NOTES

- The Stars scored three goals in the third period to earn a 5-1 win over the LA Kings. Dallas' 64 goals in the final frame this season leads all teams.
- Forward **Roope Hintz** (1-1—2) scored his 30th career game-opening goal, which mark the most among Stars players since his debut season in 2018-19. It was also his 18th goal of the season, tied with **Joe Pavelski** for the team lead. Hintz has multi-point performances in each of his past two games (1-3—4).
- Forward Jason Robertson (0-2—2) recorded his 82nd career multi-point game. Since 2020-21, only eight players have as many entering Tuesday: Connor McDavid (139), Leon Draisaitl (106), Nathan MacKinnon (101), Mikko Rantanen (99), Auston Matthews (94), David Pastrnak (92), Artemi Panarin (90) and Mitchell Marner (83).
- Forward **Evgenii Dadonov** (1-1—2) reached double digits in goals with his 10th of the season. Dadonov has points in two consecutive games (1-2—3) and 20 points (10-10—20) in 41 GP this season.
- Forward **Wyatt Johnston** (1-1—2) tallied a goal and an assist to give him 26 points (12-14—26) in 43 GP this season. The 20-year-old had 41 points (24-17—41) in 82 GP during his 2022-23 rookie campaign.
- In his 300th career NHL game, forward **Sam Steel** (1-0—1) tallied his second shorthanded goal of the season, a new career high. Steel has five goals and 13 points (5-8—13) in 38 GP this season.
- Forward **Joe Pavelski** (1-0—1) scored his 18th goal of the season, tied with **Roope Hintz** for most on the team. Pavelski has points in four straight (3-1—4) and 39 points (18-21—39) in 43 GP.
- Defenseman **Esa Lindell** (0-1—1) earned his 15th assist of the season (43 GP), one shy of his output in 82 GP last season.
- Goaltender Jake Oettinger made 32 saves on 33 shots to improve his record this season to 13-8-2.
