#### NOV. 16, 2019

Steven Stamkos scores his 400th career goal, all with the Lightning, in a 4-3 home loss to Winnipeg, becoming the first Tampa Bay player to reach the 400-goal milestone.

## NOV. 23, 2019

Andrei Vasilevskiy makes 36-of-38 saves in a 6-2 home victory over the Anaheim Ducks to become Tampa Bay's all-time franchise leader fo goalier wins with No. 132, passing Ben Bishop.

#### DEC. 23, 2019

Nikita Kucherov becomes the fourth different Lightning player to reach the 500-point milestone, joining Martin St. Louis, Vincent Lecavalier and Steven Stamkos, after recording a goal and two assists in a 6-1 home victory over the Florida Panthers.

## DEC. 28, 2019

Steven Stamkos notched a goal and an assist in a 5-4 home victory over Montreal to hit 800 points and become the third Lightning player to achieve the point total.

The game is also the first playoff contest in NHL history to be decided by a shootout.

#### AUG. 11, 2020

Tampa Bay defeats the Columbus Blue Jackets 3-2 in five overtimes in Game 1 of a First Round playoff series from Toronto's Scotiabank Arena for the longest game in Lightning history (150:27) and fourth-longest game in NHL history. Andrei Vasilevskiy stopped 61-of-63 shots to set a franchise record for most saves in a game (playoffs or regular season).

## **SEPT. 17, 2020**

Tampa Bay defeats the New York Islanders 2-1 in overtime in Game 6 of the Eastern Conference Final from Edmonton's Rogers Place to capture the Prince of Wales Trophy and advance to the Stanley Cup Final for the third time in franchise history.

# **SEPT. 25, 2020**

Nikita Kucherov tallies two assists in a 5-4 victory over Dallas in Game 4 of the Stanley Cup Final for his 24th and 25th assists of the 2020 Playoffs, most ever by a winger in NHL history in a single playoff season. Kucherov would finish the 2020 Playoffs with 27 assists.

## **SEPT. 28, 2020**

Tampa Bay wins its second Stanley Cup after defeating the Dallas Stars in six games at Edmonton's Rogers Place. The Lightning shut out the Stars 2-0 in Game 6 behind a 22-save performance by Andrei Vasilevskiy. Victor Hedman is awarded the Conn Smythe Trophy as playoff MVP after scoring 10 goals, third most by a defenseman in a playoff season in NHL history. Brayden Point scores his 14th goal of the 2020 Playoffs in the Cup clinching win to set a Lightning franchise record for most goals in a playoff season.

#### DEC. 7, 2020

Lightning hire Rob Zettler to serve as an assistant coach.

# **JAN. 7, 2021**

Lightning hire veteran play-by-play announcer Dave Randorf as the voice of the team to join the FOX Sports Sun broadcasting crew of Brian Engblom, Paul Kennedy, Dave Andreychuk, Bobby Taylor and Adam Hall.

## JAN. 13, 2021

The Lightning unveiled their 2020 Stanley Cup championship banner at the 2020-21 regular season opener at AMALIE Arena against the Chicago Blackhawks, a 5-1 victory. With no fans in the stands due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the banner was unveiled and remained hanging over the VIP Lounge until it could be raised to the rafters once fans returned to the building.

#### FEB. 1, 2021

Lightning captain Steven Stamkos scores a power-play goal at 7:23 of the second period in a 5-2 victory at AMALIE Arena over Nashville for his 301st career power-play point, passing Martin St. Louis as the franchise's all-time leader for power-play scoring.

## **MARCH 13, 2021**

With a significant amount of fans in the building for the first time during the 2020-21 regular season (attendance: 3,800), the Lightning raise the 2020 Stanley Cup championship banner to the AMALIE Arena rafters before a 6-3 victory over the Nashville Predators.

## MAY 10, 2021

Tampa Bay completes the 2020-21 regular season with a 36-17-3 record, finishing third in the Central Division and qualifying for the postseason for the fourth-consecutive season, seventh time in the last eight seasons and 13th time in franchise history.

## MAY 16, 2021

Tampa Bay and Florida meet for the first time ever in the postseason after the two teams are matched up against each other in the First Round of the 2021 Playoffs. The Lightning would defeat the in-state rival Panthers in six games, punctuated by a 4-0 shutout victory in Game 6 at AMALIE Arena on May 26.

## **JUNE 23, 2021**

Brayden Point nets a goal in Game 6 of a Stanley Cup Semifinal series at the NY Islanders for his ninth-straight playoff game with a goal, a franchise record for a playoff goal streak and the second longest in NHL history. Only Reggie Leach's 10-game goal streak for Philadelphia in the 1976 Playoffs ranks longer.

## **JUNE 25, 2021**

Yanni Gourde scores shorthanded for the only goal as Tampa Bay defeats the NY Islanders 1-0 in Game 7 of the Stanley Cup Semifinals at AMALIE Arena to advance to the Cup Final for the second-straight season and fourth time in franchise history.

## **JULY 2, 2021**

Jan Rutta scored 1:52 into Game 3 of the Stanley Cup Final at Montreal's Bell Centre to become the first NHL player to score a goal (regular season or playoffs) in the month of July. Victor Hedman netted a power-play goal at 3:27 of the first period to become the first NHL player to score a goal in each of the 12 calendar months.

#### **JULY 7, 2021**

Tampa Bay beats Montreal 1-0 at AMALIE Arena in Game 5 of the Stanley Cup Final to defeat the Canadiens 4-1 and win the franchise's second-straight Stanley Cup and third in team history. Andrei Vasilevskiy stops all 22 shots for his fifth shutout of the 2021 Playoffs and fifth straight in a potential series clinching game going back to the 2020 Cup Final, a NHL record, and is awarded the Conn Smythe Trophy. Rookie Ross Colton scored the only goal of Game 5 at 13:27 of the second period. The Lightning become the second team this century to win back-to-back Cups and the ninth different franchise to repeast as Stanley Cup champions (fifth to do so among clubs that joined the NHL in 1967-68 or later).

# **JULY 7, 2021**

Nikita Kucherov finishes as the 2021 Playoffs scoring leader after notching eight goals, 24 assists and 32 points to become the sixth different player in the NHL's expansion era (since 1967-68) to lead the Stanley Cup Playoffs in points in consecutive years. Kucherov is just the third player in NHL history to record 30-plus points in consecutive playoffs years, joining Mario Lemieux (1991 and 1992) and Wayne Gretzky (1983-1985 and 1987-1988).

Unlike the raising of the 2020 Stanley Cup championship banner, a sold-out crowd of 19,092 fans were in the building as the banner was raised to the rafters.

#### NOV. 26, 2021

Andrei Vasilevskiy records a 17-save shutout against Seattle for his 200th career NHL win and becomes the first goaltender in franchise history to hit the 200-win mark.

## **APRIL 21, 2022**

Steven Stamkos scores a power-play goal, recording his 954th career point and passing Martin St. Louis as the franchise's all-time scoring leader in an 8-1 win over Toronto. The primary assist on Stamkos's goal went to Nikita Kucherov, who recorded his 600th career point on the play in his 557th career game, becoming the fastest skater in franchise history to hit the 600-point mark.

#### **APRIL 23, 2022**

Victor Hedman records both his 20th goal and 57th assist of the season in a 6-2 win over Nashville. Hedman joined Dan Boyle as the only defenseman in franchise history to hit the 20-goal mark, while his 57th assist set a new franchise record for defensemen, passing his previous mark of 56 set in 2016-17. Hedman finished the season with 65 assists and 85 points, both franchise records for defensemen.

## **APRIL 26, 2022**

Steven Stamkos scores two goals in a 4-1 win over Columbus and hits the 100-point mark for the first time in his NHL career, becoming the fourth different player in franchise history to record 100 points in a single season.

# **APRIL 28, 2022**

Nikita Kucherov caps an eight-game goal streak that began April 14, matching the longest goal streak in franchise history set previously by Brian Bradley during the Bolts' inaugural season (Nov. 11-24, 1992).

## **APRIL 29, 2022**

Steven Stamkos scores a hat trick in the regular season finale, his franchise-record 10th career hat trick, in a 6-4 win over the Islanders. With the hat trick, Stamkos wrapped up the regular season with nine consecutive multi-point games (10-16-26) and passed Vincent Lecavalier for the longest stretch of multi-point games in franchise history. Finishing the month of April with 33 points (12G, 21A) in 16 games, Stamkos set a franchise record for the most points in a calendar month. His 33 points were the most in a single month by any NHL player since Mario Lemieux posted 34 points in 14 games for Pittsburgh in December of 1995. Tampa Bay concluded the 2021-22 regular season with a 51-23-8 record, finishing third in the Atlantic Division and qualifying for the postseason for the fifth-consecutive season, a franchise record for consecutive playoff appearances. It marked the eighth time in the last nine seasons and 14th time in franchise history that Tampa Bay qualified for the playoffs.

## MAY 17, 2022

Ryan McDonagh records five blocked shots in a 4-1 win over Florida in Game 1 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals. With the five blocks, McDonagh passed Dan Girardi (383) for the most blocked shots in NHL playoff history.

## MAY 23, 2022

Tampa Bay defeats Florida, 2-0, in Game 4 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals to complete a four-game sweep over the in-state rival Panthers. With the win, the Lightning became the third franchise in NHL history (fourth instance) to win 10 or more consecutive playoff series. The victory marked Andrei Vasilevskiy's sixth career series-clinching shutout, the most in NHL history.

#### **JUNE 5, 2022**

Ondrej Palat scores the game-winning goal in Game 3 of the Eastern Conference Final, a 3-2 win over the Rangers. With the goal, Palat recorded his 10th career game-winning goal in the playoffs, passing Tyler Johnson for the most in franchise history.

## **JUNE 11, 2022**

Tampa Bay defeats the Rangers, 2-1, in Game 6 of the Eastern Conference Final to advance to the Stanley Cup Final for the third-straight season, the first team to do so since the Edmonton Oilers made three in a row from 1983-85.

## **JUNE 15, 2022**

Nikita Kucherov records one assist in a 4-3, overtime loss to Colorado in Game 1 of the Stanley Cup Final. With the helper, Kucherov became the first player in franchise history to record 100 career playoff assists and the 25th player in NHL history to do so.

## **JUNE 15, 2022**

The Lightning defeat Colorado, 6-2, in Game 3 of the Stanley Cup Final at AMALIE Arena. With the win, Tampa Bay set a new franchise record with eight consecutive playoff victories at home. In the victory, Nikita Kucherov recorded two assists and became the fourth player in NHL history to record 25-plus points in three straight postseasons, joining Mike Bossy (1981-83), Wayne Gretzky (1983-85) and Bryan Trottier (1980-82). Additionally, his 26th career multi-assist postseason game tied Jaromir Jagr for the most among primary wingers in NHL playoff history.

## **JULY 12, 2022**

The Lightning hire Jeff Blashill to serve as an assistant coach.

## NOV. 13, 2022

Mikhail Sergachev records two goals and two assists in the first period of a 6-3 home win over the Washington Capitals to tie the NHL record for most points by a defenseman in a period.

## **DEC. 1, 2022**

Lightning captain Steven Stamkos becomes the first player in franchise history to amass 1,000 points with the Lightning after notching an assist on Nick Paul's goal at 7:55 of the second period in a 4-1 victory at the Philadelphia Flyers. Stamkos is the 95th player in NHL history to accumulate 1,000 career points.

## **DEC. 8, 2022**

Tampa Bay records the 300th consecutive home sellout at AMALIE Arena in a 5-2 victory over the Nashville Predators. The streak, which includes playoff contests but doesn't include the 2020-21 season due to social distancing protocols because of the COVID-19 pandemic, is the longest active streak in the NHL and remains intact through the 2022-23 season, sitting at 330 games entering 2023-24.

## **JAN. 18, 2023**

Steven Stamkos becomes the first player in Lightning history to score 500 career goals with the franchise on the first of his three goals at the Vancouver Canucks. He also recorded his 11th career hat trick. Stamkos becomes the 47th player in NHL history to reach the 500-goal milestone.

## **JAN. 28, 2023**

The Lightning defeat the Los Angeles Kings 5-2 at AMALIE Arena to cap a 12-game home win streak and set a franchise record for most consecutive wins at home. The streak started on Dec. 8 with a 5-2 win over the Nashville Predators.

## FEB. 11, 2023

Victor Hedman records his 500th career assist on Anthony Cirelli's game-winning goal with :44 seconds remaining in regulation to become the third player in franchise history (also: Steven Stamkos and Vincent Lecavalier) and first defensement to reach the milestone.

## FEB. 23, 2023

Despite a 6-5 overtime loss to the Buffalo Sabres at AMALIE Arena, Tampa Bay caps a 16-game home point streak that is the longest home point streak in franchise history. The streak started Dec. 8 with a 5-2 win over the Nashville Predators. The Bolts went 14-0-2 over the 16-game stretch.

# **MARCH 11, 2023**

Nikita Kucherov establishes a franchise mark for a home point streak after notching an assist on Brayden Point's game-winning tally with a minute to go in regulation of a 3-1 win over the Chicago Blackhawks at AMALIE Arena for his 24th-consecutive home game with at least one point. Kucherov recorded 7-36---43 pts. during the home point streak, which began November 25 vs. St. Louis.

#### **MARCH 19, 2023**

Nikita Kucherov reaches 100 points on the season on a first-period goal in a 5-2 home loss to the New Jersey Devils, the third 100-point season of his career (also: 2017-18, 2018-19) and the sixth 100-point season in franchise history.

## **APRIL 1, 2023**

Tampa Bay secured a postseason berth with a 5-0 shutout home victory over the New York Islanders, marking the sixth-consecutive season the Lightning qualified for the postseason, extending their franchise record for longest playoff streak.

## **APRIL 6, 2023**

Steven Stamkos skates in his 1,000th career game in a 6-1 loss at the New York Islanders, becoming the second player in franchise history to reach the milestone behind former teammate Vincent Lecavalier.

## **APRIL 13, 2023**

Brayden Point nets his 50th goal of the season on a power play at 10:47 of the third period and tacks on his 51st five minutes later in a 5-0 shutout home victory over the Detroit Red Wings in the regular season finale. Point becomes just the third player in franchise history to reach the 50-goal mark in a season, joining Steven Stamkos (60 goals in 2011-12, 51 goals in 2009-10) and Vincent Lecavalier (52 goals in 2006-07).

## **JUNE 16, 2023**

Lightning owner Jeff Vinik sells a minority interest of the team to Arctos Sports Partners at a record-setting \$1.4 billion valuation.

## **JUNE 26, 2023**

Joel Bouchard is hired to become the head coach of the Lightning's AHL affiliate in Syracuse.

#### NOV. 24, 2023

The Lightning scored eight goals on 14 shots in an 8-2 win at Carolina, marking the best shooting percentage (57.1%) in NHL history.

## NOV. 24, 2023

Nikita Kucherov records six points (2-4—6) in an 8-2 win at Carolina, tying the franchise record for points in a game set by Doug Crossman (3-3—6 on Nov. 7, 1992 at NYI). Kucherov also matched Crossman's franchise record for most power-play points in a game with four (1-3—4).

## DEC. 4, 2023

Victor Hedman skates in his 1,000th career game as the Lightning blank Dallas 4-0. Hedman became the third player and first defenseman in Lightning history to reach 1,000 games.

# JAN. 9, 2024

Jon Cooper ties Toe Blake for the fifth-most wins with a single franchise in NHL history with his 500th NHL win. Cooper (839 GC) required the third-fewest games among all head coaches in NHL history to reach the 500-win mark trailing only Scotty Bowman (825 GC) and Bruce Boudreau (837 GC). He is the fastest in NHL history to record 500 wins with a single franchise.

## **JAN. 25, 2024**

Steven Stamkos becomes the 29th player in NHL history to record 1,100 points with one team. He does it on an assist to Nikita Kucherov in the second period.

## FEB. 25, 2024

With 100 points in 59 games, Kucherov becomes the fastest player in TBL franchise history to record 100 points. He did it in 59 games besting his previous mark of 62 games in 2018-2019. He joins Connor McDavid as the only two players over the past 25 years to record 100 points in fewer than 60 games.

## FEB. 29, 2024

It is the fourth time in franchise history that the Tampa Bay Lightning will play a game on February 29th, a leap year. Tampa Bay lost 3-2 in overtime to Buffalo and moved to 3-0-1 on leap day.

# **MARCH 9, 2024**

Darren Raddysh records five assists, which is a new TBL franchise record for a defenseman. He joins Pavel Kubina and Doug Crossman as the only three defensemen in TBL franchise history to record five points in a single game. He also joins Marty St. Louis and Mark Recchi as the only skaters in franchise history with five helpers in a single game. Raddysh is only the 33rd defenseman since 1950 to record five assists in a single game.

# **MARCH 14, 2024**

Victor Hedman officially passes Vincent Lecavalier to take sole possession of the second-most games played in TBL franchise history with 1,038 of them.

## **MARCH 14, 2024**

Brayden Point becomes the third player in TBL franchise history to record six points in a single game. He ties the franchise record. Doug Crossman and Nikita Kucherov, who accomplished the feat earlier this season, are the only other players to do it.

#### **MARCH 30, 2024**

Steven Stamkos becomes the 47th player in NHL history with nine career 30-goal seasons.

#### **APRIL 1, 2024**

Steven Stamkos records his 211th career power-play goal passing Luc Robitaille and taking sole possession of the third-most power-play goals scored with a single franchise in NHL history.

#### **APRIL 3, 2024**

Nikita Kucherov officially sets a new franchise record for points in a single season with 129 with an assist to Brayden Point with 17:06 remaining in the second period.

#### **APRIL 13, 2024**

Erik Cernak becomes the fourth player in TBL franchise history to record 500 blocked shots with the club.

#### **APRIL 15, 2024**

Steven Stamkos scores his 40th goal of the season. He has scored 40+ goals in seven seasons, the most in TBL history.

#### **APRIL 17, 2024**

Nikita Kucherov becomes the fifth player in NHL history to record 100 assists in a single season.

## **JUNE 25, 2024**

Lightning head coach Jon Cooper is named the head coach for Team Canada for both the 2025 4 Nations Face-Off and 2026 Olympic Winter Games in Milan and Cortina d'Ampezzo, Italy.

#### **JUNE 28, 2024**

Lightning forward Brayden Point is one of the first six players announced to the Team Canada roster for the 2025 4 Nations Face-Off

## **JULY 23, 2024**

Lightning general manager and president of hockey operations Julien BriseBois is named the assistant general manager for Team Canada for both the 2025 4 Nations Face-Off and 2026 Olympic Winter Games in Milan and Cortina d'Ampezzo, Italy.

## **SEPT. 18, 2024**

Defenseman Victor Hedman is named the 11th captain in franchise history.

# OCT. 15, 2024

Lightning launch Tampa Bay Strong campaign to raise financial help for the Tampa Bay area following Hurricanes Helene and Milton. The team raised more than \$1 million in a 50-50 raffle that ran through December, and Lightning owner and chairman Jeff Vinik donated \$2 million to hurricane relief efforts through the Lightning Foundation.

#### OCT. 24, 2024

Vinik Sports Group announces ownership expansion, involving a group of investors led by Doug Ostrover and Marc Lipschultz.

## OCT. 28, 2024

The Lightning's newest ownership group, led by Ostrover and Lipschultz, donate \$1 million to hurricane relief efforts.

#### NOV. 14, 2024

Lightning goalie Andrei Vasilevskiy makes 23 saves in a 4-1 win over Winnipeg to become the fastest goalie in NHL history to reach 300 career wins, doing so in his 490th career game.

## NOV. 27, 2024

Lightning coach Jon Cooper coaches in his 900th NHL game with Tampa Bay. His 536 wins through 900 games were second-most in NHL history behind only Scotty Bowman (548).

## NOV. 30, 2024

Lightning defenseman Victor Hedman registers his 589th career assist to become the franchise's all-time leader, passing Martin St. Louis. He went on to become the first player in franchise history to reach 600 assists on Jan. 16 vs. Anaheim.

## DEC. 4, 2024

Lightning forwards Anthony Cirelli and Brandon Hagel are named to Team Canada's 4 Nations Face-Off roster, joining Brayden Point as well as coach Jon Cooper and general manager Julien BriseBois, while forward Jake Guentzel was named to Team USA.

## DEC. 5, 2024

Longtime play-by-play broadcaster Rick Peckham and Lightning alumnus forward Brian Bradley are announced as the 2025 inductees to the Lightning Hall of Fame.

# DEC. 12, 2024

Lightning goalie Andrei Vasilevskiy finishes with 19 saves in his 500th career NHL game. His 306 career wins were the most by any goalie through their first 500 NHL games.

#### DEC. 28, 2024

Victor Hedman plays against the New York Rangers in his 1,083rd game for the Lightning, surpassing former teammate Steven Stamkos as the franchise's all-time leader for games played.

#### **JAN. 8, 2025**

NHL announces Tampa Bay will host the Boston Bruins on Feb. 1, 2026 for the Navy Federal Credit Union Stadium Series at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, one of the first-ever outdoor hockey games held in Florida.

## **JAN. 30, 2025**

Defenseman Victor Hedman is named captain for Team Sweden at the 4 Nations Face-Off, scheduled for February.

#### FEB. 1, 2025

Longtime play-by-play broadcaster Rick Peckham and Lightning alumnus forward Brian Bradley are welcomed to the Lightning Hall of Fame at the annual Hall of Fame game.

## FEB. 8, 2025

Lightning forward Nikita Kucherov records three assists to pass Victor Hedman for the franchise record for career assists (610).

#### FEB. 20, 2025

Coach Jon Cooper, GM Julien BriseBois and forwards Brayden Point, Anthony Cirelli and Brandon Hagel win the 4 Nations Face-Off championship game over Team USA at TD Garden in Boston.

## **MARCH 27, 2025**

Goalie Andrei Vasilevskiy stops all 25 shots he faces against Utah to earn his 40th NHL shutout, becoming just the 49th goalie in NHL history to reach that mark.

#### **APRIL 5, 2025**

Lightning clinch a berth to the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs for an eighth consecutive season, establishing a new franchise record. It is the 17th time the Lightning qualified for the playoffs.

## **APRIL 18, 2025**

Nikita Kucherov wins his second consecutive Art Ross Trophy after leading the NHL in scoring with 121 points in 78 games. He is only the third player in the last 25 seasons to win consecutive Art Ross trophies, joining Jaromir Jagr and Connor McDavid.

## **APRIL 28, 2025**

Lightning goalie Andrei Vasilevskiy is named a top-three finalist for the Vezina Trophy, given annually to the top goalie in the NHL. He finished second in the NHL for wins, shutouts, saves and high-danger save percentage, while his .921 save percentage ranked third.

# **MAY 2, 2025**

Lightning forward Anthony Cirelli is named a top-three finalist for the Frank J. Selke Trophy, given annually to the NHL's best two-way forward. He became the first player in team history to be a finalist.

#### **JUNE 4, 2025**

Nikita Kucherov earns his second career Ted Lindsay Award as the league's "most outstanding player", per an NHL Players' Association vote.

## **JUNE 6, 2025**

Dan Hinote is hired by the Lightning as an assistant coach.

## **JUNE 16, 2025**

Five Lightning players are named to the initial rosters for the 2026 Olympics in Milan, Italy, including Victor Hedman (Sweden), Brayden Point (Canada), Erik Cernak (Slovakia), Oliver Bjorkstrand (Denmark), and Zemgus Girgensons (Latvia).

# **JULY 7, 2025**

Jeff Tambellini is hired as Lightning assistant general manager and director of hockey operations.

## AUG. 13, 2025

Lightning announce a new naming partner for their home facilities, partnering with locally owned Benchmark International to rename the arena Benchmark International Arena beginning immediately.
