DETROIT RED WINGS

All-Time Wild Record: 26-31-12 (14-11-9 at Grand Casino Arena, 12-20-3 at Detroit)

2024-25: Minnesota went 1-1-0 against Detroit...Minnesota won the series-opening game, 4-3, in overtime at Little Caesars Arena (2/22) and Detroit earned a 3-2 win in Saint Paul (2/25)...LW **Matt Boldy** (1-2=3) and C Marco Rossi (2-1=3) led the Wild with three points...LW **Marcus Johansson** had two points (0-2=2)...LW **Marcus Foligno** and RW **Vinnie Hinostroza** each had a goal...G Marc-Andre Fleury stopped 27-of-30 shots faced to earn a win in the first meeting...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped 13-of-16 shots faced in the second meeting...LW **Alex DeBrincat** led Detroit with three points (1-2=3)...D **Simon Edvisson** (2-0=2), C **Dylan Larkin** (0-2=2) and RW **Lucas Raymond** (1-1=2) all had two points...G **Cam Talbot** went 1-0-1 with a 2.91 GAA and a .905 SV% in two starts.

WILD LEADERS: Johansson leads Minnesota with 20 points (6-14=20) in 33 career games against Detroit...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns 18 points (6-12=18) in 25 games...RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** has 14 points (6-8=14) in 23 games...C **Joel Eriksson Ek** owns 11 points (4-7=11) in 13 matches.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 2-3-0 with a 2.45 GAA and .889 SV% in five starts against Detroit...G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced Detroit.

RED WINGS LEADERS: RW **Patrick Kane** leads the Red Wings with 55 career points (25-30=55) in 60 career games against the Wild...LW **J.T. Compher** has 18 points (7-11=18) in 30 games...Larkin owns 17 points (5-12=17) in 17 contests...DeBrincat has 16 points (8-8=16) in 21 games.

RED WINGS GOALIES: Talbot is 9-8-2 with a 2.43 GAA and a .924 SV% in 19 career starts against Minnesota...G **John Gibson** is 7-8-4 with a 2.67 GAA, a .920 SV% and three shutouts in 20 starts.

CONNECTIONS: Tarasenko collected 33 points (11-22=33) in 80 games with Detroit during the 2024-25 season...Detroit Head Coach **Todd McLellan** served as Head Coach for the IHL's Cleveland Lumberjacks for one season (2000-01) and Head Coach for the AHL's Houston Aeros for four seasons (2001-05) when each team served as the Wild's primary minor league affiliate...Red Wings Assistant Coach **Alex Tanguay** spent two seasons as an Assistant Coach for the Iowa Wild (2019-21)...Talbot posted a record of 51-20-9 with a 2.71 GAA, a .913 SV% and five shutouts in 82 games (81 starts) over two seasons with Minnesota (2020-22).

FAST FACTS: Minnesota is 8-3-0 in its last 11 games against Detroit (since 2/22/19), outscoring the Red Wings 45-30...The Wild has earned a point in eight of its last 12 games in Detroit (6-4-2)...Minnesota has earned a point in 17 of the last 21 meetings at Grand Casino Arena (11-4-6) and is 7-2-0 in the last nine games played in Saint Paul.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: At 28-14-9, ranks T-4th in the NHL with 65 points, tied for the third-highest point total through a season's first 51 games in franchise history...Is 25-8-6 (.718) since Nov. 1, ranking second in the NHL in points (56) and third in wins...Since Nov. 1, ranks second in the NHL in team SV% (.916), third in goal differential (plus-33) and fourth in team GAA (2.44)...Has scored first in 32 games this season, tied for most in the NHL (Washington)...Ranks T-1st in the NHL with seven shutouts, one shy of tying the franchise's single-season record...Ranks third in the NHL with 801 blocked shots.

Brock Faber: Scored his 11th goal of the season at MTL (1/20), establishing a new single-season career high...Owns 10 points (3-7=10) in nine games played since Jan. 3...Posted a career-high plus-4 rating at TOR (1/20) as well as two assists...In 19 games since Dec. 14, ranks T-5th among NHL defensemen with five goals and T-6th with 16 points (5-11=16)...Since Nov. 7, ranks sixth among NHL defensemen with a plus-23 rating...For the season, ranks T-6th among NHL defensemen in goals and eighth among all skaters in blocked shots (108) and ninth in TOI/G (24:44).

Marcus Foligno: Notched the first hat trick of his NHL career with three goals at TOR (1/19)...Owns five goals in his last five games.

Filip Gustavsson: Played in his 200th career NHL game at TOR (1/19) and currently owns 99 career wins...Recorded an assist at BUF (1/17) to push his career point total to five (1-4=5)...Is 7-2-0 with a 2.34 GAA, a .913 SV% and one shutout in his last nine road games...Since Dec. 8, ranks sixth in the NHL with a 2.27 GAA and nine wins and T-6th with a .916 SV% (min. nine GP)...In 18 games (17 starts) since Nov. 16, is 12-2-3 and ranks T-4th in the NHL with two shutouts, and T-5th with a .921 SV% and 2.17 GAA (min. 11 GP)...Ranks T-4th in the NHL with three shutouts this season.

Ryan Hartman: Recorded a season-long four-game active point streak (3-2=5) from 1/12 - 1/19 and owns points in six out of his last eight games (5-2=7)...Posted a career-long four game road goal streak from 1/5 - 1/19...With a goal at TOR (1/19), reached 111 goals in a Wild sweater, moving past Nino Niederreiter (110) and tying Eric Staal (111) for 10th in franchise history...Ranks T-2nd on the Wild with three GWG and third with 14 goals this season.

Quinn Hughes: Owns an active three-game point streak (1-4=5)...Has 14 points (1-13=14) in his last 10 games and ranks T-2nd in the NHL in assists and T-9th in scoring since Jan. 2...In 18 games since making his Wild debut on Dec. 14, ranks fourth among NHL skaters (second among defensemen) with 19 assists and second among NHL defensemen with 21 points (2-19=21)...With two assists at TOR (1/19), became the fastest player in Wild history to reach 20 points with the club, doing so in his 18th game...Ranks T-2nd among NHL defensemen in assists (40) and fifth in scoring (4-40=44) this season...Leads all NHL skaters with a 27:39 TOI/G, even strength TOI/G (23:05) and second in power-play TOI/G (4:27) this season.

Kirill Kaprizov: Has tallied three consecutive multi-assist games during his active three-game point streak (0-7=7)...Since Dec. 14, ranks T-5th in the NHL with 18 assists and T-6th with 25 points (7-18=25)...Ranks T-5th in the NHL with 174 shots, T-9th with nine PPG, 10th with 59 points (25-34=59) and T-10th with 25 goals...Ranks first on Wild in points and assists and second in goals.

Vladimir Tarasenko: Has scored multiple goals in two consecutive games (1/19 at TOR, 1/20 at MTL), becoming the fourth player in Wild history to record multiple goals on consecutive days (also Kaprizov, 2x; Zucker, Gaborik)...Owns five goals in an active three-game goal streak (5-2=7) and eight points (5-3=8) in an active four-game point streak...Matched his season high with three points (2-1=3) at TOR (1/19).

Yakov Trenin: Tied his career high with a game-high nine hits in consecutive games at TOR (1/19) and at BUF (1/17)...Leads the NHL with 255 hits, the highest total in franchise history through a season's first 51 games and the second-highest total in the NHL through 51 games since the 2006-07 season.

Jesper Wallstedt: Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four shutouts and T-7th with a .914 SV%...Is 6-2-3 with a 2.34 GAA, .921 SV% and two shutouts on the road this season.

Danila Yurov: Recorded a career-long three-game point streak (2-1=3) from 1/15 - 1/19.

Mats Zuccarello: Owns an active three-game point streak (1-4=5).

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Matt Boldy** and defenseman **Brock Faber** were named to the United States roster on Jan. 2, joining defenseman **Quinn Hughes**, who was selected to the United States' preliminary roster in June.

Defenseman **Jonas Brodin**, forward **Joel Eriksson Ek**, and goaltenders **Filip Gustavsson** and **Jesper Wallstedt** were named to Sweden's roster on Jan. 2.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster in June.

Iowa Wild defenseman **David Spacek** was named to Czechia's roster on Jan. 7 and Iowa Wild goaltender **Samuel Hlavaj** was named to Slovakia's roster on Jan. 8.

BY THE PERIOD

- Ranks fifth in the NHL with a plus-11 goal differential in the opening frame and T-5th by allowing 0.73 first-period goals per game this season.
- Ranks T-5th the NHL by allowing 0.88 second-period goals per game this season and T-6th with a plus-7 second-period goal differential.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks T-4th in the NHL by allowing 0.85 goals per game in the third period and sixth with a plus-10 goal differential in the final frame.
- Ranks T-4th in NHL with nine extra-time victories (six OTW, three SOW) this season.

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 32 games this season, tied for most in the NHL.
- Owns a 22-4-6 record (.781) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 678-180-112 all-time record (.757) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

SCORING UPTICK

- Minnesota ranks T-4th in the NHL with 3.74 goals scored per game since Dec. 14.

- Since Dec. 14, the Wild ranks fourth in the NHL with 30.3 shots on goal per game and seventh with 62.2 shot attempts per game.
- Since Dec. 14, Minnesota ranks sixth in the NHL with a 27.6 PP% (16/58).

RED HOT AND ROLLING

- At 28-14-9, ranks T-4th in the NHL with 65 points, tied for the third-highest point total through a season's first 51 games in franchise history.
- Is 25-8-6 (.718) since Nov. 1, ranking second in the NHL in points (56) and third in wins.
- Since Nov. 1, ranks second in the NHL in team SV% (.916), third in goal differential (plus-33) and fourth in team GAA (2.44).
- Recorded a seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) from 12/8 - 1/3, the team's longest road point streak since a nine-game run last season (Oct. 29 - Dec. 6, 2024).
- Recorded a 14-game home point streak (12-0-2) from 11/1 - 12/20, the longest run in franchise history and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, active 16 game streak).
- Won seven consecutive games from 12/8 - 12/20, tied for the team's longest streak of the season (also seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- All seven wins from 12/8 - 12/20 were in regulation, tying the franchise record for most consecutive wins in regulation (2x previously).
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Finished 10-3-2 (.733) in December, ranking T-3rd in the NHL in points (22) and T-4th in wins.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Recorded 10 or more wins in both November and December 2025, marking the fourth time in franchise history the team has won 10 or more games in consecutive months (February and March, 2014-15; December and January, 2016-17; March and April, 2021-22).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** has tallied three consecutive multi-assist games during his active three-game point streak (0-7=7).
- Since Dec. 14, ranks T-5th in the NHL with 18 assists and T-6th with 25 points (7-18=25).
- Ranks T-5th in the NHL with 174 shots, T-9th with nine PPG, 10th with 59 points (25-34=59) and T-10th with 25 goals.
- Ranks first on Wild in points and assists and second in goals.
- Recorded three assists at BUF (1/17) and ranks fifth in the NHL with seven games with three-plus points this season.
- Has surpassed the 50-point plateau for the season time in his career, moving past Gaborik (5x) and trailing only Mikko Koivu (7x) for most in franchise history.
- Scored a goal vs. NYI (1/10) to move his career point total to 438 (210-228=438) and pass Marian Gaborik for second on the franchise's all-time points list (Koivu, 205-504=709).
- Tallied an assist at VGK (12/29), reaching 225 career assists and passing Mikael Granlund (224) for sixth in franchise history
- With two helpers at SEA (1/8), recording his 45th career multi-assist game and moved past teammates Jared Spurgeon and Mats Zuccarello for the third most in Wild history.
- Recorded a power-play assist at WPG (12/27), reaching 146 career power-play points (70-76=146) and passing Marian Gaborik (145) for second in franchise history (Koivu, 251).
- Posted three points (1-2=3) at CBJ (12/18) to reach 427 career points (207-220=427) and move past Spurgeon (119-305=424) for third in Wild history.
- Notched a PPG vs. WSH (12/16) to reach 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.

HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov recorded a seven-game point streak (7-2=9) from 11/16 - 11/29.
- Recorded a season-long five-game goal streak (6-1=7) from 11/21 - 11/29, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NHL this season.
- Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.

- **Quinn Hughes** owns an active three-game point streak (1-4=5).

THE WALL OF ST. PAUL

- **Jesper Wallstedt** stopped 26-of-28 shots faced at SEA (1/8) to improve to 12-2-4 on the season and tie Darcy Kuemper (2013-14) and Kaapo Kahkonen (2021-22) for the second most wins in a season by a Wild rookie goaltender. Kahkonen also tops the list with 16 in 2020-21.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL with four shutouts and T-7th with a .914 SV%.
- Is 6-2-3 with a 2.34 GAA, .921 SV% and two shutouts on the road this season.
- Posted a 27-save win at CBJ (12/18) and improved to 10-1-2 (.846), setting the franchise benchmark for fewest games to 10 wins in a season by a rookie goaltender (previously Kaapo Kahkonen, 14 GP in 2020-21).
- He also tied Devan Dubnyk (13 GP in 2014-15) for the fastest to 10 wins by any Wild goaltender.
