#58 Fyodor Avramov Left Wing | Shoots: R Drafted by CAR (6-188, 2024) | Unsigned

Avramov tallied six points (4g, 2a) in 22 VHL (Russia-2) games with HK Rostov and appeared in 19 KHL games with HK Sochi in 2024-25, recording no points. The St. Petersburg, Russia, native also posted 11 points (6g, 5a) in eight MHL (Russia-Jr.) games with Kapitan Stupino, ranking second on the team in points per game (1.38). Avramov spent the 2023-24 season with Stupino, leading the club in goals, assists and points (23-21—44). He has now totaled 55 points (29g, 26a) in 57 MHL games with Stupino over the past two seasons, leading all team skaters in goals, assists and points in that span.



#67 Dominik Badinka
Defenseman | Shoots: R
Drafted by CAR (2-34, 2024) | Signed to ELC on 7/14/24

Badinka earned five points (2g, 3a) in 49 SHL games during his second season with Malmo IF in 2024-25, tied for fifth among league defensemen under 20 years old in points and establishing an SHL career high in goals and points. The blueliner skated in eight SHL playoff games, recording no points, and skated in four games with Malmo's U20 team, registering two points (1g, 1a). Badinka, who signed an entry-level contract with Carolina on July 14, 2024, appeared in two AHL games with Chicago at the conclusion of his SHL season and completed his Swedish Hockey League career with nine points (3g, 6a) in 82 games.




#95 Roman BausovDefenseman | Shoots: R
Drafted by CAR (3-87, 2025) | Unsigned

Bausov posted 11 points (2g, 9a) in 41 MHL games with Dynamo St. Petersburg's junior team in 2024-25, ranking third among club blueliners in goals (tied), assists and points. He also finished tied for 11th in the MHL in points among defensemen under 18 years old last season and added one assist in two playoff games. The St. Petersburg, Russia, native skated in 32 MHL games with Dynamo St. Petersburg's junior team in 2023-24, tallying three points (1g, 2a). The 6'5", 190-pound blueliner has totaled 14 points (3g, 11a) in 73 career MHL games, ranking second among club blueliners under 18 years of age in points since 2023-24.



#59 Blake Biondi Center | Shoots: R Camp Invitee

Biondi posted 27 points (12g, 15a) in 38 NCAA games as a graduate student with Notre Dame in 2024-25, ranking third among Fighting Irish skaters in goals (tied) and points, tied for fourth in assists and second in power-play goals. Prior to Notre Dame, Biondi spent four seasons with Minnesota-Duluth (2020-24), earning 58 points (30g, 28a) in 119 games. The Minnesota native was drafted 109th overall by the Montreal Canadiens in 2020, after registering 76 points (37g, 39a) in 25 games in his senior year at Hermantown High School, earning Minnesota Mr. Hockey honors. He signed a professional contract with the Chicago Wolves on March 20, 2025 and appeared in seven games for the Wolves in 2024-25.



#45 Charlie Cerrato

Center | Shoots: L

Drafted by CAR (2-49, 2025) | Unsigned

Cerrato tallied 42 points (15g, 27a) in 38 NCAA games with Penn State in 2024-25, ranking second in points, tied for second in assists and tied for third in goals among Nittany Lions skaters. The 20-year-old center also led all Big Ten rookies in goals, assists and points, helping him earn Big Ten All-Freshman Team honors. He ranked second in the nation in points and assists and third in goals by a freshman skater. His 42 points also mark the second-most by a Nittany Lion rookie in school history. The Fallston, Maryland, native spent 2023-24 with the Youngstown Phantoms in the USHL, registering 50 points (12g, 38a) in 45 games, ranking second among Phantoms skaters in points and leading the club in assists. The 6'0", 190-pound forward also spent two seasons (2021-23) with the United States National Team Development Program, totaling 29 points (9g, 20a) in 54 USHL games in that span.

#41 Filip Ekberg

Left Wing | Shoots: L

Drafted by CAR (7-221, 2025) | Unsigned

Ekberg, 18, tallied 45 points (16g, 29a) in 53 games with the Ottawa 67's in the OHL during the 2024-25 season, ranking fourth among club skaters in points per game (.85). Prior to the OHL, Ekberg recorded 44 points (21g, 23a) in 53 career J20 Nationell games for Almtuna IS's junior team from 2022-24. The Uppsala, Sweden, native accumulated five points (3g, 2a) in 20 career games with Hockey Allsvenskan (Sweden-2) from 2022-24. The 5'10" 168-pound winger represented his country at the 2025 IIHF Under-18 World Junior Championship, recording 18 points (10g, 8a) in seven games to lead all tournament skaters in goals and points to help Sweden capture a silver medal.



#78 Michael Emerson

Right Wing | Shoots: R Drafted by CAR (6-190, 2023) | Unsigned

Emerson played his first full NCAA season with Merrimack College in 2024-25, registering 12 points (6g, 6a) in 32 games. The winger finished tied for fourth on the team in goals and eighth on the team in points and was one of only three Warriors skaters to boast a positive plus/minus rating (+1). Emerson spent the majority of 2023-24 with Chicago (USHL) after skating in six NCAA games with North Dakota at the beginning of the season. He completed his four-year USHL career with 91 points (43g, 48a) in 129 games.



#65 Simon Forsmark

Defenseman | Shoots: R

Drafted by CAR (4-101, 2022) | Unsigned

Forsmark posted 23 points (4g, 19a) in 49 SHL games with Timra IK in 2024-25, leading team defensemen in goals, assists and points and establishing career highs in assists and points. Forsmark also ranked sixth among all Timra IK skaters in points and assists, and his +11 rating was tied for the seventh highest of any SHL blueliner. The Kumla, Sweden, native has totaled 45 points (10g, 35a) in 158 career SHL games, with 42 points (10g, 32) coming as a member of Timra IK. Forsmark ranks ninth in points and assists by a defenseman in Timra IK franchise history, and his 19 assists last season are tied for the third-most by a blueliner in a single season in club history.



#60 Semyon Frolov

Goaltender | Catches: L

Drafted by CAR (2-41, 2025) | Unsigned

Frolov spent the majority of the 2024-25 season with MHK Spartak Moskva in the MHL, posting a 9-2-2 record, .915 save percentage and 2.05 goals-against average with two shutouts in 13 regular-season games. He also went 0-2-0 with a .903 save percentage and 2.88 goals-against average in four playoff appearances to help the club win the 2025 MHL championship. Frolov also spent time with MHK Krylia Sovetov Moskva (MHL), posting a 2-2-1 record, .910 save percentage and 2.75 goals-against average in five regular-season games and a 1-2-0 record, .912 save percentage, 3.32 goals-against average and one shutout in three playoff appearances. The 6'3", 203-pound goalie also played in nine games with Ladia Togliatti (MHL) in 2024-25, recording a 5-3-0 record, .937 save percentage and 1.83 goals-against average. The Togliatti, Russia, native went 7-4-2 record and a .907 save percentage and 2.51 goals against average with one shutout in 16 games with Ladia Togliatti (MHL) in 2023-24.



#75 Noel Fransen
Defenseman | Shoots: L
Drafted by CAR (3-69, 2024) | Unsigned

Fransen recorded 20 points (3g, 17a) in 50 games with Vasteras IK in HockeyAllsvenskan, Sweden's second-highest professional league, ranking second among club blueliners in points and assists and finishing tied for sixth in points among all Vasteras skaters. Fransen led all HockeyAllsvenskan blueliners under 20 years old in goals, assists and points and ranked third in points among all league skaters in that age group. He also dressed in one SHL game for Farjestad BK and two games for Farjestad's under-20 team, posting three points (1g, 2a). The blueliner has tallied 48 points (22g, 26a) in 54 games with Farjestad's junior team over the past four seasons (2021-25) and completed his first professional season in 2024-25.



#34 Ben Hrebik Goaltender | Catches: L Camp Invitee

Hrebik posted a 21-9-2 record, .920 save percentage, 2.87 goals-against average and one shutout in 34 OHL games with the Barrie Colts in 2024-25. He finished tied for second in the OHL in save percentage and sixth goals against average during the regular season, and his .920 save percentage marked the eighth highest (tied) by a Colts netminder in franchise history and the highest since the 2015-16 season. The Milton, Ontario, native added a 1-4-1 record, .867 save percentage and 4.87 goals-against average in seven playoff games with the Colts last season. He also appeared in two games for Barrie in 2023-24, registering a 0-1-0 record, .875 save percentage and 4.58 goals-against average. The 6' 3", 198-pound netminder also played in 12 Ontario Junior Hockey League games two seasons ago, recording a 6-3-0 record, .903 save percentage, 2.99 goals-against average and one shutout.

#81 Nils Juntorp Right Wing | Shoots: R Trade with CHI (Jan. 24, 2025) | Unsigned

Juntorp tallied 20 points (11g, 9a) in 33 HockeyEttan (Sweden-3) games with HC Dalen in 2024-25, tied for third on his team in goals and tied for fifth in points. A native of Ulricehamn, Sweden, the forward has now totaled 42 points (19g, 23a) in 74 HockeyEttan contests over three seasons (2021-25), and he also spent 2022-23 with Dubuque in the USHL, registering 27 points (12g, 15a) in 59 games. He was acquired from Chicago along with Taylor Hall on Jan. 24, 2025, in exchange for the Blackhawk's own third-round pick in the 2025 NHL Draft and 50% retention of Mikko Rantanen's salary.




#68 Kurban Limatov Defenseman | Shoots: L Drafted by CAR (3-67, 2025) | Unsigned

Limatov registered 23 points (8g, 15a) in 46 regular-season games with MHK Spartak Moskva in the MHL in 2024-25 and added five points (2g, 3a) in seven playoff appearances. The 6'4", 190-pound defenseman also played in one game with Dynamo Moskva in the KHL, one of seven players to appear in a KHL game under the age of 18 last season. The Moskva, Russia, native recorded six points (1g, 5a) in 30 regular-season games with MHK Dynamo Moskva (MHL) in 2023-24 and appeared in five playoff games.



#94 Josh Nadeau Right Wing | Shoots: R Camp Invitee

Nadeau registered 29 points (10g, 19a) in 37 games as a sophomore at Maine in 2024-25. He ranked second (tied) in assists, third in points and finished tied for fourth in goals among Black Bear skaters. Last season, he tallied 45 points (18g, 27a) in 37 games at Maine, trailing only his brother Bradly for the team lead in points. In 2023-24, Nadeau was selected as a Hockey East Third Team All-Star and named National Player of the Month in December 2023. The 21-year-old forward has now registered 74 points (28g, 46a) in 74 NCAA games with Maine since the beginning of last season, leading all Black Bear skaters in assists and points in that span. Prior to joining Maine, Nadeau spent two seasons with the Penticton Vees, recording 182 points (84g, 98a) in 108 BCHL games.




#32 Jaeden NelsonGoaltender | Catches: L
Camp Invitee

Nelson earned a 12-14-5 record, .889 save percentage and 3.65 goals-against average in 33 OHL games with the Ottawa 67's last season. Before joining the OHL, Nelson spent 2023-24 with Navan Grads of the CCHL, recording a 25-8-0 record, .921 save percentage, 2.57 goals-against average and three shutouts. The Ottawa native led the CCHL in wins, ranked third in save percentage and tied for third in shutouts two seasons ago, helping him earn CCHL Best Goaltender, CCHL Rookie of the Year and the CCHL Top Prospect Award. Nelson added a 12-4-1 record, .932 save percentage, 2.41 goals-against average and two shutouts in 17 CCHL playoff games in 2023-24 en route to a CCHL championship. The 6'1", 207-pound goaltender recorded the ninth highest save percentage in a playoff run in league history, helping him earn CCHL Playoff MVP.

#96 Viggo Nordlund Left Wing | Shoots: L


Drafted by CAR (6-183, 2025) | Unsigned

Nordlund registered 49 points (24g, 25a) in 40 regular-season games as an alternate captain with Skellefta AIK in the J20 Nationell, Sweden's top junior league, and added 12 points (6g, 6a) in six playoff games during the 2024-25 season. The Ingaro, Sweden, native led his club in goals and points, ranked second in assists and finished eighth (tied) among all league skaters in goals during the regular season. He also ranked second in the league in points per game (2.00) during the J-20 Nationell playoffs. Additionally, he recorded one assist in 15 SHL games for Skellefta AIK and appeared in seven playoff games with the club last season, one of four skaters 18 years old or younger to appear in an SHL regular-season game for the club. In 2023-24, the 5'9", 168-pound winger posted 35 points (9g, 26a) in 37 regular-season games with Skellefta AIK (J20). He added 22 points (7g, 15a) in nine playoff games, establishing a league record for the most assists and points in a single postseason. Nordlund has totaled 34 points (13g, 21a) in 15 career J20 Nationell playoff games, the most postseason points of any skater in league history.

Perron finished his sophomore season at North Dakota with 19 points (10g, 9a) in 31 games, establishing NCAA career highs in assists and points. He finished fourth among Fighting Hawks skaters in goals, seventh in points, second in power-play goals (6) and tied for second in game-winning goals (2). The forward is committed to the University of Michigan for the 2025-26 season, and he leaves UND with 37 career points (21g, 16a) in 70 NCAA games, ranking fourth in goals, sixth in points and 10th (tied) in assists among Fighting Hawks skaters since 2023-24. Perron previously recorded 117 points (41g, 76a) in 121 USHL games in two seasons with Chicago, earning league All-Rookie Second Team honors in 2021-22.



Poirier registered 80 points (43g, 37a) in 58 QMJHL games in 2024-25 with Baie-Comeau Drakkar, establishing a CHL career high in assists. The 18-year-old forward led all Baie-Comeau skaters in goals and ranked second in points and assists, and his 43 regular-season goals ranked fourth among all QMJHL skaters. He was also named QMJHL Player of the Week twice in 2024-25 (Nov. 4 & Jan. 27) and appeared in only two playoff games for the Drakkar due to injury. In 2023-24, Poirier found the back of the net 51 times, becoming the first 17-year-old since Sidney Crosby to score 50 goals in a QMJHL season. The Valleyfield, Quebec, native has committed to the University of Maine for the 2025-26 season, finishing his CHL career with 210 points (122g, 88a), which ranks fourth in Drakkar franchise history in goals and 10th in points.





Ryabkin earned 30 points (19g, 11a) in 27 USHL games with the Muskegon Lumberjacks in 2024-25, leading all club skaters and ranking ninth among league skaters in points per game (1.11). He added 16 points (7g, 9a) in 14 playoff games, helping Muskegon capture its first USHL title. Ryabkin ranked second in the USHL in postseason points, two shy of the league lead. The Balakovo, Russia, native also tallied 12 points (1g, 11a) in 15 MHL games with MHK Dynamo Moskva, posted two assists in eight VHL games with Dynamo St. Petersburg and skated in two KHL games with Dynamo Moskva last season. The 5'11", 209-pound center

led all MHK Dynamo Moskva skaters in points per game (.80) in 2024-25 and finished tied for the club lead in points (24-34—58) in 2023-24. He is the all-time MHK Dynamo Moskva points per game leader (1.19) and leads all MHL skaters under 18 years of age in assists and points (25-45—70) over the past two seasons (2023-25).



#85 Alexander Rykov Right Wing | Shoots: L Drafted by CAR (4-100, 2023) | Unsigned

Rykov posted six points (2g, 4a) in 22 KHL games with Traktor Chelyabinsk in 2024-25. The Russian forward was one of three Traktor skaters under 20 years of age to appear in a KHL game last season, and he ranked 11th in the league among that age group in points per game (.27). Rykov added one goal in 12 KHL playoff games. He also skated in 22 VHL (Russia-2) games with Chelmet Chelyabinsk, tallying 14 points (7g, 7a), ranking fourth on the team in points per game (.64). Rykov has now totaled 14 points (8g, 6a) in 57 career KHL games and 50 points (19g, 31a) in 69 VHL games, ranking second in VHL history in points by a player under 20.




#86 Alexander Siryatskiy Defenseman | Shoots: L Drafted by CAR (4-124, 2024) | Unsigned

Siryatskiy earned 10 assists in 49 VHL (Russia-2) games with Magnitka Magnitogorsk in 2024-25, ranking third among club defensemen in assists and leading all VHL blueliners under 19 years of age in points. Additionally, Siryatskiy's 10 points were tied for the third-most in a season by an 18-year-old defenseman in league history. The Omsk, Russia, native added two assists in 13 VHL playoff games. He also dressed in one KHL game for Metallurg Magnitogorsk last season and appeared in six MHL (Russia-Jr.) games with Stalnye Lisy Magnitogorsk, registering three assists.



#83 Oskar Vuollet Left Wing | Shoots: L Drafted by CAR (5-133, 2024) | Unsigned

Vuollet finished his first full SHL season with nine points (4g, 5a) in 44 games with Skelleftea AlK, tied for the 12th-most points among league skaters under 20 years old. He added two goals in 11 SHL playoff games. The Swedish forward also tallied three points (2g, 1a) in two games with Skelleftea's junior team in the Swedish under-20 league last season where, in 2023-24, he was named J20 Nationell Best Forward after ranking second in the league in goals and tied for fifth in points. Vuollet added 21 points (14g, 7a) in nine playoff games to help Skelleftea win the junior league title two seasons ago, scoring six more postseason goals than any other league skater.



#92 Stanislav YarovoiRight Wing | Shoots: R
Drafted by CAR (4-126, 2023) | Unsigned

Yarovoi tallied 12 points (9g, 3a) in 49 KHL games with Vityaz Moscow Region, ranking eighth on the team in goals, tied for second in game-winning goals (2) and fifth in even-strength goals (9). The forward also matched his KHL career high in goals. Yarovoi has now posted 39 points (22g, 17a) in 130 career KHL games with Vityaz, ranking sixth in goals and 10th (tied) in points among club skaters since 2022-23. The Tuymazy, Russia, native also ranks first in goals, second in points and third in assists among Vityaz skaters under 22 in that span.
