- Dallas' 4-1 victory over Seattle extended the Stars' win streak to seven games, which tied for the second-longest winning streak in franchise history. The team previously won seven straight games from March 22 to April 3, 2025.
- Dallas became the 11th team this season to win at least seven consecutive games.
- Dallas is now 13-1-1 all-time against Seattle and has won nine consecutive games against the Kraken dating back to Dec. 18, 2023. The Stars have outscored the Kraken 29-10 during that span.
- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 19th power-play goal of the season, setting the Dallas Stars team record for most power-play goals in a single season.
 - **Johnston** scored his eighth and ninth career goals against the Kraken and now ranks fourth in career goals vs. Seattle among all NHL skaters according to NHL Stats.
- **Matt Duchene** scored a goal and added an assist to extend his personal point streak to seven games (7-4—11), his longest since he also had a point in seven straight games from March 27 to April 8, 2025.
- **Thomas Harley** tallied two assists to extend his point streak to four games, matching his career high that he has reached on three other occasions.
 - **Harley** now has nine points (3-6—9) in his last nine games played.
- **Miro Heiskanen** had an assist to extend his assist streak to four games for the third time this season. He now has 11 assists in his last nine games played dating back to Jan. 20.
 - **Heiskanen** has six points (1-5—6) in his last five games against the Kraken. He's played at over a point-per-game pace against Seattle in his career, totaling 14 points (3-11—14) in 13 games.
- **Esa Lindell** tallied an assist and now has four points (1-3—4) in his last four games against Seattle.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third and final game that the Stars will play against the Predators this season. Dallas defeated Nashville in both of their previous games earlier this season on Oct. 26, 2025 (3-2 W) and Nov. 8, 2025 (5-4 W).
- **Wyatt Johnston** (120) enters tonight's game one goal shy of tying **Joe Pavelski** (121) for 24th on the franchise's all-time goals list.
- The Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL in wins (35, tied fourth), points (79, fifth) and points percentage (.681, fourth) this year entering play Friday. The team's success this season comes despite having 197 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Matt Duchene**, **Adam Erne**, **Thomas Harley**, **Roope Hintz**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin** and **Tyler Seguin** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this year.
- Seventy-two of the Stars' 193 goals this season have been scored in the third period, which was tied for the fifth-most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- **Roope Hintz** has gone 428-for-723 at the faceoff dot this season for a 59.2 percent success rate, which was the seventh-best mark in the NHL this season among skaters to take at least 500 draws entering play Friday.
- **Colin Blackwell** is two points shy of notching 100 career points. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the ninth active, seventh-round pick to total 100 NHL points.
- The Stars have not lost in regulation in games in which **Justin Hryckowian** has scored this year. Dallas is 5-0-3 in those games.
- **Casey DeSmith** ranks seventh and eighth in the NHL, respectively, in goals saved above expected (14.1) and goals saved above expected per 60 (0.651) this season according to MoneyPuck.com entering play Friday.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game having won each of the last seven games that they have played dating back to Jan. 23, which was the longest active winning streak in the NHL entering play Friday.
 - Dallas has won six of the seven games during the streak by a one-goal margin. In all, the team has won 19 games by a one-goal margin this season, which was the second-most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- A Stars victory tonight would give the team eight consecutive wins, matching the franchise record that Dallas set from March 16 to April 3, 2024.
- A Dallas win would also make them the fifth team this season to win at least eight consecutive games.
- Dallas has scored first in each of the last seven games that they have played and have only trailed for 22:25 of game time during the seven-game win streak.
- The team has gone 9-for-24 on the power play over the course of this winning streak for a 37.5 percent success rate. Their 37.5 percent conversion rate and nine power-play goals scored ranked four and tied for first, respectively, in the NHL since Jan. 23 entering play Friday.
- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer during the streak, totaling 11 points (7-4—11) since the start of the streak on Jan. 23. In all, eight Stars skaters have played at a point-per-game pace over the course of the streak: **Duchene** (1.57), **Jamie Benn** (1.14), **Jason Robertson** (1.14), **Miro Heiskanen** (1.14), **Thomas Harley** (1.00), **Roope Hintz** (1.00), **Wyatt Johnston** (1.00) and **Mikko Rantanen** (1.00).
- **Duchene's** seven goals during that span were tied for the most in the NHL entering play Friday.

PREDATORS TO PREY

- Dallas is 61-41-12 all-time vs. Nashville, including a 35-16-4 mark on home ice.
 - Dallas' 35 all-time wins at home against Nashville ranks fourth among all NHL teams.
- The Stars have earned wins in five of their last seven games played against the Predators (5-2-0), dating back to Feb. 15, 2024. Dallas has outscored Nashville 28-21 during that span.
- **Matt Duchene** has totaled 40 points (14-26—40) in 42 career games against the Predators. **Duchene's** 40 career points vs. Nashville are tied for eighth among active NHL skaters.
 - **Duchene** has nine points (3-6—9) in eight games against the Predators as a member of the Stars, dating back to Dec. 23, 2023.
 - He enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak vs. Nashville (0-3—3).
- **Jason Robertson** has totaled 28 points (10-18—28) in 26 career games played against the Predators, his highest assist and point total against a single opponent.
 - He is averaging 1.08 points per game and carries a plus-minus rating of +12 against them.
- **Lian Bichsel** has tallied two goals in four career games vs. Nashville, upholding a plus-minus rating of +5. He made his NHL debut against Nashville on Dec. 12, 2024, where he also scored his first career goal.
- **Wyatt Johnston** enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak against the Predators, collecting three points (1-2—3) during that span. In all, **Johnston** has totaled 11 points (6-5—11) in 14 career games played vs. Nashville.
- **Roope Hintz** has totaled 27 points (14-13—27) in 30 career games against the Predators, his highest total against a single opponent. He also holds a plus-minus rating of +13 vs. Nashville which is tied for ninth among all active NHL skaters.
- **Oskar Bäck** scored his first career goal against the Predators and his first goal of the season in the teams' first meeting of the season on Oct. 26, 2025. He enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak vs. Nashville, notching two points (1-1—2) during that span.

- **Mavrik Bourque** enters tonight's game riding a two-game point streak against the Predators, earning three points (1-2—3) during that span, including putting up a multi-point outing (1-1—2) in his last meeting against them on Nov. 8, 2025. In four career games played vs. Nashville, **Bourque** has registered four points (1-3—4).
- **Alexander Petrovic** has recorded two points (0-2—2) in eight career games played against the Predators, carrying a plus-minus rating of +10.
 - His +10 rating against them ranks tied for third on the team, behind **Roope Hintz** (13) and **Jason Robertson** (12).
- **Miro Heiskanen** registered two assists in his last game vs. Nashville on Nov. 8, 2025 and now has totaled 16 points (5-11—16) in 30 career games against them, upholding a plus-minus rating of +8 and averaging 24:56 of time on ice per game.
 - His 24:56 time on ice per game played against them is the eighth-best mark among all active NHL skaters.
- **Arttu Hyry** is expected to play in his first career game against the Predators.

JAKE AND BAKE

- **Jake Oettinger** has won the last six games he has played dating back to Jan. 20, taking down the Bruins, Blues (3x), Golen Knights and Jets. It marks his second six-game win streak this season, after also winning six straight games from Nov. 20 to Dec. 7.
 - His six-game win streak was the third-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Friday.
- If **Oettinger** were to win the next game he plays, it would make him the eighth goaltender this season to win at least seven consecutive games.
- **Oettinger's** six-game win streak is tied for the seventh-longest in franchise history and the fifth-longest in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). **Oettinger** currently holds the Stars team record, winning eight straight games from March 20 to April 9, 2024.
- In all, **Oettinger** has won 23 games this season, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NHL entering play Friday.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** has totaled 25 points (5-20—25) in 46 games this season. Despite missing 12 games with an injury, his 25 points rank second among Stars defensemen this year, trailing only **Miro Heiskanen's** 47 points (7-40—47).
- **Harley** enters tonight's contest having recorded nine points (3-6—9) in his last nine games played.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Harley** points in five consecutive games, which would set a career high for the defenseman.
- **Harley** has scored 37 goals in his career and enters tonight's game one goal shy of tying Richard Matvichuk (38) for the 14th-most in franchise history by a defenseman.
- When **Harley** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in Dallas' last game – a 4-1 win over the Seattle – the Stars outscored the Kraken 3-0 and outshot them 12-3 according to Natural Stat Trick. **Harley** tallied two assists in the win.
- **Harley** scored the sixth overtime goal of his career in Dallas' game on Feb. 2 against Winnipeg, which is tied for the fourth-most in franchise history. **Harley** and John Klingberg are the only two defensemen in franchise history to score six overtime goals.
 - **Harley** also scored the series-clinching overtime goal against Winnipeg in Game 6 of the Second Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- **Harley's** six overtime goals since the start of the 2023-24 season are tied for the ninth-most in the NHL and top all NHL defensemen during that span.
- Three of **Harley's** five goals this season have stood as game winners, which is tied for the most in his career in a single season. He also scored three game-winning goals in both 2023-24 and 2024-25.
- **Harley's** three game-winning goals this year were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Friday.

HEATING UP

- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's game riding a seven-game point streak, totaling 11 points (7-4—11) during that span. His seven-game point streak was tied for the seventh-longest active streak in the NHL entering play Friday.
- If he were to have a goal or an assist tonight, it would give him points in eight consecutive games for the first time since April 16 to 29, 2022.
- **Jamie Benn** has recorded eight points (2-6—8) in the Stars last five games, including a three-point showing (2-1—3) in Dallas' game on Feb. 4 against St. Louis.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has recorded 11 assists in his last nine games played dating back to Jan. 20. If he were to tally an assist tonight, it would give him assists in five consecutive games for the second time this season.
- **Roope Hintz** has eight points (1-7—8) in his last eight games played dating back to Jan. 20 against the Boston Bruins.
- **Jason Robertson** has recorded multi-point efforts in four of the last nine games that he has played, totaling 10 points in all (5-5—10) during that span.
- **Robertson** scored the 200th goal of his career in Dallas' game on Feb. 4 against St. Louis, becoming the...
 - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
 - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
 - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.
- Dallas' tilt against St. Louis was the 431st game of **Robertson's** career, making the second-fastest player to record 200 goals with the Stars/North Stars according to NHL Stats, trailing only Dino Ciccarelli (381 GP). **Robertson** also required the ninth-fewest games among U.S.-born players to reach 200 career goal according to NHL Stats.
- **Mavrik Bourque** has five points (3-2—5) in his last five games played.
- **Esa Lindell** has tallied an assist in each of Dallas' last two games. If he were to do so again tonight, it would give him assists in three consecutive games for the second time this season after also doing so from Dec. 18 to 21.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 51-for-170 on the power play this season for a 30.0 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- The Oilers (53) and the Stars (51) were the only teams to score at least 50 power-play goals this season entering play Friday.
- If the Stars were to score on the man advantage tonight, it would give them power-play goals in five consecutive games for the first time since the team scored a power-play goal in eight straight games earlier this season from Nov. 1 to 15.
- Dallas' 51 power-play goals are just four shy of the 55 they scored in 82 games last season. The team is currently on pace to finish the year with 72 power-play goals, which would tie for the sixth-most in Dallas Stars team history.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 16 different times this season, most recently on Jan. 31 against the Utah Mammoth, a 3-2 win. The Stars had 12 multi-power-play-goal games in all of 2024-25.
 - Their 16 multi-power-play goal games are their most in a season since they scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 times in 2022-23.
 - The Stars have scored two power-play goals in four of the last seven games that they have played.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 51 power-play goals have been scored by 11 different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (19), **Jason Robertson** (11), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Matt Duchene** (4), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Justin Hryckowian**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
 - **Robertson's** 11 power-play goals are just two shy of matching his career high that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Rantanen** (5-25—30) and **Johnston** (19-11—3) were tied for fourth in the NHL in power-play points this season entering play Friday, followed by **Robertson** (11-16—27) who was tied for seventh.
 - **Johnston's** 30 power-play points are already a career high. **Robertson's** 27 power-play points are the third-most of his career and **Rantanen's** 30 power-play points are the sixth-most of his career.
- **Johnston's** 19 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Friday and were four more than the second-ranked skater (Vegas' Pavel Dorofeyev).
- His 19 power-play goals are already a career high and are the most in a single-season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
 - **Johnston's** 19 power-play goals are three shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
- **Heiskanen** has totaled 19 points (1-18—19) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the fifth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Friday.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 19th power-play goal of the season in Dallas' last game on Feb. 25 against Seattle, setting the Dallas Stars team record (since 1993-94) that Mike Modano previously held with 18 during the 1993-94 season, the Stars' first year playing in Texas.
- His 19 power-play goals are already tied for the seventh-most in a single season in franchise history and are three shy of tying the franchise record of 22 that Dino Ciccarelli set during the 1986-87 season.
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 27 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart also scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, **Johnston** has scored 30 power-play goals, which was tied with Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Friday.

THE ROARING TWENTIES

- The line of **Mavrik Bourque**, **Roope Hintz** and **Jason Robertson** has played 206:30 together at 5-on-5 this season. During that time, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-7, have a 67.7 expected goals for percentage, a 59.3 shots for percentage and a 60.0 Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick.
- According to MoneyPuck.com, the line has a 67.2 expected goals for percentage, which was the best mark of any forward line in the NHL to play at least 150 minutes together entering play Friday.
- In Dallas' game on Jan. 20 against Boston, when the trio was on the ice the Stars outscored the Bruins 2-0 and outshot them 8-1 at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - All three players had two points in the game – **Robertson** scored two goals, **Hintz** had two assists and **Bourque** had a goal and an assist.
- The Stars owned a 60 percent Corsi rating and a 58.7 expected goals for percentage at 5-on-5 when the line was on the ice on Jan. 22 against the Blue Jackets.
- In the Stars' game on Jan. 29 against Vegas, the team had a 79.9 expected goals for percentage and a 59.1 Corsi rating when the trio was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- On Feb. 2 against Winnipeg, the line had a 74.8 percent on-ice expected goals for percentage and a 68.8 Corsi rating.
- **Hintz** and **Robertson** both assisted on **Bourque's** goal on Feb. 4 against the St. Louis Blues. It marked the 200th time the two have factored in on the same goal according to NHL Stats, which is the third-most in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). They trail only **Jamie Benn** and **Tyler Seguin** (272) and Mike Modano and Jere Lehtinen (242).

- Despite playing in only 58 games this season, **Bourque** (11-12—23) is two assists and two points shy of matching his totals from last season that he reached in 73 games. **Bourque** finished the 2024-25 campaign with 11 goals, 14 assists and 25 points.
 - He's currently pacing to finish the season with a career high 16 goals, 17 assists and 33 points.

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

- **Wyatt Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 44 goals, 42 assists and 86 points, all of which would be career highs.
 - **Johnston** enters tonight's game just two goals shy of matching his career high of 33 that he set last season.
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 27 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart also scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- **Jason Robertson** (45) and **Johnston** (44) are both pacing to finish the season with at least 40 goals. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the first pair of 40-goal Stars teammates since Brian Bellows (55) and Dave Gagner (40) in 1989-90.
 - There have been five instances in franchise history of Stars teammates scoring at least 40 goals in the same year, but none have occurred since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.
- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 23 points (5-18—23) in 58 games this year, which is the third-most among Stars defensemen this season. It puts him on pace to finish the season with 25 assists and 33 points, both of which would be career highs.
 - His 18 assists this season are only three shy of matching his career high that he's reached on four previous occasions, most recently last year.
- **Sam Steel** is currently on pace to finish the season with 11 goals, 20 assists and 31 points, all of which would be career highs.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- The Stars scored a goal with less than a minute and a half in three straight games against the Blues to win in regulation. **Jason Robertson** scored with 60 seconds left on Jan. 23 to defeat the Blues 3-2, **Thomas Harley** scored with 67 seconds left on Jan. 27 to secure a 4-3 Stars win and **Jamie Benn** scored with 22 second remaining in Dallas' last game on Feb. 4 to beat the Blues 5-4.
- At the time, **Robertson's** goal was the latest game-winning goal in regulation for the Stars since **Harley** scored at 19:55 on March 4, 2025 to help Dallas defeat the New Jersey Devils 4-3.
- With his game-winning goal on Jan. 27, **Harley** became the first defenseman in franchise history with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** became the fourth active defenseman with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats, alongside Shea Theodore (3x), Drew Doughty (2x) and Charlie McAvoy (2x).
- **Benn's** goal on Feb. 4 was his second career go-ahead goal in the final minute of regulation, which tied Brian Lawton for the second-most in franchise history according to NHL Stats. Only Dino Ciccarelli (3) has more.

SHOOT YOUR SHOT

- **Jason Robertson** and **Mikko Rantanen** both scored in the shootout and **Jake Oettinger** stopped each of the two shots he faced to help the Stars defeat the Golden Knights 5-4 in their game on Jan. 29.

- **Robertson's** goal – which stood as the game decider – was the 21st of his career, which passed Mike Ribeiro (20) for the most in franchise history.
 - The goal was also the sixth game-decider in his career, which is just one shy of the most in franchise history.
- His goal against the Golden Knights was also his fourth shootout goal of the season, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- **Robertson** has gone 21-for-37 in his career in the shootout for a 56.8 percent success rate, which is the fourth-best mark in the NHL among active skaters to have at least 20 shootout attempts in their career.
- **Robertson's** 21 shootout goals since the start of the 2020-21 season are the most in the NHL during that span and are four more than the second-ranked skaters (Adrian Kempe and Trevor Zegras with 17 each).
 - Despite not taking a shootout attempt until the 2020-21 season, **Robertson's** 21 shootout goals are the most in the League since the start of the 2018-19 season.
- **Rantanen's** goal was the third shootout goal as a member of the Stars. Two of his three shootout goals with Dallas have been game deciders.
- **Rantanen** has scored 11 shootout goals in his career, which is tied for eighth in NHL history among Finnish skaters.
- With the win, **Oettinger** improved to 3-1 in shootouts this season and has .750 save percentage against shootout attempts this year.
- His performance against the Golden Knights was the ninth time in his career that he has not allowed a goal against in the shootout.
- In all in his career, **Oettinger** has a 0.739 save percentage in the shootout, which is the seventh-best mark in the NHL among active goaltenders to play in at least 20 shootout games.

MR. 300

- Forward **Wyatt Johnston** played in his 300th NHL regular-season NHL game on Jan. 29 against the Golden Knights. He became the fourth player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to reach the 300-game milestone and the 82nd player in franchise history to play in 300 regular-season games with the team.
- **Johnston** has not missed a Stars game (regular season or playoffs) since making his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He became the 17th skater in NHL history – and first since Nick Suzuki – to begin his NHL career by playing in at least 300 consecutive regular-season games according to NHL Stats.
 - Suzuki played in 410 consecutive regular-season games from Oct. 3, 2019 to Dec. 31, 2024 to begin his NHL career.
- **Johnston** totaled 235 points (117-118—235) in the first 300 games of his career, which was tied for the 19th-most in franchise history through a player's first 300 games played with the team according to NHL Stats.
 - **Johnston's** goal against Vegas tied Dennis Maruk for 19th. Maruk had 235 points (80-155—235) in his first 300 games with the Minnesota North Stars from 1978-79 to 1987-88.
- His 235 points are also the 10th-most in franchise history through a player's first 300 games played with the Stars from the start of his career according to NHL Stats.
 - **Jason Robertson** (137-183—320) is the only Stars skater who began his career with the team since the franchise relocated to Dallas to have more points than **Johnston** through his first 300 games played.
- **Johnston**, selected with the 23rd-overall pick in 2021, leads all 2021 draftees in career goals (120), assists (118), points (238), even-strength goals (78), even-strength points (160), power-play goals (36), power-play points (72) and shorthanded goals (6).

STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson**, **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4—9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (350) and **Wyatt Johnston** (304).
- **Robertson's** 350-game Iron Man streak was tied the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Friday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 16 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 304 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Friday, it was tied for the 11th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.

- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only **Will Borgen** (248) and **Charlie Coyle** (247) appeared in more.
 - **Borgen** (84) and **Coyle** (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star **Mikael Granlund**, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** played for Nashville for four seasons (2019-20 to 2022-23), recording 197 points (84-113—197) in 197 regular-season games and adding nine points (5-4—9) in 17 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** played part of the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons with the Predators, totaling 10 points (3-7—10) in 33 regular-season games.
- Stars Director of Player Personnel **Rich Peverley** played for Nashville from 2006-07 to 2008-09, recording 20 points (7-13—20) in 73 regular-season games.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Predators forward **Ryan O'Reilly** played in Colorado together from 2009-10 to 2014-15. The two also played for Team Canada together at the 2013, 2015, 2016 and 2017 IIHF World Championships and the 2016 World Cup of Hockey. They've won four medals together: 2015 IIHF World Championship (gold), 2016 IIHF World Championship (gold), 2016 IIHF World Cup of Hockey (gold) and 2017 IIHF World Championship (silver).
 - Stars forward **Tyler Seguin** won a gold medal with the duo at the 2015 IIHF World Championship.
 - Predators forward **Steven Stamkos** was also on the 2013 team with **Duchene** and **O'Reilly**. **Stamkos** played again with the two at the 2017 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** and defenseman **Esa Lindell** have both played for Team Finland in international competition with Predators goaltender **Juuse Saros**.
 - **Hintz** and **Saros** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
 - **Lindell** and **Saros** played together at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Championship. They won a gold medal in 2014 and a silver medal in 2016.
- Stars forwards **Roope Hintz** and **Mikko Rantanen** and defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** and **Esa Lindell** and Predators forward **Erik Haula** and goaltender **Juuse Saros** all won the bronze medal with Team Finland during the 2026 Winter Olympic Games in Milan.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** played with Predators forward **Michael Bunting** in Arizona during the 2018-19 and 2020-21 seasons.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** played with Predators forward **Michael Bunting** in Toronto during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** played with Predators defensemen **Justin Barron** and goaltender **Justus Annunen** in Colorado. **Rantanen** played with **Barron** during the 2021-22 and with **Annenen** from 2021-22 to 2024-25.
- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** and defenseman **Esa Lindell** played with Predators goaltender **Juuse Saros** for Team Finland in the 2025 Four Nations Faceoff.
- Stars forward **Mavrik Bourque** and Predators forward **Luke Evangelista** were teammates on Canada White during the 2019 IIHF U17 World Hockey Challenge.
- Stars forward **Nathan Bastian** and Predators **Erik Haula** skated together in New Jersey from 2022-23 to 2024-25.
- Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** and Predators **Tyson Jost** shared the ice together in Colorado from 2016-17 to 2021-22.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Predators forward **Tyson Jost** played 12 games together in Minnesota during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forward **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Predators forward **Tyson Jost** were teammates on the Buffalo Sabres during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman **Alexander Petrovic** and Predators forward **Jonathan Marchessault** skated together in Florida during the 2016-17 season.
- Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** and Predators defenseman **Justin Barron** played two games together in Colorado during the 2020-21 season.

- Stars defenseman **Thomas Harley** and Predators defenseman Justin Barron were teammates on Team Canada during the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Predators defenseman Nick Perbix shared the ice on Team USA during the 2023 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Adam Erne** and Predators defenseman Brady Skjei both represented Team USA during the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship.
