- The Stars victory over the Predators extended the Stars' winning streak to seven games, matching their season long that the previously achieved from Dec. 29 to Jan. 11. Dallas is the third team this season to have two separate win streaks of at least seven games, joining the Winnipeg Jets (3) and the Carolina Hurricanes (2).
- Mikael Granlund (1-0-1) extended his point streak against Nashville to five games, earning eight points (5-3-8) in those games.
- Mikko Rantanen (0-2—2) extended his point streak against the Predators to three games, totaling six points (1-5—6) during that span.
- Mason Marchment scored a goal in the third period and became the fifth Stars player to reach the 20-goal mark in 2024-25. This is the third straight campaign Dallas has had at least five 20-goal scorers the second longest run in franchise history behind a six season stretch from 1978-79 1983-84 according to NHL Stats.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Today is the second and final game that the Stars will play against the Penguins this season and the first time they are playing in Dallas this year. The Stars defeated the Penguins with a 7-1 win on Nov. 11 in Pittsburgh.
- The Stars enter today's game with a 50-21-4 record for 104 points and a .693 points percentage. Their point total and points percentage ranked third in the NHL this season and their 50 wins ranked second entering play Friday.
- In 19 games since the Four Nations break (since Feb. 22), the Stars have outscored their opponents 26-9 at even strength when **Cody Ceci** has been on the ice. His plus-17 on-ice even-strength goal differential was the best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Friday.
 - o Ceci was on the ice for four of the five goals Dallas scored in their last game on April 3 against Nashville.
- Entering play Friday, the Stars were the only team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Friday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in goals for per game (3.43, third) and in goals against per game (2.51, third).
 - o Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 39 of the 75 games that they have played this year.

PLAYOFF BOUND

- Dallas became the third team to clinch a berth to the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs with their 5-1 win over the Kraken in their game on March 29.
- 2024-25 season marks the 37th postseason appearance in franchise history and their fifth time in the past five seasons
 tied for the most among all teams in that span according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars have made the Conference Finals in each of their past two postseasons and can become the fifth team in the
 past 20 years to do so in three straight (also TBL, CHI, LAK & DET) according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars have won nine series in the past 10 years, tied with the Penguins for the third most in the NHL in that span according to NHL Stats behind only the Lightning (18) and Golden Knights (11).

MARCH OF THE PENGUINS

- Dallas is 70-71-14 all-time vs. Pittsburgh, including a 46-24-8 mark at home.
- The Stars have won their last four consecutive games against Penguins dating back to March 23, 2023. Dallas has also earned points in eight of their last 10 games at American Airlines Center vs. Pittsburgh (8-2-0).
- Matt Duchene has five points (2-3—5) in this last five games he has played against the Penguins. In all, Duchene has registered 18 points (10-8—18) in 26 career games vs. Pittsburgh.
- Mason Marchment has five points (1-4-5) in five career games against the Penguins. His five points were all recorded
 in Dallas' last game vs. Pittsburgh on Nov. 11, his second highest point total tallied in a single game in his career (most:
 6 at CBJ, Jan. 31, 2022).
- Mikko Rantanen has 16 points (5-11—16) in 14 career games against the Penguins, including putting up five points (3-2—5) in his last game played vs. Pittsburgh on Dec. 10. Rantanen is averaging better than a point a game against them (1.14).
- Mikael Granlund enters today's matchup riding a three-game point streak vs. Pittsburgh, earning four points (2-2—4) in those games. In all, Granlund has 13 points (7-6—13) in 20 career games against the Penguins.
- Thomas Harley has three points (1-2-3) in three career games against Pittsburgh.
- **Jake Oettinger** has a 5-1-0 career record against the Penguins, posting a .944 save percentage and a 1.67 goals-against average in those games.
 - Oettinger's 1.67 goals-against average ranks second among active netminders to play the Penguins at least three times.
- Jason Robertson has nine points (1-8—9) in six career games against Pittsburgh. He has posted multi-point efforts in four of the six games he has played against the Penguins.
 - o **Robertson's** 1.50 points per game against the Penguins is tied for the second-highest rate in the NHL amongst active players to have played Pittsburgh at least three times.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter today's game having won each of their last seven games played, which is the second-longest active win streak in the NHL (St. Louis; 11).
- A victory today would match the franchise record for consecutive wins that the team set last season from March 16 to April 3, 2024. A Dallas victory today would also make them the fifth team this season to have a win streak of at least eight games, joining Carolina (2), Winnipeg (2), St. Louis and Tampa Bay.
- Dallas has won each of their last six games in regulation. If the Stars were to do so again today, it would give the team seven consecutive wins in regulation for the first time since the team won eight straight regulation wins from March 16 to April 3, 2024.
- The team has also earned at least a point in each of their last 10 games played (8-0-2). A win or an overtime loss today would give them points in 11 consecutive games for the first time since the team had a point in 12 consecutive games from Oct. 29 to Nov. 25, 2019, posting an 11-0-1 record during that span.
- A win or overtime loss today would also give the Stars their eighth point streak of at least 11 games since the team relocated from Minnesota to Dallas.
 - o The Stars had one point streak of at least 10 games when the team was located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 10-game point streak is the second longest active point streak in the NHL, trailing only the St. Louis Blues (11). If they were to earn at least a point today, they would become the fourth team this season to have a point streak of at least 11 games, joining the Capitals (12), Jets (11) and Blues (10).

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston has scored in each of the last six games that he has played, which is a career high for the forward. He is the first Star to scored in six consecutive games since Jamie Benn did so from March 16 to 28, 2024.
- If **Johnston** were to extend his goal streak today, he would be the first Stars skater in Dallas team history and the fifth player in franchise history to score in seven straight games according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston's six-game goal streak is the longest active such streak in the NHL. If he extends his streak today, he would become the fourth skater this season to score in seven consecutive games, joining Filip Forsberg, Jake Guentzel and Leon Draisaitl.
- With his goal against the Kraken on March 31, Johnston became the fifth player in the past 30 years to have multiple goal streaks of at least five games in the same season at age 21 or younger according to NHL Stats. The others to

- achieve this feat are Patrik Laine (3x in 2017-18), Alex Ovechkin (3x in 2005-06), Patrick Kane (2x in 2009-10) and Steven Stamkos (2x in 2009-10).
- His goal against Seattle was also his 30th of the season, making him the second player in franchise history to have consecutive 30-goal seasons at age 21 or younger following Brian Bellows (1982-83 to 1983-84) according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston's goal was the eventual game winner, the 10th of his career, becoming the fourth player in franchise history to reach the double-digit mark at age 21 or younger, following Brian Lawton (13), Brian Bellows (13) and Mike Modano (12) according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston's goal in Dallas's March 29 game against Seattle was his 66th point of the season, which set a career high for the forward.

HEATING UP

- Mikael Granlund has nine points (5-4—9) in his last nine games dating back to Mach 18 against Anaheim.
 - o **Granlund** enters today's game riding a four-game point streak. A goal or an assist today would give him points in five consecutive games for the second time this season.
- Mason Marchment has been playing at a point-per-game pace since March 7, totaling 13 points (5-8–13) in 13 games.
- Mikko Rantanen has totaled 13 points (4-9—13) in 13 games with the Stars since being acquired by Dallas from Carolina prior to the NHL Trade Deadline.
- Matt Duchene enters today's game riding a four-game point streak, recording six points (2-4—6) during that span. A
 goal or an assist today would give him his third point streak of at least five games this season.
 - Duchene's second assist in Dallas' last game was his 48th assist of the season, which set a career high for the forward.

SEEING STARS

- Roope Hintz was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on March 30 after tallying nine points (2-7—9) in four games played.
- It is the third time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors after previously being named the NHL's Third Star of the Week on April 12, 2021 and the Second Star of the Week on March 3, 2025.
- Hintz is one of 10 players this season to earn Star of the Week honors on multiple occasions.
- Hintz joins Matt Duchene (week ending on Oct. 27, 2024) and Mason Marchment (week ending on Nov. 17, 2024) as
 the three Dallas players to earn Star of the Week honors this season.
- Hintz has totaled 29 points (6-23—29) in 18 games played since the Four Nation Break. Since Feb. 22, his 23 assists were tied for the most in the NHL entering play Friday and his 29 points were tied for second.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when Hintz has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play since Feb. 22, the Stars have outscored their opponents 15-6.
- Hintz recorded his 200th career assist in Dallas' March 29 game against Seattle. With the assist he became...
 - o The 28th skater in franchise history to total 200 assists with the team.
 - o The 18th skater selected in the 2015 NHL Draft to reach the 200-assist milestone.
 - o The 30th Finnish player in NHL history to have 200 career assists.
- In all this season, **Hintz** has totaled 65 points (28-37—65) in 69 regular-season games, making the 2024-25 campaign his fourth consecutive 60-point season.

THIRTY, FLIRTY AND THRIVING

- The Stars enter today's game with three players that have scored at least 30 goals this season: **Jason Robertson** (33), **Mikko Rantanen** (31) and **Wyatt Johnston** (30).
- Entering play Friday, the Stars were one of three teams this season to have at least three 30-goal scorers on its roster, joining the Tampa Bay Lightning (4) and the Washington Capitals (3).
- Entering today's game, Matt Duchene and Roope Hintz are one and three goals shy, respectively, of reaching the 30-goal mark. If they were both to score 30 goals by the end of the regular season, it would mark the first time in franchise history that the Stars would have five 30-goals scorers on its roster.
- Additionally, the Stars could become the first team to have five 30-goal scorers on its roster since the Pittsburgh Penguins and Detroit Red Wings, who both did so during the 1992-93 season according to NHL Stats. Please note that this includes players who did not score all 30+ of their goals with one team.

IT TAKES TWO

- **Jake Oettinger** has an 20-6-2 record in his last 28 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .916 save percentage and a 2.45 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 20 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Friday.
- Oettinger made a season-high 41 saves in Dallas' March 26 game, a 4-3 win over the Oilers. The Stars were outshot 44-24 in that game.
- Oettinger made 33 saves for his 12th career shutout in Dallas' March 24 game, a 3-0 win over Minnesota, which tied Jon Casey for the sixth-most shutouts in franchise history.
 - Oettinger saved 5.74 goals above expected in the game according to MoneyPuck.com.

- Oettinger's shutout was also the 12th of his career, which tied teammate Casey DeSmith for the fifth-most by a U.S.born goaltender in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars' victory over the Wild was also the 146th win of **Oettinger's** career, which passed Cesare Maniago (145) for the fourth-most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
- Oettinger earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- Casey DeSmith has posted an 8-0-1 record in his last eight games played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .943 save percentage and a 1.87 goals-against average in those contests.
 - Among netminders that have played at least five games since Jan. 25, DeSmith ranked second and seventh, respectively, in the NHL in save percentage and goals-against average.
- DeSmith's current run is the first time in his career that he has earned nine consecutive decisions without losing a game
 in regulation.
- DeSmith made 46 saves in Dallas' March 27 game against the Flames, a 5-2 Stars win. His 46 saves were the most by a
 Dallas netminder this season and the third-most in a single game in DeSmith's career.
- In all this season, **DeSmith** has saved .806 goals above expected per 60, which was the second-best mark in the NHL this season entering play Friday among netminders that have played in more than five games.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .912 save percentage this season, which was the second-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Friday. The duo's 2.49 goals-against average this season ranked third in the NHL this year entering play Friday.

HOME COOKING

- The Stars have a 28-7-2 record at home this season. Entering play Friday, they ranked in the top five in the NHL in home wins (tied second), points (fourth) and points percentage (.784, third).
- Dallas is one home win shy of matching the franchise record of 29 set by the team in 1998-99.
- The Stars have earned at least a point in each of the last 12 games that they have played at home dating back to Jan. 24 against Vegas. With a win or overtime loss today, the Stars would extend their home point streak to 13 games for the first time since Oct. 30 to Dec. 23, 2010.
- Since Jan. 24, the Stars have gone 13-for-38 on the power play at the American Airlines Center. Their 34.2 percent success rate on the power play at home was the third-best mark in the NHL during that span, and their 13 home power-play goals were tied for second entering play Friday.
- Jason Robertson (41 points, 37 games played) and Roope Hintz (39 points, 35 games played) are both playing at a
 point-per-game pace at home this year.
 - o Robertson's 41 home points this year are the most of any Stars skater this season.
- Wyatt Johnston has been playing at a point-per-game pace at home since Oct. 20, totaling 33 points (16-17—33) in 33 games.
- Thomas Harley has recorded 19 points (6-13—19) in his last 18 home games dating back to Dec. 31. His nineteen home points during that span ranked fourth on both the Stars and among all NHL defensemen entering play Friday.
 - o Fourteen of those nineteen points have come in the 10 home games that he has played since Feb. 2
 - He has 27 home points (9-18—27) in all this season, which ranked 10th among NHL defensemen entering play Friday.
- Matt Duchene has tallied 19 points (4-15—19) in his last 17 home games and enters today's game riding a six-game home point streak.
- Mikael Granlund has five points (3-2—5) in his last five games played at the American Airlines Center.
- Mason Marchment has five points (2-3—5) in his last five home games.
- Jake Oettinger has won the last nine games that he has played at the American Airlines Center dating back to Jan. 24, posting a .927 save percentage, a 2.09 goals-against average and one shutout in those games.
 - o Oettinger's current nine-game home win streak is the longest such streak of his career.
- Casey DeSmith has a 4-1-1 record at home this year, which includes earning at least a point in his last four starts at the American Airlines Center.

R&R&R

- Roope Hintz, Jason Robertson and Mikko Rantanen have played 139:13 together in all situations since Rantanen was
 acquired from the Hurricanes prior to the NHL Trade Deadline. The line has logged a 56.1 percent Corsi rating together
 during that span according to Natural Stat Trick.
- According to Natural Sat Trick, when the trio has been on the ice together in all situations, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-3.
- Since March 18 against the Ducks, **Hintz** (1.33), **Robertson** (1.11) and **Rantanen** (1.00) have been playing at a point-per game pace.

 The line also plays on the Stars' top power-play unit together along with forward Wyatt Johnston and defenseman Thomas Harley. In the 10 games that the unit has played together, the Stars have scored five goals in 29:15 of powerplay ice time according to Natural Stat Trick.

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley has 24 points (8-16—24) in his last 25 games played dating back to Jan. 31, which ranks fifth on Dallas' roster during that span.
- Harley's 24 points (8-16—24) since Jan. 31 were tied with Buffalo's Rasmus Dahlin and Edmonton's Evan Bouchard for the second-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Friday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (34).
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without Miro Heiskanen Harley has been averaging 25:01 of ice time per game, which
 tops all Stars skaters and ranked ninth in the NHL entering play Friday.
 - o Prior to Jan. 31, **Harley** was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
 - Harley skated a career-high 31:11 in Dallas' game on March 20 against the Tampa Bay Lightning. It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since Heiskanen skated 32:01 on April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 47 points (15-32—47) in 73 regular-season games this season. His goal, assist and point totals from this season all match his career high from last year.
 - His 15 goals this season were tied for the sixth-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Friday.
 - His 15 goals this year are also tied for the eighth-most by a Stars defensemen in a single season in franchise history.
- When Harley has been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 89 51. His plus-38 on-ice even-strength goal differential was the best mark in the NHL this season entering play Friday.
- Harley recorded the 100th point of his NHL career with an assist in Dallas' March 26 game against the Oilers, making him the third defenseman drafted in 2019 to reach the 100-point milestone, joining Detroit's Moritz Seider and Buffalo's Bowen Byram. He also became the 24th defenseman in franchise history to total 100 points with the Stars.
- Harley's 100th career point came in his 188th career regular-season games, making him the fourth-fastest defenseman in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career points according to NHL Stats, following John Klingberg (145 GP), Craig Hartsburg (170 GP) and Brad Maxwell (170 GP).
- Harley matched his single-game career high with three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' March 18 game against the Ducks, surpassing Larry Murphy (93) for the 25th-most points by a defenseman in team history.
 - In that game, the Stars outshot the Ducks 15-2 when Harley was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Harley's game-winning goal in Dallas' March 22 game against the Flyers came just nine seconds into overtime, which set a record for the quickest overtime goal in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- Harley is one of four defensemen this season to score two overtime goals. In total, he has scored five overtime goals since the start of 2023-24, which leads all NHL defensemen and is tied for fifth in the NHL.
- Harley's two-goal performance against the Flyers brought his season total up to 15, matching his career high that he
 set last season. He is the third defenseman in franchise history to record consecutive 15-goal seasons according to NHL
 Stats, joining Phillippe Boucher (2 from 2005-06 2006-07) and Lou Nanne (1971-72 1972-73).

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 84.9 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL
 this year entering play Friday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 31, and their -25 goal
 differential on the penalty kill this year was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 28th in the league in total penalty minutes (519) and 27th in penalty minutes per game (6:55) entering play Friday.
- Entering play Friday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (265:08) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:32) this season.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Thomas Harley is two assists shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is one goal shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is four assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is 10 points shy of tying Lou Nanne (225) for 10th most points by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is one assist shy of surpassing Miro Heiskanen (225) the 20th-most assists in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is 10 goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.

- Stars forward **Mikael Granlund** played for the Penguins for part of the 2022-23 season, earning five points (1-4—5) in 21 games.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith played five seasons for the Penguins (2017-18 to 2022-23), earning 58 wins in 115 starts
- Stars defenseman Cody Ceci played one season (2020-21) for the Penguins, earning 17 points (4-13—17) in 53 games.
- Penguins defenseman Ryan Shea played for the Texas Stars for three seasons (2020-21 to 2022-23).
- Stars forwards Evgenii Dadonov and Mason Marchment skated with Penguins forward Noel Acciari for the Florida Panthers. Dadonov played with Acciari in 2019-20 and Marchment joined Acciari in 2020-21 and 2021-22.
