The Calgary Flames wrapped up a four-game homestand on Monday night by welcoming the Washington Capitals. Washington would score the only goal of the opening frame to lead 1-0 through 20. Kevin Rooney would get the Flames on the board in the second, but Washington scored three to lead 4-1 through 40. MacKenzie Weegar would draw the Flames within two in the final frame, but Washington added an empty netter to win 5-2.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third of four meetings this season between the Flames and Canucks. Calgary and Vancouver have split the season-series so far this season.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 9-7-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 19-16-2 against Western Conference opponents.

THIS SEASON VERSUS VAN:

The Flames and Canucks first meeting came on November 16th at the Scotiabank Saddledome. The Canucks would open the scoring mid-way through the first with Elias Pettersson capitalizing on a Vancouver power play to make it 1-0 for the visitors. With just under three minutes left in the opening frame, MacKenzie Weegar would zip home his then-third on the campaign to draw the Flames level through 20. The middle stanza would be all Flames, with Calgary more than tripling Vancouver's shot total, scoring two unanswered tallies to make it 3-1 Flames. Jonathan Huberdeau would shelf his third on the season just over three minutes into the third to extend the Flames lead to 4-1. Nils Hoglander gave Vancouver life midway through the frame, but a Flames empty netter along with seven third period saves from Jacob Markstrom helped the Flames take meeting number one 5-2. The Flames suffered a 4-3 setback in meeting number two but have outscored the Canucks 8-5 in their two matchups so far this season.

WEEGSY BABY:

MacKenzie Weegar found the back of the net for the 16th time this season in the Flames last contest on Monday against Washington. Weegar's 16 goals have now doubled his previous career-best of eight which he set during the 2021-22 campaign with the Florida Panthers and is now four points away from matching his career-best of 44 which he also set during 2021-22. Weegar has scored 15 of his 16 markers at even-strength, which leads all defenceman in the NHL so far this season, and his 16 goals total are the fourth-most in the league, behind only Roman Josi (18), Rasmus Dahlin (17) and Cale Makar (17).

TRICK OF THE TRADE:

The Flames and Canucks made two trades this season prior to the March 8th trade deadline. Their first swap came on November 30th, 2023 when they acquired a 2024 conditional fifth-round pick and a 2026 third-round pick for Nikita Zadorov. The two clubs would make a blockbuster deal on January 31st when the Flames acquired Andrei Kuzmenko, prospects Joni Jurmo, Hunter Brzustewicz, a 2024 first-round pick and a conditional 2024 fourth-round pick for Elias Lindholm.

CALGARY TIES TO VANCOUVER:

Flames goaltender Jacob Markstrom spent seven years with the Vancouver Canucks, posting a 99-93-27 record in 218 starts and 229 games played. Flames forward Andrei Kuzmenko was acquired by the Flames on January 31st and has registered eight points from five goals and three assists in 15 games as a member of the Flames. Kuzmenko is set to face the Vancouver Canucks for the first time in his NHL career.

VANCOUVER TIES TO CALGARY:

Canucks defenceman Nikita Zadorov and forward Elias Lindholm were both traded from Calgary to Vancouver this season. Nikita Zadorov skated in 177 games for the Flames, with 49 points while Lindholm had been a member of the Flames since the 2018-19 season and posted 357 points in 418 games with Calgary.

NEW NAME:

On Monday, the Calgary Flames announced the signing of college free agent centre Sam Morton. Morton, a Lafayette, Colorado native was named the CCHA Player of the Year following a career-best and conference-leading 24 goals along with 10 assists for 34 points in 37 games this season. Morton registered nine power play markers which ranked tied for the eighth-most in all of college hockey in 2023-24 and helped Minnesota State reach the semifinals of the Mason Cup. The 24-year-old was named the CCHA Forward of the Month in January after posting six goals and three assists for nine points in eight games through the month, helping Minnesota State go 5-1-2 in January. In two games with the AHL's Calgary Wranglers, Morton has posted two points (1G, 1A).


HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Mikael Backlund opened the scoring against Montreal last Saturday for his 41st-career game-opening goal. Only three players in Flames franchise history have scored the first goal of a game more: Jarome Iginla (93), Theo Fleury (47), and Kent Nilsson (45).

With Dustin Wolf's fourth career win, he passes Curtis Joseph on the Flames all-time wins list. He now sits one win away from tying Hockey Hall of Fame honoree Grant Fuhr in wins with the Flames.

Andrew Mangiapane scored his first NHL goal at Rogers Arena against the Vancouver Canucks on February 9th, 2019.

CALGARY WRANGLERS (AHL): 31-22-7
