from 2017-18 to 2022-23, while Steel joined them during the 2022-23 season. Benn skated with Dumba and Greenway in 2021-22.
- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov and Sabres forwards Alex Tuch and Peyton Krebs were teammates in Vegas for a short time during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Sabres forwards Sam Lafferty and Jason Zucker shared the ice in Pittsburgh from 2019-20 to 2021-22. DeSmith and Zucker stayed in Pittsburgh until 2022-23 while DeSmith and Lafferty crossed paths again in Vancouver during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars Player Development Assistant Jordie Benn and Sabres forward Sam Lafferty were teammates in Toronto during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba and Sabres forward Alex Tuch were teammates in Minnesota for six games during the 2016-17 season.
