R. THOMAS GAGLARDI Owner, Governor and Chairman



R. Thomas (Tom) Gaglardi is the owner and governor of the Dallas Stars Hockey Club and the president of Northland Properties Corporation, the largest family-owned hospitality company in Canada with its head offices located in Vancouver, B.C. He was officially introduced as the sixth owner in franchise history on Nov. 21, 2011.

Since acquiring the club, Gaglardi has revitalized hockey in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex, overhauling the team's front office and installing one of the most respected hockey minds in Jim Nill as general manager. He also spearheaded the overhaul of the team's logo and uniform, forging a new identity for the club to fit his vision. Under his watch, industry insiders have consistently identified the Stars as a team "on the rise" for both the business and hockey operations side of the organization. During the 2014-15 season, Gaglardi purchased the Texas Stars of the American Hockey League (AHL) and acquired the operating rights to H-E-B Center at Cedar Park in Cedar Park, Texas. The move reinforced his commitment to sustaining and growing the sport of hockey in the state of Texas and

creating a seamless organizational process to develop and train NHL-caliber players, coaches and front office staff.

A passionate and knowledgeable leader who is deeply involved in all aspects of the family's business, Gaglardi began his career in the hospitality industry at age 13 as a busboy and has worked in virtually every area of his business since that time. He spent considerable time in construction, hotel and restaurant operations, real estate development and finance. At age 23, he was promoted to president of the Sandman Hotel Group, and at 26 he became president of Northland Properties Corporation, the Gaglardi family's umbrella company.

Under his direction, Northland has grown to be the largest family-owned hospitality company in Canada including a large portfolio of hotels with the Sandman Hotel Group and the Sutton Place Hotels & Resorts, several restaurant chains including Denny's Restaurants of Canada, Moxie's Grill & Bar, Chop Steakhouse & Bar and Shark Club Bar & Grill. In 2009, Gaglardi began expanding his brand of hospitality to the United Kingdom and more recently began operating in the United States, with the first Moxie's Grill & Bar opening in Dallas in November 2016, and the first Sandman Hotel opening in Plano in February 2019. The family also owns and operates a large real estate portfolio and the world-renowned Revelstoke Mountain Resort. In addition to his role with the Stars, Gaglardi is a co-owner of the Kamloops Blazers Hockey Club of the Western Hockey League and serves as its governor.

An active member of the community, Gaglardi founded the Sandman Harvest Foundation, which has raised over \$1 million for disadvantaged and medically challenged children living in the Okanagan Valley of British Columbia. He also serves as trustee for the PA and JM Gaglardi Senior Citizens Society, a non-profit society providing housing for seniors in Kamloops, B.C. and serves on the board of St. George's School in Vancouver. He founded the Josh Dyck Foundation to assist Josh with his recovery from an auto accident in October 2006, which left him paralyzed and confined to a wheelchair.

Gaglardi and his wife Brittney have three sons, Charlie, Bennett and Wilson, all of whom play competitive hockey. In addition to his own participation on his hockey team, Gaglardi enjoys playing golf and spending time with his family at their cottage on the shores of Kamloops Lake near Savona, B.C.

BRAD ALBERTS *President/Chief Executive Officer*



Brad Alberts is in his second tenure with the Dallas Stars and currently serves as President and Chief Executive Officer after rejoining the team in February 2011.

Additionally, he acts as President and Alternate Governor of the Texas Stars, Dallas' development affiliate in the American Hockey League, roles in which he has served in since July 1, 2017.

Alberts serves on the American Airlines Center Board of Directors, assisting in the management of one of the busiest arenas in the United States.

Alberts, who was named team President on March 2, 2018 and took on the role of Chief Executive Officer on July 10, 2020, oversees all aspects of the Stars business operations. Previously leading all sales and marketing, he's also in charge of all aspects of the organization's finance and administration, box office, human resources and information technology, as well as the communications department, which has won three Dick

Dillman Awards as the NHL's Western Conference top public relations staff under his leadership.

Alberts' career includes nearly two decades of professional sports experience selling tickets, suites, premium seating and sponsorships. From 1996-2009, Alberts worked for the Dallas Stars and Texas Rangers in various sales management roles in tickets, suites and corporate sponsorships. From 2006-09, Alberts served as the Executive Vice President of the Hicks Sports Marketing Group, the in-house sponsorship sales group for the Stars, Texas Rangers and Liverpool Football Club. In 2009, Alberts took over as the Vice President of Sponsorship and Sales at Legends/CSL, overseeing events at numerous venues around the country, most notably the Circuit of The Americas, a Formula One racing track in Austin, Texas.

Since rejoining the team in 2011, Alberts has played an integral role in the resurgence of the Stars in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex, helping lead the organization to tremendous growth in brand visibility, attendance and sponsorship sales. Alberts and his leadership team were instrumental in the sweeping rebrand of the team, retiring the numbers of Mike Modano, Jere Lehtinen and Sergei Zubov and creating tremendous sponsorship value for the team and its partners. Under his leadership and direction, the organization hosted the 2020 Winter Classic at Cotton Bowl Stadium against the Nashville Predators. The event sold out within hours of tickets going on sale and was hailed as one of the most successful NHL events of all time, becoming the second-highest attended game in league history with a capacity crowd of 85,630.

Alberts received his bachelor's degree from Ripon College in 1992 where he was a four-year letterman and co-captain of the basketball team, earning an induction into the Ripon College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2002. He received a master's degree in sports administration from University of Northern Colorado in 1995. Alberts is an avid golfer and fitness enthusiast. Alberts serves as a member of the American Cancer Society CEO Board, the Dallas Sports Commission Board and is actively involved in other non-profit causes in the Metroplex.

He resides in Dallas with his wife Kate and their daughter Grace.

JIM NILL General Manager



Jim Nill is in his 13th season with the Stars, having served as the team's 11th general manager and sixth GM since moving to Dallas. The longest-serving general manager in franchise history, Nill became the first GM in team history to win the Jim Gregory General Manager of the Year Award following the conclusion of the 2022-23 campaign, which recognizes the work of the top general manager in the NHL. A five-time finalist, Nill followed up his 2023 win by taking home the award again in 2024 and 2025, making him the only general manager in NHL history to capture the award three times.

During Nill's tenure, the Stars have amassed a record of 505-327-113 and have made the Stanley Cup Playoffs in eight seasons (2013-14, 2015-16, 2018-19, 2019-20, 2021-22, 2022-23, 2023-24 and 2024-25), which includes four trips to the Western Conference Final (2020, 2023, 2024 and 2025) and an appearance in the Stanley Cup Final (2020). During his three-year reign as General Manager of the Year, the Stars lead the entire NHL with 327 points in the regular season and rank fourth with 149 wins.

In the Stanley Cup Playoffs, the club's 29 wins trail only Florida (45) and Edmonton (35) for the most wins in postseason play and rank third in total games played (56) over that span. He enters the 2025-26 campaign as the third-longest tenured general manager in the NHL, behind only Winnipeg's Kevin Cheveldayoff and St. Louis' Doug Armstrong.

Since joining the Stars, Nill has dramatically re-shaped the team's culture and roster with a series of trades and acquisitions. He began to make his mark on the club with key acquisitions of centers Tyler Seguin and Jason Spezza and three-time Stanley Cup champion Patrick Sharp. He'd continue to add more pieces over the next few seasons, including trading for goaltender Ben Bishop and signing right wing Alexander Radulov, goaltender Anton Khudobin and center Joe Pavelski, leading to a highlight season for the Stars in 2019-20. In March of 2025, he pulled off the blockbuster trade of the season by adding dynamic forward Mikko Rantanen from the Carolina Hurricanes and inked him to an eight-year contract extension. He later bolstered the Stars for the 2025 postseason with the acquisition of forward Mikael Granlund and defenseman Cody Ceci, who ultimately helped the team reach its third-consecutive Western Conference Final.

Nill has also used the NHL Draft to build the core for both the team's present and future, selecting standout players such as Roope Hintz (2015), Miro Heiskanen (2017), Jake Oettinger (2017), Jason Robertson (2017), Oskar Bäck (2018), Thomas Harley (2019), Mavrik Bourque (2020), Wyatt Johnston (2021) and Lian Bichsel (2022), all of whom contributed to the Stars during their 2024-25 campaign. Nill's draft picks have combined to play in 3,478 regular-season games for the Stars, led by Miro Heiskanen, who ranks second among all 2017 draftees with 475 regular-season games played. Cheveldayoff (7,328) and Armstrong (5,060) are the only active general managers to have more games played from their draft picks for their current team than Nill.

A native of Hanna, Alberta, Nill joined the Red Wings' front office in the summer of 1994 following three seasons with the Ottawa Senators. Previously, Nill enjoyed a nine-season NHL career as a right wing with the Boston Bruins, Vancouver Canucks, St. Louis Blues, Winnipeg Jets and Detroit Red Wings. He collected 58 goals, 87 assists and 854 penalty minutes in 524 regular-season games. Nill later went to Adirondack as a player/coach, retiring as a player after the 1990-91 season. A member of the 1979-80 Canadian National and Olympic teams, he was originally selected by St. Louis in the fifth round (89th overall) of the 1978 NHL Draft.

Jim and his wife, Rebecca, reside in Frisco, Texas, and have three children: Jenna, Trevor and Kristin, and three grandchildren: Cael, Hazel and Lincoln.

GLEN GULUTZAN Head Coach



Glen Gulutzan returns to Dallas after being named the team's head coach on July 1, 2025, spending the previous seven seasons as an assistant coach for the Edmonton Oilers. During his tenure with the team (from 2018-19 to 2024-25), the Oilers led the NHL with a 26.8 power-play percentage in the regular season and a 29.8 power-play percentage in the postseason. While behind the bench in Edmonton, the team qualified for the postseason six times and reached consecutive Stanley Cup Finals in 2024 and 2025.

A native of Hudson Bay, Saskatchewan, Gulutzan earned his first NHL head coaching opportunity with Dallas, spending two seasons with the Stars (2011-13) and recording a 64-57-9 record in 130 regular-season games. He has also served as the head coach of the Calgary Flames for two seasons (2016-18), amassing an 82-68-14 record in 164 regular-season games and led the club to an appearance in the 2017 Stanley Cup Playoffs. Gulutzan spent three seasons with Vancouver (2013-16) as an assistant coach before being named the head coach of the Flames. In

total, he holds a record of 146-125-23 in 294 regular-season NHL games coached.

Prior to his time in the NHL, Gulutzan served as the head coach for the Texas Stars, Dallas' primary affiliate in the American Hockey League (AHL). In each of his two seasons he led his team to the Calder Cup Playoffs, posting 87-56-17 record in 160 regular-season games and reached the Calder Cup Finals in the franchise's inaugural season of 2009-10. Gulutzan spent six seasons (2003-09) as the head coach and general manager of the Las Vegas Wranglers of the ECHL, amassing a 254-124-55 record in 433 regular-season games, collecting 100-plus points in three consecutive seasons from 2005 – 2008, a first for any team in the history of the ECHL. He reached the postseason in five of his six seasons in Las Vegas, including a trip to the Kelly Cup Finals in 2007-08. Gulutzan was selected on three occasions to coach the ECHL All-Star Game and was honored during the 2005-06 campaign with the John Brophy Award as the ECHL's coach of the year.

Glen and his wife, Nicole, have four children – son, Landen, and daughters, Emma, Brielle and Grace.

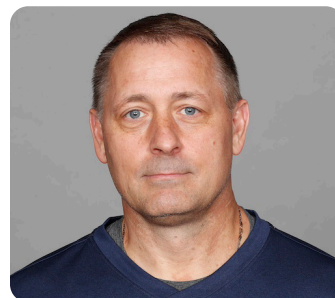

SEASON IN REVIEW



REGULAR SEASON GAME NOTES

REGULAR SEASON RECAP

The Stars finished the 2024-25 regular season with a 50-26-6 record, ranking in the top five in the NHL in wins (tied fourth), points (fifth), goals for (275, tied third), goals for per game (3.35, tied third) and penalty kill (82.0 percent, tied fourth). The 2024-25 campaign marked the second straight year that Dallas has finished the regular season with at least 50 wins and the third consecutive year that the team concluded the regular season with a points percentage above .640. This season also sat near the top in the franchise record book in terms of single-season success with the team's 50 wins tying for the fourth-most in franchise history. The team's success this year comes in spite of logging 190 man games lost to injury, which includes significant stretches playing without Tyler Seguin (62 games), Miro Heiskanen (32 games), Nils Lundkvist (40 games), Mason Marchment (20 games) and others.

HOME COOKING

Dallas logged a 28-10-3 record in home games in 2024-25, which included 40 games played at the American Airlines Center and one game played at Nokia Arena in Finland as part as the NHL's Global Series. The team's 28 home wins were just one shy of matching the franchise record set in 1998-99, and their 59 home points and .720 home points percentage were tied for the fourth- and fifth-best marks in franchise history.

Jason Robertson (43 points, 41 games played), Mikko Rantanen (44 points, 41 games played) and Roope Hintz (40 points, 39 games played) and Tyler Seguin (10 points, 10 games played) all played at a point-per-game pace in home games this year. Additionally, Thomas Harley concluded the regular season by recording 21 points (6-15-21) in his last 21 home games dating back to Dec. 31. His 21 points were tied for fifth among all NHL defensemen during that span.

THIRTY, FLIRTY AND THRIVING

Four skaters on Dallas' roster scored at least 30 goals in 2024-25: Jason Robertson (35), Wyatt Johnston (33), Mikko Rantanen (32) and Matt Duchene (30). The 2024-25 campaign marked the first time the Stars' roster housed four 30-goal scorers since the 1992-93 season when Russ Courtnall (36), Ulf Dahlen (35), Dave Gagner (33) and Mike Modano (33) all scored at least 30 goals. The Stars and the Tampa Bay Lightning were the only teams to finish the regular season with four 30-goal scorers on their rosters.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Stars had a 22-16-3 record when playing on the road in 2024-25, which tied for the seventh-most road wins in a single season in franchise history. Matt Duchene was the team's highest-scoring player on the road last season, totaling 46 points (17-29-46) in 41 games. His 46 road points matched his career high, were tied for the seventh-most in the NHL in 2024-25 and were tied for the sixth-most by a Stars skater in a single season in franchise history. Trade deadline acquisition Mikko Rantanen had 12 points (4-8-12) in 11 road games with the Stars and finished the regular season tied for 10th in the NHL with 44 road points (16-28-44).

From Jan. 1 through the end of the regular season, Jason Robertson scored 16 goals when playing away from the American Airlines Center, leading all NHL skaters in road goals during that span. In all, Robertson scored 20 goals on the road in 2024-25, which topped Dallas skaters and tied for eighth in the NHL.

BIKER GANG

Defenseman Thomas Harley had a career year in 2024-25, totaling 50 points (16-34-50) in 78 regular-season games and setting career highs in goals, assists, points, even-strength goals (15), power-play points (15), plus/minus (plus-32) and time on ice per game played (23:23). His 50 points ranked 15th among all NHL defensemen last year and made him the third Stars defenseman in the last 10 years to reach the 50-point plateau. His 16 goals last season were tied for the sixth-most by a Stars defenseman in a single season in franchise history and were tied for the sixth-most among all NHL defensemen that year. Twenty-seven (9-18-27) of his 50 points came in 30 games from Jan. 31 – Dallas' first without Miro Heiskanen – through the end of the regular season, which ranked fifth on Dallas' roster and tied for fifth among all NHL defensemen during that span.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

The Stars had three players appear in every regular-season game for the club in 2024-25: Matt Duchene, Wyatt Johnston and Jason Robertson. The 2024-25 campaign marked the third time in Robertson's career that he played in all 82 of Dallas regular-season games after also doing so in 2023-24 and 2022-23. Robertson finished the regular season playing in 292 consecutive regular-season games dating back to Jan. 20, 2022, which was the ninth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL at the end of the regular season.

Johnston has played in every single regular-season game since he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 26 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 246 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. His 246-game Iron Man streak was tied for the 18th-longest active streak in the NHL at the end of the regular season.

SEEING STARS

Dallas had three players earn NHL Star of the Week honors during the 2024-25 regular season: Roope Hintz, Matt Duchene and Mason Marchment. Hintz was first named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on March 2, 2025 after topping the NHL with seven assists and nine points overall (2-7-9) – as well as five power-play assists/points – in three games played. He was again named the League's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on March 30 after tallying nine points (2-7-9) in four games played. He was one of 13 players in 2024-25 to earn Star of the Week honors on multiple occasions. Duchene was named the League's Third Star of the Week for the week ending on Oct. 27 after notching six points (3-3-6) in three games.

KILLING IT

The Stars went 187-for-228 on the penalty kill in 2024-25 for a 82.0 percent success rate, which was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL last season. It marked the third consecutive regular season in which the Stars had a success rate on the penalty kill of at least 82 percent. Dallas allowed only 41 power-play goals against last season, which tied for fifth in the NHL and was tied for the seventh-best mark in franchise history.

Defenseman Esa Lindell led the NHL in total shorthanded ice time (287:02) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:35) in 2024-25. His 287:02 of shorthanded ice time was nearly 10 more minutes than the second-ranked player (Mike Matheson; 277:22).

GOING STREAKING

The Stars recorded two separate seven-game win streaks during the 2024-25 regular season. Their seven-game win streaks were tied for the seventh-longest win streaks in the NHL last year and made them one of four teams (Carolina, Detroit, Winnipeg) to have multiple winning streaks of at least seven games.

The team recorded their first seven-game win streak from Dec. 29 to Jan. 11, outscoring their opponents 26-13 during that span. Dallas then had a second seven-game win streak from March 22 to April 3. In those games, the Stars outscored their opponents 28-10 and had an 88.5 percent success rate on the penalty kill.

POSTSEASON GAME NOTES

THE MOOSE WAS LOOSE

In his first playoff run with the Stars, Mikko Rantanen had the sixth-highest scoring postseason in Dallas Stars team history, totaling 22 points (9-13-22) and scoring a career-high nine goals in 18 playoff games. His 22 points led the Stars and he ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in postseason goals (sixth), assists (tied ninth) and points (tied seventh).

He became the third player in franchise history (Dino Ciccarelli and Joe Pavelski) to score multiple playoff hat tricks with the team and the only player to do so in the same postseason after having two three-goal performances. He scored a hat trick in Game 7 of the First Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs to eliminate the Colorado Avalanche with all three of his goals coming in the third period. It marked the first-ever hat trick in the third period of a Game 7 in NHL history, the second Game 7 hat trick in franchise history and the second four-point period (3-1-4) in a Game 7 in League history. With three goals in Game 1 of the Second Round against the Jets, Rantanen became the third player in NHL history to score a hat trick in consecutive Stanley Cup Playoff games. All three of Rantanen's goals came in the second period, making him the first player in Stanley Cup Playoffs history with multiple three-goal periods in the same postseason and fourth to do so at any point during their career.

Aside from his hat tricks, Rantanen set several other league and franchise records during the 2025 postseason. He tied the NHL record for points in a period with four (1-3-4) in the second period of Game 6 against the Colorado. Rantanen and Roope Hintz, who also had four points (2-2-4) that period, became the first pair of teammates in NHL history to have simultaneous four-point periods in a playoff game. He then became the first player in NHL history with multiple four-point periods in a single postseason after notching four points (3-1-4) in the third period of the following game. Rantanen also became the first player in NHL history with five three-point games through his first 10 contests in a postseason and became the first player in NHL history to factor in on 13 consecutive goals for his team when he did so from Game 5 of the First Round to Game 3 of the Second Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

BIKER GANG

Thomas Harley finished the 2025 postseason with a career-high 14 points (4-10-14), ranking second on both the team and among all NHL defensemen in playoff scoring. His 2025 Stanley Cup Playoff run tied for the fifth-highest scoring postseason by a Stars/North Stars defenseman in franchise history. Between the regular season and playoffs, Harley scored 19 goals, which tied Philipp Boucher in 2006-07 for the second-most in a single season by a Stars defenseman in franchise history, trailing only Brad Maxwell (21 in 1983-84). Most notably, he became the third defenseman in franchise history to score a series-clinching goal when he did so in overtime against the Winnipeg Jets in Game 6 of the Second Round. The goal also made him the third-youngest defenseman in NHL history to score a series-clinching goal in overtime. He has now totaled 27 playoff points (5-22-27) over the course of his career, which leads all skaters drafted in 2019.

Harley totaled over 467 minutes of ice time during the playoffs, which topped all Stars skaters and was nearly 44 minutes more than the second-ranked player (Esa Lindell, 423:27). Despite not advancing to the Finals, Harley ranked ninth in the NHL in total time on ice during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. He totaled over 25 minutes of ice time in 12 of the 18 games he played during the postseason, including skating a career-high 35:54 in Game 2 against Colorado.

KILLING IT

The Stars finished the postseason with a 79.7 percent success rate on the penalty kill, which was the fifth-best mark of any team during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. Esa Lindell (79:19) and Cody Ceci (60:43) ranked second and fourth, respectfully, in the NHL in total shorthanded ice time during the playoffs despite not advancing to the Finals. Their 2025 playoff runs are also the third and fourth highest shorthanded ice time totals in a single postseason in franchise history. Sam Steel (50:12, second), Wyatt Johnston (36:57, 10th) and Oskar Bäck (31:13, 15th) all ranked in the top 15 among all NHL forwards in total shorthanded ice time during the 2025 postseason.

The Stars finished the First Round against Colorado with a 86.4 percent success rate on the penalty kill, their best mark in a playoff series since 2022 against the Calgary Flames (91.7 percent). In Games 3 through 7 of the First Round, the Stars went 14-for-15 on the penalty kill, not allowing a power-play goal against in Games 3, 5, 6 or 7. This included going a perfect 6-for-6 on the penalty kill in Game 3 (10:17 of shorthanded ice time in total) and killing off 3:20 of penalty kill time to begin overtime. Dallas' Game 3 performance marked the 13th time that the Stars had been shorthanded for at least 10 minutes without allowing a power-play goal against in a Stanley Cup Playoff game since the NHL began tracking penalty kills in 1977-78. Lindell played 8:09 of Dallas' 10:17 of shorthanded time that game, the highest single-game total by a Stars skater in franchise playoff history.

REWRITING THE HISTORY BOOKS

The Stars defeated the Avalanche 4-2 in Game 7 to advance to the Second Round with goals coming from Mikko Rantanen (3) and Wyatt Johnston. With the win, the Stars became the first team in NHL history to trail by multiple goals in the third period of a Game 7 and win in regulation. The team's victory over the Avalanche also marked the fourth time in franchise history that the Stars overcame a deficit to win a Game 7, also doing so in 2020, 1984 and 1980. The win improved the team's record to 9-9 in Game 7s in franchise history.

The Stars' final tilt with the Avalanche marked the fourth time in franchise history that Dallas has faced Colorado in a Game 7, going a perfect 4-0 in those games. Dallas improved to 3-0 in their last three series against the Avalanche and 5-2 in seven all-time postseason rounds versus Colorado dating to the 1999 Conference Finals. The Stars' five series wins against the Avalanche are tied for their most versus one opponent since relocating to Texas in 1993-94 (also five against Edmonton).

MR. GAME 7

Wyatt Johnston scored the game-winning goal with 3:56 remaining in Game 7 of the First Round to secure Dallas' series victory over the Avalanche, marking the 11th-latest go-ahead goal in Game 7 history. The goal was his third in as many career Game 7s and also made him the first player in franchise history to score multiple series-clinching goals in a Game 7 after also doing so in 2023 against Seattle. In all, Johnston has scored three series-clinching goals in his career, making him the second player in NHL history (Jeremy Roenick, 4) to have at least three series-clinching goals at age 22 or younger.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

The Stars won three games in overtime during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs: Game 2 against Colorado (4-3), Game 3 against Colorado (2-1) and Game 6 against Winnipeg (2-1). In all three wins, the Stars erased a one-goal, third-period deficit. Dallas was the only team to go undefeated in overtime during the postseason, and their three overtime wins ranked second to only Edmonton (5). The team's three overtime wins were also tied for the third-most in a single postseason in franchise history, trailing only their five in 2020 and four in 1999.

Colin Blackwell scored the game-winner in Game 2 against the Avalanche, becoming the second player in franchise history to score an overtime goal in his first Stanley Cup Playoff game with the Stars/North Stars (Brian Propp, 1991). Tyler Seguin scored the game-winning goal two days later in Game 3 against Colorado. The goal was the second overtime goal of his career and first since Game 6 of the 2012 Conference Quarterfinals when he was playing for Boston, making him the third player in NHL history to go more than 13 years between scoring overtime goals in the playoffs. Dallas' Game 3 and Game 4 victories over Colorado was the first time in franchise history that the Stars won consecutive overtime games in the playoffs.

Thomas Harley became the third defenseman in franchise history to score a series-clinching goal when he did so in overtime against the Winnipeg Jets in Game 6 of the Second Round. The goal also made him the third-youngest defenseman in NHL history to score a series-clinching goal in overtime. Harley's goal was also the third-fastest series-clinching overtime goal by a defenseman in NHL history, behind only Chris Tanev (0:11 in Game 4 of 2020 SCQ) and Bobby Orr (0:40 in Game 4 of 1970 SCF).

BASH BROS

Defensemen Lian Bichsel and Alexander Petrovic played 164:03 of 5-on-5 ice time together during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs, which was the 12th highest total of any defensive pair during the postseason. Among defensive pairs that played at least 50 minutes of 5-on-5 together during the playoffs, the Bichsel/Petrovic pairing ranked eighth in the NHL with a 59.0 percent on-ice Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick.

Bichsel finished the postseason with 75 hits, which led all rookies, ranked eighth in the NHL and was tied for the eighth-most in a single playoff run in franchise history. He recorded 13 hits in Game 3 against Winnipeg, which was tied with Zach Hyman (on May 14 against Vegas) for the most by any skater in a Stanley Cup Playoff game during the postseason. Bichsel's 13 hits were tied for the seventh-most in a single playoff game in NHL history and rank second to only Brendan Morrow (19 on May 4, 2008) in Stars franchise history. Petrovic had a playoff career-high nine hits in Game 2 against Winnipeg, which at the time was the highest total by a Stars skater in a single game since Denis Gurianov also had nine hits on Sept. 8, 2020 against the Vegas Golden Knights.

THE FINNISH FIVE

Game 4 against the Jets marked the first time that all five of Dallas' Finnish players (Mikael Granlund, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz, Esa Lindell and Mikko Rantanen) took the ice in the same game. Defenseman Miro Heiskanen had already been sidelined with an injury when Granlund and Rantanen were acquired by Dallas. Game 4 marked the first time since the league began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting in a regular-season or playoff game were from Finland.

THREE OF A KIND

Mikael Granlund scored all three Stars goals in Dallas' 3-1 win over the Jets in Game 4 of the Second Round, marking the first playoff hat trick of his career. Granlund's performance in Game 4 was the 13th playoff hat trick scored in franchise history and the third by a Stars skater that postseason following Mikko Rantanen's three-goal showings in Game 7 against Colorado and Game 1 against Winnipeg. Dallas' 2025 playoff run marked the second time in franchise history (2020) that the Stars scored three hat tricks in the same postseason. It also made them the fourth franchise in NHL history to have multiple postseasons with at least three hat tricks, joining the Oilers (6 in 1985 and 1983), Islanders (4 in 1983 and 3 in 1981) and Bruins (3 in 1972 and 1970). The Stars also became the fourth team in NHL history and first in more than 30 years to have multiple playoff hat tricks scored by players acquired earlier that season, joining the 1994 Blackhawks (Gary Suter and Tony Amonte), 1990 Rangers (Mike Gartner and Bernie Nicholls) and 1990 Kings (Tony Granato and Tomas Sandstrom).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Enters the 2025-26 season ranked fourth in franchise history with 149 career wins. His 149 wins since the start of the 2020-21 season – when he made his NHL debut – rank fifth in the NHL during that span.
- Ranks fourth among active, American-born goaltenders with 149 career wins and is tied for fifth with 12 career shutouts.
- Has won at least 30 games in four of his five NHL seasons, making him the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons.
- Since making his postseason debut during the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs, Oettinger's 32 career playoff wins rank second in the NHL (Sergei Bobrovsky, 48). His 32 playoff wins are the second-most in franchise history and are tied for the fourth-most in NHL history among American-born goaltenders.
- Posted a 24-7-1 record with a .920 save percentage and a 2.14 goals-against average in home games in 2024-25. His 24 home wins were a career high and tied for the most by a Stars goaltender in franchise history (Marty Turco; 2003-04, 2005-06).
- Began the 2024-25 season with a perfect 4-0-0 record, the third-longest winning streak to begin a season in franchise history.
- Opened the 2024-25 season by winning 10 consecutive games at the American Airlines Center (excluding the Global Series), becoming the ninth netminder in NHL history to win the first 10 games he played at his home arena.
- Made his 200th NHL start and recorded his 125th career win on Nov. 29, 2024 vs. Colorado. His 125 wins were tied for the fifth-most through a goaltender's first 200 NHL starts in NHL history.
- Won 50 games in the 2024 calendar year (including playoffs), setting a franchise record and making him the third American-born goaltender to win 50 games in a calendar year.
- Won nine consecutive home games from Jan. 24, 2025 to April 3, 2025, the longest home winning streak of his career.
- Posted his 100th career win (100-45-23 in 177 games played) on Feb. 29, 2024 vs. Winnipeg, becoming the third-fastest U.S.-born goaltender in NHL history to reach the 100-win mark.
- Recorded wins in eight consecutive starts (8-0-0) from March 20 to April 9, 2024, the second-longest win streak in franchise history. He also became the first goaltender in franchise history to record multiple win streaks of at least seven games in a single season after winning seven straight games from Jan. 23 to Feb. 15, 2024.
- Allowed two goals or fewer in six consecutive starts in Game 2-7 of the First Round vs. Vegas during the 2024 Stanley Cup Playoffs, becoming the third goaltender in franchise history to hold such a streak in the postseason.
- Set a career high with 37 wins and five shutouts during the 2022-23 season, tying for third and second in the League in wins and shutout, respectively. His 37 wins are tied for the third-most by a goaltender in a single season in franchise history.

- Named the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the week ending on Feb. 20, 2022 after stopping 104 of the 107 shots he faced, compiling a 2-1-0 record, 0.98 goals-against average, .972 save percentage and one shutout.
- Stopped 19 of 21 shots he faced against the New York Islanders on April 5, 2022, becoming the fastest goaltender in franchise history to reach 25 wins in a season (40 games played).
- Among netminders to appear in at least two games, Oettinger led the NHL with a .954 save percentage a 1.81 goals-against average during the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- Earned a 29-save shutout in Game 2 of the First Round of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs against Calgary for his first career win and shutout in the Stanley Cup Playoffs, becoming the youngest goaltender in Dallas Stars history to earn a postseason shutout (23 years, 138 days).

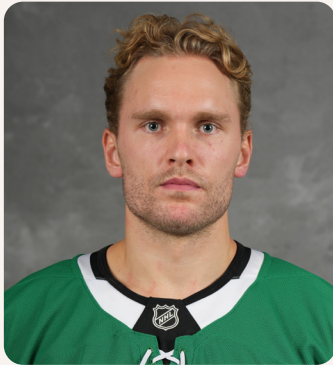

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Enters the 2025-26 season ranked in the top 10 in NHL history among Finnish-born players in career goals (294, fourth), assists (411, 10th), points (705, seventh) and points per game (1.08, second). His 705 career points are good for third among players selected in the 2015 NHL Draft.
- Since the start of the 2016-17 – his first full NHL season – his 294 goals and 705 points rank eighth and 10th, respectively, in the League.
- Ranks 11th in the NHL among all active players with 123 career playoff points (43-80–123), which is good for third in NHL history among Finnish skaters.
- Has played in the NHL All-Star Game twice – in 2019 and 2023.
- Joins Edmonton's Connor McDavid and Leon Draisaitl as the only three players in the NHL to finish in the top 15 in League scoring in each of the last five seasons.
- Has scored at least 30 goals in each of the last five seasons, making him the third Finnish player in NHL history to record five consecutive 30-goal seasons.
- Enters the 2025-26 season as one of 12 active skaters and one of three Finnish players in NHL history to post multiple 100-point seasons.
- Was one of six NHLers named to Finland's preliminary roster for the 2026 Winter Olympic Games.
- Was the NHL's First Star of the Month in October 2019 and its Second Star of the Month in November 2024. Additionally he's been named a Star of the Week three times for the weeks ending on Nov. 24, 2024 (Second), Nov. 13, 2022 (First) and Oct. 2, 2018 (Third).
- Recorded a league-leading three hat tricks during the 2024-25 season: on Oct. 9 at Vegas, on Nov. 13 vs. Los Angeles and on Dec. 10 at Pittsburgh.
- Acquired by Dallas from Carolina in a trade on March 8, 2025 prior to the NHL's Trade Deadline. He was averaging 1.13 points per game in 2024-25 at the time of the trade, which was the highest scoring rate of any player dealt on the NHL trade deadline since Joe Juneau (1.14) in 1994.
- Had the sixth-highest scoring postseason in Dallas Stars team history during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs, totaling 22 points (9-13–22) and scoring a career-high nine goals in 18 playoff games.
- Tied the NHL record for points in a period with four (1-3–4) in the second period of Game 6 against the Colorado Avalanche in the First Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. Rantanen and Roope Hintz, who also had four points (2-2–4) that period, became the first pair of teammates in NHL history to have simultaneous four-point periods in a playoff game.

- Scored a hat trick in Game 7 of the First Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs to eliminate the Colorado Avalanche with all three of his goals coming in the third period. It marked the first-ever hat trick in the third period of a Game 7 in NHL history, the second Game 7 hat trick in franchise history and the second four-point period (3-1-4) in a Game 7 in League history.
- Became the first player in NHL history with multiple four-point periods in a single postseason after doing so in Game 6 and 7 against the Avalanche.
- With three goals in Game 1 of the Second Round against the Jets, Rantanen became the third player in NHL history to score a hat trick in consecutive Stanley Cup Playoff games. All three of Rantanen's goals came in the second period, making him the first player in Stanley Cup Playoffs history with multiple three-goal periods in the same postseason and fourth to do so at any point during their career.
- Became the first player in NHL history to factor in on 13 consecutive goals for his team when he did so from Game 5 of the First Round to Game 3 of the Second Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. He also became the first player in NHL history to have 10 or more points in Games 5 through 7 of a series after notching 11 (5-6-11) against Colorado.
- Totaled 104 points (42-62-104) in 80 games with the Avalanche in 2023-24, leading all NHL forwards with 22:54 of average ice time per game and posting a career-best 62 assists. He joined Teemu Selanne (1995-97) and Jari Kurri (five straight, 1982-87) as the only Finnish players to post back-to-back 100-point campaigns.
- Became the first Avalanche player since the team relocated to Denver to score at least 30 goals in four consecutive seasons and the second to score 40 goals in consecutive seasons after netting 42 goals in 2023-24.
- Became the third player in NHL history to record four points in a season-opening game in consecutive years after scoring two goals and adding two assists on Oct. 11, 2023.
- Notched his 100th career playoff point in Game 5 of the Second Round of the 2024 Stanley Cup Playoffs - his 80th game - to tie Glenn Anderson for the 10th-fewest playoff games in NHL history needed to reach 100 points.
- Surpassed the 100-point mark for the first time in his career in 2022-23, finishing eighth in the NHL with a career-best 105 points (55-50-105) and setting an Avalanche franchise record for points in a season by a right wing.
- His 55 goals in 2022-23 were the third-most in the NHL, were tied for the third-most in Avalanche franchise history and made him the third Finnish-born player in NHL history to reach the 50-goal mark.
- Recorded 107 points (46-61-107) in 86 games during the 2022 calendar year, marking the second 100-point calendar year of his career (113 points in 2018) and the seventh 100-point year in Avalanche history.
- Scored seven goals in seven games during the 2023 Stanley Cup Playoffs to finish the 2022-23 season with 62 goals, becoming the third Avalanche/Nordiques player to score 60 or more combined regular season and playoff goals.
- Helped the Avalanche win the 2022 Stanley Cup after finishing second on the team and fifth in the NHL with 25 points (5-20-25) in 20 playoff games.
- Recorded eight of his 20 playoff assists in 2022 during the Stanley Cup Finals against Tampa Bay and scored a goal in each of the four Western Conference Final games against Edmonton.
- Named to the NHL's Second All-Star Team in 2020-21 after leading the Avalanche and ranking fifth in the League in goals (30) and points (66-tied) in 52 games.
- His 0.58 goals-per-game in 2020-21 ranked fourth in the League and was the highest mark by an Avalanche player since Milan Hejduk (0.61) in 2002-03.
- Had a point in 17 consecutive playoff games, beginning during the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs and concluding the following postseason, setting an Avalanche franchise record for longest personal point streak during the playoffs.
- Scored 31 goals in 2018-19 to become the second player in Avalanche history to score at least 20 goals in each of his first three NHL seasons.
- Became the ninth player in NHL history to record 40 assists in his team's first 32 games of a season on Dec. 14, 2018, joining Wayne Gretzky (11x), Mario Lemieux (3x), Bobby Orr, Ron Francis, Forsberg, Denis Savard, John Mullen and Evgeni Malkin.
- Led Colorado in playoff scoring with 14 points (6-8-14) in 12 games during the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs, the most by an Avalanche player in the postseason since 2002 (Peter Forsberg 27, Joe Sakic 19).
- Tallied his first career hat trick on Feb. 7, 2017 vs. Montreal, becoming the second-youngest Avalanche player to record a hat trick at 20 years and 101 days.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Enters the 2025-26 season having played in 292 consecutive regular-season games, which is the ninth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Ranks 18th in franchise history in scoring (168-226-394) and is tied for second in points per game (1.05) among skaters to play in at least three games despite only playing in five full NHL seasons – one of which was shortened due to the Covid-19 pandemic.
- Since the start of the 2020-21 season – his first full NHL season – he leads all Stars skaters in goals (168), assists (225) and points (393), while also ranking 13th in the NHL in scoring over that span.
- Is the third highest-scoring California-born player in NHL history, trailing only Auston Matthews (727) and Jason Zucker (423), and ranks fourth among American NHLers in both goals and points since the start of the 2020-21 season.
- Ranks third among 2017 draftees in career goals (168) and fifth in points (394).
- Has led the Stars in goals in three of his five full NHL seasons.
- Scored 41 goals in 2021-22, 46 in 2022-23 and 35 in 2024-25 to become the sixth player in franchise history to have three 30-goal seasons at the age of 25 or younger.
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Month in November 2024, Rookie of the Month in April 2021, and earned Star of the Week honors five times for the weeks ending on April 13, 2023 (First), Dec. 4, 2022 (Third), Nov. 27, 2022 (First), Nov. 6, 2022 (First) and March 6, 2022 (First).
- Had 80 points (35-45-80) in 82 games with the Stars in 2024-25 to become the second player in Stars team history to have three consecutive 80-point seasons, joining Mike Modano who did so from 1998-99 to 2000-01.
- Scored a goal on Oct. 24, 2024 at Boston in his 300th NHL game. The goal was the 137th of his career – the second most by a Stars/North Stars player through 300 career NHL games behind Dino Ciccarelli (158). It was also the 320th point of his career, which was the sixth-most among active skaters through their first 300 career games.

Neal Broten began his NHL career with a bang, being named the franchise's Rookie of the Year after setting team records that still stand for most goals, assists and points by a rookie (38-60-98) in the 1981-82 season. Sixteen seasons later, Broten retired as the club's all-time leader in games played (992), assists (593) and points (867) and is fourth in team annals in goals (274). The team's Most Valuable Player in 1984 and 1986, Broten participated in the NHL All-Star Game in 1983 and 1986. In that 1985-86 campaign, he became the first American-born player to record 100 points (105) and set the current club mark for most assists in a season with 76. Moving with the team to Texas in 1993, Broten scored the first-ever goal in Dallas Stars history on October 5, 1993 against Detroit. Broten's number seven was retired by the Stars on February 7, 1998 and he was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame in 2000.

Bill Goldsworthy began his NHL career with the Boston Bruins in 1964, appearing in just 33 regular-season games and earning 12 points (6-6-12) over parts of three seasons with the Bruins before he was selected by the Minnesota North Stars in the expansion draft in 1967. Goldsworthy would make a name for himself in the NHL with the North Stars through goal-scoring and the invention of his signature goal celebration, the Goldy Shuffle. Goldsworthy registered five 30+ goal seasons in his career, all coming while he was in Minnesota. The native of Waterloo, Ontario was the first player from a post-1967 expansion club to reach the 200- and 250-goal mark, while he eclipsed the 500-point plateau during the 1976-77 season to become the first player in Minnesota North Stars history to accomplish the feat.

Goldsworthy finished his 10-season career with the North Stars in 1977. Over that span, he registered 267 goals, 239 assists and 506 points (267-239-506) in 670 regular-season games. He currently ranks fifth all-time in goals (267), sixth in game-winning goals (34), 10th in points (506) and third in shots on goal (2,237). Goldsworthy was also named to an All-Star four times during his career (1970, 1972, 1974 and 1976). In recognition of his accomplishments, Goldsworthy's number eight was retired by the organization on February 15, 1992. Goldsworthy passed away on March 29, 1996 at the age of 51 due to complications from AIDS.

Mike Modano, the greatest American-born hockey player in NHL history, played 21 seasons in the NHL and is the all-time franchise leader in nearly every category, including games played (1,459), goals (557), assists (802), points (1,359), short-handed goals (29), game-winning goals (92) and power play tallies (156).

A seven-time NHL All-Star, 2014 Hockey Hall of Fame class member, and United States Hockey Hall of Fame inductee, Modano is also the American-born record holder in goals (561) and points (1,374). He was also instrumental in helping the Stars capture the 1999 Stanley Cup championship. The Livonia, Michigan native skated for Team USA at the Olympic Games on three separate occasions, winning the silver medal at the 2002 Games in Salt Lake City. He also captured the gold medal at the 1996 World Cup of Hockey; and was captain of the United States squad at the 2005 World Cup. Modano was drafted first overall in 1988 by the Minnesota North Stars.

On March 8, 2014, the Dallas Stars honored Mike Modano, the greatest player to wear a Stars uniform, by retiring his iconic number 9. On March 16, 2024, the Stars unveiled an 18-foot statue of Modano – the team's first on PNC Plaza – that was created by renowned artists Omri Amrany and Sean Michael Bell commemorating Modano's achievements with the Stars and his place in Dallas sports history.

Bill Masterton was a member of the Minnesota North Stars inaugural NHL team in 1967-68, recording 12 points (4-8-12) in 38 contests before suffering a fatal head injury in a game on Jan. 13, 1968.

A native of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Masterton attended the University of Denver where he played for three seasons with the Pioneers in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA), winning two National Championships in 1960 and 1961. The first player to sign with the new Minnesota club, Masterton made his NHL debut in the team's inaugural game on Oct. 11, 1967 against the St. Louis Blues, scoring the first goal in franchise history. In a game against the Oakland Seals on Jan. 13, 1968, Masterton suffered a severe head injury when his head hit the ice after being checked. The 29-year-old would eventually succumb to his injury as he passed away just two days later on Jan. 15.

In his memory, the Professional Hockey Writers' Association created the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy in 1968, an award presented annually to the "National Hockey League player who best exemplifies the qualities of perseverance, sportsmanship and dedication to hockey." Masterton's number 19 has never been worn by another player in franchise history, and was retired by the organization on January 17, 1987.

Jere Lehtinen was originally selected by the Minnesota North Stars in the fourth round (88th overall) of the 1992 NHL Draft before making his NHL debut with Dallas in 1995-96. Lehtinen played his entire 14-season NHL career in a Dallas Stars sweater and recorded 514 points (243-271-514) in 875 regular-season games, landing himself on the Stars franchise leaderboard in a number of categories.

At the time of his retirement on Dec. 8, 2010, the Espoo, Finland native ranked third in franchise history in games played (875), seventh in goals (243), eighth in points (514) and 10th in assists (271). Lehtinen also finished third in game-winning goals (37) and sixth in power play goals (77), while he continues to sit atop the franchise leaderboard with a career +174 plus/minus rating.

Best known for his two-way play, Lehtinen won the Frank J. Selke Trophy as the NHL's top defensive forward three times in 1998, 1999 and 2003. The forward also earned recognition being named to the 1998 All-Star Game, his only All-Star appearance in his 14-season career. Lehtinen helped the Stars capture the 1999 Stanley Cup, finishing tied for second on the team with 10 goals and ranked fifth with 13 points (10-3-13) while appearing in all 23 postseason games during the team's championship run.

Inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in November 2019, Zubov spent 12 of his 16 NHL seasons as a member of the Dallas Stars, registering 549 points in 839 regular-season contests. Among franchise leaders (1967-present), he ranks third in assists (438) and plus/minus rating (+103), fifth in games played and seventh in points.

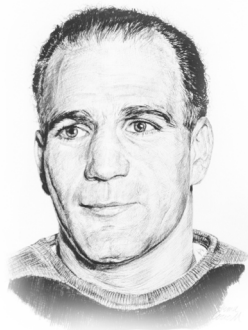
Zubov is the franchise leader among defensemen in numerous statistical categories including points, goals (111), assists, games played, power-play goals (60) and shots on goal (1,694).

The native of Moscow, Russia qualified for the Stanley Cup Playoffs in 13 of 16 NHL campaigns, including 10 of his 12 seasons with Dallas, and registered 117 points in 164 career postseason contests. With Dallas, he tallied 72 points in 114 Stanley Cup Playoff games and ranks first in plus/minus (+18), second in assists (57), fourth in games played, sixth in points and is tied for seventh in power-play goals (ninth) among franchise leaders. Zubov won two Stanley Cups in his career, including a championship with Dallas in 1999.

Over his career, Zubov made three appearances in the NHL All-Star Game (1998, 1999, 2000) and was selected to the 2005-06 NHL Second All-Star Team.

His No. 56 was raised to the rafters at American Airlines Center on Jan. 28, 2022, becoming the sixth player in franchise history to have his number retired.

Prior to his current role, he served as the host of Stars Live, the pregame, intermission and postgame show during Stars broadcasts on FOX Sports Southwest. While there Bogorad was voted Broadcaster of the Year in both the ECHL and CHL, and won the CHL's Communications Executive of the Year Award.

DARYL "RAZOR" REAUGH

Color Analyst

Daryl Reaugh is in his 29th season on Stars television and radio broadcasts and his 27th as the team's color analyst. For two seasons from 2016-18, Reaugh had served as the team's play-by-play announcer in the wake of Dave Strader's cancer diagnosis.
