- Tyler Seguin's goal and assist extended his point streak against Colorado to six games. He now has 49 points (25-23—49) in 42 career games against the Avalanche.
- Jake Oettinger appeared in his 200th NHL start and recorded his 125th career win. The only goalies in NHL history with as many wins through 200 starts are Bill Durnan (134), Michel Larocque (129), Igor Shesterkin (127), Mike Vernon (125) and Andy Moog (125), according to NHL Stats.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of four games the Stars will play against the Jets this season and the first time the two teams are facing off in Dallas this year. The teams will next meet on March 14, 2025 in Winnipeg.
- Since the start of the 2022-23 season, the Stars have gone 20-for-23 on the penalty kill against the Jets for an 87.0 percent success rate, which is the fifth-best mark in the NHL during that span.
- Tonight's game against the Jets and tomorrow's game against the Utah Hockey Club are the third of 11 back-to-back sets that the Stars will play this season and the first of three sets in which one game will be played at home and another on the road.
 - o Although technically the Stars' Nov. 1 and 2 back-to-back against the Panthers was a home/road split, both games were played at Nokia Arena in Tampere.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.68 goals against per game this season, which was the fifth-best mark in the NHL entering
 play Saturday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 12 of the 22 games that they have played this year.
- Only one of Dallas' games this season has required extra time their 3-2 shootout win over the San Jose Sharks on Oct. 15. Entering play Saturday, the Stars and the Rangers were the only teams in the NHL this season to have only one of their games go beyond regulation.

GROUNDING THE JETS

- Dallas is 32-20-5 all-time vs. Winnipeg, including a 18-8-2 mark at home.
- Evgenii Dadonov (2-2-4) and Roope Hintz (2-2-4) both have four points in their last four games against the Jets.
- Jason Robertson has 12 points (9-3—12) in 10 career games against Winnipeg.
 - Robertson's nine goals against the Jets since the start of the 2019-20 season are tied for the sixth-most in the NHL.
 - His nine goals are also tied for his third-most against a single opponent, trailing only the 10 he has scored against both Minnesota and Nashville.
- Tyler Seguin has recorded 54 points (29-25-54) in 50 career regular-season games against the Jets.

- Seguin's 54 career points against Winnipeg are tied for the fifth-most among active NHL Skaters. Only Alex Ovechkin (100), Sidney Crosby (60), Steven Stamkos (60) and Connor McDavid (56) have more. His 29 goals rank third behind Ovechkin (55) and Stamkos (33).
- o His goal, assist and point totals against the Jets are all his highest marks against any opponent in his career.

GOING STREAKING

- Wyatt Jonston enters tonight's game riding a five-game point streak dating back to Nov. 20 vs. San Jose, totaling six points (1-5—6) during that span. His five-game point streak was tied for the fourth-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Johnston has also recorded an assist in each of Dallas' last five games. His five-game assist streak was the second-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Johnston points in six consecutive games for the first time in his career, and an
 assist would make him the 13th skater this season to record an assist streak of at least six games.
- Miro Heiskanen has recorded at least a point in each of Dallas' last four games dating back to Nov. 23 at Tampa Bay, totaling six points (2-4—6) in those games.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Heiskanen** his first five-game point streak since he had a point in 12 consecutive games from March 1 to 23, 2023.

HOME COOKING

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against Winnipeg with an 9-2-0 record while playing at the American Airlines Center this season.
 - Only one of Dallas' "home" losses this season was American Airlines Center, with the first coming at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
- Dallas' nine home wins and .818 points percentage at home this year were both tied for the second-most in the NHL this season entering play Saturday.
- The Stars have allowed only 23 goals and 2.09 goals-per-game in home games this year, which were both tied for the third-best marks in the NHL this season entering play Saturday.
- Dallas has gone 26-for-30 on the penalty kill at home this year. Their 86.7 percent success rate when play a man down at home this year was the fifth-best mark in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Matt Duchene is the team's leading scorer at home this year, totaling 12 points (7-5-12) in 11 games.
- **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's game riding a seven-game home point streak dating back to Oct. 26 against Chicago. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in eight consecutive home games for the first time this season.
 - Benn has recorded a point in nine of the 11 home games he has played this year.

SLIDING INTO YOUR DMS

- Matt Duchene, Mason Marchment and Tyler Seguin have combined for 30 goals this season, accounting for 39.5 percent of Dallas' total offense this year.
- Duchene, Marchment and Seguin have all factored on the same goal nines time this season the most by any trio of teammates in the NHL according to NHL Stats.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when the trio is on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 13-6 and have 104 scoring chances to their opponents' 83.
- All three of Duchene (1.23), Marchment (1.10) and Seguin (1.11) are playing at a point-per-game pace this season. Only
 Tampa Bay Lightning (four) had more players playing at a point-per-game rate or better this season than the Stars
 entering play Saturday.
- The trio also ranks first (Duchene), second (Marchment) and third (Seguin) in scoring on the Stars roster this season.

TILTING THE ICE

- Thomas Harley has recorded a plus-16 even strength on-ice goal differential this season, which was tied for the sixth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.
- In all, **Harley** has been on the ice for 32 even-strength goals this season, which was tied for fourth in the NHL entering play Saturday, trailing only Washington's Rasmus Sandin (34) and Dylan Strome (33), and Vegas' Jack Eichel (33).
- Among NHL defensemen this year, **Miro Heiskanen** ranked in the top 10 in both even strength on-ice goal differential (11, tied ninth) and even strength on-ice goals for (30, tied sixth) entering play Saturday.
- Since Nov. 11, both **Harley** and **Heiskanen** have recorded a plus-10 even strength on-ice goal differential, which was tied with Columbus' Dante Fabbro for the best mark in the league during that span entering play Saturday.
- Entering play Saturday, Mason Marchment (plus-14) and Tyler Seguin (plus-13) were tied for fourth and sixth, respectively, among all NHL forwards this season in even strength on-ice goal differential.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- Matt Duchene enters tonight's game having totaled 27 points (12-15—27) in 22 games this season, which includes recording nine multi-point efforts this year. He is currently riding a four-game point streak.
- Entering play Saturday, Duchene was ranked in the top 10 among Canadian skaters this season in goals (tied fifth) and points (tied eighth).

- With 27 points in 22 games, **Duchene** has already reached 41.5 percent of his total scoring from last year (25-40—65) despite only being 26.8 percent of the way through the 2024-25 season.
- Duchene has recorded a point in 16 of the 22 games he has played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in goals (12), assists (15) and points (27).
- When **Duchene** has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 19-9 according to Natural Stat Trick.

SETTING THE PACE

- With 61 regular-season games remaining, six different Stars skaters are pacing to set career highs in scoring this year:
 Colin Blackwell, Matt Duchene, Ilya Lyubushkin, Mason Marchment, Tyler Seguin and Sam Steel.
- **Duchene** is currently pacing to finish the year with 45 goals, 56 assists and 101 points, which would all be career highs for the 16-year veteran.
 - If he were to maintain that pace, his 2024-25 season would be the sixth-highest scoring season in franchise history.
 - o Forty-five goals would also be the sixth-highest total by a Stars skater in a single season in franchise history.
- Marchment is currently pacing to finish the year with 35 goals, 54 assists and 89 points, all of which would be career highs. His 23 points this year are already 43.4 percent of his career high of 53 (22-31—53) that he reached last season in 81 games.
- **Blackwell** (9-14–23), **Lyubushkin** (0-22–22), Seguin (39-48–87), **Steel** (8-27–35) are all on pace to finish the regular season with career highs in both assists and points.
- Wyatt Johnston (37), Esa Lindell (22) and Brendan Smith (18) are all pacing to finish the 2024-25 season with a career high in assists while Miro Heiskanen is on track to score 15 goals this season, which would be a career high.
- Additionally, rookie **Logan Stankoven** is pacing to finish the year with 42 assists and 58 points. Forty-two assists would be the sixth-most by a rookie in franchise history.

LIND, LAUGH, LOVE

- Esa Lindell has recorded eight points (2-6—8) in 22 games this season and enters tonight's contest ranked third among Stars defensemen in scoring.
- Lindell enters tonight's game one point shy of totaling 200 career points. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 13th defenseman from the 2012 NHL Draft class to total 200 points.
- He will also become the 49th player and 13th defenseman in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars.
- Lindell is one goal away from tying Philippe Boucher (52) for 10th in franchise history in goals scored by a defenseman.
- He is averaging 3:30 of shorthanded ice time per game this season, which was tied for the third-highest mark in the NHL entering play Saturday.

FACING OFF

- Jamie Benn has gone 120-for-194 at the faceoff dot this season. His 61.9 percent success rate was the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year among skaters to take at least 20 draws entering play Saturday.
- Benn is one of five players this season to take at least 10 draws while only losing one or fewer and one of two players (Tomas Hertl) to do so twice.
- Benn first went a perfect 16-for-16 at the faceoff dot on Nov. 7 against the Chicago Blackhawks. It marked the first time in his career that he has taken at least 16 draws in a game without losing one.
- Since the NHL began tracking faceoffs in 1997-98, **Benn** became just the sixth player to go undefeated at the faceoff dot when taking at least 16 draws.
- Benn then went 10-for-11 at the faceoff dot in Dallas' game on Nov. 18 against the Anaheim Ducks for a 90.9 percent success rate.

FIRST THING'S FIRST

- The Stars have opened the scoring in 59.1 percent of the games that they have played this season, recording the first goal of the game in 13 of their 22 games.
- Dallas has gone on to win 11 of the 13 games that they have scored first in. Their 11 wins when scoring first were tied with Minnesota for the best mark in the league this season entering play Saturday.
- Additionally, the Stars' .846 win percentage when scoring first this year was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Dallas' first goal in their game on Nov. 25 came on their first shot of the game. **Tyler Seguin** opened the scoring 18 seconds into the game, which tied Michael Kesselring (0:18 on Nov. 7 w/ UTA) for the second-fastest game-opening goal this season behind Nathan Walker (0:11 on Nov. 21 w/ STL) according to NHL Stats.
 - The Stars have scored on their first shot of the game three times this season according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

• Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history. He is also just one win away from tying Don Beaupre (126) for seventh on the franchise's all-time wins list.

- Miro Heiskanen is two assists shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list. He's also
 four assists shy of trying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is six points away from tying Tom McCarthy (333) for 24th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Matt Duchene is eight points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- Esa Lindell is nine games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
