CHASING THE STORM

- Going into Wednesday's game, Philadelphia is looking to back in the win column and break their three-game winless streak against Carolina (0-2-1).

- The Flyers are on a six-game winless streak against the Hurricanes at home with the last win on home ice on March 5, 2020 (4-1). Philadelphia is 0-2-3 in the last five games against Carolina at home.

- The Flyers have two players looking to extend their streaks against the Hurricanes: Travis Konecny and Morgan Frost.

- Forward **Travis Konecny** owns an active four-game goal/point streak (5g-2a) and has 10 points (6g-4a) in the last seven games against Carolina.

- Forward **Morgan Frost** owns an active two-game point streak (1g-1a) and has three points (1g-2a) in the last four games against Carolina.

- Forward **Owen Tippett** has seven points (3g-4a) in the last six games against Carolina.
- Captain Sean Couturier has four points (Og-4a) in the last four games against Carolina.
- Forward Scott Laughton has three points (1g-2a) in the last five games against Carolina.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Philadelphia have a 1-1-0 record so far in the five-game homestand, which is the second-longest homestand this season behind a seven-game homestand from March 4-15, 2025. The Flyers will play four of their next five games at home.

- The Flyers have a 4-5-0 record at home this season, registering a 85.7% penalty kill percentage while at home (7th best in NHL).

EAST MODE ACTIVATED

- Philadelphia has a 4-5-1 record against the Eastern Conference, including a 0-3-0 record against the Metropolitan Division.

- Last season, the Flyers had a 19-24-7 record against the Eastern Conference, including a 9-13-2 record against the Atlantic Division and a 10-11-5 record against the Metropolitan Division.

EXTRA ATTITUDE IN EXTRA TIME

- The Flyers have gone into overtime in four consecutive games (11/7-11/14), which tied their lengthiest streak in franchise history at four games (6x; last: Dec. 16-30, 2021).

- Philadelphia played three consecutive that have gone to a shootout (11/7-11/11), posting a 2-1 record during that stretch.

- The last time the Flyers experienced a similar streak was during the 2019-20 season, going 2-1 in three shootout games: 11/9/19 at Toronto, 11/10/19 at Boston & 11/13/19 vs. Washington.



SPECIAL TEAMS SURGE

- The Flyers rank 19th in the NHL with 11 power-play goals in 62 attempts (17.7%)
- The longest streak of consecutive games this season with power-play goals was four games, Oct. 11-17.

- Last season, the longest streak of consecutive games with power-play goals was five games, Jan. 6-13, 2024. Philadelphia has reached the five-game threshold 81 times since 1977-78 when power play stats started being recorded.

- Philadelphia ranks fourth in the league in the penalty minutes per game (11:00), however the Flyers rank fourth in the NHL with nine power-play goals-against in 66 penalty kills (86.4%).

- The Flyers have a perfect kill rate in 12 of 19 games this season.

- Philadelphia owned a seven-game streak without allowing a goal on the penalty kill, 10/29-11/11.
- Philadelphia tallied a shorthanded goal against Calgary (10/12).

- Last season, the Flyers led the NHL in shorthanded goals (16) and ranked fourth in the league on the penalty kill (83.4%).

WALKING ON ERR

- Samuel Ersson owns a 4-0-1 record in his last six games.

- He has allowed three-or-fewer goals in eight of 11 games played.

- He ranks tied for third among NHL goaltenders who have played 10-plus games in shutouts (1).

- He returned to action against Florida (11/9) after missing two games due to a lower-body injury, stopping 28-of-31 shots in regulation/OT and 3-of-5 shots in the shootout.

- The Swedish native posted his sixth career shutout in a 2-0 win at Boston (10/29), stopping all 25 shots he faced. He becomes the 17th Flyers goaltender to reach the milestone in franchise history.

- Per NHL Stats, Ersson became just the third Flyers goaltender to post a shutout in Boston, joining Antero Niittymaki (27 saves on Jan. 2, 2006) and Brian Boucher (21 saves on March 4, 2000).

- He stopped a season-high 28-of-31 shots in regulation against Vancouver (10/19).
- He earned his first win of the season on Friday (10/11), saving 24-of-26 shots in regulation/OT and 4-of-5 shots in the shootout.

- The win during the season-opener against Vancouver (10/11) marked the goaltender's fifth career shootout win to tie for fourth all-time among Flyers goaltenders in shootout wins.

KONNECT THE DOTS

- Travis Konecny posted an assist against Colorado (11/18) to extend his point streak to seven games (6g-7a), 11/5-11/18.

- He ranks fifth in the NHL among players on active point streaks with seven games.
- He ranks second in the NHL in points (13) since Nov. 5th, just one point behind Colorado's Nathan MacKinnon (14 pts).
- He owns 20 points (9g-11a) in the last 13 games.

- The 27-year-old leads the team in goals (11), assists (12), points (23), power-play goals (5), and shorthanded goals (1), ranks second in shots (55) and ranks third in TOI per game (21:13).

- Six of his 11 goals this season have been on special teams.
- He notched his fifth multi-point game (2g-1a) of the season on Nov. 16 vs. Buffalo.
- He tallied multi-point games in consecutive contests: Nov. 14 at OTT (1g-1a) and Nov. 16 vs. BUF (2g-1a).

- He scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Tampa (11/7), his second shootout goal this season and fourth goal in his career. It was also his second game-deciding goal in his career.

- He tallied a four-point game (2g-2a) against Carolina on Nov. 5, his third multi-point game this season and 94th in his career.
- He tallied a three-game point streak (3g-4a) from Oct. 23-27.
- He notched his first career four-assist and five-point game (1g-4a) on Oct. 26 vs. Minnesota.
- The right-winger scored two goals (SH/PP), his first multi-point game at Calgary (10/12).
- He scored a shootout goal in the season-opener at Vancouver (10/11).

MAGICAL MATVEI

- Matvei Michkov saw his point streak come to end on Nov. 18 vs. Colorado, where he totaled 3 shots in 19:47 TOI.

- The right winger leads NHL rookies in goals (6), points (15), power play goals (3), power play points (8), and overtime goals (1), ranks third in assists (9) and ranks fourth in shots (32).

- He ranks second on the team in goals, assists, points, and power play goals and ranks tied for sixth in shots (32).
- He posted two assists on Nov. 16 vs. Buffalo to extend his point streak to four games (2g-3a), 11/11-11/16.

- He scored the overtime goal at Ottawa (11/14), his first career overtime goal. He is the youngest Flyer to score an overtime goal in franchise history.

- The rookie is the fourth Flyers rookie to score an overtime goal, along with Shayne Gostisbehere, Murray Baron and Dmitry Yushkevich. (NHL Stats)

- Per NHL Stats, Michkov (1g-1a) recorded his fourth career multi-point game, which ties with Ron Sutter and Boby Kelly for sixthmost by a Flyers teenager. (11/11)



- He tallied an assist at Carolina (11/5) to become the 17th Flyers skater to reach 10 career points in 13 games or fewer. Over the past 30 years, only two Flyers skaters have accomplished the feat: James van Riemsdyk (9 GP in 2009-10) and Mike Richards (11 GP in 2005-06). (NHL Stats)

- He was named NHL Rookie of the Month for October (11/1).

- He recorded a career-high three-game point streak twice this season: Oct. 12-17 (2g-2a) and Oct. 22-26 (2g-3a).

- The Russian native tallied his second consecutive multi-point game (1g-1a) on Oct. 26 vs. Minnesota.

- He notched his second career multi-point (1g-1a) at Washington (10/23).

- The forward became the first Flyers rookie since James van Riemsdyk (1g-6a in 2009-10) to record at least seven points through his first seven NHL games. The only other teenage rookies to do so for the club are Peter Zezel (2g-6a in 1984-85), Eric Lindros (4g-3a in 1992-93) and Rich Sutter (5g-2a in 1983-84). (NHL Stats)

- Per NHL Stats, he has spent 44.8% of playing time in the offensive zone - the highest percentage among top five highest-scoring rookies this season (via NHL EDGE) (10/22).

- He recorded a career-high three-game point streak (2g-2a), Oct. 12-17.

- The 19-year-old tallied his first and second NHL goals, both while on the power play, his first multi-goal and multi-point game in his career (10/15 at EDM).

- He is the first Flyers rookie to score multiple power-play goals since Nolan Patrick on April 3, 2018 at NY Islanders.
- The forward posted his first NHL assist/point against Calgary (10/12).
- He posted four shots and blocked one shot in 18:32 ice time in his NHL debut on Oct. 11 against Vancouver.

NEW GUY ON THE BLOCK

- Anthony Richard saw his point streak come to end against Colorado (11/18).

- He tallied two assists against Buffalo (11/16) to extend his point streak to a career-igh four games (2g-4a), 11/9-11/16.
- He posted his first multi-point game of the season (1g-1a) at Ottawa on Nov. 14.
- He made his Flyers debut on Nov. 7 at Tampa Bay and logged a career-high 16:00 TOI.
- The center was recalled to the Flyers on Nov. 6.
- At the time of his recall from Lehigh Valley, he led the team in assists (5), points (9) and ranked second in goals (4).
- He was on a five-game point streak (3g-4a), 10/25-11/2, for the Phantoms.

SANNY SIDE UP

- Travis Sanheim registered an assist on Nov. 18 vs. Colorado to extend his point streak to three games (2g-4a), 11/14-11/18.

- He ranks tied for fourth among NHL defensemen in points (11) since Oct. 26th.
- The 28-year-old leads all Flyers defensemen in goals (5), assist (7), points (12) and shots (46).
- He leads the team in time on ice per game (25:35), ranks third in goals, points, shots and ranks third in assists.
- He posted his third multi-point game (1g-1a) vs. Buffalo (11/16).
- He registered his fifth-career three-point game (1g-2a) at Ottawa on Nov. 14.
- He notched three points (2g-1a), his first multi-point appearance of the season, against Montreal (10/27).
- The defenseman logged a season-high 27:49 time on ice on Oct. 26 vs. Minnesota (10/26).
- He scored his first goal of the season against Washington (10/22).

TIPP OF THE HAT

- Owen Tippett scored a goal on Nov. 18 vs. Colorado, breaking a four-game goal drought.

- He owns four points (3g-1a) in the last seven games and nine points (4g-5a) in the last 13 games.
- He leads the team in shots (56), ranks tied for fourth in goals (3), assists (6) and ranks fourth in points (9).

- He scored the lone goal for Flyers in regulation against Tampa on Nov. 7 as well as a shootout goal to help earn the victory. His shootout goal was on his first shootout goal on his first attempt this season and his fourth attempt in his career.

- He tallied a multi-point game (1g-1a) against Carolina (11/5), his third this season and 35th in his career.
- The right winger posted a three-game point streak (1g-4a) from Oct. 23 27.

BLUELINE BRILLIANCE

- In the last ten games, the Flyers have had 20 points (4g-16a) from defensemen (10/29-11/18).
- Emil Andrae has two assists in his last three games (11/11-11/16).
 - He tallied an assist at Ottawa (11/14) to give him an assist in consecutive games.
 - He ranks third among NHL rookie defensemen in TOI per game (18:27), tied for third in assists (3) and shots (13) and tied for sixth in points (3).
 - He played a career-high 25:40 TOI on Nov. 11 vs. San Jose.
 - He notched his first NHL assist/point at Boston (10/29).
 - He became the 25th Swedish-born player and 16th Swedish defenseman to tally a point for the Flyers franchise.



- Helge Grans tallied his first NHL point in his NHL debut on Nov. 18 vs. Colorado.

- He became the 26th Swedish-born player and 17th Swedish defenseman to tally a point for the Flyers franchise.

- Erik Johnson recorded his 1,000th game in the NHL on Nov. 16 against Buffalo.
 - He scored his first goal of the season against San Jose (11/11).
 - He is one of eight players drafted in the 2006 NHL Draft still actively playing in the NHL and just one of two defensemen.
 - He ranks 12th among players drafted in the 2006 NHL Draft in games played (1000).
- Rasmus Ristolainen ranks second among Flyers defensemen in shots (19) and tied for fourth in points (3)
 - He posted an assist on Nov. 9 at Florida.
 - He ranks fourth among NHL defensemen drafted in the 2013 NHL Draft in assists (235) and points (288).
 - He recorded two points (1g-1a) on Oct. 26 vs. Minnesota, his 47th career multi-point game.
- Nick Seeler ranks third among Flyers defensemen in assists (4) and points (5).
 - He has two points (0g-2a) in the last five games.
 - After returning from an injury, he has five points (1g-4a) in the last 10 games.
 - He posted two points (1g-1a) on Saturday against Minnesota (10/26).
- Egor Zamula saw his three-game point streak come to an end against Colorado (11/18).
 - He notched his first multi-point game (1g-1a) of the season, his fourth in his career, to extend his assist/point streak to three games (1g-3a), 11/11-11/16.
 - He ranks second among Flyers defensemen in assists (5) and points (6).

BETWEEN THE PIPES

- Ivan Fedotov is on a three-game win streak, 11/7-11/16.
 - He earned his first win at home and first win in regulation on Nov. 16 vs. Buffalo, saving 24-of-26 shots.
 - The goaltender notched his first overtime win at Ottawa on Nov. 14, stopping 33-of-37 shots he faced.
 - He recorded his first NHL win and shootout win against Tampa on Nov. 7.
 - He stopped 22-of-23 shots he faced in regulation/overtime and went 2-for-2 shots in the shootout vs. Tampa (11/7).
- **Aleksei Kolosov** is looking for his first NHL win and owns a 0-4-0 in his four games played.
 - He missed three games due to a lower-body injury, 11/17-11/11.
 - He ranks fifth among NHL rookie goaltenders in goals-against-average (3.71) and save percentage (.872).
 - The goaltender made his NHL against Montreal on Oct. 27, saving 20-of-24 shots he faced and posting a .833 save percentage.
 - He became the first Belarusian-born goaltender and 17th Belarusian-native to play in the National Hockey League.
