- Five Stars skaters recorded a point during the game. Jason Robertson had a multi-point outing (1-1-2).
- Jamie Benn assisted on Robertson's goal to give him 51 career points (22-29—51) against the Blues, which is tied with Chicago for his most against a single opponent.
- Matt Duchene scored the 13th overtime goal of his career and third as a member of the Stars. His 13 overtime goals are tied for the 12th-most among all active NHL skaters.
- Duchene now has 17 points (6-11—17) in his last 14 games against the Blues dating back to Feb. 15, 2020.
- Jake Oettinger earned his 49th win of the 2024 calendar year (including playoffs) and passed Ed Belfour (48 in 2000) for the most by a goaltender in Stars/North Stars history according to NHL Stats.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final time the Stars will play the Capitals this season, after falling to them 3-2 on Oct. 17 in Washington.
- Tonight is the fourth of six consecutive home games the Stars will play, their longest such stretch of the season.
- Entering play Sunday, the Stars, Minnesota Wild and Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.55 goals against per game this season, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 16 of the 27 games that they have played this year.
- Mason Marchment has logged a plus-16 even-strength on-ice goal differential this season, which was tied for the sixth-best mark among all NHL forwards this year entering play Sunday.

NO CAP

- Dallas is 57-31-20 all-time vs. Washington, including a 29-13-12 mark at home.
- Roope Hintz has 10 points (5-5—10) in 10 career games against the Capitals and enters tonight's matchup riding a sixgame point streak (4-4—8) against Washington.
- Mason Marchment has four points (2-2—4) in his last four games against Washington.
- **Jake Oettinger** is undefeated in his career against the Capitals, posting a 4-0-0 record with a .950 save percentage, 1.60 goals-against average and one shutout.
- Jason Robertson has six points (2-4—6) in his last six games against Washington.

HOME COOKING

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against Washington with an 12-3-0 record while playing at home this season.
 - Only two of Dallas' "home" losses this season were American Airlines Center, with the first coming at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
 - o Currently the Stars are tied with the Vegas Golden Knights and Los Angeles Kings for the fewest losses at home this season (3).
- Dallas' .800 points percentage and 12 wins at home this season were both the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- The Stars have allowed only 31 goals and 2.07 goals-per-game in home games this year, which were both tied for the third-best marks in the NHL this season entering play Sunday.
- Dallas has gone 34-for-38 on the penalty kill at home this year. Their 89.5 percent success rate when playing a man
 down at home this year was the best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.
 - o No team has allowed fewer power-play goals against at home this year than Dallas' four.
- Dallas' next home win will be their 13th of the season. Last year, the Stars won their 13th home game of the season on Jan. 10, 2024 against the Minnesota Wild.
- Matt Duchene is the team's leading scorer at home this year, totaling 14 points (8-6-14) in 15 games.
- **Jamie Benn** as 11 points (4-7—11) in his last 11 home games dating back to Nov. 1 and enters tonight's matchup riding a three-game home point streak.
- Jason Robertson has totaled nine points (3-6—9) in his last seven games at the American Airlines Center dating back to Nov. 14.
- Roope Hintz has six points (2-4-6) in his last six home games dating back to Nov. 20.

KILLING IT

- Entering play Sunday, the Stars had the sixth-ranked penalty kill in the NHL this season with an 83.1 percent success rate.
 - o They have gone a perfect 6-for-6 on the penalty kill and scored one shorthanded goal during their current homestand.
- Dallas has allowed only 14 power-play goals against this season, which was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL
 this season entering play Sunday. Their 0.48 power-play goals against per game were also ranked fifth in the NHL
 entering play Sunday.
- Thomas Harley has allowed 3.65 power-play goals against per 60, which was the fifth-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday among defensemen that have at least 40 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- Esa Lindell has skated 99 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was fifth-highest total of any NHL skater this season entering play Sunday.

H'S HOUSE

- Thomas Harley (4-10—14) and Miro Heiskanen (4-10—14) enter tonight's contest against the Capitals tied for the lead in scoring among Dallas defensemen this season.
- Both players are pacing to finish the year with 40 points, which would mark the third consecutive 40-point season of Heiskanen's career and the second consecutive 40-point season of Harley's career.
- Harley and Heiskanen have played together for 194:39 at 5-on-5, the most of any Dallas defensive pair this season.
- While the duo has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 10-7, outshot them 118-75 and have 115 scoring chances for to their opponent's 82.
 - o In Dallas' last game at 5-on-5, the Stars outshot the Blues 15-4 when **Heiskanen** was on the ice and 14-5 when **Harley** was on the ice.
- This season when **Harley** has been on the ice during even-strength play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 38-21. **Harley** is leading all Stars skaters this year in both and on-ice even-strength goals for (38) and on-ice even-strength goal differential (+17).
- Entering play Sunday, **Harley** ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in both on-ice even-strength goals for (tied seventh) and on-ice even-strength goal differential (tied fifth).

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise
 history.
- Miro Heiskanen is one assist shy of tying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is one point away from taking sole possession of 24th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Matt Duchene is five points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- Esa Lindell is two games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
- Lindell also enters tonight's contest four assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.

BICHS BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Dallas' game against the Predators on Dec. 12 marked the first NHL game of defenseman Lian Bichsel's career.
- In making his NHL debut, Bichsel became:
 - The 33rd player and 13th defenseman selected in the 2022 NHL Draft to appear in an NHL regular-season game.
 - The eighth player drafted by the Stars between 2017 and 2024 to play in at least one regular-season game for Dallas.
 - o The 46th Swiss player and 15th Swiss defenseman in league history to appear in an NHL regular-season game.
- Bichsel scored his first NHL goal in the game, making him the third defenseman in franchise history to score in his NHL debut according to NHL Stats, joining Daniel Poulin (Dec. 12, 1981) and Bryan Maxwell (Feb. 16, 1987). Bichsel's goal came exactly 43 years to the day after Poulin's.
- Additionally, Bichsel recorded five hits in the game, which is tied for the most by a Stars skater in a single game this
 season
- When Bichsel was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in his first two NHL games, the Stars outshot their opponents 12-6 and had 11 scoring chances to their seven according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - Bichel's 66.7 percent on-ice Corsi rating in his NHL debut was the best mark of any defenseman to take the ice (Stars or Predators) during the game.
- Standing at 6'7", there are only four players to appear in a regular-season game this year that are taller than **Bichsel**: New York's Matt Rempe (6'9"), Vancouver's Tyler Myers (6'8"), Chicago's Louis Crevier (6'8") and Calgary's Adam Klapka (6'8").
- Bichsel was originally selected by the Stars with the 18th-overall pick of the 2022 NHL Draft, the only Swiss player to be drafted that year. It made him the seventh-highest drafted Swiss player in NHL history, behind Nico Hischier (first overall, 2017), Nino Niederreiter (fifth overall, 2010), Timo Meier (ninth overall, 2015), Kevin Fiala (11th overall, 2014), Sven Bärtschi (13th overall, 2011) and Michel Riesen (14th overall, 1997).
 - Defenseman Mirco Müller was also drafted 18th overall, taken by San Jose in 2013.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward Roope Hintz (Finland), defensemen Miro Heiskanen (Finland) and Esa Lindell (Finland), and goaltender Jake Oettinger (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only seven teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, NY Rangers, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - Heiskanen has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold)
 IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - Lindell suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He
 again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the
 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - Hintz previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - Oettinger has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are playing for Finland together.
 - o Heiskanen and Lindell previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen will serve as Finland's General Manager.

- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Capitals forward Taylor Raddysh were teammates in Chicago from 2022-23 to 2023-24.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Capitals forward Dylan Strome shared the ice for a handful of games in Arizona during the 2018-19 season.
