PLAYER NOTES

- **William Nylander** scored for the Maple Leafs at 12:29 of the first period and scored his second goal of the game at 5:43 of the second period. Nylander has scored in three-consecutive games (5G) while extending his current point streak to six games where he has recorded 10 points (6G, 4A). Nylander marked his fifth multi-goal game of the season and the 33rd multi-goal game of his NHL career. Nylander also posted his 13th multi-point game of the season. In improving to 23 goals scored this season, Nylander currently ranks second in the league among goal leaders.
- **Bobby McMann** scored for the Maple Leafs at 13:49 of the third period, scoring his ninth goal of the season. McMann has scored in three-consecutive games (3G) and extended his current point streak to four games where he has posted six points (3G, 3A). McMann tied the longest goal streak of his NHL career with three consecutive games and tied the longest point streak of his NHL career with four consecutive games, both of which he has marked on two occasions during his NHL career.
- **John Tavares** recorded the primary assist on Nylander’s first goal of the game, posting his 17th assist of the season. Tavares has recorded an assist in three-consecutive games (4A) and is currently on a four-game point streak where he has recorded seven points (3G, 4A).
- **Mitch Marner** recorded the primary assist on McMann’s goal, posting his 35th assist of the season. Marner is currently tied for the second most assists recorded this season with 35. Marner extended his current assist streak to five games where he has recorded seven assists.
- **Joseph Woll** stopped 28 of 33 shots he faced in tonight’s loss.
- **Morgan Rielly** was on the ice for a team-high 26 Toronto shot attempts-for at 5-on-5.
- **Matthew Knies** finished the game with a team-high 5-on-5 shot attempt percentage of 65.38 percent (17 for, 9 against).

TEAM NOTES

- Tonight was a penalty free game by both teams. The last occasion this occurred for the Maple Leafs dates back to Nov. 24th, 2018 vs. Philadelphia.
- Toronto has posted a 14-5-0 record on home ice this season.
- The Maple Leafs have posted a 4-3-1 record in the second game of a back-to-back this season.
