PITTSBURGH PENGUINS

All-Time Wild Record: 15-16-2 (7-7-2 at Xcel Energy Center, 8-9-0 at Pittsburgh)

2023-24: Minnesota went 1-1-0 in the season series against Pittsburgh...The Penguins won the series-opening game, 4-3, at PPG Paints Arena (12/18)... Minnesota won the second contest, 3-2, in Saint Paul (2/9)... **LW Matt Boldy** (1-2=3) and **LW Kirill Kaprizov** (1-2=3) had three points each... **D Jonas Brodin** (1-1=2) and **D Brock Faber** (0-2=2) had two points each... **G Filip Gustavsson** stopped 26-of-30 shots faced in the first meeting... **G Marc-Andre Fleury** stopped 34-of-36 shots faced in the second game... **C Sidney Crosby** (2-1=3), **LW Jake Guentzel** (2-1=3), **C Evgeni Malkin** (1-2=3) all had three points... **D Marcus Pettersson** (0-2=2), **D Valteri Puustinen** (0-2=2) and **D Erik Karlsson** (0-2=2) all had two points... **G Alex Nedeljkovic** went 1-1-0 with a 3.06 GAA and a .895 SV% in two starts.

WILD LEADERS: **LW Marcus Johansson** leads Minnesota with 24 points (10-14=24) in 42 career games against Pittsburgh... **RW Mats Zuccarello** owns 22 points (6-16=22) in 35 games... **D Zach Bogosian** has 13 points (4-9=13) in 31 games... **Brodin** owns 12 points (3-9=12) in 19 games.

WILD GOALIES: **Fleury** is 5-4-0 with a 3.05 GAA, a .906 SV% and one shutout in nine starts vs. Pittsburgh... **Gustavsson** is 1-3-0 with a 4.04 GAA and a .873 SV% in four games (three starts).

PENGUINS LEADERS: **Karlsson** (9-26=35 in 29 games) and **Crosby** (12-23=35 in 24 games) lead Pittsburgh with 35 points each vs. Minnesota... **Malkin** owns 26 points (11-15=26) in 20 matches... **D Kris Letang** has 18 points (4-14=18) in 22 contests... **RW Rickard Rakell** has 17 points (11-6=17) in 32 games.

PENGUINS GOALIES: **G Tristan Jarry** is 3-0-1 with a 2.95 GAA and a .900 SV% in four career starts vs. the Wild... **Nedeljkovic** is 1-2-1 with a 4.29 GAA and a .860 SV% in four starts... **G Joel Blomqvist** has not faced Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota President of Hockey Operations and General Manager **Bill Guerin** totaled 57 points (26-31=57) in 95 games with Pittsburgh in two seasons (2008-10), winning the Stanley Cup in 2009... **Guerin** spent eight seasons in the Penguins' front office (2011-19), including five seasons (2014-19) as Assistant General Manager where he won two more Stanley Cups (2016, 2017)... **Minnesota Head Coach John Hynes** served as Head Coach of Wilkes-Barre Scranton for five seasons (2010-15) and one season as an Assistant Coach (2009-10)... **Hynes** led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs as Head Coach... **Fleury** was selected by the Penguins first overall in the 2003 NHL Draft and went 375-216-68 with a 2.58 GAA, a .912 SV% and 44 shutouts in 691 career games (667 starts) in 13 seasons (2003-17)... He posted a 62-51 record with a 2.65 GAA, a .908 SV% and 10 shutouts in 115 career playoff contests (113 starts) with Pittsburgh and win the Stanley Cup in 2009, 2016 and 2017... **C Freddy Gaudreau** collected 10 points (2-8=10) in 19 games with the Penguins in 2020-21... **Gustavsson** was selected by Pittsburgh in the second round (55th overall) of the 2016 NHL Draft... **Crosby** played at Shattuck St. Mary's (2002-03)... **C Blake Lizotte** is from Lindstrom and played two seasons at St. Cloud State University (2017-19).

FAST FACTS: The Wild has scored 97 goals in the all-time series, while Pittsburgh has scored 101.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Recorded a seven-game season-opening point streak (5-0-2) from 10/10 - 10/24, marking the fourth time in franchise history achieving the mark following 2007-08 (7-0-1 in 8 GP), 2008-09 (6-0-1 in 7 GP) and 2001-02 (3-0-4 in 7 GP)... Did not trail in regulation for 391:31 to start the season, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21), and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (4:14:32, 2014-15)... Is fourth in the NHL with a .913 SV% and fifth with a 2.50 GAA... Owns a 30.8 PP% (8/26), fifth-best in the NHL.

Matt Boldy: Owns an active four-game point streak (2-4=6)... T-3rd in the NHL with three PPG and T-5th with six PPP (3-3=6)... T-7th in NHL with four multi-point games... T-16th in the NHL with 11 points (4-7=11).

Joel Eriksson Ek: Owns an active three-game goal and point streak (3-2=5).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Has appeared in 99 career games for Minnesota, needs one game appearance to reach 100 in a Wild sweater... Currently at 1,027 career games played, needs two game appearances to tie Patrick Roy (1,029 career games) for third-most all time.

Marcus Foligno: Notched his 12th career multi-goal game with two goals (2-0=2) at PHI (10/26).

Brock Faber: Currently ranks fourth in the NHL with 25:48 of TOI/G.

Filip Gustavsson: Owns a 4-1-1 record through six starts, ranking T-3rd in the NHL in wins among qualified goalies.

Kirill Kaprizov: Owns an active five-game point streak (3-8=11)... Has also posted multiple points in five consecutive games, a career long, the longest road multi-point streak in franchise history and tied with Kevin Fiala (five-game streaks in 2021-22 & 2019-20) for the second-longest run in Wild history behind Mats Zuccarello (six game streak in 2021-22)... T-1st in the NHL with six multi-point games this season... Recorded the 37th multi-point game of his career with two assists (0-2=2) at PHI (10/26), passing Pierre-Marc Bouchard and Mikael Granlund for sole possession of fourth-most in franchise history... Leads the team and ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 15 points (4-9=13)... Leads NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:35)... T-3rd in the NHL with 11 assists... Needs one PPG to tie Mikko Koivu (60 PPG) for second-most all-time in franchise history... Currently with 23 career GWG, needs one GWG to move past Eric Staal for sole possession of fourth-most in team history.

Jake Middleton: Owns an active three-game point streak (1-4=5), tied for a career long... T-7th in the NHL with 26 blocked shots this season... Notched three assists (0-3=3) at FLA (10/22), tying his career high in points (two other occurrences) and assists (also 10/24/23 vs. EDM).

Marco Rossi: Recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12 - 10/24... Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 - 10/22, also a career-long mark.

Mats Zuccarello: Recorded a four-game point streak (2-3=5) from 10/15 - 10/24.

TEAM NOTES



HOT START

- The Wild began the season with a seven-game season-opening point streak (5-0-2) from 10/10 - 10/24, marking the fourth time in franchise history achieving the mark following 2007-08 (7-0-1 in 8 GP), 2008-09 (6-0-1 in 7 GP) and 2001-02 (3-0-4 in 7 GP).
- Of the 60 previous occurrences of a season-opening seven-game point streak in NHL history, 53 teams made the playoffs. 13 of those teams won the Stanley Cup.

OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild has allowed three first-period goal this season, T-3rd in the NHL. Minnesota owns a plus-5 goal differential (eight goals for, three goal against) in the first period this season, T-3rd in the NHL.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

- The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 - 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota's four road wins and nine road points this season mark the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in the month of October.

ON THE POWER PLAY

- Minnesota currently ranks fifth in the NHL with a 30.8 power-play percentage (8/26) and is T-6th in PPG scored.
- Owens an active five-game streak with a power-play goal scored (six total PPGs), tied for the longest active streak in the NHL (also Carolina) and the longest NHL streak this season.
- The Wild finished the 2023-24 campaign with a 22.7 power-play percentage (62/273), the highest single-season percentage in franchise history.

- The Wild ranks T-5th in the NHL with 23 points (8-15=23) registered by players aged 23 years or younger to start the season (Boldy, Faber, Khusnutdinov, Rossi).
- Matt Boldy is T-1st among NHL players who started the season age 23 or younger with 11 points (4-7=11).
- Minnesota ranked second in the NHL last season with 0.42 rookie points scored per game played (min. 100 games played by rookie skaters).

PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** owns an active five-game point streak (3-8=11).
- Has also posted multiple points in five consecutive games, a career long, the longest road multi-point streak in franchise history and tied with Kevin Fiala (five-game streaks in 2021-22 & 2019-20) for the second-longest run in Wild history behind Mats Zuccarello (six game streak in 2021-22). Is T-1st in the NHL with six multi-point games this season.
- Recorded the 37th multi-point game of his career with two assists (0-2=2) at PHI (10/26), passing Pierre-Marc Bouchard and Mikael Granlund for sole possession of fourth-most in franchise history.
- Leads the team and ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 15 points (4-9=13). T-3rd in the NHL with 11 assists
- Leads NHL forwards in TOI/G (22:35).
- Scored his 27th career game-opening goal at TBL (10/24) to pass Jason Zucker for the fourth most in Wild history.
- Posted his 33rd career game with three-plus points at TBL (2-1=3, 10/24). Currently trails only Mikko Koivu (34 games with three-plus points) for most in franchise history.
- Needs one PPG to tie Mikko Koivu (60 PPG) for second-most all-time in franchise history.
- Kaprizov led Minnesota in points (46-50=96) and goals and was second in assists last season. Ranked T-3rd in the NHL with 19 PPG, fifth with 41 PPP (19-22=41), T-8th in goals, T-11th with eight GWG and 11th in points.
- Is the first player in franchise history to post three consecutive seasons with 40-plus goals.
- Is one of four NHL players (Matthews, Pastrnak, Draisaitl) with 40-plus goals in each of the last three seasons (2021-24).
- Kaprizov has been named an NHL Star of the Week five times in his career, trailing only Devan Dubnyk (6x) for most in franchise history. He is the only Wild player to receive four First Star awards (also 1/18/21).
- Kaprizov posted his fourth career regular-season hat trick vs. VAN (2/19/24) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record.

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov notched the 23rd GWG of his career at CBJ (10/19), moving into a tie with Eric Staal for fourth-most in team history.

- Kaprizov posted season-long five-game goal streak (6-3=9) from 3/10/24 to 3/19/24, marking his fourth career goal streak of five-plus games. Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is one of three players in Wild history to record multiple five-game goal streaks (Gaborik, two times; Rolston, two times).

CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** owns an active three-game goal and point streak (3-2=5).
- Eriksson Ek played in his 500th career NHL game vs. SEA (10/12).
- Opened the season with a goal (1-0=1) and five hits vs. CBJ (10/10), tied for the ninth-highest single-game hit total of his career.
- Currently with 37 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs two PPGs to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek ranked second on the Wild with 12 PPGs and a career-high 30 goals last season while ranking third in points (30-34=64).
- Became the 11th player in franchise history to record 30 goals in a single season, reaching the mark vs. SJS (3/28/24).
- Eriksson Ek posted an eight-game point streak (7-8=15) from 2/9/24 to 2/24/24, a career long.
- Posted a career-long four-game goal streak (7-4=11) from 2/12/24 to 2/19/24.
- The Swede posted his second career hat trick vs. VAN (2/19/24) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record. With the hat trick, he reached 120 career goals and moved past Andrew Brunnette (119 goals with MIN) for sixth on the franchise goal list.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** owns an active four-game point streak (2-4=6), is T-3rd in the NHL with three PPG, T-5th with six PPP (3-3=6), T-7th with four multi-point games and T-16th with 11 points (4-7=11).
- Boldy reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.
- Boldy opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.
- Finished T-15th in the NHL with seven GWG in 2023-24.
- Finished 2023-24 second on the Wild with 69 points (29-40=69), reaching a new single-season career high with an assist at VGK (4/12).
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6/23). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).

THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** owns a 4-1-1 record through six starts, ranking T-3rd in wins among qualified goalies.
- Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 15 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 18 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.
- He is the 10th goalie to score a goal by shooting it into an empty net (the others were the last to touch an own-goal).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** currently ranks fourth in the NHL with 25:48 of TOI/G.
- Reached 50 career points (8-42=50) in his 89th career game at CBJ (10/19), becoming the second-fastest Wild defenseman to reach 50 points with the franchise (Ryan Suter, 83 games).
- Faber led all NHL rookies with 24:58 TOI per game and 150 blocked shots, ranked T-1st with 39 assists and third with 46 points (8-39=47). Faber finished sixth among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.
- With a blocked shot at LAK (4/15/24), became the ninth NHL rookie to post 150-plus blocks in a season since 2005-06.
- With a two-point game (1-1=2) vs. STL (3/23/24), moved past Matt Boldy (15-24=39 in 2021-22) for the second-highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie.
- With two blocks at COL (3/8/24), reached 126 for the season and moved past Nate Prosser (124 blocked shots in 2011-12) for the highest single-season blocked shot total by a rookie in franchise history.
- With an assist vs. PIT (2/9/24), moved his season point total to 4-27=31 and surpassed Filip Kuba (9-21=30 in 2000-01) for the highest single-season point total by a Wild rookie defenseman. Also moved past Calen Addison (26 assists in 2022-23) for most single-season assists by a Wild rookie.
- Played in his 50th career game vs. NSH (1/25). With 29 points (4-25=29) in 50 career games, matched Marek Zidlicky for the second-most points by a Wild defenseman through their first 50 games with the Wild. The only blueliner with more is Ryan Suter (4-29=33 in 50 GP), per NHL Stats.
- Recorded five games with 30-plus minutes of TOI last season, four of which came in a five-game span from 12/14/23 to 12/21/23. Became one of two NHL rookies since 1997-98 to play four games with 30-plus minutes of TOI in a single season.
- **Skated a career-high 33:25 vs. MTL (12/21/23), the highest single-game total in the NHL last season and the third-highest by an NHL rookie since the start of the 2000-01 season.**
- Per NHL Stats, since time on ice began being tracked in 1997-98, Faber is only the 2nd rookie to record consecutive 30-plus-minute games (Atlanta's Toby Enstrom in March 2008), doing so vs. CGY (12/14/23) and vs. VAN (12/16/23).

- Among NHL rookies, Rossi finished second in goals (21), T-3rd in shots (167), T-4th in GWG (two) and fifth in points (21-19=40) last season.
- With two assists at LAK (4/15/24), became the third rookie in franchise history with 40 points in a single season.

MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- **Mats Zuccarello** recorded a four-game point streak (2-3=5) from 10/15 - 10/24.
- Posted a 1-1=2 statline at FLA (10/22) and became the fastest player in team history (ninth overall) to reach 200 assists with the Wild, doing so in his 330th game with the club. The previous mark was held by Mikko Koivu (400 games). He also became the sixth player in team history to record 70 multi-point games with the club.
- Zuccarello reached 200 career goals by scoring vs. SEA (10/12), becoming the first Norwegian-born player to reach the mark.
- He finished first on the Wild with 51 assists last season.
- With two assists at COL (4/9/24), reached the 50-assist mark for the second season in his career (also 2021-22, 55 assists).
- Needs one assist to tie Zach Parise (201 assists with MIN) for eighth-most in franchise history.

- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
