

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 28, 2026 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. COLORADO AVALANCHE [9]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames began a six-game road trip on Monday night in Colorado, falling 9-2 to the Avalanche at Ball Arena. Colorado struck five times in the opening frame to overwhelm Calgary. Brennan Othmann provided a brief spark early in the second period to get the visitors on the board with his first as a Flame, but Nathan MacKinnon responded late in the frame before the Avalanche piled on three more in the third. Ryan Strome added Calgary's second goal midway through the final period.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the fourth of four meetings this season between the Flames and Golden Knights. Calgary has gone 1-2-0 against Vegas so far in 2025-26.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 12-7-3 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 17-21-4 against Western Conference opponents.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Mikael Backlund enters tonight's contest with 16 goals on the campaign, seeing him tied with Owen Nolan for the third most goals by player age 35 or older in a single season in Flames history:

With one more tally, Backlund can tie previous Flames captain Mark Giordano for the second-most goals by a Flame age 35 or older, and two more would see him join current Flames assistant coach Dave Lowry for first place on the list.

THE OTHMANN:

Brennan Othmann scored his first goal as a member of the Calgary Flames on Monday night, registering his second-career NHL goal. Othmann made his Flames debut on Saturday night against Vancouver, marking the occasion with an assist in Calgary's 7-3 victory, giving him points in both of his outings with the Flames. He was acquired by Calgary from the New York Rangers on March 6 and skated in 10 games with the AHL's Calgary Wranglers, notching five helpers before being called up on March 28. He now has 44 games of NHL experience to his credit recording five points from two goals and three assists.

CALGARY/VEGAS TIES:

On January 18, the Calgary Flames acquired defenceman Zach Whitecloud, prospect defenceman Abram Wiebe, a 2027 first round pick (VGK), and a conditional 2028 second round pick (VGK) from Vegas in exchange for defenceman Rasmus Andersson.

Whitecloud skated in 47 games for the Golden Knights in 2025-26, scoring two goals and five assists for seven points. He would appear in 368 games with Vegas, amassing 78 points from 23 goals and 55 assists and was a member of the 2023 Stanley Cup-winning Golden Knights squad, recording eight points in 22 playoff contests, with three of them coming in the Stanley Cup Finals.

Fellow Calgary blueliner Brayden Pachal was claimed off waivers from Vegas on February 4, 2024, and has skated in 143 games for the Flames since joining the club, scoring four goals and 13 assists for 22 points.

Flames forward Victor Olofsson spent the 2024-25 season with the Vegas Golden Knights, skating in 56 regular season contests, notching 25 points. He would play his first nine career playoff games with Vegas last postseason, scoring two goals and two assist for four points.

Vegas defenceman Rasmus Andersson was selected by the Flames in the second round (53rd overall) of the 2015 NHL Draft. He would go on to play 584 games with Calgary, amassing 261 points from 57 goals and 204 assists through his 10 years with the club from 2016-2026. He would grow into a leadership role in Calgary, being named an alternate to captain Mikael Backlund on October 7, 2023. Andersson is looking to face his former club for the first time.

Fellow Golden Knights rearguard Noah Hanifin spent six years with Calgary, with a significant portion of that coming as Rasmus Andersson's defence partner. He totalled 420 games during his tenure with the Flames, scoring 42 goals and 149 assists for 191 points.



STRO MY GOODNESS:

Ryan Strome scored his fourth goal in Flames threads on Monday in Colorado to record his 10th point in his 13th game as a member of the Calgary Flames. Strome has now accumulated 499 points in his NHL career and is one away from becoming the 15th member of the 2011 draft class to reach the 500-point plateau. Since his Calgary debut on March 7, he is tied with Olli Määttä (2-8 – 10) for the most points on the Flames during that timeframe from four goals and six assists.

CASTAGNA:

On Monday afternoon, the Calgary Flames announced the signing of forward Jonathan Castagna to a three-year entry-level contact. The Toronto, ON, native just completed his third season with Cornell University, appearing in 34 contests, leading the Big Red in scoring with 15 goals and 19 assists for 34 points along with 31 penalty minutes. He was a unanimous First-Team All-Ivy after recording 11 points in Ivy League play and tied for third in league scoring. The 20-year-old also earned a spot on the All-ECAC First Team and was named the ECAC's Best Defensive Forward.

In 2023-24, Jonathan helped Cornell win the ECAC Championship, was named ECAC Tournament MVP, and earned a spot on both the ECAC All-Rookie Team and the All-Ivy League Second Team. Last season, he helped Cornell repeat as ECAC Champions while being named to the ECAC All-Tournament Team.

THE BIG AX:

On Wednesday morning, the Calgary Flames announced the signing of defenceman Axel Hurtig to a three-year entry-level level contact. Hurtig, a native of Högåås, SWE, captained the WHL's Calgary Hitmen for the 2025-26 season, posting a career-best 19 points from six goals and 13 assists along with 46 penalty minutes through 64 contests. The Hitmen are currently in the first round of the WHL Playoffs, with Hurtig recording a goal and two assists through three games, helping Calgary hold a 3-0 series lead over Brandon.

Last season, Hurtig would appear in 11 playoff contests for the Hitmen, after a regular season where he totalled 16 points in 55 outings, as well as represent Sweden at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship. He was the Flames seventh-round selection (208th overall) in the 2023 NHL Draft.

MAGIC NUMBER:

With their seven-goal outburst on March 28 against Vancouver, the Calgary Flames have won 55-straight games when scoring four or more goals in a contest, dating back to December 16, 2023. This season, Calgary is 18-0-0 when reaching or surpassing the four-goal mark in a game. The Flames have the longest active four-plus goal win streak and have passed the Ottawa Senators (53 from 2004-2006) for the fourth-longest streak in NHL history for wins when scoring four-or-more goals in a game.

FROSTY THE SNOWMAN:



Morgan Frost registered his second three-point night of the season on March 28 against Vancouver with a goal and two assists. He has scored a team-leading 18 goals coming into tonight's contest and with one more tally he can match his career-high of 19 goals, which he reached during the 2022-23 season as a member of the Philadelphia Flyers. Two more goals would see Frost reach the 20-goal plateau for the first time in his NHL career.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Connor Zary posted three helpers on December 20 against Vegas to record his first career three-assist and three-point game.

The Calgary Flames delivered one of their most complete performances of the season on December 20, rolling past the Vegas Golden Knights 6–3 at the Scotiabank Saddledome. Calgary struck three times in the opening period, getting goals from Mikael Backlund, Adam Klapka and Ryan Lomberg, before Backlund added his second of the night early in the second to extend the lead. Joel Farabee's shorthanded marker made it 5–1 and proved to be the turning point, as Vegas could get no closer than two the rest of the way. Jonathan Huberdeau sealed the win with a late empty netter. Backlund finished with two goals and an assist while Connor Zary posted a three-assist night. Devin Cooley turned aside 34 of 37 shots he faced to earn his fourth win on the season.
