MATCHUP NOTES

- ★ Columbus has won four of the last six games in the all-time series, scoring four-plus goals in each victory.
- * The winning team has scored four or more goals in eight-straight meetings as well as 17 of the last 18 and 25 of the last 29 games of the series.
- ★ The winning team has won by a multiple goals in five of the last seven meetings overall, including four instances by three-plus goals.
- The teams have combined to score six-plus goals in 10 of the last 13 matchups overall.
- ★ The winning team has scored four or more goals in 19 of the 20 games played at Nationwide Arena.
- D Zach Werenski has collected 0-15-15 in 17 career games against the Maple Leafs and has assists in seven of his past nine contests against the club (0-10-10).

JACKET TO WATCH - C Adam Fantilli

Has tallied 4-1-5 in 6 games, including a hat trick in one of the contests last season on Jan. 22, 2025. Has recorded points in two of his three career home contests against the team (1-1-2).





MAPLE LEAF TO WATCH - C Auston Matthews

Has tallied 15-10-25 with eight multi-point efforts in 18 career games. Has points in 12 of the last 13 matchups (14-10-24). Also has goals in 6-straight at CBJ (8-4-12).



TEAM NOTES

- ★ Columbus won its second-straight game and for the fourth time in the past five contests after earning a 4-3 OT victory at Buffalo on Tuesday.
- * The club stretched its road win streak to four-straight and has started a campaign 4-1-0 on the road for the third time in franchise history (also 2010-11 and 2018-19).
- ★ CBJ conclude the second of 15 back-to-back sets of the season on Wednesday vs. Toronto. The club plays three consecutive back-to-backs from Oct. 24-Nov. 2 (also Nov. 1 vs. STL/Nov. 2 at NYI).
- ★ CBJ have outshot opponents in seven of the nine contests this season and rank second in the NHL in shots/game (33.6).
- ★ The Jackets have scored first in five of the nine games this season and are 4-1-0 when notching the opening goal.

PLAYER NOTES

- * RW Kirill Marchenko collected an assist on Tuesday and has points in seven of the nine games this season (5-4-9).
- ★ G Elvis Merzlikins (3-1-0 in 2025-26) surpassed Steve Mason for second on the club's all-time wins list with his 97th victory on Oct. 25 at Pittsburgh.
- ★ C Sean Monahan collected an assist for the fourth-straight game on Tuesday and sits one point from 600 for his NHL career (263-336-599, 827 GP). He would become the fourth player from the 2013 NHL Draft class to reach the mark, joining C Nathan MacKinnon (1,029 points), C Aleksander Barkov (782 points) and C Elias Lindholm (613 points).
- LW Dmitri Voronkov had his points streak snapped at four games (3-2-5) on Tuesday but has tallied points in seven of the club's nine games this season (5-4-9).
- ★ D Zach Werenski notched his second multi-point effort of the campaign and 81st of his career with 1-1-2 on Tuesday, tying Cam Atkinson for third-most in franchise history (Rick Nash, 137; Boone Jenner, 82).
- ★ LW Miles Wood became the second different player in club history to score the game-tying goal in the third period as well as the OT winner in the same game on Tuesday at Buffalo (David Vyborny; Mar. 7, 2007 & Jan. 14, 2006).
